By the KING. A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain goods should be prohibited as hereinafter provided:

Now, THEREFORE, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council; in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.—

Jewellery and all manufactures of gold and silver other than watches and watch cases.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 11) Proclamation, 1916.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Sixteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendment be made in the said Regulations:—

After Regulation 2r the following regulations shall be inserted:—

- 2F.—(1) Where the Board of Trade are of opinion that it is expedient that special measures should be taken in the interests of the public for maintaining the supply of any article of commerce the maintenance of which is important as being part of the food supply of the country or as being necessary for the wants of the public or for the wants of any section of the public, the Board by order may, with a view to maintaining the supply of the article, apply to that article any of the provisions appended to this regulation.
- (2) Any such order may be made either so as to apply generally or so as to apply to any special locality, or so as to apply to any special supplies of any article, or to any special producer, manufacturer, or dealer.
- (3) If any person acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions appended to this regulation he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

Provisions which may be applied.

I. A person shall not waste or unnecessarily destroy any article to which this provision is applied; and if the order applying this provision to that article declares that any specified process, action, or other thing done is waste or unnecessary destruction of the article, that process, action, or other thing done shall be deemed to be waste or unnecessary destruction for the purpose of this provision.

II. Where the order applying this provision to any article specifies the purposes for which the article is to be used, a person shall not (subject to any conditions contained in the order) use the article except for the purposes so specified; and where the order prescribes any special manner in which the article is to be used, a person shall not (subject to any conditions contained in the order) use the article except in that manner.

III. Where the order applying this provision to any article contains any directions or regulations as to the manufacture or production of the article in such a manner as to secure that the public are supplied with the article in the form most suitable in the circumstances, all persons concerned in the manufacture or production of the article shall comply with those directions or regulations.

IV. Where the order applying this provision to any article contains any directions or regulations as to the mode of sale or the distribution of the article with a view to securing that the available supply of the article is put to its best use throughout the country or in any locality, all persons concerned in the sale or distribution of the article shall comply with those directions or regulations.

V. Where the order applying this provision to any article contains any directions or regulations as to the market operations in that article with a view to preventing an unreasonable inflation of the price of the article as the result of market operations, all persons concerned in market operations shall comply with those directions or regulations.

VI. A person shall not (subject to any exceptions contained in the order applying this provision) directly or indirectly sell or offer for sale any article to which this provision is applied at a price exceeding by more than the amount named in the order the corresponding price of the article at a date specified in the order (the corresponding price to be settled in case of difference by the Board of Trade); and where the consideration for any sale or offer consists wholly or partly of any conditions made or offered to be made in connection with the transaction, or is otherwise not of a pecuniary character, the value of the consideration or such part thereof as is not of a pecuniary character, shall, for the purposes of this provision, be taken into account in determining the price of the article.

VII. All persons owning or having power to sell or dispose of any article to which this provision is applied or any stocks thereof shall, if required by the Board of Trade, place at the disposal of the Board the article, or the whole or any part of the stocks thereof as may be required by the Board on such terms as the Board may direct, and shall deliver to the Board or to any person or persons named by them the article or stocks in such quantities and at such times as the Board may require.

Such compensation shall be paid for any article or stock so requisitioned as shall, in default of agreement, be determined by the arbitration of a single arbitrator appointed in manner provided by the order applying this provision; but in determining the amount of the compensation the arbitrator shall have regard to the cost of production of the article and to the allowance of a reasonable profit without necessarily taking into consideration the market price of the article at the time.

2G.—(1) If the Board of Trade are of

2g.—(1) If the Board of Trade are of opinion that information is required with respect to any article of commerce with a view to the exercise of any powers of the Board of Trade in relation to that article, the Board may by order apply the provisions of this regulation to that article; and if the provisions of this regulation are so applied to any article, every person owning or having power to sell or dispose of the article, or concerned in the manufacture or production of the article shall, subject to any exceptions or limitations contained in the order, make a return to the Board giving such information in such form and within such time as may be specified in the order applying those provisions—

(a) as to the stocks of the article held by him or consigned to him or under order to him; and

(b) as to any contracts for the supply to, or by, him of the article or any contracts for, or in connection with, the production or manufacture of the article, or the dealing therein; and

(c) as to the prices paid by him or received by him for or in respect of the article; and

(d) as to the cost of production of the article, and the names and addresses of the

persons by whom the article has been supplied to him or to whom the article of commerce has been supplied by him; and

- (e) as to any other matters specified in the order applying the provisions of this regulation with respect to which the Board may desire information for the purpose of any of their powers and duties.
- (2) For the purpose of testing the accuracy of any return made to the Board under this regulation, or of obtaining information in case of a failure to make a return, any officer of the Board authorised in that behalf by the Board may enter any premises belonging to or in the occupation of the person making or who has failed to make the return, or on which he has reason to believe that any article to which the provisions of this regulation are applied are kept, stored, manufactured, or produced, and may carry out such inspections and examinations (including the inspection and examination of books) on the premises as the officer may consider necessary for testing the accuracy of the return or for obtaining any such information.

