PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage, be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial

or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect":

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar

Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 17th day of January, 1916, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edgar Charles Sumner, by Divine Permission Bishop of Gloucester, do, in pursuance of the Twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the City of Gloucester and within my Diocese of Gloucester the Perpetual Curacy of Saint James, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 7110. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Glebe Rent and Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £249 or thereabouts:

"2. There is also in the same City and within my said Diocese the Perpetual Curacy of All Saints, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 6690. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £308 or thereabouts:

"3. There is also in the City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester and within my Diocese of Gloucester, the Vicarage of Saint Mary de Lode with Holy Trinity (hereinafter called 'Saint Mary de Lode' only), the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3964. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Glebe Rents and Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and Fees and other sources, is £218 or thereabouts:

"4. There is also in the City and County of Gloucester and within my said Diocese the Vicarage of Barnwood, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1,462. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe-Rent-Charge, Glebe Rent, Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and Fees and other sources, is £300 or thereabouts:

"5. There is also in the County of Gloucester and within my said Diocese the Rectory of Hempsted, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 413. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe-Rent-Charge, and Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, and Fees and other sources, is £960 or thereabouts:

"6. There is also in the County of Gloucester and within my said Diocese, the Rectory of Quedgeley, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 476. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe-Rent-Charge, Glebe Rent, and Fees and other sources, is £132 or thereabouts:

"7. There is also in the County of Gloucester and within my said Diocese of Gloucester, the Vicarage of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 602. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe-Rent-Charge, Glebe Rents, and Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, and Fees and other sources, is £220 or thereabouts:

"8. Certain portions of the said Parish of Barnwood are situate in the Coney Hill Dis-

trict and adjoin the said Parish of Saint James, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish they are nearer than they are to the Parish Church of Barnwood aforesaid:

"9. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is detached from the main portion of the said Parish and is situate in the old T-Station District and adjoins the said Parish of All Saints, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is considerably nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode aforesaid:

"10. Certain portions of the said Parish of Hempsted are detached from the main portion of the said Parish and are situate in the Canal District and adjoin the said Parish of Quedgeley, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish they are more accessible than they are to the Parish Church of Hempsted aforesaid:

"11. Certain portions of the said Parish of Quedgeley are detached from the main portion of the said Parish and are situate in the Bristol Road District and adjoin the said Parish of Hempsted, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish they are considerably nearer than they are to the said Parish Church of Quedgeley aforesaid:

"12. A certain portion of the said Parish of Quedgeley is detached from the main portion of the said Parish and is situate in the Toots Farm District and adjoins the said Parish of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon, and to the Church of Whaddon, in such last-mentioned Parish, it is considerably nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Quedgeley aforesaid:

"13. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the following alterations in the contents of the above-mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made:—

(a) The separation of the Coney Hill District portions of the said Parish of Barnwood referred to in the paragraph numbered 8 from the said Parish of Barnwood and their annexation to the said Parish of Saint James to which they are contiguous.

(b) The separation of a portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode situate in the Old T-Station District and referred to in paragraph numbered 9 from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and its annexation to the said Parish of All Saints to which it is contiguous.

(c) The separation of the Canal District portions of the said Parish of Hempsted referred to in the paragraph numbered 10 from the said Parish of Hempsted and their annexation to the said Parish of Quedgeley to which they are contiguous.

(d) The separation of the Bristol Road District portion of the said Parish of Quedgeley referred to in the paragraph numbered 11 from the said Parish of Quedgeley and its annexation to the said Parish of Hempsted to which it is contiguous.

(e) The separation of the Toots Farm District portion of the said Parish of Quedgeley referred to in the paragraph numbered 12 from the said Parish of Quedgeley and its annexation to the said Parish of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon to which it is contiguous.

"14. The Benefice of Saint James is in my Patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of All Saints is in my Patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Barnwood is in the Patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The Benefice of St. Mary de Lode is in the same Patronage.

The Benefice of Hempsted is in the Patronage of Mrs. Julia Charlotte Higford.

The Benefice of Quedgeley is in the Patronage of Colonel John Frederick Curtis Hayward.

The Benefice of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon is in the Patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester and Sir Audley Dallas Neeld, Baronet, alternately (the said Sir Audley Dallas Neeld having the next turn).

