The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated 27th October, from His Majesty's Consul-General at Alexandria, stating that quarantine measures have been imposed on vessels arriving from Karachi.

Ministry of Munitions of War, 31st October, 1916.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 15 (c) of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the Minister of Munitions hereby requires all persons engaged in the production, manufacture, purchase, sale or distribution of any coal tar or coke oven by-products (including in particular tar, carbolic crystals, Benzol, Toluol. Ammoniacal Liquor, and Sulphate of Ammonia) to furnish to the Minister of Munitions such particulars as to output, working of

plant, cost of manufacture, sales, deliveries, stock-in-hand, purchases, and prices, as may be required on his behalf, such particulars to be furnished in such form and at such intervals as may be required as aforesaid.

The Minister of Munitions further requires that any particulars so furnished shall be verified and authenticated by the signature of the person required to furnish the same, or, where such person is a firm or company, of a partner, director, or other responsible officer.

Extending Time for operation of Section 57 of the Broadstairs and St. Peter's Urban District Council Act, 1913.

BROADSTAIRS AND SAINT PETER'S URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

TRAMWAYS ACT 1870 AND WALSALL CORPORATION ACTS, 1900 AND 1914.

OTICE is hereby given, that The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walsall, acting by the Council of the said Borough, in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Walsall Corporation Acts, 1900 and 1914, on the 30th day of October, 1916, made the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to their tramways and motor omnibuses, namely:—

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Walsall, under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Walsall Corporation Acts, 1900 and 1914.

1.—Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Walsall; the word "Tramways" means the Tramway and Motor Omnibus System worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the County Borough of Walsall, or in any other District where the Corporation have running powers; the word "Car" means any Carriage or Car run upon the Tramways and any Motor Omnibus or other vehicle owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Passenger" shall mean every person being conveyed or attempting to be conveyed by a Car; the word "Conductor" means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of a Car; and the word "Driver" means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a Car.

2.—The Bye-laws and Regulations herein after set forth shall extend and apply to every Car using the tramways, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations under the Tramways Act, 1870.

3.—Every passenger shall enter a Car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise unless so directed by the Conductor.

Persons desiring to board a Car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit to alight all persons who may be intending to do so.

4.—Except at a terminus, every passenger shall leave the Car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform and not otherwise, unless specially directed by the Conductor.

At a terminus passengers desiring to leave the Car shall (if so directed by the Conductor) leave such Car at the Driver's end thereof.

5.—No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for that purpose.

6.—No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, nor any person who from any other cause in the opinion of the Conductor is unfit to be a passenger, shall enter or mount upon any Car, and any such person found in or

upon any Car may be immediately removed from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

7.—No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any Car, Tramway Station, Waiting Room, or any premises used in connection with the Tramways, or spit, or commit any nuisance, in or upon or against any Car, Tramway Station, Waiting Room, or premises as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

8.—No passenger or any other person shall, while travelling in or upon any Car or whilst upon any Tramway Station, Waiting Room, or premises as aforesaid, sing, play, or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon any Car, Tramway Station, Waiting Room or premises, as aforesaid, any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any other objectionable matter in or upon any Car, Tramway Station, Waiting Room, or premises as aforesaid.

9.—No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any Car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any Car. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

10.—No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a Car, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, soil, injure, or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the Car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the Conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any Car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any Car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any Car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation; and if any such person be found in or upon any Car, he shall, on the request of the Conductor, leave such Car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so, he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation. vided that on Cars specially run for artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a Car, under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

11.—Each passenger, before leaving the Car, shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, whether the same shall or shall not be demanded, and obtain a ticket therefor.

12.—Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the Conductor

or any duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

No passenger shall alter, cut, tear, or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

13.—No passenger shall bring on to any Car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and any such luggage shall be placed by the passenger in such position on or in the Car as shall be directed by the Conductor.

The Conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking upon any Car any personal or other luggage exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and any luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the Conductor, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the Car.

- 14.—No person not being an officer or duly authorized servant of the Corporation shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any Car, and no person not being an officer or duly authorized servant of the Corporation shall stand on the platforms or on the upper deck of any Car or shall sit on the outside rail on the upper deck or on any part of any Car not intended for passengers, and any person so travelling, riding, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor or other duly authorized servant of the Corporation.
- 15.—No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any Car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any Car, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the lower deck of the Car with the consent of the Conductor.
- -When any Car contains in the interior or lower deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to the Car is provided in such interior or lower deck, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein except by the permission of the Conductor first obtained. any Car contains on the outside or upper deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to the Car is provided on such outside or upper deck, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.
- No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any Car whilst in motion.
- 18.—No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any Car, except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. person shall take a dog or other animal into any Car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any Car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the 'Car immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.
- 19.—No person shall place upon, or travel in or on any Car, with loaded firearms, or any

- article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any Car or the clothing of any passenger.
- 20.—No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, upon or in connection with any Car or the Tramways.

No person shall in any way wilfully obstruct or impede any Car.

- 21.—No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in con-nexion with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation, and no person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, light ventilators, trolley cord, or any other part of a carriage or its equipment.
- 22.—If at any time a Car becomes disabled or in any way injured or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same; and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid; but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available Car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares.
- 23.—Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any Car any breach of these Bye-Laws, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.
- 24.—Every Inspector, Conductor, or Driver of a Car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-Laws and prevent any breach
- 25.—Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-Laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.
- 26.—There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each Car in use a printed copy of these Bye-Laws and Regulations.
- 27.—These Bye-Laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of February,
- 28.—From and after the date of these Bye-Laws and Regulations coming into force, the Bye-Laws and Regulations made by Mayor, Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Walsall as Promoters, on the 8th day of December, 1913, shall be repealed.
