By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such List

as so varied or added to being in the last mentioned Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List":

And whereas the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the

Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3. A List consolidating all previous Lists was published on the 22nd December, 1916 (The Consolidating List No. 15a), which, together with the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE. (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

*NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June, and 10 November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE. (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Declaration of Wart Disease of Potatoes
Infected Area.*

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be infected with Wart Disease and an Infected Area for the purposes of the Wart Disease of Potatoes (Infected Areas) Order of 1914.

Notification of Disease.

2. Reports of the existence of Wart Disease within the Infected Area shall be made to the Board, or to The Police Constable, Milton, Staffordshire.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Prohibition of planting of Potatoes on premises where Wart Disease has occurred except by licence.

1. No person shall plant potatoes, or cause or permit potatoes to be planted, in any field, garden, or allotment in his occupation on which potatoes affected with Wart Disease have been grown in a previous year, unless such planting is authorised by, and is in accordance with the conditions (if any) imposed by, a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or of the Local Authority, and any person who shall plant potatoes, or cause or permit potatoes to be planted, in contravention of this provision, or who shall permit to remain in any field, garden, or allotment in his occupation, potatoes planted in contravention of this provision, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the Court that he did not know that potatoes affected with Wart Disease had been grown on the land in a previous year.

*Extension of Restriction on Planting in
Infected Area.*

2. Any person who shall permit to remain in any field, garden, or allotment in his occupation, which is situate in an Infected Area declared for the purposes of the Wart Disease of Potatoes (Infected Areas) Order of 1914, potatoes which have been planted without the authority of a licence granted under that Order or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions imposed by a licence so granted, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Definition.

3. The expression "Wart Disease" means the disease affecting potatoes which is known as *Synchytrium endobioticum* or Wart Disease of potatoes, Black Scab, Cauliflower Disease, or Potato Canker; and the expression "the Local Authority" means as regards any District the Local Authority for the District under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as THE WART DISEASE OF POTATOES ORDER OF 1917.
