A PROCLAMATION

UNDER THE MUNITIONS OF WAR ACTS, 1915.
AND 1916.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section three of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, as amended by the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916, it is provided that the differences to which Part I. of the first-mentioned Act applies are differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting munitions work, and also any differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting employment on any other work of any description, if that Part of that Act is applied to such a difference by His Majesty by Proclamation, on the ground that in the opinion of His Majesty the existence or continuance of the difference is directly or indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, or supply of Munitions of War; and it is also provided that the said Part of the said Act may be so applied to such a difference at any time, whether a lock-out or strike is in existence in connection with the difference to which it is

applied or not: Provided that if in the case of any industry the Minister of Munitions is satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement without stoppage of any difference arising on work other than on munitions work, no Proclamation shall be made under the said section with respect to any such difference:

AND WHEREAS a difference within the meaning of the said section exists between employers and persons employed on the work of dock labourers in and in the immediate vicinity of the Port of Glasgow as to rates of wages, hours of work, and otherwise as to terms and conditions of or affecting employment on the work carried on by such dock labourers:

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Munitions is not satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement of the said difference without stoppage, being a difference arising on work other than munitions work:

AND WHEREAS in Our opinion the existence or continuance of the said difference is directly and indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, and supply of Munitions of War:

Now, THEREFORE, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, are pleased to proclaim, direct and ordain, that Part I. of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, shall apply to the said difference.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twenty-fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm.

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendment be made in the said Regulations:—

After Regulation 10A the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"10B. The Secretary of State may by order restrict either generally or in particular areas the hours in the evening during which any class of trade or business may be carried on; and any person who is expressed in any such order to be liable to a penalty in connection with any contravention of the order

shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations and punishable accordingly.

"In the application of these regulations to Scotland the Secretary for Scotland, and in the application of these regulations to Ireland the Lord Lieutenant, shall be substituted for the Secretary of State."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of September, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council, bearing date the 18th day of July, 1898, provision was made for the grant to Officers selected for Boom Defence Duties of the allowances provided for Officers employed on Transport Duties:

"And whereas the conditions then existing have been largely modified since the outbreak of hostilities, and the scale of allowances at present authorized is no longer appropriate to the services for which it was established:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to repeal the before-mentioned Order in Council, and to sanction the following proposals:—

(1) That Officers below the rank of Captain who are in charge of Boom Defence at each Base shall be paid an allowance at the rate of 2s. 6d. per day, without Command Money, subject to the provision that any Officer now in receipt of an allowance of 3s. per day shall continue to receive such allowance in lieu of the allowance of 2s. 6d. a day until he is superseded.

(2) That all Officers and Men employed in connection with Booms, including Officers in Charge, shall be paid Hard Lying Money at half rates if living and sleeping in exposed conditions on shore, under the same conditions as those applicable in the case of Officers and Men living and sleeping afloat, and that the payment of such Hard Lying Money shall take effect as from the 1st day of January, 1916.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Naval Agency and Distribution Act, 1864, it is provided that money distributable among the Officers and Crews of any of His Majesty's Ships of War in respect of Awards made in the several cases therein mentioned, so far as full provision respecting the distribution thereof is not made by or under any Act of Parliament other than that Act, shall be distributed under the direction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty in the shares in that behalf specified in any Royal Proclamation or Order in Council:

And whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was graciously pleased, by Her Royal Proclamation of the 17th September, 1900, to regulate, according to the Scheme set forth therein or recognised thereby, the distribution of the net proceeds of prizes captured from the enemy, of captures and seizures under the several Acts of Parliament passed relating to the Revenues of Customs, and to Trade and Navigation, for the abolition of the Slave Trade, for the capture and destruction of Pirates and Piratical Vessels, and of the rewards conferred for the same, as also of the awards for all salvage granted to the Crews of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels of War, when not otherwise specially apportioned by the terms of the respective awards and allowances:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 28th August, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to cancel that part of the above-mentioned Proclamation which related to the distribution of the net proceeds of Prizes captured from the Enemy:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 29th February, 1916, His Majesty was pleased to declare that money distributable as Prize Bounty for the taking or destroying of any armed Ship of any of His Majesty's enemies should be distributed in the shares mentioned in the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient that certain modifications should be made with respect to the manner in which Commanders serving under Captains in His Majesty's Ships should share, and further that there should be one scale for the distribution of all net proceeds and awards distributable in the nature of Prize Money, arising from all Services as aforesaid, other than the distribution of the proceeds of the capture of Prize of War:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to cancel the above-mentioned Proclamation of the 17th September, 1900, and the Order in Council of the 29th February, 1916, and to authorize the distribution under the direction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty of all Prize Bounty, also the net proceeds of Captures and Seizures under the several Acts of Parliament passed relating to the Revenues of Customs, and to Trade and Navigation, for the Abolition of the Slave Trade, for the Capture and Destruction of Pirates and Piratical Vessels, and of the Rewards conferred for the same, and also of the Awards for all Salvage granted to the Crews of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels of War, when not otherwise specially apportioned by the Terms of the re-

spective Awards and Allowances, and all other Monies whatsoever granted to be shared among the Officers and Crews of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the manner of Prize Money, except those arising from Prize of War, in the shares and under the Regulations set forth below.

