

Admiralty, dated the 21st day of November, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council, bearing date the 6th February, 1892, it is provided that payment of 6*d.* a day may be made to a Royal Marine employed on printing duties at each of the Royal Marine Divisions, and the Dépôt:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the quantity of Printing now requiring to be done warrants the employment of 2 men at each Division, at a higher rate of pay than that now allowed:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the employment at each of the Royal Marine Divisions, and at the Dépôt, of one Royal Marine as Printer, and one as Assistant Printer, with pay at Regimental rates, together with an allowance of £16 and £12 per annum respectively, as is now paid to men acting as Printer and Assistant Printer in Your Majesty's Navy, with effect as from the 21st September, 1916.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 9th day of November, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94,

have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, the New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, the New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, and the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, all in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester:

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 26th day of October, in the year 1860, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate in the Parish of Blackburn, in the said County of Lancaster, and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Blackburn’:

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 15th day of October, in the year 1872, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church of All Saints, situate at Nova Scotia, in the said Parish of Blackburn, and such District Chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn’:

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 26th day of January, in the year 1874, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, portions of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Over Darwen, of the New Parish of Saint James, Over Darwen, and of the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Tockholes, all within the original limits of the said Parish of Blackburn, were constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named ‘The District of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen’:

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 23rd day of January, in the year 1911, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Ewood, within the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood’:

“And whereas the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Blackburn, the said District Chapelry of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, the said District of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, of the said New Parish of
