The following Order is published in substitution for that which appeared in the Fourth Supplement to the London Gazette of January 23, 1917 (page 929):—

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 24th day of *January*, 1917.

PRESENT,
The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called "the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914"), under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to

order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. At the end of the first paragraph of Regulation 2E after the words "authorised by the order" there shall be inserted the words "and to deliver it to them or to any person or persons named by them, delivery to be made in such quantities and at such times and places as may be specified by them or on their behalf."

2. The following regulations shall be inserted after Regulation 7B:—

"7C.—(1) Where the Treasury are of opinion that for the purpose of strengthening the financial position of the country, it is expedient that this regulation should be applied to any foreign securities, or to the securities of any concern owning or controlling any foreign securities, or any property or undertaking outside the United Kingdom or otherwise carrying on business wholly or mainly outside the United Kingdom, the Treasury may by order apply this regulation, subject to any exceptions and conditions for which provision may be made by the order, to any such securities specified in the order, whether the securities are actually in the United Kingdom or not:

"Provided that no such order shall apply to any securities as to which the Treasury are satisfied that on the twenty-fourth day of January nineteen hundred and seventeen they were beneficially owned by a person not ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom and that they remain so owned.

"(2) The Treasury may take possession or require delivery of any securities to which this regulation is for the time being applicable on such terms as may be provided by the order under which the regulation is made applicable to the securities, and deal with them in such manner as they think fit, and the owner of any such securities, and any person who has any interest in or is the registrar of any such securities shall take all steps and do anything which is necessary or is directed by the Treasury for the purpose of, or in connection with, the transfer or delivery of those securities to the Treasury.

"A certificate signed by a Secretary to the Treasury that any securities particulars of which are given in the certificate have been taken possession of by the Treasury shall be taken as conclusive evidence of the facts stated in the certificate by the registrar of any securities.

"(3) Provision may be made by an order under this regulation for any case in which securities transferred or delivered to the Treasury are subject to any mortgage or other charge by substituting for the mortgage or charge on the securities a mortgage or charge on any payment made or other consideration given in respect of the transfer or delivery of the securities.

"(4) Any order of the Treasury under this regulation may be revoked or varied as occasion requires.

"7D.—(1) A person shall not without the consent of the Treasury remove from the United Kingdom or be directly or indirectly concerned in removing from the United Kingdom any securities to which the Treasury have power to apply or have applied Regulation 7C, or dispose of any such securi-

ties to any person except to a person ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom.

"(2) The Treasury may, by notice published in the London, Edinburgh, and Dublin Gazettes, require the owners of any securities to which the Treasury have power to apply Regulation 7C, or have applied that regulation, to make a return to the Treasury, giving such particulars as to those securities within such period as may be specified in the notice, and owners of those securities shall make a return accordingly.

"7E.—(1) In Regulations 7C and 7D the expression "securities" includes stocks, shares, and other securities, and the expression "foreign securities" includes any securities where the principal or interest of the securities is payable in any foreign country, or where the funds necessary for the payment of the principal or interest of the securities are provided from any foreign country, and the expression "registrar" includes as respects any securities any person having the charge of, or concerned with, the registration of registered securities, and any person having the charge of, or concerned with, the books in which any inscribed securities are inscribed.

"(2) Any of the provisions of Regulations 7C and 7D applying to foreign securities shall also apply to securities where the principal or interest of the securities is payable in any British possession, or where the funds necessary for the payment of the principal or interest of the securities are provided from any such possession.

"The provisions of Regulations 7C and 7D applying to the owner of any securities shall apply to any person who has power to dispose of or sell any such securities or has the custody of, or receives on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person the dividends or income from, any such securities, or has any interest in any such securities, as they apply to the actual owner of the securities.

"(3) If any person acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any provisions of Regulation 7C or 7D, that person shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations, and the administration of those regulations is for the purpose of subsection (11) of Regulation 56 hereby assigned to the Treasury."

