WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by

various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council, dated the 24th day of October, 1916:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the 24th day of October, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

In Regulation 10b for the words "*Secretary of State*" there shall be substituted the words "*Lieutenant-Governor*."

Omit the second paragraph.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 21st day of November, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council, bearing date the 6th February, 1892, it is provided that payment of 6*d.* a day may be made to a Royal Marine employed on printing duties at each of the Royal Marine Divisions, and the Depôt:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the quantity of Printing now requiring to be done warrants the employment of 2 men at each Division, at a higher rate of pay than that now allowed:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the employment at each of the Royal Marine Divisions, and at the Depôt, of one Royal Marine as Printer, and one as Assistant Printer, with pay at Regimental rates, together with an allowance of £16 and £12 per annum respectively, as is now paid to men acting as Printer and Assistant Printer in Your Majesty's Navy, with effect as from the 21st September, 1916.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 9th day of November, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94,

have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, the New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, the New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, and the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, all in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester:

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 26th day of October, in the year 1860, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate in the Parish of Blackburn, in the said County of Lancaster, and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Blackburn’:

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 15th day of October, in the year 1872, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church of All Saints, situate at Nova Scotia, in the said Parish of Blackburn, and such District Chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn’:

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 26th day of January, in the year 1874, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, portions of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Over Darwen, of the New Parish of Saint James, Over Darwen, and of the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Tockholes, all within the original limits of the said Parish of Blackburn, were constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named ‘The District of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen’:

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 23rd day of January, in the year 1911, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Ewood, within the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood’:

“And whereas the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Blackburn, the said District Chapelry of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, the said District of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, of the said New Parish of

All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, and of the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose, that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, and the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, shall be altered so that (*firstly*) All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, which is described in the *First Schedule* hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured *green*, shall be dissevered from such New Parish, and shall be annexed to, and shall in future form part of, the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn; and (*secondly*) All those portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, and of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, which are described in the *Second Schedule* hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and are thereon coloured *pink*, shall be dissevered from such New Parishes, and shall be annexed to, and shall in future form part of, the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, and proposing, any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before-mentioned Acts, or any of them, or any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly represent, recommend, and propose, to Your Majesty in Council.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, which is bounded upon the south-west, and upon the north-west, by the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east, and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, from the said New Parish of Christ

Church, Blackburn, at the junction of Hutchinson Street and Cumpstey Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Cumpstey Street for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with St. Ann's Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of St. Ann's Street for a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence of the wharf of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal Company adjacent to the Cumpstey Street Mill, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the towing path on the northern side of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, and continuing thence south-eastward in the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing the said towing path) for a distance of 14 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said Leeds and Liverpool Canal, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of $15\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Highfield Road across such canal, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"1. All those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Saint James, Lower Darwen, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-west by the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west, and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, crosses the middle of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal near the south-western end of the Ewood Aqueduct which carries the said canal across Aqueduct Road and the River Darwen, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Bolton Blackburn and Hellfield Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway across such canal, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said Line of Railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn) for a distance of $27\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such Line of Railway is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Lower Darwen.

"2. And also all that portion of the New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, in the said County and Diocese, which is included in the County Borough of Blackburn, and which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, in the said County and

Diocese, upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Saint James, Lower Darwen, and upon the south by the boundary which divides the said County Borough of Blackburn from the Municipal Borough of Darwen."

And whereas Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patrons, and also the Incumbents of two of the said Cures, have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Incumbent of the New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, and the Incumbent of the New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, have offered certain objections to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of such Drafts as aforesaid:

And whereas, notwithstanding the said objections, the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the Representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in any City or Town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that Burials in any City or Town, or within any other limits, or in any Burial Grounds or Places of Burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in such City or Town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, Burials in such City or Town, or within such limits, or in such Burial Grounds or Places of Burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that Notice of such Representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be

taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representation, one month before such Representation is so considered: Provided also that no such Representation shall be made in relation to the Burial Ground of any Parish until 10 days' previous Notice of the intention to make such Representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Wrestlingworth, in the County of Bedford, and of the Parish of Harwell, in the County of Berks, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have made Representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Wrestlingworth aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and Burials discontinued therein as herein-after directed; and that, for the like reason, Burials should be discontinued in the Civil Parish of Harwell aforesaid as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 3rd day of October, 1916, to give Notice of such Representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 14th day of November, 1916, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Wrestlingworth, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that Burials in the said Civil Parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

WRESTLINGWORTH.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of St. Peter, Wrestlingworth, in the County of Bedford, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

