SHIRT-MAKING TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).

Proposal to vary certain Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers in the Shirt-making Trade in Great Britain.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade, and dated the 27th of April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirt-making

Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 26th December, 1913, hereby give notice, as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that they propose to vary the minimum rates of wages for female workers fixed by them on 5th July, 1915, and made obligatory under an Order of the Board of Trade dated the 6th January, 1916, as follows, that is to say:—

1. (a) For female workers other than home-workers, from 3½d. an hour to 4d. an hour.
- (b) For female home-workers, from 3½d. an hour to 4d. an hour.
