At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of January, 1917.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such

List as so varied or added to being in the last mentioned Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List":

And whereas the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Note (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3. A List consolidating all previous Lists was published on the 22nd December, 1916 (the Consolidating List No. 15a), which, together with the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

*Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of

export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared, on application, to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of tele-graphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in making enquiries, would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to His Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE WITH REGARD TO STREET COLLECTIONS.

By virtue of the powers conferred upon me by Section 5 of the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, I, being the Police Authority for the Metropolitan Police District, hereby make the following Regulations with respect to the places where and the conditions under which persons may be permitted in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District to collect money or sell articles for the benefit of charitable or other purposes:—

- (1) No collection of money (other than a collection taken at an open-air meeting) or sale of any article shall be made in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District unless the society, committee, or other body of persons responsible for such collection or sale shall have obtained from the Commissioner of Police a permit for such collection or sale. All applications for permits shall be referred to an Advisory Committee appointed by the Commissioner and approved by the Secretary of State:
- (2) Application for a permit shall be made in writing in the form contained in the Schedule hereto not later than the first day of the month preceding that month in which it is proposed to hold the collection or sale, and every application shall be made in the name of a committee or other body consisting of not less than three persons, who shall be jointly responsible for the collection or sale.

- (3) No collection or sale shall be made except upon the day and between the hours stated in the permit, and no permit of a continuous character will be granted.
- (4) The Commissioner may in granting a permit limit a collection or sale to such streets or public places or such parts thereof as he may think fit.
- (5) No person may assist or take part in any collection or sale without the written authority of the committee or body of persons to whom a permit has been granted. Every person so authorised shall produce such written authority forthwith for inspection by any Police Officer on demand.
- (6) No collection or sale shall be made in any part of the carriage-way of any street; nor shall any collection or sale be made on the footway or in any public place to the obstruction or annoyance of any person in such street or public place.
- (7) All persons acting as collectors or vendors shall occupy a stationary position at some place on the footway. Not more than two persons shall act as collectors or vendors at the same place, and no person shall collect money or sell articles within 30 yards of the place where any other person or persons are collecting or selling.
- (8) No person under the age of 18 years shall act or be permitted to act as a collector or vendor.
- (9) No collector or vendor shall use a table for the purpose of any collection or sale so as to cause or be likely to cause obstruction. No table used shall exceed 30 inches in length and 20 inches in width.
- (10) No collector or vendor shall use a box or other receptacle at the end of a pole intended to reach upper windows or the roofs of conveyances.
- (11) No collector or vendor shall be accompanied by any animal.
- (12) No collector or vendor shall importune any person to the annoyance of such person.
- (13) Every collector or vendor shall carry and present to all contributors or purchasers for the reception of money contributions a box or other receptacle numbered and securely closed and sealed in such a way as to prevent the same being opened or the money extracted without such seal being broken, and into this box or other receptacle all money received shall be immediately placed. All such boxes or receptacles shall be numbered consecutively. Every collector or vendor shall deliver his boxes or other receptacles with the seals unbroken to one of the persons responsible for the proper application of the money received.
- (14) A collector or vendor shall not carry any collecting box, receptacle or tray which does not bear displayed prominently thereon the name of the fund for which the collection or sale is being made nor any box or other receptacle which is not duly numbered.
- (15) No payment or reward shall be made to any collector or vendor or other person connected with the promotion or conduct of a collection or sale for or in respect of services rendered in connection therewith.
- (16) Within one month after the date of any collection or sale the society, committee or other body of persons responsible therefor shall forward to the Commissioner for the informa-

tion of the Advisory Committee a statement in the form contained in the Schedule hereto with vouchers certified by two officials of the society and audited by its auditor or other responsible person not connected with the fund, showing in detail the amount received and the expenses incurred in connection with such collection or sale, and shall if required by the Commissioner satisfy him as to the due and proper application of the proceeds of the collection or sale.

Any person who acts in contravention of any of the foregoing Regulations will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding forty shillings, or in the case of a second or subsequent offence not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing Regulations do not apply to the selling of articles in any street or public place when the articles are sold in the ordinary course of trade and for the purpose of earning a livelihood and no representation is made by or on behalf of the seller that any part of the proceeds of sale will be devoted to any charitable purpose.