"15. The Reverend Frederick Billett is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint James.

The Reverend William Christian Macklin is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode.

The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boinville is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of All Saints.

The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Barnwood.

The Honourable and Reverend Charles Augustus Sinclair is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hempsted.

The Reverend Frederick Ralph Grenside is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Quedgeley.

The Reverend Edmund Henry Blake is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon.

"16. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Pluralities Act, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to this Representation, describing the several Districts so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parishes of Saint James, All Saints, Quedgeley, Hempsted, and Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents, to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same, and such Consents, by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Barnwood and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint James. The said portions (three in number) are delineated and described in Plan 'A' hereunto annexed and therein coloured *red* and lettered 'A,' and consist of the District known as the Coney Hill District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of All Saints. The said District is delineated and described in Plan

'A' hereunto annexed and therein coloured *blue* and lettered 'B,' and is part of the District known as the Old T-Station District.

"That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Hempsted and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Quedgeley. The said portions (three in number) are delineated and described in Plan 'B' hereunto annexed and therein coloured *green* and lettered 'C,' and consist of the District known as the Canal District.

"That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Quedgeley and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Hempsted. The said portions (two in number) are delineated and described in Plan 'B' hereunto annexed and therein coloured *yellow* and lettered 'D,' and consist of the District known as the Bristol Road District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Quedgeley and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon. The said District is delineated and described in Plan 'C' hereunto annexed and therein coloured *red* and lettered 'E,' and consists of the District known as the Toots Farm District.

"That the respective Incumbents of the Parishes to which such several Districts shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said Districts.

"That the Parishioners of such several Districts shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes to which the said Districts shall be annexed, and shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes from which the said Districts shall be separated, excepting, nevertheless, any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any Pew or Sitting in either of the said Parish Churches, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That Marriages, Baptisms, Churchings, and Burials shall be solemnized and performed as follows:—

(a) For the Inhabitants of the Coney Hill District in the said Parish of Saint James.

(b) For the Inhabitants of the part of Old T-Station District in the said Parish Church of All Saints.

(c) For the Inhabitants of the Canal District in the said Parish Church of Quedgeley.

(d) For the Inhabitants of the Bristol Road District in the said Parish Church of Hempsted.

(e) For the Inhabitants of the Toots Farm District in the said Parish Church of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon.

"That all Fees, Dues, Ecclesiastical Offerings, and Emoluments (excepting Tithe-Rent-Charge) arising from each of the Districts shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which such District shall be annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them."

"The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint James, in the City of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Frederick

Billett, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of All Saints, in the City of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boinville, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the Benefice of St. Mary de Lode, in the City and County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend William Christian Macklin, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Dean and Chapter, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Barnwood, in the City and County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, Julia Charlotte Higford (Widow), being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Hempsted, in the County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Honourable and Reverend Charles Augustus Sinclair, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, Colonel John Frederick Curtis Hayward, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Quedgeley, in the County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Frederick Ralph Grenside, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Dean and Chapter of Gloucester and Sir Audley Dallas Neeld, Baronet, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present alternately to the Benefice of Brookthorpe-with-Whaddon (the said Sir Audley Dallas Neeld being entitled to present on the happening of the next vacancy), and The Reverend Edmund Henry Blake, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth, and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"That the Patrons and Incumbents aforesaid are consenting Parties to the separation and annexation herein-after proposed, and the matters and things in the Scheme hereto annexed, stated, and proposed:

"That the portion of the Parish of West Pelton aforesaid immediately adjoining the said Parish of Craghead, and coloured *Green* on the Map annexed hereto, at present contains no population, but extensive building operations therein are in contemplation:

"That the said portion of the Parish of West Pelton aforesaid, coloured *Green* on the said Map, is remote of access by the Vicar of West Pelton, being situate at a distance of approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Parish Church thereof, but is only approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile from the Parish Church of Craghead, and that the Vicar of Craghead could more readily and advantageously work the said part of West Pelton, coloured *Green* as aforesaid, than can the Vicar of the Parish of West Pelton:

"That it appears to me that the said portion of the Parish of West Pelton, coloured *Green* as aforesaid on the said Map, may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the 1st and the 2nd years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and the 2nd and 3rd years of the same Reign, Chapter 49, be advantageously separated from the said Parish, to which it now belongs, and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Craghead:

"That if the proposed Scheme be carried into effect it should not affect the present state of the Patronage of the said two Benefices of West Pelton and Craghead:

"That pursuant to the direction contained in Section 26 of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, appended to this Representation, describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected, and how the changes consequent upon such alteration may be made with justice to all parties concerned, and I, the said Lord Bishop, submit the same to Your Grace to the intent that Your Grace may, if on full inquiry you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme, certify the same and such Consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"1. The separation of that part of the Parish of West Pelton aforesaid, coloured *Green* on the said Map, and immediately adjoining the Parish of Craghead aforesaid, from that Parish, and the annexation of the same to the said Parish of Craghead for all ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. The Vicar of West Pelton shall cease to have Cure of Souls within the said portion so separated and annexed, and the Vicar of Craghead shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same.

"3. The Inhabitants of the said portion, so separated and annexed, shall have the same Rights as to Pews, and the performance of all Offices and Services of the Church in the Parish Church of Craghead, and otherwise in relation to the same Church and the Parish thereto belonging, as the other Inhabitants of the Parish of Craghead.

"4. The fees for all such Offices and Services performed for the Inhabitants of the said portion of the Parish of West Pelton, so separated and annexed as aforesaid, or arising within the limits of the same, and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice, shall belong and be payable to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Craghead.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage or the Endowment of either of the said two Benefices affected by this Scheme."

"CONSENTS.

"We, the undersigned, being respectively the Patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices of West Pelton, and Craghead, in the County and Diocese of Durham, do hereby give our Consents to the foregoing Representation and Scheme, and the several matters and things therein stated and proposed.

"Given under our hands this 31st day of December, 1915.

"JOICEY, Patron of West Pelton.

"EDWARD J. TAYLOR, Incumbent of West Pelton.

"H. H. ASQUITH, *First Lord of the Treasury*, Patron of Craghead.

And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same, and the Consents aforesaid, to His Majesty in Council by his Report dated the 16th day of February, 1916, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—

"We, the undersigned, Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, do certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That The Right Reverend The Lord Bishop of Durham, has represented to us that it appears to him that that portion of the Parish of West Pelton, in the County and Diocese of Durham, coloured *Green* on the Map or Plan attached to the Representation, may be advantageously separated from that Parish, to which it now belongs, and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Craghead, in the same County and Diocese:

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing (and transmitted the same to us for our consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alter-

ation may best be effected with justice to all parties:

"That the Patrons and Incumbents of the said two Benefices of West Pelton, and Craghead, have consented in writing under their hands to the Scheme of the said Lord Bishop:

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop, together with the Scheme in writing, and the Consents of the Patrons and Incumbents beforementioned are hereunto annexed:

"And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with such Scheme, do hereby certify the same, and such Consents as aforesaid, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Scheme be carried into effect.

COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS) ENGLAND.

DIRECTIONS, DATED 9TH AUGUST, 1916, MADE BY THE LORD CHANCELLOR UNDER THE COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACTS, 1914 TO 1916.

1. In cases where it is clear that the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1914, alone applies and that the Courts (Emergency Powers) (Amendment) Act, 1916, has no application the Forms I., I.A., and II. at present in use under the Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1914, and the Directions, dated the 15th February, 1915, or Forms substantially to the like effect should continue to be used.

2. But in cases where the Courts (Emergency Powers) (Amendment) Act, 1916, does or may apply variations to the following effect should be made in these Forms, namely:—

(a) Each of the Forms should refer both in its title and its body to the later Act as well as to the earlier Act.

(b) There should be substituted for the Note to Form I. and Form I.A. a Note in the

words or substantially to the effect following, namely:—

"Under the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1914, execution on or enforcement of the judgment or order in question may be stayed if the Court is of opinion that you are unable immediately to make the payment thereby directed by reason of circumstances attributable directly or indirectly to the present war. And, further, under the Courts (Emergency Powers) (Amendment) Act, 1916, if you are an officer or man of His Majesty's Forces such execution or enforcement may be stayed in the discretion of the Court even though your inability to pay is *not* due to circumstances attributable directly or indirectly to the present war. In either case it is for you to satisfy the Court that a stay should be granted."

