Lord Chancellor. Lord Privy Seal. Mr. Secretary Samuel.

HEREAS by the Crown Office Act, 1877, a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council consisting of the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being, the Lord Privy Seal for the time being, and one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time direct impressions with the same device as the Great Seal to be taken in such manner and of such size or sizes as they may from time to time prescribe, on embossed paper, wax, wafer, or any other material; and any such impression (in the said Act called a "Wafer Great Seal") when attached to or embossed on any document required to be or usually authenticated by or passed under the Great Seal shall confer on that document the same validity in all respects as if the document itself had been authenticated by or passed under the Great Seal, and such Committee may by Order make and (when made) from time to time revoke, add to, or alter Rules prescribing the documents to which the Wafer Great Seal is to be attached, and the mode in which the documents to which the said Act applies are to be prepared, whether printed or written, or partly printed and partly written, and whether to be printed or written on paper, parchment, or any other fitting material:

And whereas the provisions of Section One of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Committee, in pursuance of the said Act, do by this Their Order make the Rules following, and do revoke any former Rules which may be inconsistent with such Rules:—

Rule 1.

All documents not specified in the Schedule hereto shall continue to be printed and written on the material hitherto employed, and be passed under the Great Seal in the manner hitherto accustomed.

Rule 2.

All marginal decorations now inscribed on documents shall be discontinued, except that such documents shall bear the Royal Arms printed in one colour.

Rule 3.

The documents specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be printed or written on the material mentioned in the

second column, and shall be impressed with or have attached to them the Great Seal named in the third column.

Rule 4.

The Great Seal and Wafer Seal in the Schedule hereto mean the Great Seal and the Wafer Great Seal within the meaning of the Crown Office Act, 1877.

Rule 5.

If in any particular case or cases it shall be found more convenient to pass any such documents under the Great Seal in the manner hitherto accustomed, or to use the material hitherto employed, the Lord Chancellor may direct the same to be done accordingly.

BOARD OF TRADE ANNOUNCEMENT.

LICENCES FOR THE IMPORTATION INTO FRANCE AND ALGERIA OF GOODS THE IMPORT OF WHICH INTO THOSE COUNTRIES IS PRO-HIBITED.

In agreement with the British Government, the French Government has set up at King's House, Kingsway, London, W.C., a special office for the issue of licences for the importation into France and Algeria of goods of *British* production or manufacture which are included in the list of articles prohibited to be imported into those countries.

The following procedure has been laid down for the working of this service:—

The application for a licence must be drawn up strictly in accordance with the annexed form, and must include a certificate to the effect that the place of production or manufacture of the goods is situated within the British Empire, that is to say, either in the United Kingdom or in a British Dominion, Colony or Protectorate. This certificate (which is to be inserted on the form of application itself) must be signed on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce of the district or town in which the merchant concerned carries on his business.

The form should then be forwarded by the applicant to the Board of Trade, Gwydyr House, Whitehall, London, S.W., which Department, after examining the application, will "viser" the same and forward it to the French Office in London. On receipt of this document the French Office will, unless there are reasons to the contrary, issue an import licence, which will be dispatched in original to the actual consignee of the goods in France, and of which a copy will be addressed to the exporter in this country.

In order to prevent delays and difficulties, applicants for licences are specially recom-

mended-

(1) to draw up their applications in as precise a form as possible as regards the number and description of the packages, the marks and numbers thereon, the description of the goods, and the quantities to be exported;

(2) to specify on the application, in a legible manner, the name and address of the consignee, and the port of discharge in France or Algeria; and to furnish the description of the goods in both French and

English.

The French Office in London will not grant licences for the import into France or Algeria of diamonds, woods and metals, and those parts or accessories of automobiles of which the importation is prohibited. In these cases applications for import licences should be made by the consignee to the competent authorities in France.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (MUNI-TION WORKERS) EXCLUSION ORDER.

Made by the Board of Trade, dated 29th August, 1916.

Whereas by Section 1 (1) of the National Insurance (Part II) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916, it is provided inter alia that subject to the provisions of that Act the provisions of the National Insurance Act, 1911, relating to un-employment insurance as amended by the National Insurance (Part II, Amendment) Act, 1914, and the National Insurance (Part II, Amendment) Act, 1915 (which provisions as so amended are therein and herein referred to as the principal Act), and the regulations made thereunder shall extend to every person being a worker within the meaning of the principal Act who is engaged on or in connection with munitions work as defined by the Munitions of War Acts, 1915 and 1916, except such classes of such work as the Board of Trade may by order exclude:

And whereas by Section 4 of the abovementioned National Insurance (Part II) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916, it is, amongst other things, provided that nothing in that Act shall affect any workman in an insured trade within the meaning of the principal Act in respect of his employment in that trade:

Now therefore, the Board of Trade, by virtue of the power of exclusion conferred upon them as hereinbefore recited and of every other power them hereunto enabling, do hereby order that the classes of munitions work specified in the Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the operation of Section 1 (1) of the National Insurance (Part II) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916.