I hereby confirm the foregoing Regulations and direct that the same shall come into operation 14 days after their publication in the London Gazette.

His Majesty the KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Joseph Johannes Venter under the following circumstances:-

On the 19th April, 1915, Thomas Reardon and Joseph Johannes Venter were carrying out blasting operations at the Government Gold Mining Areas (Modderfontein) Consolidated Mine, South Africa. Each man was working in a separate drive, and it was their practice to charge their shot holes (13 in number) and await the signal of a boy stationed at a point where the two drives joined, whereupon they lit their fuses and withdrew to the junction of

On this occasion Venter duly received the On reaching the signal and lit his fuses. junction of the drives he heard a report in Reardon's drive and was told by the boy that Reardon was still at his working place. He at once rushed down Reardon's drive, through heavy fumes, and, after travelling about 250 feet, fell over Reardon's body. He picked him up and carried him about 78 feet when two further shots exploded in Reardon's place, Venter then dragged knocking Venter down. Reardon to the shelter of the wall and ran for help, returning in about two minutes with two In pursuance of the powers conferred upon or three men. As they entered the drive, fur-

ther shots exploded. They went through the fumes and carried Reardon clear, but he died four days later.

In entering Reardon's drive for the purpose of rescuing Reardon, when only one shot out of thirteen had exploded, and knowing that the remaining shots might (as in fact some of them did) explode at any moment, Venter undoubtedly risked his life to save Reardon.

YORK INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL FOR GIRLS.

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 1 of the year 1917.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

PART I. Closing of Ports.

Former Notice.—No. 645 of 1916; hereby cancelled.

- (1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, referred to in Part III. of this Notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.
- (2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must approach the port with the greatest caution and implicitly obey all orders or signals given them by the Examination vessel or signal station.

(3) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III. of this Notice, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.


Examination Service.

- (4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad, referred to in Part III. of this Notice.
- (5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the Port. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.
- (6) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III., serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lamps, two red and two white, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.



By night the steamer will carry: -

- (a) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.
- (b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

- (8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the distinguishing signal of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer makes the signal.
- (9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that they must not lower any boats (except to avoid accident), communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Starmer

- (10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Port should be approached with caution.
- (11) Merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night: the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.
- (12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

PART IV.

SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

Notice is hereby given that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force.

H.M. Vessels are constantly engaged in sweeping operations off the coasts of the United Kingdom.

Whilst so engaged, they work in pairs connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they will show the following signals:—

A black ball at the foremast head and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to pass.

For the public safety, all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, must keep out of the way of vessels flying this signal, and should especially remember that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair, as the vessels may have mines trailing in their sweeps and also on account of the danger caused to traffic if mine sweepers have to slip their sweeps to get out of the way of vessels.

Caution.

Part IV. of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in Part IV of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.

ENGLISH CHANNEL, NORTH SOUTHERN PORTION, WITH RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY AND AP-PROACHES.

Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 1428 of 1916; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:-

- I. ENGLISH CHANNEL AND NORTH SEA SOUTHERN PORTION-PILOT-AGE REGULATIONS.
- 1. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.
- 2. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.
- 3. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.
- 4. All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Great Yarmouth and vice versa, and between those places and the Sunk light-vessel, or any intermediate pilot station that may hereafter be established, and

vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

- 5. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.
- 6. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots :-
 - (a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamers attached to the Downs Station will cruise in: the vicinity of a position two miles southeast of Deal Pier.
 - (b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise between the position of the wreck of the Corton Light-Vessel (Lat. 52° 31½′ N., long. 1° 50′ E.) and the South Scroby Buoy.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships trading with Netherlands Ports, but no others, can obtain Pilots for the River

Thames and the Downs.
The Sunk Pilot Steamer will be on her station between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. only.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