(c) There should be substituted for the first of the two Notes to Form II. a Note in the words or substantially to the effect following, namely:—

"The Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1914, provides that during its operation certain remedies for the payment or recovery of money (including the remedy above mentioned) are not to be exercised except on an application to the Court, and that the Court may in its discretion defer the exercise of such remedies for such time and subject to such conditions as the Court thinks fit, if of opinion that the inability to make payment is due to circumstances attributable directly or indirectly to the present war. Further under the Courts (Emergency Powers) (Amendment) Act, 1916, the discretion of the Court may be exercised in favour of any officer or man of His Majesty's Forces even though his inability to pay may *not* be due to circumstances attributable directly or indirectly to the present war. If you desire to take advantage of either of these Acts you should attend by yourself or your solicitor and satisfy the Court that its discretion should be exercised in your favour."

3. On applications in the Chancery Division to make orders for foreclosure absolute it is sufficient to proceed by way of a summons in the foreclosure proceedings without taking out a separate originating summons. But such summons should be headed also in the matter of the Act or Acts as the case may be and should have a Note appended thereto substantially equivalent *mutatis mutandis* to that appended to Forms I. and I.A. either as originally framed or as hereby varied as the case may be.

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the First Class on—

Lieutenant Frederick Joseph Rutland, R.N.
(Flight Lieutenant, Royal Naval Air Service).

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred :—

During the transhipment of the crew of H.M.S. "Warrior" to H.M.S. "Engadine" on the morning of the 1st of June, 1916, succeeding the naval battle off the coast of Jutland, one of the severely wounded, owing to the violent motion of the two ships, was accidentally dropped overboard from a stretcher and fell between the ships. As the ships were working most dangerously, the Commanding Officer of the "Warrior" had to forbid two of his officers from jumping overboard to the rescue of the wounded man, as he considered that it would mean their almost certain death. Before he could be observed, however, Lieutenant Rutland, of H.M.S. "Engadine," went overboard from the forepart of that ship with a bowline, and worked himself aft. He succeeded in putting the bowline around the wounded man and in getting him hauled on board, but it was then found that the man was dead, having been crushed between the two ships. Lieutenant Rutland's escape from a similar fate was miraculous. His bravery is reported to have been magnificent.

Former Notice.—No. 796 of 1916; hereby cancelled.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

(1) *Beachy Head to St. Albans Head—Traffic Regulations.*

I. REGULATIONS REGARDING TRADING, FISHING AND PLEASURE CRAFT.

1. The areas on the South Coast of England to which the following orders apply are:—

Area A.—Enclosed by a line from Beachy head to Owers light-vessel to Boulder bank buoy, thence in a 315° (*N. 30° W. Mag.*) direction to the Portsmouth Defence area.

Area B.—Enclosed by a line from Culver cliff to a point 3 miles, 90° (*S. 75° E. Mag.*), from Culver cliff, thence within the 3-mile limit to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from Freshwater Gate, thence to Freshwater Gate.

Area C.—Enclosed by a line joining Chewton Bunny to Christchurch ledge buoy, thence to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from Anvil point, thence to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Albans head, thence to St. Albans head.
Variation.— 15° W.

2. The term craft as used herein includes ships, barges, boats and vessels of all descriptions, and the orders apply to all fishing and pleasure craft.

3. No craft are to go out in the specified areas between sunset and sunrise.

4. All craft from places within these areas are to be on shore or back in their harbour half an hour after sunset.

5. No craft are to put to sea during fog or thick weather, and any caught at sea by fog, &c., are to return to shore or harbour at once, if possible.

6. Craft unable to return to harbour owing to failing wind or fog, &c., are to anchor and show the regulation anchor lights at night. No bright lights are permitted. Fishing craft anchoring off Brighton or Hove are to anchor between the piers.