HARWELL.—Forthwith and entirely in the Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, in the Parish of Harwell, in the County of Berks, and also in the Chapelyard: Provided that in the said Chapelyard the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Mrs. Ellen Allen, Mrs. Sophia Day, Mrs. Fanny Greenaway, and Miss Sarah Turner, at their decease, in grave spaces in which no interments have heretofore taken place, and which have been reserved and appropriated as burial places with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

THE ADDITIONAL COUNTY COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS) RULES, 1916, DATED 23RD NOVEMBER, 1916, MADE BY THE LORD CHAN-

CELLOR FOR COUNTY COURTS UNDER THE COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACTS, 1914 TO 1916 (4 & 5 GEO. 5, c. 78; 6 & 7 GEO. 5, c. 13; 6 & 7 GEO. 5, c. 18).

Preliminary.

The following additional Rules under the Courts (Emergency Powers) Acts, 1914 to 1916, shall apply to the County Courts and to the City of London Court, which shall for the purposes of these Rules be deemed to be a county court.

These Rules shall be read and construed as if they were contained in the Consolidated County Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1916. They may be cited as the Additional County Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1916, or each Rule may be cited as if it had been one of the Consolidated Rules, and had been numbered therein by the number placed in the margin opposite such Rule. They shall come into operation on the first day of December, 1916, and shall apply to all proceedings pending on that day.

Execution against Goods.

1.—(1) Where in any proceedings application is made for the issue of a warrant of execution against goods without leave of the Court, then, unless it sufficiently appears on the face of the proceedings that the judgment or order is for the payment or recovery of a sum of money to which the Courts (Emergency Powers) Acts, 1914 to 1916, do not apply, the warrant shall not issue without leave unless the following conditions are complied with.

(2) The applicant shall be required to state in the præcipe, in the form appended to this Rule,

(a) whether the debtor is or is not an officer or a man of His Majesty's Forces, or that the fact is not known; and

(b) if it is stated that he is not, that the judgment or order is not for the payment or recovery of a sum of money payable in pursuance of a contract made before the beginning of the fourth day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, or of a contract for rent not amounting to fifty pounds per annum made after the beginning of that day; or

(c) if it is stated that he is, or that the fact is not known, that the judgment or order is not for the payment or recovery of a sum of money payable in pursuance of a contract made before the beginning of the eleventh day of April, nineteen hundred and sixteen, or of a contract for rent not amounting to fifty pounds per annum made after the beginning of that day.

[Form of Statement.]

(a) Debtor not a member of the Forces: or

Debtor a member of the Forces: or
Not known whether debtor a member of the Forces.

(b) Debt not on contract before, or for rent under 50*l.* on contract on or after, 4th August, 1914.

(c) Debt not on contract before, or for rent under 50*l.* on contract on or after, 11th April, 1916.]

2. Where execution has issued without leave, but it appears to the bailiff, from any informa-

tion received by him, that the case is one in which by reason of the debtor being an officer or a man of His Majesty's Forces, or for any other reason, the warrant should not have issued without leave, he shall make a special return to the court from which the warrant issued, and to the judgment creditor, stating the information that he has received and his grounds for thinking that leave was required; and the warrant shall not be executed without leave of the court granted on application made in accordance with the rules as to applications for leave to issue execution; and those rules, with the necessary modifications, shall apply accordingly.

Power to proceed on Notice, &c., where Party abroad or cannot be found.

3. In any case where any debtor or other party to any proceedings under the Emergency Rules is absent or abroad or cannot be found, or it is uncertain whether he is alive or dead, or it is otherwise difficult to serve him, the court may proceed on such notice or intimation of the proceedings whether to any other person or by advertisement or otherwise as the court shall in its absolute discretion think fit. And the provisions of this Rule shall be in addition to and by way of extension and enlargement of the ordinary powers and practice of the court as to proceeding *ex parte* and as to substituted service.

The KING was pleased, on Saturday, the 25th instant, at Buckingham Palace, to present to Lieutenant Henry Joseph Higgs, Royal Engineers, the Albert Medal of the First Class, which had been conferred upon him by His Majesty for gallantry in saving life, as detailed below:—

At Newark, on the 17th February last, whilst instruction in the use of bombs was being given to a class of non-commissioned officers and men, who were standing round, two

members of the class, after lighting the fuzes, dropped their bombs, through nervousness. Lieutenant Higgs picked up the bombs, the fuzes being more than half burned at the time, and threw them over the parapet. The bombs exploded when just clear of the parapet.