II: RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY, &c.—TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-Buoys, and through the Oaze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels between a line drawn from London Stone to No. 3 Sea Reach Light-Buoy and thence to Canvey Point on the west, and the Sunk Head Buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles Buoys, on the east, from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise. chant or other private vessel is to be at anchor in the Black Deep, and the Main Channel of the Thames, to the Southward of a line joining a position in lat. 51° 38′ N., long. 1° 21′ E., D3 Buoy, a position in lat. 51° 33′ 08′ N., long. 1° 13′ 03″ E., Knob Light-Buoy, North Knob Light-Buoy, South Shoebury Light-Buoy, a position in lat. 51° 29′ 15″ N., long. 1° 49′ 45″ E., and Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Sea Reach Buoys, from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise, and no vessel is to anchor in the Black Deep Channel between the parallel of lat. 51° 40′ N., and the Sunk Light-Vessel from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise except such South-bound vessels as are unable to proceed further south owing to darkness or thick weather. Anchorage for merchant or private vessels is also prohibited in the West Swin.

All other Channels are closed to navigation. The Nore Examination Anchorage is reserved for vessels under examination before entry into the Medway, and also for vessels on Government service which have left the Medway and are awaiting orders as to route, &c.

- 2. Coasting vessels are not to be under way nor exhibit any lights in the East Swin or Wallet between sunset and sunrise.
- 3.—(a) Cruising of yachts and pleasure craft is prohibited in the following areas:—.

(b) The rivers Coine, Blackwater, and adjoining creeks so far as the tide flows.

(c) That portion of the Estuary of the Thames East of a line drawn between the Grain Spit and West Shoebury buoys.

(d) The area in the River Thames enclosed by a line drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and a 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction through the Ovens Buoy to a line joining Holehaven Point and the Blyth Middle buoy.

(e) The River Medway East of Rochester Bridge.

Note.—For the purposes of this Order the Estuary of the Thames is to be considered to include the north coast of Kent from North Foreland to Sheerness, and the coast of Essex from Shoeburyness to the Naze.

- 4. (a) The cruising of yachts and other pleasure craft under sail, steam, or otherwise mechanically driven, and under oars, in those portions of the Estuary of the Thames and the rivers Thames and Medway outside the areas specified in Section 3, and also in the rivers Crouch and Roach, will be permitted under the following restrictions.
- (b) Cruising is permitted in the Crouch west of a line drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and a 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction through Nass Point. Cruising is also permitted in the Roach as far as Paglesham Hard, but owners of yachts are to intimate their intention to proceed up the Roach to the Coast Guard, Burnham, before leaving, and report their return.

(i.) No yachts may anchor in the Crouch between Burnham Coast Guard Station and Nass point.

(ii.) Landing in the Roach may be permitted only at Paglesham Hard and permits are to be exhibited to the Military Patrol stationed there.

- (c) Local craft used for business purposes are subject to the foregoing restrictions, but may in certain instances be allowed in prohibited areas, if permission in writing has been previously obtained from the Naval or Military 'Authorities.
- (d) Owners of boats anchored within sight of Burnham Coastguard Station may go on board their boats up to 10.0 p.m., provided that a permit to do this has been obtained from the Senior Naval Officer, Brightlingsea, and provided also that the boat remains at anchor.

(e) Pleasure craft using the areas mentioned in paragraph (b) of this Sub-Section or the

waters to the west of the line mentioned in Sub-Section 3, paragraph (c), must obtain a licence from the local Police.

(f) If more than one craft is used, a separate

licence is required for each.

(g) The name must be marked legibly on every craft. All open, half-decked and other craft must have the number and distinguishing letter of the licence clearly painted on each side of the bow.

(h) The licence must be carried in the craft,

and is to be available for inspection.

(i) Boats licensed for hire may be taken out by British subjects other than those in whose names the licences are made out, provided that they be returned to the licensees by sunset on the day of hire. The licence for the boat must be carried by the person hiring it.

(j) All pleasure craft of any description are prohibited from being under weigh between

the hours of sunset and sunrise.