1. The Flag Officer or Officers to have one-thirtieth part of the net amount distributable according to the following conditions and modifications:—

When there is but one Flag Officer he shall have the entire one-thirtieth part; when two Flag Officers shall be sharing together the Chief shall have two-thirds and the other Flag Officer shall have the remaining one-third of the one-thirtieth part; and when there shall be more than two Flag Officers the Chief shall have half of the said one-thirtieth part and the remaining half shall be equally divided among the Junior Flag Officers.

Commodores of the First Class, including Captains of the Fleet, to share as Flag Officers.

Every Commodore having a Captain under him may be esteemed a Flag Officer whether he is Commanding-in-Chief or serving under Command.

No Flag Officer shall share in any distribution of Prize Bounty unless he was in fact on board one of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels of War actually present at the taking or destroying of the armed enemy Ship in question.

No Flag Officer, unless actually present at the capture or destruction of any Pirates or Piratical Ship, Vessel, or Boat, shall share in any distribution of the proceeds or bounty in respect of such Pirates, or of the Crews of such Piratical Ship, Vessel, or Boat.

No Flag Officer shall share in any remuneration or award conferred or awarded to the Crew of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels as salvage, unless he shall have been actually on board the Ship or Vessel to which the award shall be made, or have personally aided and assisted in the transaction at the time the service was rendered.

2. Any Officer on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels of War actually present at the taking or destroying of any armed Ship of His Majesty's enemies or otherwise entitled to share in any award who shall have more Commissions than one shall be entitled only to share according to the share allotted to him by the above-mentioned distribution in respect to his superior Commission or Office.

3. Every Chief of the Staff not of Flag Rank shall share as Captain in Command or Captain not in Command as the case may be.

4. The Officer or Officers actually in Command of His Majesty's Ships and the Commander next in command in Ships commanded by Captains may divide one-tenth part of the remainder, or, if there is no Flag Officer to share, one-tenth part of the whole amount distributable, in the following proportions:—

Where the Officer is in command of a Ship singly entitled to an award, and has not a Commander as Second in Command under him, he shall take the whole one-tenth part.

Where Commanding Officers of various Ranks, and Commanders serving under Captains as aforesaid share jointly, the one-tenth part shall be so divided into parts as to provide for each Captain Commanding receiving six parts, each Commander Commanding or Commander serving as Second in Command

under a Captain, three parts, and each Lieutenant-Commander, Lieutenant, or other Officer, actually commanding, two parts.

5. After provision shall thus have been made for the Flag share (if any), and for the Commanding Officer or Officers, and others as above specified, the remainder of the net amount distributable shall be distributed in Classes, so that each Officer, Man, and Boy, composing the rest of the complements of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels of War, and actually present on board at the time of such Service, and every person present and assisting shall receive shares or a share according to his Class, as set forth in the following scale, the relative Ranks mentioned being those laid down in the Regulations and Instructions for the Government of His Majesty's Naval Service, the Instructions for the Government of the Coast-guard Service, and the Regulations for the Government of the various classes of the Reserves, or, if not so laid down, as determined by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

6. Supernumerary Officers and Men doing duty in His Majesty's Ships and Vessels of War shall share according to the Ranks which they hold in the Service.

7. No Interpreter unless holding some Rank or Rating in the Service or otherwise forming part of the Officers and Crews of His Majesty's Ships of War shall share in any award.

8. Officers and others holding Acting Appointments superior to their Substantive Ranks or Ratings and who are in receipt of the pay of such Acting Appointments, shall share according to such Acting Rank.

9. All persons temporarily employed in His Majesty's Naval Forces shall share in the Classes to which the Ranks or Ratings to which they are temporarily appointed may belong or be deemed equivalent.

10. In the event of any difficulty arising with respect to any of these Rules, or if any case should occur not herein provided for, or not sufficiently provided for, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty shall be competent to issue such directions thereon as may appear just and expedient.

11. The distribution herein ordered shall take effect forthwith as regards money decreed as Prize Bounty, but the proceeds arising from all captures, seizures, salvage, and other services as aforesaid, made or performed prior to the date of this Order shall be distributed in accordance with the Proclamation in force at the time of such captures, seizures, or services respectively, and applicable thereto.

declare, and it is hereby declared, that the said Bishopric of Exeter shall become vacant on the 1st day of November, 1916, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Exeter.

SCHEDULE.