3. The following regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 9B:—

"9BB. Where there is reason to apprehend that the holding of any meeting for the purpose of hare or rabbit coursing, whippet racing, or other similar recreation will impede or delay the production, repair, or transport of war material or of any work necessary for the successful prosecution of the war, it shall be lawful for the Minister of Munitions to make an order either prohibiting the holding of the meeting, or permitting the holding thereof subject to such conditions as may be specified in the order, and if the meeting is attempted to be held in contravention of any such prohibition or conditions, it shall be lawful to take such steps as may be necessary to prevent the holding thereof.

"If any person takes part in the control, management, or organisation of any meeting

which is prohibited under this regulation, or allows any dog to run at any such meeting or brings any dog to a place where such a meeting is proposed to be held for the purpose of taking part in the meeting, or fails to comply with any such conditions as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

4. The following regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 16:—

"16A. The Local Government Board may, during the continuance of the war, authorise any local authority or person to purchase and distribute any drug, medicine or medicinal preparation specially designed for the treatment of venereal diseases, and a local authority or person so authorised, and any person obtaining a supply of any such drug, medicine or preparation from or through them or him, shall not be liable to any action or proceedings in respect of the importation, purchase, sale, distribution, or use thereof on the ground that any patent or other similar rights are infringed thereby.

"In the application of this regulation to Scotland and Ireland, the Local Government Board for Scotland and Ireland, respectively, shall be substituted for the Local Government Board."

5. The first paragraph of Regulation 28 shall be omitted therefrom; and after Regulation 28, the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"28A.—(1) No person shall trespass on any railway, or loiter on, under, or near any tunnel, bridge, viaduct, or culvert.

"(2) The competent naval or military authority may by order prohibit all or any persons, or persons of any class or description, unless they have obtained his permission or the permission of a person duly authorised by him, from entering, or from being in or on—

(a) any land or premises specified in the order belonging to or occupied by His Majesty or any Government Department;

(b) any foreshore, land between tide-marks, quay, wharf, dock, or dock premises specified in the order, or any ship or vessel lying in, on, or alongside any such foreshore, land, quay, wharf, dock, or dock premises;

(c) any road or waste or unenclosed land adjacent to any such land or premises as aforesaid.

"An order under this regulation may prohibit the acts to which the order relates either at all times and for all purposes, or during certain times or for certain purposes only.

"(3) If any person acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any provision of this regulation or of any order made thereunder, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations."

6. The following regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 55:—

"55A.—(1) Where a Secretary of State, after consultation with the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, is satisfied, as respects any area which is not wholly situated within the boundaries of one police area, that it is expedient for naval or military reasons or for reasons connected with the supply of munitions that the con-

trol of police in the area should be unified, he may by order—

(a) constitute the area a special police area and define the limits thereof;

(b) assign to the special police area such number of constables belonging to the police forces of the police areas (or any of them) in which any part of the special police area is contained, or acting in those areas, in such proportion as may be agreed between the departments and authorities concerned or, in default of or pending agreement, as may be directed by the Secretary of State;

(c) provide that constables assigned to the special police area shall, for the purpose of control and discipline, act under the direction of a single authority, being either the chief officer of police of an existing police force or such other person or authority as may be specified in the order; and

(d) make such additional and supplemental provisions as appear to him necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to the order;

and a Secretary of State may also give from time to time such directions as appear to him expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to the order.

"(2) All constables assigned to any special police area or any part of such area shall, without prejudice to any of their other powers, have all the powers, duties and privileges of constables throughout such area and also throughout any police area any part of which is included in such special police area.

"(3) The powers conferred by this regulation on a Secretary of State shall, as respects any area situated wholly in Scotland, be exercised by the Secretary for Scotland; and shall as respects any area situated partly in England and partly in Scotland, be exercised jointly by a Secretary of State and the Secretary for Scotland."

7. The following regulations shall be substituted for Regulation 63:—

"63. These regulations may be cited as the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

"The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

"64. Where by any Order in Council for the time being in force, any regulations or words are directed to be added to or omitted from these regulations, or to be substituted for any other regulations or words in these regulations, then copies of these regulations printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office after such direction takes effect may be printed with the regulations or words added or omitted or substituted for other regulations or words as such direction requires, and with the regulations and paragraphs thereof numbered in accordance with such direction; and these regulations shall be construed as if they had, at the time at which such direction takes effect, been made with such addition, omission, or substitution.