- 5. (a) Pulling boats are allowed within the prohibited area in Sub-Section 3, par. (c), provided they obtain a licence in accordance with Sub-Section 4, pars. (e) (f) and also comply with Sub-Section 4, pars. (h), (i), (j), and that no such boats proceed more than one mile from the shore. In the area between Margate Coast Guard Station and the North Foreland they must keep within half a mile from the shore.
- (b) Pulling boats are forbidden to go alongside or communicate with any vessel lying off the shore.
- (c) No pleasure pulling boats are allowed in the Medway to the Eastward of Rochester Bridge nor are any allowed in the area specified in Sub-Section 3, par. (d).
- 6. The use of the Swin and Wallet Channels by sailing barges and small trading vessels engaged in coastwise traffic along the Essex coast is permitted, subject to compliance with the following restrictions:—
 - (a) Each vessel must obtain from the Customs a special clearance card, which is to be kept available for inspection by the Patrol Officers, on demand.
 - (b) A red ensign is to be displayed while navigating the Middle Deep and Swin Channel.
 - (c) No vessel may be under way after dark, except as provided for hereinafter.
 - (d) When at anchor in the Wallet, Ray Sand, and Whitaker Channels, or in the Rivers Colne, Blackwater, and Crouch, all lights are to be screened so that they will not show outboard.
 - (e) No vessel may anchor in the River Crouch in the area indicated in Section II., Sub-section 4, paragraph b (i.); or in the River Blackwater in the areas bounded by a line drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and a 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction, through Ramsey Stone to the opposite shore, and a line drawn through the Tollesbury and Mersea Oyster Fishery Company's Beacon on Thurslet Spit and the same Company's Beacon on the south side of the river, and extended to the north and south shores of the River.
 - (f) To enable vessels to save their tides they will be permitted to navigate the Rivers

Colne, Blackwater, and Crouch at night above the following places:-

River Roach above Quay Reach.

River Crouch above Burnham Coast Guard Station.

River Blackwater above Ramsey Island Stone.

River Colne above Brightlingsea Creek.

They are to anchor immediately, should they be ordered to do so by the Naval or Military Authorities.

- (g) Vessels are to carry out all instructions received from the Naval Officers in command of vessels patrolling these Channels and
- (h) No vessels are to enter or pass through the defended area in the Middle Deep and Swin Channels until they have been boarded and examined by the vessels stationed there for that purpose.

(Note.—The Examination Officers will board South-bound vessels in the vicinity of Those leaving the the Whitaker Spit. Thames and Medway will be boarded near the Mouse Light-Vessel.)

The Boarding Officers will give Masters of vessels instructions as to the course they are to steer when passing through the defended

- (i) Vessels reaching the entrance to the defended area within one hour of sunset will not be allowed to pass through till daylight.
- 7. All vessels, other than those of British Nationality or those of the Allied Nations, are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers.

All Neutral Aliens are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers in British vessels, and this applies to Aliens carried in British ships or barges as passengers or part of crew; the limits of the prohibited area are defined as from the Outer Bar buoy in the River Medway to Rochester bridge, and the whole of the River Swale from the light on Queenborough spit to Columbine spit buoy. Attention is drawn to the necessity of shipowners and charterers satisfying themselves that no Neutral Aliens are on board vessels sent to the Rivers Medway and Swale.

Variation.—14° W.

III. HARWICH APPROACHES-TRAFFIC REGULATION.

With a view to safeguarding the interests of shipping in the vicinity of Harwich, no vessel, either British, Allied, or Neutral, is to be within the area west of a line joining the following positions:-

- (a) Lat. 52° 08' N., long. 1° 41' E. (b) Lat. 52° 02' N., long. 1° 42'. E.
- (c) Sunk Light-Vessel. (d) Sunk Head Buoy.

Except in the case of a vessel trading with Netherlands ports which may enter the area to the Westward of the Sunk Light-Vessel, in order to communicate with the Sunk Pilot-Vessel, to embark or disembark her pilot, should the Pilot Vessel be on her Pilot Station within the area at the time.

Any vessel contravening the foregoing regulation will run the gravest risk of being sunk.

River Humber and Approaches—Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.-No. 1290 of 1916; hereby

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:

- That portion of the Humber which lies between two straight lines, drawn from shore to shore, as follows:—(1) a line drawn 225° (S. 61° W. Mag.) through Spurn lighthouse, (2) drawn 344° (North Mag.) from the east side of Barrow haven, will be referred to as the "port" in these regulations.
- Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels should be directed to conform to the following regulations:-
-) Except under exceptional circumstances merchant vessels will be free to enter or leave the port during the hours of Official day.
- (II) Before entering the port merchant vessels must receive permission and the necessary instructions from the Examination steamer, and before leaving they must obtain

permission through the Collector of Customs at Hull, Grimsby, or Goole, as the case may be.

