The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W'HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of September, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under consideration the Regulations governing the award of pensions and compassionate allowances to the Widows and Children of Officers of Your Majesty's Navy, Naval Reserve, and Naval Volunteer Reserve:

"And whereas under existing Regulations the Widows and Children of Officers on the Reserved and Retired Lists are, except in certain specified cases, eligible only for the pensions and compassionate allowances applicable to the Rank and Seniority of their Husbands or Fathers at the date they were last on the Active List:

"And whereas we have had under consideration cases, arising out of the present War, in which Officers, recalled from the Retired List, have served in a Rank superior to that held by them before retirement:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to recognise such service for the purposes of the award of Widows' pensions and Children's compassionate allowances:

"We, therefore, beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the award to Widows, Children and Dependent Relatives of pensions and compassionate allowances according to the highest permanent Rank held by the deceased fficers while on full pay, whether before retirement or during re-employment.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of September, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act. 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under consideration the Regulations governing the award of pensions to Widows and compassionate allowances to Children of Officers of Your Majesty's Coast Guard promoted on retirement to the Rank of Honorary Lieutenant:

"And whereas the existing Regulations provide only a single rate of pension for the Widows (viz. £40), and a single rate of compassionate allowance for the Children (viz. £5 to £10) of Officers of this Rank, and contain no special provision for the Dependants of Officers recalled to the Service and dying from causes in any way attributable to the Service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable in the present circumstances to make such provision:

"And whereas under Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 29th February, 1916, pensions of £50 a year and compassionate allowances of £8 to £14 a year, may, in cases arising out of the present War, be awarded to the Widows and Children, respectively, of Commissioned Warrant Officers of Your Majesty's Navy:

"We, therefore, beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the award of pensions and compassionate allowances to the Dependants of Officers of Your Majesty's Coast Guard, promoted on retirement to the Rank of Honorary Lieutenant, and called up for service in the present War, on the same scale and under the same conditions as apply in the case of Commissioned Warrant Officers of Your Majesty's Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your!

Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 18th day of August, 1916:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 18th day of August, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

- 1. In Regulation 8c, for the words "The 1st day of September" there shall be substituted the words "The 21st day of September"; and after the words "The Finance (1909-10) Act, 1910," there shall be added the words "being an Act of the Imperial Parliament."
- 2. In the following Regulations the words "The Lieutenant-Governor" shall be substituted for the respective words herein mentioned, that is to say:—

In Regulation 9D, for the words "The Minister of Munitions":

In Regulation 12D, for the words "A Secretary of State."

- 3. In Regulation 14E, after the words "Great Britain" there shall be inserted the words "Or the Isle of Man."
- 4. (a) In Regulation 15B, for the words "The United Kingdom" there shall be substituted the words "The Isle of Man."
- (b) The words "Summary Offence" in Regulation 15s shall mean an offence punishable before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace.
- 5. In the addendum to Regulation 18 contained in Paragraph 7 of the Order in Council of the 18th August, 1916, after the words "The United Kingdom" there shall be inserted the words "Or the Isle of Man."

W HEREAS by the Coroners Act, 1844, it is (amongst other things) enacted that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the Justices of any County that such County should be divided into two or more Districts for the purposes of that Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act, it shall be lawful for the said Justices in General or Quarter Session assembled, to resolve that a Petition shall be presented to His Majesty praying that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such Petition until notice thereof shall be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such County as thereinafter provided; and that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such Resolution to every Coroner for such County, and of the time when the Petition will be taken by the said Justices into consideration, and the Justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the Meeting of the Justices for that purpose touching such Petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed District, the number of the Inhabitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as shall appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act; and such Petition, with a description of the several proposed Districts and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the Petition is founded, shall be certified to His Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such Petition shall be agreed to, and the Clerk of the Peace for such County shall forthwith give or send a true copy of such Petition, certified under his hand, to every Coroner for such County, and that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, if He shall think fit, with the advice of His Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such Petition, and also any Petition which may be presented to Him by any Coroner of the same County concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it shall seem fit to His Majesty to direct the issue of a Writ de Coronatore Eligendo for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such County, to order that such County shall be divided into such and so many Districts for the purposes of the said Act as to His Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such Districts, and every such Order shall be published in the London Gazette:

And whereas by the Local Government Act, 1888, the powers and business of the said Justices in respect of the matters aforesaid in each County were transferred to the Council of such County:

And whereas by an Order in Council, made on the 26th day of June, 1861, under the provisions of the hereinbefore first-recited Act, the County Palatine of Lancaster was divided into six Districts for Coroners' purposes and the purposes of the said Act, which said Districts were named respectively the Lancaster, Preston, Blackburn, Salford, Rochdale, and West Derby Districts, and such Districts were to comprise respectively the several Parishes, Townships, and Places set forth and enumerated in the said Order:

And whereas by an Order in Council, made on the 5th day of February, 1870, under the same provisions of the said hereinbefore first-recited Act, the said Salford and Rochdale Districts of the said County were divided into three Districts, which said Districts were named respectively the Salford, Rochdale, and Bolton Districts, and such Districts were to comprise respectively the several Parishes, Townships, and Places set forth and enumerated in the said Order:

And whereas a Petition has been presented to His Majesty by the County Council of the County Palatine of Lancaster praying for the transfer of the Salford Hundred portion of the Borough of Bacup (formerly part of the late Township of Spotland) from the Rochdale Coroner's District to the Blackburn Hundred Coroner's District:

And whereas the said Petition, with the reasons upon which it is founded, has been duly certified to His Majesty:

And whereas all the provisions in that behalf of the hereinbefore first-recited Act have been duly complied with:

And whereas the Coroners for the said County have not presented any Petition to His Majesty concerning the said proposed alteration:

And whereas the Chancellor and Council of the Duchy of Lancaster have recommended the making of an Order in Council in accordance with the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas His Majesty has, with the advice of His Privy Council, taken into con-

sideration the said Petition, and is minded to make such alteration as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, direct, and declare, as it is hereby ordered, directed, and declared:—

- From and after the date hereof, alteration shall be made of the division heretofore made of the County Palatine of Lancaster for Coroners' purposes, and for the purposes of the Coroners Act, 1844, as follows, that is to say, the Salford Hundred portion of the Borough of Bacup (formerly part of the late Township of Spotland) shall be transferred from the Rochdale Coroner's District of the said County to the Blackburn Hundred Coroner's District of the said County.
- 2. The said Districts shall respectively comprise the several Parishes and Places in that behalf prescribed and mentioned in the Schedule hereto.
- 3. This Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (CONSOLIDATION) REGULATIONS, 1914.

Order dated the 7th day of September, 1916.

By virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities them thereunto enabling, the Lords Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom do hereby order that from and after the seventeenth day of September, 1916, all ships (other than ships belonging to

His Majesty) which are under charter to or are in the service of His Majesty or any Department of His Majesty's Government, while navigating in any part of the pilotage district stated below for the purpose of entering, leaving, or making use of any dockyard port in such district, shall be under the pilotage of a pilot appointed by the Senior Naval Officer of such district or of a Master or Mate possessing a pilotage certificate for such district granted by the Senior Naval Officer, and shall not be obliged to employ any other pilot. If any such ship is not under pilotage as hereby required, after a pilot appointed as aforesaid has offered

to take charge, her Master shall be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914.

Where this Order has effect Section 633 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall apply, and the Pilotage Act, 1913, shall not apply.

Nothing herein contained shall impose on the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty any liability for any loss or damage occasioned by any act or default of any Pilot appointed by the Senior Naval Officer.