"65. A reference in any Order in Council or other document to the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, or

to the Defence of the Realm Regulations, or to any of them, shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed to refer to these regulations as amended by any Order in Council for the time being in force.

“ 66. The fact that any regulation or provision of a regulation is, or has been, revoked or superseded by any subsequent regulation shall not affect, and shall be deemed not to have affected, the previous operation of any regulation or provision so revoked or superseded, or the validity of any action taken under any such regulation or provision, or any penalty or punishment incurred in respect of any contravention or failure to comply with any such regulation or provision, or any proceeding or remedy in respect of any such penalty or punishment.”

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of *January*, 1917, in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“ And whereas we have had under consideration the Regulations governing the payment of Physical Training Allowances to Men of the Royal Marines qualified as Physical Training Instructors :

“ And whereas we consider that the conditions under which these allowances are payable should be assimilated to those in force for Petty Officers and Seamen of Your Majesty's Navy who are similarly qualified :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the continuous payment of the authorized allowances to Men of the Royal Marines qualified as Physical Training Instructors, First Class or Second Class.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IN pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows :—

1. The Northern and Salford Divisions (as defined by the Order in Council of the 4th day of *May*, 1864) of the County of Lancaster shall, for the purpose of the Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of “ The Spring Assize County, No. 2.”

2. The Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be held at Manchester.

3. The Court at the Spring Assizes at Manchester shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County or neighbouring area who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a Court of *Oyer and Terminer* and Gaol Delivery would have had at the Assizes in the County where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, 1879, or the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provisions of Section 13 of the Sheriffs Act, 1887, shall apply to the execution of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned ; provided that the expression in the said Section “ The Sheriff of such County ” shall mean the Sheriff of the County in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, or the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, had not been passed.

4. The Sheriff of the County of Lancaster shall act for the purpose of the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County.

5. The precepts of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of Lancaster.

6. The Gaol Delivery precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring Assize County who under the provisions of this Order will have to be tried at Manchester, to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be brought accordingly without any writ of *Habeas Corpus*.

7. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs,

Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority, and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either Division comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper Officer thereof, any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority and be under the same obligation to attend at the Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper Officer thereof, such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document.

8. In all indictments and presentments at the Spring Assizes the venue laid in the margin thereof shall, in addition to the name of the County where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize County, No. 2."

9. Any person who, after the date of this Order, and before any Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court of *Oyer* and *Terminer* or General Gaol Delivery, to be holden for either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at such Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County.

10. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence committed in either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, or in relation to a prisoner committed for trial under the provisions of the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the next Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such last-mentioned Spring Assizes or forfeit his recognizance.

11. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Manchester, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, so far as the same list can then be made out, and of the prisoners (if any) to be transmitted under the provisions of the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the County of Lancaster, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement, and a notice that the persons bound by recognizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall appear and prosecute and give evidence at Manchester.

12. It shall be lawful for the Gaoler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County are appointed to be held, to send, without any writ of *Habeas Corpus*, such prisoners to His Majesty's Gaol at Strangeways, Manchester, in the County of Lancaster, for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper steps for their transmission

to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way, and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, subject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law.

13. The Clerk of Assize at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses, and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the County where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoners had been tried at the Assizes held in such last-mentioned County.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County, any Judge of the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the County or place from which he is committed, or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the County or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recognizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding £20 to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his witnesses as may have been bound by recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

14. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the County or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of *Oyer* and *Terminer* or Gaol Delivery in the County where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, or the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known Agent on his behalf, shall attend the Spring Assizes during the sitting of the Court to pay all such orders.

15. Where the Court at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial, but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the County or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly, without any writ of *Habeas Corpus*.

16. Except where the context otherwise requires, terms used in this Order shall have the

same meaning as that which the same terms have in the Spring Assizes Act, 1879.

17. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring Assizes, 1917, and thereafter during the continuance of the Spring Assizes in each succeeding year until further Order.

IN pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows:—

1. The North and East Riding Division and the West Riding Division (as defined by the Order in Council of the 10th day of June, 1864) of the County of York, and the County of the City of York, shall, for the purpose of the Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of "The Spring Assize County, No. 3."