- (III) Shipowners and local agents are advised to time the arrival of their vessels at the port for daylight.
- (IV) Vessels desiring to enter the port from seaward are, unless previously met by the Examination steamer, to proceed to the Southern Examination anchorage (except during strong northerly or north-easterly winds, when they should proceed to the Northern Examination anchorage) and there anchor
- (V) The Examination steamer will be met in the Examination area between Bull lightvessel and Chequer Shoal buoy.

The Examination steamer will be distinguished by the following means:—

By Day.—A white ensign, and at the foremast head the special flag mentioned in Part II. of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1 of 1917. When the port is closed 3 red balls will be hoisted in addition to the special flag.

By Night.—Three lights vertically, 3 feet apart, conspicuously displayed at the end of a yard so as to show an unbroken light round the horizon. When the port is closed these lights will be red, when it is open they will be white.

Note.—These lights are in addition to the ordinary navigation lights.

(VI) There are two Examination anchorages. The northern is to be used in strong northerly and easterly winds. The southern is to be used under all other conditions.

The Northern Examination anchorage comprises those portions of Hawke road and Middle shoal included between the intersection of the following lines of bearing:—

- (1) Skeffling Church bearing 18° (N. 34° E. Mag.).
- (2) Skeffling Church bearing 4° (N. 20° E. Mag.).
- (3) Špurn lighthouse bearing 120° (S. 44° E. Mag.).
- (4) Extreme of Spurn point bearing 115° (S. 49° E. Mag.).

The Southern Examination Anchorage comprising the area bounded as follows:—

- (1) On the north by the Bull sand.
- (2) On the south by the three fathom contour line northward of Tetney haven.
- (3) On the east by the line joining the Bull light-vessel and entrance to Tetney
- (4) On the west by a line parallel to and 7 cables from the eastern limit (3).

Note.—When the Southern Examination anchorage is full of shipping further arrivals should anchor eastward of and as near to it as possible.

The Examination area is that portion of the river enclosed by an irregular line drawn from the Bull light-vessel to the extreme of Spurn point, thence to the Chequer Shoal buoy, thence to a point 210° (S. 46° W. Mag.) of and distant 7 cables from Bull light-vessel and thence to Bull light-vessel.

3. All pilotage certificates granted to masters and mates for the whole or any part of the Humber Pilotage district are suspended and further all vessels (irrespective of draught, size,

or nationality, but with the exception of those provided for in paragraph 4) bound to or from any place on the Humber must be conducted by licensed pilots over the whole or any part of the waters between Hull and the Outer Pilotage station of the Humber Pilotage district, which, until further notice, will be situated in the neighbourhood of the "Bull" light-vessel.

- 4. In the case of lighter inter-dock traffic and of small British vessels engaged in local traffic above Immingham, pilotage by licensed pilots is not compulsory.
- 5. During the hours of official night, and during fog with visibility of less than half-amile, no traffic is permitted to move on the Humber below Paull point; also when these conditions prevail no vessel should enter or remain within a radius of five miles from "Humber" (late "Spurn") light-vessel.
- 6. A vessel should not approach the Humber unless there is sufficient time available to enable such vessel to obtain a pilot and to arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor before the commencement of official night.
- 7. No vessel should anchor whilst awaiting a pilot.
- 8. Vessels when leaving the Humber must proceed direct to sea. Should it be necessary to wait for the weather to moderate or clear, they must remain inside the river at an authorised anchorage.

The pilot lobbies will be notified when the existence of fog outside the river is known.

9. A pilot should not board a vessel unless there is sufficient time available to enable such vessel to arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor, before the commencement of official night. The latest time at which the pilot cutter stationed at the "Bull" light-vessel should board inward-bound vessels is one hour before the commencement of official night.

Vessels bound outward should not pass Hawkins point later than 45 minutes before the commencement of official night.