1.—(1) The next Statutory Elections of members shall be postponed, or, in the case of Elections already postponed under the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, further postponed for a year; and the term of office of the existing members shall accordingly be extended, or further extended by one year.

This provision shall apply only where the next Statutory Election (whether a postponed election or not) would take place before the 1st day of November, 1917.

(2) Sub-sections (3), (4) and (5) of Section 1 of the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, shall apply to the foregoing Sub-section as they apply to the provisions of that Section with the substitution of the year 1917 for the year 1916.

(3) Any enactment making the payment of a fine a condition of resigning any office shall not have effect so as to require the payment of a fine in the case of a member who resigns any office after the date on which his term of office would, but for the provisions of the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, or this Act, have expired.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Elections (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, and shall be construed as one with the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man.

situate in the County and Diocese of Durham, for the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Luke, Darlington, situate in the same County and Diocese:

"Whereas under the provisions of the 21st Section of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, the right of Patronage and the nomination of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), is exercisable alternately by Your Majesty and by the Bishop of the said Diocese of Durham:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Darlington, is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and in the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, and his successors alternately:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the said Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), and Saint Luke, Darlington, should be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said two Benefices, and of the Patronage thereof, respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"And whereas the said two Benefices are of modern origin, and are in consequence not entered in Your Majesty's Books:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Darlington, (in testimony of which consent he, the said Herbert Henry Asquith, has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, now Bishop of Durham, as the alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), (in testimony

4. For Male Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, from 22s. 6d. to 23s. 6d. per week.
5. For Male Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, from 18s. 6d. to 19s. 6d. per week.
6. For Male Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, from 15s. to 16s. 3d. per week.
7. For Male Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 12s. to 13s. 6d. per week.
8. For Male Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 10s. to 11s. 6d. per week.
9. For Male Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 8s. to 9s. per week.
10. For Male Workers under 15 years of age, no variation.

B. FEMALE WORKERS.

1. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and upwards (and others to whose employment the minimum rate of 14s. 1d. per week is applicable under the terms of paragraphs (a) and (b) of Section 1 of the above-mentioned Notice dated 29th November, 1915), from 14s. 1d. to 16s. 3d. per week.
2. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months and cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, from 12s. to 13s. 6d. per week.
3. For Female Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 12s. to 13s. 6d. per week.
4. For Female Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 10s. to 11s. 6d. per week.
5. For Female Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 8s. to 9s. per week.
6. For Female Workers under 15 years of age, no variation.

The above proposals are on the basis of a week of 52 hours, the rates being subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less or more than 52.

Variation of certain Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers in certain branches of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons. To come into force on 23rd October, 1916.

1. In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade and dated the 27th of April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for certain branches of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 10th January, 1914, have given notice, as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that they have varied the Minimum Rates fixed by them on 19th August, 1912, and 19th July, 1915, and made obligatory under Orders of the Board of Trade dated the 20th February, 1913, and the 20th January, 1916, in respect of the following class of workers, that is to say:— Female Workers employed as Cutters, Trimmers or Fitters-up.

2. In respect of such class of workers the Minimum (or lowest) Time Rates of wages as varied and subject to the provisions of this Notice shall be as follows, clear of all deductions,* that is to say:—

For all Female Workers when employed under 19 years of age 4d. per hour.

For all Female Workers when employed at 19 and under 20 years of age 5½d. "

For all Female Workers when employed at 20 years of age and over 6d. "

Provided that in the event of any Female Worker being employed for the first time at such work at or over the age of 19 years the rate to be paid during the first two months of her employment shall be at 1d. per hour less than the rate appropriate to her age as set out above.

Provided also that in the case of workers under 18 years of age who are learners (as defined by the Trade Board in their Notice of 19th July, 1915) and are occupied wholly or mainly in—

(a) *Fitting-up,*

(b) *Hooking-up* material composed solely of Cotton or Linen to be used in making overalls and other similar washable garments, the minimum rates shall be as follows:—

When employed under 16 years of age 8s. 3d. per week:

When employed at 16 and under 17 years of age ... 10s. 9d. "

When employed at 17 and under 18 years of age ... 14s. 3d. "

The weekly rates so provided are based on a week of 50 hours, and they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours spent under contract of employment by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.

3. For the purpose of this Notice Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up shall be deemed to be workers who are substantially occupied in one

or more of the following processes, that is to say:—

(a) Marking in or Marking up cloth or linings or other materials.

(b) Laying up, Hooking-up, or Folding cloth or linings or other materials.

(c) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials.

(d) Trimming, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on of cutting and assembling together the linings and fittings of garments.

(e) Dividing, that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their Assistants of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making up.

(f) Fitting-up, that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting or machining, which consists of preparing and fitting accurately the various parts of the garment, before being basted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing and fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

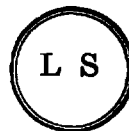