(3) If any person—

- (a) refuses or without lawful excuse neglects to make a return as required by this regulation to the best of his knowledge and belief, or makes or causes to be made a false return; or
- (b) obstructs or impedes an officer of the Board in the exercise of any of his powers under this regulation; or
- (c) refuses to answer or gives a false answer to any question, or refuses to produce any books or documents required for obtaining the information to be furnished in pursuance of this regulation;

that person shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

- (4) No individual return or part of a return made under this regulation, and no information as to any person or his business obtained under this regulation, shall, without lawful authority, be published or disclosed except for the purposes of a prosecution under this regulation; and if any person acts in contravention of this provision he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.
- 2H.—(1) If the Board of Trade, in any special case are of opinion that, before exercising any of their powers under these regulations in relation to any article, it is expedient to hold an inquiry with respect to that article in any locality, the Board may appoint such persons as they think fit to hold an inquiry as respects that article and report to the Board on such points as the Board may direct.
- (2) Any persons so appointed shall have power to take evidence on oath and to administer an oath for the purpose.
- 2J.—(1) The Board of Trade may make arrangements with any other Government Department for the exercise by that Department on behalf of the Board of Trade of the powers of the Board under the regulations numbered 2F, 2G and 2H with respect to any particular article of commerce, and in such case the Department and the officers thereof shall, as respects that article, have and exercise the same powers as are by those regulations conferred on the Board of Trade and the officers of that Board, and the Local Government Board (or as respects Scotland the Secretary for Scot-

- land, and as respects Ireland the Local Government Board for Ireland) may by arrangement with the Board of Trade confer and impose on any local authorities and their officers any powers and duties in connection with the enforcement of the said regulations numbered 2F and 2G.
- (2) Nothing in the regulations numbered 2g and 2H shall prevent the exercise by the Board of Trade of any of their powers in relation to any article under these regulations or otherwise, without having obtained or endeavoured to obtain returns under Regulation 2g or having held an inquiry under Regulation 2H.
- (3) Any order of the Board of Trade under the said regulations numbered 2F and 2G may be revoked or varied as occasion requires.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of

certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:-

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:-

- (1) That the following headings should be deleted :-
 - (c) Casein and preparations thereof;
 - (B) Cocaine and its salts and preparations;
- (B) Emery, corundum, natural or artificial (such as alundum) carborundum and crystolon and manufactures thereof;

Hemp and hemp manufactures, the following:

- (a) Italian, Russian and Manila hemp, Maguey fibre, and manufactures thereof;
- (c) Other hemp and manufactures thereof:
- (в) Mica, mica chimneys, mica splittings, micanite and micanite cloth;
 - (c) Varnishes, spirit, containing gum.
- (2) That the following headings should be added:-
 - (A) Barometers;
 - (B) Casein and preparations thereof;
 - (A) Cocaine and its salts and preparations;

(c) Electrical apparatus and plant for the generation, distribution and utilisation of electric power, not otherwise prohibited;

(B) Emery and corundum and manufactures thereof, carborundum, alundum, crystolon and all other artificial abrasives and manufactures thereof;

Hemp and hemp manufactures, the following:-

(A) Hemp ropes, old;(A) Hemp waste;(A) Italian, Russian and Manila hemp, Maguey fibre, and manufactures thereof, except Tagal braid; and manu-

(c) Other hemp and manufactures thereof, not otherwise specifically prohibited;

(c) Tagal braid.

Insulating materials, the follow-

- (c) Compounds intended for the purpose of electrical insulation;
- (c) Lead, oxides of; (c) Zinc-barium pigments made from zinc salts and barium sulphate;
- (в) Mica, mica splittings, mica powder, micanite, articles made from them, and insulating materials containing them;
 - (c) Oils, essential (except turpentine oil);
- (A) Thermometers (except clinical thermometers);
- (c) Varnishes not otherwise prohibited; c) Waterproof wearing apparel, not .otherwise specifically prohibited;

- (c) Wearing apparel, manufactured wholly, or partly of wool or hair, not otherwise specifically prohibited;
- (c) Wool, or hair, all manufactures, mixtures and products of, not otherwise specifically prohibited.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

(Amendment of Yorkshire Registries Act 1884, in its application to North Riding Removal of Restrictions on Qualification for Appointment as Registrar thereunder; E tension of Act to Letters of Administration in cases of Intestacy in all three Ridings of Yorkshire; Expenses of North Riding County Council; Amendment of Acts.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire (hereinafter referred to as "the North Riding Council") for leave to bring in a Bill for the following or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):

To amend the Yorkshire Registries Act, 1884, in the following respects, viz.:-

- (1) By removing certain of the restrictions upon the qualification of persons for appointment as Registrar for the North Riding under the said Act, and (inter alia) by providing (if thought fit) that notwithstanding anything in the said Act any Registrar appointed by the said Council thereunder may for such period and upon and subject to such terms and conditions as may be approved by the Lord Chancellor, be a person who either by himself or in partnership with some other person follows another calling or profession during the time he holds the appointment of Registrar.
- (2) By extending the application of the said Act to Letters of Administration granted in any case of intestacy in all three Ridings of Yorkshire.

To make all such further or other amendments of the said Act or any Act amending the same as may be deemed necessary or expedient in connection with or incidental to the amendment hereinbefore referred to.

To make all such other provisions as may be deemed necessary or expedient with respect to

all or any of the matters aforesaid.

To provide that all costs and expenses of the North Riding Council in the execution of the powers of the intended Act and the costs of and incident to the promotion of the Bill for the intended Act shall be defrayed as payments for general or special county purposes within the meaning of the Local Government Act, 1888, as may be defined in the intended Act.

The Bill will or may repeal, alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the following Acts, in addition to those hereinbefore specifically referred to, viz.:—

The Yorkshire Registries Amendment Act, 1885, the Local Government Act, 1888.

The Bill will or may also repeal, alter or amend such of the provisions of any other Act or Acts (whether local or general) as would be inconsistent with or prevent the carrying into effect of the objects of the intended Act.

The Bill will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with any of its objects and confer other rights and privileges.