10. All vessels proceeding into or out of the Humber must be navigated by way of Hawke and Sunk roads passing to the northward of the Bull light-vessel, except those outward-bound from Grimsby, which may cross the Middle shoal passing at once into the channel north of the Middle.

Note.—The five-fathom channel through the Sunk and Hawke roads is very narrow at the western entrance and also at a point north of the "Middle" light-vessel; deep-draught vessels steaming against the tide when approaching the buoys marking these portions of the channel should endeavour to avoid passing other vessels between them by easing engines to allow ships with the tide under them to get through first. Smaller vessels outward-bound should pass close to the southward of the buoys marking the south side, and those inward-bound close to the northward of the buoys marking the north side, of the narrow portions of the channel, provided always that their draught of water and the state of the tide will admit.

11. Sailing vessels of 50 tons register and upwards when entering or leaving the Humber must be towed through the Boom Defence gateways. Should tugs not be available, inward-

bound yessels may anchor north-westward of the No. 2 Lower Middle light-float at a distance of not more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from it, but they must not bring the before-mentioned light-float to bear to the southward of 128° (S. 36° E. Mag.).

12. All vessels entering or leaving Grimsby docks must pass to the southward of the No. 4 Lower Burcom buoy except those making use of the channel southward of the Burcom shoal (hereinafter called the Burcom channel), which are exempted from this condition, but no vessel may cross the Burcom shoal between the No. 5 Middle Burcom and No. 4 Lower Burcom buoys. Vessels using the Burcom channel must pass into and out of its western end to the eastward of No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, and through a passage at its eastern end 170 feet wide each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole.

Vessels making use of this passage are cautioned to keep well in the middle of the opening and are subject to the following regulations:—

- 1. Vessels navigating against the tide must in all cases give way to those navigating with the tide.
- 2. No vessel must approach the defences in this part of the river nearer than a quarter of a mile except to pass through the beforementioned passage or to enter Grimsby docks.
- 3. No vessel may tow more vessels at one time than she can safely navigate through the passage, and under no circumstances is the tow to comprise more than three craft.
- 4. Distant signals will be shown from the flagstaff on the West Pier at the Grimsby Dock entrance as follows:—
 - (a) Two black balls will denote that the passage is open.
 - (b) Three black balls will denote that the passage is closed.
 - (c) No signal being hoisted denotes that traffic is suspended.

When signal (b) three black balls is hoisted, no vessel may approach the passage, and when traffic is suspended no vessels, other than H.M. Ships on special duty, may use the passage.

- 13. Prohibited Anchorage areas:—
- (I) Anchorage is prohibited for all vessels between two imaginary lines:—

(a) Joining Stone Creek Coast Guard flagship and the eastern extremity of the eastern jetty at Immingham.

- (b) Joining the Riverward beacon of the two centre measured mile beacons on Sunk island and the northernmost of two clumps shown southward of Stallingborough on Admiralty Chart No. 109. The latter line passes through the position of No. 6 Upper Burcom buoy.
- (II) No merchant vessel shall anchor (except when granted special permission) between the before-mentioned prohibited anchorage area (I) and the line of transit of the eastern measured mile beacons on Sunk island produced to the Lincolnshire shore or (except as provided for in paragraph 11) to the northward of the line of the Killingholme leading lights or within 1½ cables of any of the Admiralty mooring buoys.

- (III) Anchorage is prohibited to merchant vessels over the whole of Grimsby roads to the eastward of the line joining New Clee railway station and Patrington Church, except so far as the Examination anchorages are concerned.
- (1V) No vessel of any description may anchor on the south side of the Bull sand between the western limit of the Southern Examination anchorage described in paragraph 2 of this notice and a line drawn through the Cleethorpes Sewer Outfall beacon (on which a red light is exhibited in peace time) in a direction 60° (N. 76° E. Mag.), passing through a point 299° (North-west Mag.) distant 7 cables from Spurn lighthouse; nor on the north side of the Bull sand between the before-mentioned line of bearing passing through the Cleethorpes Sewer outfall and a line joining Spurn lighthouse and the Bull light-vessel produced to the Bull sand.
- 14. No merchant vessels or boats, etc., will be allowed to approach within a quarter of a mile of any defence work (except to pass through the Boom gateways) or to go alongside any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or any other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission. All vessels proceeding up and down the Humber are to pass at a distance at least three cables from H.M. Ships, if the depth of water and circumstances of navigation permit.
- 15. All vessels employed in laying moorings, raising wrecks, etc., must be passed at slow speed, propelling engines being eased at least 300 yards before reaching such vessels and so continued for 150 yards after passing them. While the said mooring or wreck raising craft are at work they will each fly a red flag.