On the 11th April last, an officers' class was being practised in the throwing of live grenades from behind a breastwork. One officer, when throwing a grenade, struck his arm against another officer, who was standing too close to him, so that the grenade was jerked out of his hand and fell between the class (numbering 30 officers) and the breastwork. Lieutenant Higgs dashed forward, seized the bomb, and threw it over the breastwork; it exploded in the air in front of the breastwork.

In addition, on several other occasions, ten or twelve in all, men when being practised in throwing the live grenades have dropped them, through nervousness, and Lieutenant Higgs has picked them up and thrown them over the parapet, thus avoiding serious accidents.

COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that on 21st November he made an Order, in pursuance of section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 21st November, 1916."

The effect of the Order is as follows:—

(a) To add the explosive "Haylite No. 2" to the list of permitted explosives.

(b) To remove the explosives "Duxite," "Permon Powder," "Superite," "Syn-

dite," and "Tutol No. 2" from the list of permitted explosives.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE HEREFORD AREA.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

Limits of Area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is the Hereford Area, being the area comprising the City of Hereford.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold.

A.—*For Consumption ON the Premises.*

2. (1) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption on the premises shall be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises; or

(b) Consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor

B.—*For Consumption OFF the Premises.*

(2) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises shall (subject to the additional restrictions as regard spirits) be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club or (except as hereinafter expressly provided) dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed off the premises; or

(b) Take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

Additional Restrictions as to Spirits.

3. In addition to the above general restrictions as to hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied, the sale and supply of spirits in licensed premises and clubs shall be subject to the following special restrictions, that is to say:

(a) No orders for spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be given by or accepted from any person actually present in any licensed premises or club except on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and during the hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

(b) Spirits to be consumed off the premises must not (except as hereinafter expressly provided) be dispatched from any licensed premises or club, nor must they be taken therefrom by the person to whom they are sold or supplied or by any person acting on his behalf, except on the days and during the hours aforesaid.

(c) Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied or taken from any licensed premises or club in any bottle or other vessel not bearing a label showing the name and situation of the premises or club, or in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.

(d) No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in or taken from any refreshment room in any railway station.

Conditions as to Distribution.

4. No person shall either by himself or any servant or agent—

(a) Sell, supply, distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor from any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle unless before the liquor is dispatched it has been ordered and the quantity, description and price thereof, together with the name and address of the person to whom it is to be supplied, has been entered in a delivery book or invoice, which shall be carried by the person delivering the liquor, and in a day book which shall be kept on the premises from which the liquor is dispatched.

(b) Carry or convey in any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle while in use for the distribution or delivery of intoxicating liquor any such liquor not entered in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(c) Distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor at any address not specified in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(d) Refuse to allow any constable to examine such van, barrow, basket or other

vehicle or receptacle or such delivery book or invoice.

(e) Solicit or canvass for orders for, or collect or receive payment for, intoxicating liquor except at the licensed premises.

(f) Send or cause to be sent or leave or cause to be left to or at any premises, or to or with any person, any order form for intoxicating liquor.

(g) Cause or permit any payment for intoxicating liquor to be made on his behalf by any person in the service or employment of the vendor of the liquor, or, being a person in such service or employment, make any such payment as the agent or on behalf of the purchaser of the liquor.

Hours of Opening for the Supply of Food and Non-intoxicants.

5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Order or of the Law relating to licensing or the sale of intoxicating liquor:—

(a) Licensed premises may be opened for the supply of food and non-intoxicating liquor at the hour of 5.30 in the morning on all days and be kept open for this purpose from that hour until the evening closing hour prescribed by the general provisions of the Licensing Acts; and

(b) Refreshment houses may be kept open for this purpose at any time during which they may be kept open under the general provisions of the said Acts.

Saving Provisions.

6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be deemed to prohibit, in cases where the same is otherwise lawful—

(a) The consumption of intoxicating liquor by any person in any licensed premises or club where he is residing; or

(b) The consumption of intoxicating liquor at a meal by any person in any licensed premises or club at any time within half an hour after the conclusion of the afternoon and evening hours during which the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is permitted by this Order: Provided that the liquor was sold or supplied and served during such hours at the same time as the meal and for consumption at the meal; or

(c) The sale or supply of spirits to any person producing a certificate in writing dated and signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner that the spirits are immediately required for medicinal purposes and specifying the quantity of spirits required: Provided that the quantity sold or supplied shall not exceed the quantity specified in such certificate; or

(d) The dispatch from licensed premises for delivery at a place more than five miles distant of any spirits or other intoxicating liquor in the forenoon of any day on which the sale of the same for consumption off the premises is permitted by Article 2 (2) and Article 3 of this Order as the case may be.