2. The Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be held at Leeds.

3. The Court at the Spring Assizes at Leeds shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County or neighbouring area who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a Court of *Oyer and Terminer* and *Gaol Delivery* would have had at the Assizes in the County where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, 1879, or the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provisions of Section 13 of the Sheriffs Act, 1887, shall apply to the execution of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned; provided that the expression in the said Section "The Sheriff of such County" shall mean the Sheriff of the County in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, or the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, had not been passed.

4. The Sheriff of the County of York shall alone act for the purpose of the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, shall have jurisdiction for that purpose over the whole district constituting the said Spring Assize County, and precepts and other documents relating to the Spring Assizes shall be addressed to him alone.

5. The Precepts of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of York, and the Jurors so summoned shall be deemed to be good and lawful men of the body of the several Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County, and the Grand and Petty Jury formed out of those Jurors shall be deemed to be a Grand and Petty Jury respectively of the body of the said Counties respectively, and shall have jurisdiction accordingly.

6. The *Gaol Delivery* Precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring Assize County who under the provisions of this

Order will have to be tried at Leeds, to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be brought accordingly without any writ of *Habeas Corpus*.

7. In all matters not before specially mentioned the precepts to the said Sheriff shall direct him to issue, and he shall issue, the like notices, precepts, warrants, and documents, and perform the same acts, *mutatis mutandis*, as if he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, and all Under Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Constables, and Officers in the said Spring Assize County shall obey accordingly.

8. The said Sheriff shall, as to all matters in relation to such Spring Assizes for which no specific provision is made by this Order, have the same power, jurisdiction, and responsibility as if he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, except that this provision shall not authorise the said Sheriff to carry sentences into execution outside the County of York, or to levy outside the said County fines imposed or recognizances estreated at the Spring Assizes.

9. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs, Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority, and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either of the counties comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper Officer thereof, any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority, and be under the same obligation to attend at the Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper Officer thereof, such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document. This provision shall not apply to the Sheriff of the County of the City of York.

10. In all indictments and presentments at the Spring Assizes, the venue laid in the margin thereof shall in addition to the name of the County where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize County, No. 3."

11. Any person who, after the date of this Order and before any Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court of *Oyer and Terminer* or *General Gaol Delivery*, to be holden for any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at such Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County:

12. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence committed in any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, or in relation to a prisoner committed for trial under the provisions of the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the next Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such last-mentioned Spring Assizes, or forfeit his recognizance.

13. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Leeds, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, so far as the same list can then be

made out, and of the prisoners (if any) to be transmitted under the provisions of the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the County of York, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement, and a notice that the persons bound by recognizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall appear and prosecute and give evidence at Leeds.

14. It shall be lawful for the Gaoler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County are appointed to be held, to send, without any writ of *Habeas Corpus*, such prisoners to His Majesty's Gaol at Leeds; for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper steps for their transmission to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way, and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, subject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law.

15. The Clerk of Assize at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses, and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the County where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoners had been tried at the Assizes held in such last-mentioned County.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County, any Judge of the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the County or place from which he is committed or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the County or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recognizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding £20 to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his witnesses as may have been bound by recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

16. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses,

the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the County or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of *Oyer and Terminer* or Gaol Delivery in the County where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, or the Assizes and Quarter Sessions Act, 1908, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known Agent on his behalf, shall attend the Spring Assizes during the sitting of the Court to pay all such orders.

17. Where the Court at the Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial, but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the County or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly, without any writ of *Habeas Corpus*.

18. Except where the context otherwise requires, terms used in this Order shall have the same meaning as that which the same terms have in the Spring Assizes Act, 1879.

19. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring Assizes, 1917, and thereafter during the continuance of the Spring Assizes in each succeeding year until further Order.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Meanwood is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in Sir Hickman Beckett Bacon, of

Thonock, near Gainsborough, in the County of Lincoln, Baronet:

"And whereas the said Sir Hickman Beckett Bacon is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Meanwood, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Thomas Wortley, now Bishop of Ripon, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Thomas Wortley, Bishop of Ripon, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Thomas Wortley, Bishop of Ripon, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Sir Hickman Beckett Bacon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Thomas Wortley, Bishop of Ripon, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Meanwood, now vested in him the said Sir Hickman Beckett Bacon as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Thomas Wortley, Bishop of Ripon, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Thomas Wortley, Bishop of Ripon, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

ENGLISH CHANNEL, NORTH SEA SOUTHERN PORTION, WITH RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY AND APPROACHES.

Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 7 of 1917; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

I. ENGLISH CHANNEL AND NORTH SEA SOUTHERN PORTION—PILOTAGE REGULATIONS.

1. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or

to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

3. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

4. All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Great Yarmouth and *vice versa*, and between those places and the Sunk light-vessel, or any intermediate pilot station that may hereafter be established, and *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

5. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

6. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamers attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal Pier.

(b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise between the position of the wreck of the Corton Light-Vessel (Lat. 52° 31½' N., long. 1° 50' E.) and the South Scroby Buoy.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships trading with Netherlands Ports, but *no others*, can obtain Pilots for the River Thames and the Downs.

The Sunk Pilot Steamer will be on her station and available for shipping and landing Pilots between the following hours, viz.:—

From the date hereof until the 31st January, 1917, between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. only.

From the 1st February until the 14th February, 1917, between 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. only.

From the 15th February until the 28th February, 1917, between 7.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. only.

From the 1st March until the 14th March, 1917, between 7.30 a.m. and 7 p.m. only.

From the 15th March until further notice, between 7.30 a.m. and 7.30 p.m. only.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

II. RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY, &c.—TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-Buoys, and through the Ooze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels between a line drawn from London Stone to No. 3 Sea Reach Light-Buoy and thence to Canvey Point on the west, and the Sunk Head Buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles Buoys, on the east, from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise.

No merchant or other private vessel is to be at anchor in the Black Deep, and the Main Channel of the Thames, to the Southward of a line joining a position in lat. $51^{\circ} 38' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 21' E.$, D3 Buoy, a position in lat. $51^{\circ} 33' 08'' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 13' 03'' E.$, Knob Light Buoy, North Knob Light-Buoy, South Shoebury Light-Buoy, a position in lat. $51^{\circ} 29' 15'' N.$, long. $0^{\circ} 49' 45'' E.$, and Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Sea Reach Buoys, from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise, and no vessel is to anchor in the Black Deep Channel between the parallel of lat. $51^{\circ} 40' N.$, and the Sunk Light-Vessel from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise except such South-bound vessels as are unable to proceed further south owing to darkness or thick weather. Anchorage for merchant or private vessels is also prohibited in the West Swin.

All other Channels are closed to navigation.

The Nore Examination Anchorage is reserved for vessels under examination before entry into the Medway, and also for vessels on Government service which have left the Medway and are awaiting orders as to route, &c.

2. Coasting vessels are not to be under way nor exhibit any lights in the East Swin or Wallet between sunset and sunrise.

2.—(a) Cruising of yachts and pleasure craft is prohibited in the following areas:—

(b) The rivers Colne, Blackwater, and adjoining creeks so far as the tide flows.

(c) That portion of the Estuary of the Thames East of a line drawn between the Grain Spit and West Shoebury buoys.

(d) The area in the River Thames enclosed by a line drawn in a 0° (*N. 14° E. Mag.*) and a 180° (*S. 14° W. Mag.*) direction through the Ovens Buoy to a line joining Holehaven Point and the Blyth Middle buoy.

(e) The River Medway East of Rochester Bridge.

Note.—For the purposes of this Order the

Estuary of the Thames is to be considered to include the north coast of Kent from North Foreland to Sheerness, and the coast of Essex from Shoeburyness to the Naze.

3. (a) The cruising of yachts and other pleasure craft under sail, steam, or otherwise mechanically driven, and under oars, in those portions of the Estuary of the Thames and the rivers Thames and Medway outside the areas specified in Section 3, and also in the rivers Crouch and Roach, will be permitted under the following restrictions.

(b) Cruising is permitted in the Crouch west of a line drawn in a 0° (*N. 14° E. Mag.*) and a 180° (*S. 14° W. Mag.*) direction through Nass Point. Cruising is also permitted in the Roach as far as Paglesham Hard, but owners of yachts are to intimate their intention to proceed up the Roach to the Coast Guard, Burnham, before leaving, and report their return.