7. Craft found after dark in the areas detailed in paragraph 1 are liable to be fired upon.

8. Fishing is permitted during daylight hours in areas A, B and C, by all *bonâ fide* fishermen, provided they are in possession of a permit which can be obtained from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, through their District Fishery Officers. When applying for these permits, fishermen are to state the port from which they intend to work, and this will be entered on the permit. Permits for areas A, B and C are only issued to craft registered locally, and will not be issued for vessels transferred from ports of registry outside areas A, B and C, to ports of registry inside those areas. Under no circumstances are fishermen allowed to carry passengers in their boats on a fishing permit.

9. All unregistered fishing craft must carry their permit number painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height. Vessels registered as British sea fishing boats are to comply with the Statutory rules as regards lettering and numbering.

10. Fishing is absolutely prohibited for all steam, oil, or petrol-driven fishing vessels of over 30-ft. keel length.

11. The following orders regarding oil of all kinds and petrol are to be complied with:—

(a) Oil, motor spirit, petrol, or other goods may not be shipped on board craft of any description, whether coasting or foreign, either as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel or as merchandise, except at places which are under the supervision of a Customs Officer. Such goods must be properly pre-entered before shipment, and a clearance must be obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915.

(b) In places where there are no Customs Officials, oil or petrol-driven craft cruising in pleasure areas, and oil or petrol-driven fishing craft of 30-ft. keel length and under, may obtain their stores locally, provided the

Coast-Watching Officer as representing the Customs Officials is previously notified, and a Stock Book giving particulars of quantities received and used is kept on board and open for inspection.

(c) Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor-spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum, or similar substances exceeding four gallons.

12. Owners of motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions, are to supply to the Coastguard Officer of the District lists of all their boats and vessels which they may place afloat, and they are to obtain from him permits for them. Without such permits these craft are not to be used. The number of the permit is to be painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

13. Motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are not to proceed outside of their ports, creeks or rivers, during the hours of official day, unless in possession of a permit which may be obtained from a Customs Official on personal application, or (in places where there is no Customs Official) from the Coastguard Officer of that district.

14. The areas within which pleasure craft with permits may move during daylight are as follows, and they are forbidden to move in any other areas:—

Newhaven: Within one mile radius from the end of the western breakwater.

Rottingdean: Within one mile radius of the slipway.

Brighton: Within one mile radius from eastern pier.

Hove: Within one mile radius from Coastguard station.

Shoreham: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Worthing: Within one mile radius from the end of town pier.

Littlehampton: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Bognor: Within one mile radius of green fishing light.

Pagham: Within one mile radius from the coast watching hut.

Selsea: Within one mile radius from Coastguard station.

Sandown bay: Inside the line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose head.

Ventnor: Within one mile of Ventnor pier.

Christchurch: Inside the line joining Chewton Bunny to Christchurch ledge buoy, and thence to Christchurch head.

Christchurch head to Sandbanks: Within 500 yards of low water mark.

Note.—Boating off Bournemouth is permitted inside a line joining the Martello tower near Sugar Loaf chine and Southbourne, provided the boats are supervised and inspected by the Piermaster and Beach Inspectors in conjunction with the Coast-Watching Officer.

Poole harbour: Within line joining North and South Havens.

Studland bay: From opposite Studland village to the old breakwater within 400 yards of low water mark.

Swanage bay: To the west of line joining Ballard and Peverill points.

15. No excursion traffic is allowed except with the written permission of the Commander-in-Chief, Portsmouth, to be obtained for the season in regard to standing excursions, and on each occasion of special excursions.

16. Nothing in these orders shall affect the standing orders relating to the Defence Areas at Portsmouth, Newhaven and Poole.

II. NEWHAVEN—CLOSING OF THE PORT.

The Port of Newhaven is closed to all merchant vessels other than those employed on Government Service, and those which have previously obtained special permission to enter from the Divisional Naval Transport Officer, Newhaven.

III. SPITHEAD APPROACH—RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.

Passage of vessels between Noman's fort and the charted position of Warner light-vessel is entirely prohibited.

IV. POOLE BAY AND SOLENT APPROACH—RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.

No craft of any description, other than craft employed on Admiralty work, is to be under way to the northward of a line joining St. Catherine's point and Anvil point, between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or during fog.

(2) Portland Harbour Approach—Restriction of Traffic.

No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland bill with St. Albans head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage.

Note.

This Notice is a revision of Notice No. 796 of 1916.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.