Treating Prohibited.

7. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply any intoxicating liquor to any person in any licensed premises or in any club for consumption on the premises unless the same is ordered and paid for by the person so supplied; nor shall any

person order or pay for or lend or advance money to pay for any intoxicating liquor wherewith any other person has been or is to be supplied for consumption on the premises; nor shall any person consume in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor which any other person has ordered or paid for or agreed to pay for or lent or advanced money to pay for;

Provided always that if such intoxicating liquor is supplied or served for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal the provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to be contravened if the person who pays for such meal also pays for such intoxicating liquor.

For the purposes of this regulation consumption on the premises includes consumption of intoxicating liquor in or on any highway, open ground or railway station adjoining or near to the licensed premises or club in which the liquor was sold or supplied; and any person consuming intoxicating liquor in or on any such highway, open ground or railway station shall be deemed to consume the liquor in such licensed premises or club, as the case may be.

Credit Prohibited.

8. No person shall—

(1) (a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any licensed premises or club or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed either on or off the premises; or

(b) Consume any intoxicating liquor in or take it from such premises or club; unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is supplied or dispatched or taken away:

Provided always that if the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal, this provision shall not be deemed to be contravened if the price of the liquor is paid together with the price of such meal and before the person partaking thereof quits the premises.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any intoxicating liquor unless it is paid for before it is so introduced.

Long Pull Prohibited.

9. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent in any licensed premises or club sell or supply to any person as the measure of intoxicating liquor for which he asks an amount exceeding that measure.

Dilution of Spirits.

A.—Compulsory.

10. (a) No person shall on or after the eleventh day of December, 1916, either by himself or by any servant or agent—

(1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 25 degrees under proof;

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 25 degrees under proof. Provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the fourth day of December, 1916.

B.—Permissive.

(b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 25 and 50 is hereby permitted.

(c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by an admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

Sale of Light Beer.

11. The Order of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) made on the third day of July, 1916, with reference to the sale of light beer shall apply to the area and come into force on the fourth day of December, 1916.

Explanatory Provisions.

12.

(a) Nothing in this Order authorises any licensed premises to be kept open for the sale of intoxicating liquor except during the hours permitted under the general provisions of the Licensing Acts.

(b) The prohibition under this Order of the sale, supply and consumption of intoxicating liquor except during certain hours is not subject to the exceptions provided for in the Licensing Acts with respect to *bond fide* travellers and the supply of intoxicating liquor at railway stations or any other provisions in those Acts enabling intoxicating liquor to be supplied during closing hours in special cases.

(c) The expression "licensed premises" includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under a licence.

(d) This Order does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade or to a registered club for the purposes of the club.

(e) This Order does not affect the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor to or in any canteen where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty.

Exhibition of Order.

13. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order and any other notice required by the Board to be so affixed.

Commencement of Order.

14. This Order shall come into force on the fourth day of December, 1916.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE HEREFORD AREA WITH REFERENCE TO MEDICATED WINES AND NEW EXCISE LICENCES.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order supplemental to the Order made on the twenty-seventh day of November, 1916, for the Hereford Area.

Conditions as to the Sale of Medicated Wines.

1. On and after the eleventh day of December, 1916, no person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises for consumption off the premises or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor in the form of or prepared as (a) medicated wine or (b) any mixture or preparation which contains any drug or medication or is sold or advertised for sale as containing or purporting to contain medicinal properties except in a bottle or other vessel bearing a label correctly stating in clear and legible words or figures the amount of proof spirit contained in such medicated wine or mixture or preparation. Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the sale of—

(a) Any medicine mixture or preparation appearing in the British Pharmacopeia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex; or

(b) Any medicine mixture or preparation which is made up for a customer on the signed prescription of a medical practitioner; or

(c) Medicated or methylated spirits or spirits made up in medicine and sold by medical practitioners or chemists or druggists.

2. (a) The expression "licensed premises" in the foregoing Article includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises is carried on under a licence.

(b) The foregoing Article does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade.

Restrictions on the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor under new Excise Licences.

3. No person shall, except with the written authority of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which such authority may be granted, either by himself or by any servant or agent, sell or supply in any premises any intoxicating liquor under an excise licence granted in respect of such premises on or after the fourth day of December, 1916, unless an excise licence authorising such sale was in force in respect of such premises on the third day of December, 1916.

Provided always that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to affect the sale of intoxicating liquor under—

(a) An excise licence granted on the authority of a Justices licence; or

(b) An excise licence granted to any person holding a canteen under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty; or

(c) A manufacturer's licence.