16. Anchor lights are to be reduced in power and screened as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916.

Vessels anchored in the Humber westward of the meridian of Greenwich are to exhibit anchor lights as mentioned above, except that between Immingham and the meridian of Greenwich they are to be reduced in brilliancy so as to be invisible at any greater distance than half-a-mile. Eastward of the meridian of Greenwich no lights whatever are to be exhibited.

Anchor lights authorised by these orders are never on any account to be extinguished; the order "Out lights" will not apply to them.

order "Out lights" will not apply to them.

Bow and masthead steaming lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916.

Other lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916, and this order also applies to vessels in dock or alongside quays and jetties. Notwithstanding anything in these orders, dredgers may be permitted to work at Hull and Immingham at night provided all their lights are extinguished within half-an-hour of issue of the general order "Out lights."

The above orders apply to vessels of every description, other than H.M. ships. The latter should, however, comply so far as the visibility of anchor lights eastward of Immingham is concerned.

17. No tug is permitted to tow more than three craft at one time through a gateway of the Boom defence. Owners of tugs may apply to the Humber Conservancy Board for pilot licences for the masters of their vessels which

will enable them to pilot their own vessels and river craft comprising their tow (in certain parts of the river). The number of craft towed will be restricted according to the power of the tug.

- 18. Humber Rule No. 18 is to be strictly enforced. No sound signals other than navigation signals authorised by the Regulations for preventing Collisons at Sea, and by Humber Rules Nos. 14 to 16 (inclusive) at all times of the day or night, and No. 17 during the day only, are on any account to be used by vessels in any part of the Humber, the Old Harbour at Hull, or within any of the docks at Hull, Immingham or Grimsby.
- 19. Owners of small vessels plying in the vicinity of the Humber are instructed not to paint their craft light grey, and are hereby directed to have any vessels so coloured repainted. They are warned that small vessels painted grey run a great risk of being fired upon in mistake for submarines. Vessels painted black run the least risk.
- 20. Fishing in the Humber.—No vessel is allowed to fish in the Humber below Hull without a permit from the Admiralty port officer; all fishing, shrimping, trawling, or whelking in this portion of the river in areas other than those for which permits are granted is prohibited.
- 21. Regulations affecting small craft in the vicinity of Cleethorpes.—Pleasure boats may ply for hire at Cleethorpes only between the Eastern and Western Sewer Outfall beacons, and must keep within a distance of one mile from the shore.

Notwithstanding anything in these orders, rowing boats may pass along the shore at Cleethorpes, but they must keep within 400 yards of the high-water mark of spring tides.

- 22. Excursions by Water.—Excursions by water are limited to the River Humber above Hull, and Rivers Ouse and Trent. Excursion steamers will not be allowed to ply without a permit from the Admiralty port officer, Dock Offices, Immingham, and in no case are they to pass to the eastward of an imaginary line joining Victoria Dock entrance, Hull, and the east beacon on Skitter Ness.
- 23. Patrol of Internal Waterways.—The internal waterways of the port will be policed by Naval patrol vessels and by the Humber Conservancy Board under the direction of the Naval authorities.

Captains and Masters of Merchant Vessels and persons in charge of barges or boats of any kind are hereby warned to observe any orders which may be given to them by Naval Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board.

SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

PY virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the Board of Trade hereby order that the period limited (1) for the construction of the Brierley Colliery Railway, the widenings of railways Nos. 1, 2 and 3, and the diversion of the River Don authorised by the Great Central Railway Act, 1912, and (2) for the compulsory purchase of lands required for such works as extended by section 4 of the Great Central Railway Act, 1915, shall be extended for a period of one year from the 7th day of August, 1917.