(i.) No yachts may anchor in the Crouch between Burnham Coast Guard Station and Nass point.

(ii.) Landing in the Roach may be permitted only at Paglesham Hard and permits are to be exhibited to the Military Patrol stationed there.

(c) Local craft used for business purposes are subject to the foregoing restrictions, but may in certain instances be allowed in prohibited areas, if permission in writing has been previously obtained from the Naval or Military Authorities.

(d) Owners of boats anchored within sight of Burnham Coastguard Station may go on board their boats up to 10.0 p.m., provided that a permit to do this has been obtained from the Senior Naval Officer, Brightlingsea, and provided also that the boat remains at anchor.

(e) Pleasure craft using the areas mentioned in paragraph (b) of this Sub-Section or the waters to the west of the line mentioned in Sub-Section 3, paragraph (c), must obtain a licence from the local Police.

(f) If more than one craft is used, a separate licence is required for each.

(g) The name must be marked legibly on every craft. All open, half-decked and other craft must have the number and distinguishing letter of the licence clearly painted on each side of the bow.

(h) The licence must be carried in the craft, and is to be available for inspection.

(i) Boats licensed for hire may be taken out by British subjects other than those in whose names the licences are made out, provided that they be returned to the licensees by sunset on the day of hire. The licence for the boat must be carried by the person hiring it.

(j) All pleasure craft of any description are prohibited from being under weigh between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

5. (a) Pulling boats are allowed within the prohibited area in Sub-Section 3, par. (c), provided they obtain a licence in accordance with Sub-Section 4, pars. (e) (f) and also comply with Sub-Section 4, pars. (h). (i), (j), and that no such boats proceed more than one mile from the shore. In the area between Margate Coast Guard Station and the North Foreland they must keep within half a mile from the shore.

(b) Pulling boats are forbidden to go alongside or communicate with any vessel lying off the shore.

(c) No pleasure pulling boats are allowed in the Medway to the Eastward of Rochester

Bridge, nor are any allowed in the area specified in Sub-Section 3, par. (d).

6. The use of the Swin and Wallet Channels by sailing barges and small trading vessels engaged in coastwise traffic along the Essex coast is permitted, subject to compliance with the following restrictions:—

(a) Each vessel must obtain from the Customs a special clearance card, which is to be kept available for inspection by the Patrol Officers, on demand.

(b) A red ensign is to be displayed while navigating the Middle Deep and Swin Channel.

(c) No vessel may be under way after dark; except as provided for hereinafter.

(d) When at anchor in the Wallet, Ray Sand, and Whitaker Channels, or in the Rivers Calne, Blackwater, and Crouch, all lights are to be screened so that they will not show outboard.

(e) No vessel may anchor in the River Crouch in the area indicated in Section II., Sub-section 4, paragraph b (i.); or in the River Blackwater in the areas bounded by a line drawn in a 0° (*N. 14° E. Mag.*) and a 180° (*S. 14° W. Mag.*) direction, through Ramsey Stone to the opposite shore, and a line drawn through the Tollesbury and Mersea Oyster Fishery Company's Beacon on Thurslet Spit and the same Company's Beacon on Thurslet Spit and the same Company's Beacon on the south side of the river, and extended to the north and south shores of the River.

(f) To enable vessels to save their tides they will be permitted to navigate the Rivers Colne, Blackwater, and Crouch at night above the following places:—

River Roach above Quay Reach.

River Crouch above Burnham Coast Guard Station.

River Blackwater above Ramsey Island Stone.

River Colne above Brightlingsea Creek.

They are to anchor immediately, should they be ordered to do so by the Naval or Military Authorities.

(g) Vessels are to carry out all instructions received from the Naval Officers in command of vessels patrolling these Channels and Rivers.

(h) No vessels are to enter or pass through the defended area in the Middle Deep and Swin Channels until they have been boarded and examined by the vessels stationed there for that purpose.

(Note.—*The Examination Officers will board South-bound vessels in the vicinity of the Whitaker Spit. Those leaving the Thames and Medway will be boarded near the Mouse Light-Vessel.*)

The Boarding Officers will give Masters of vessels instructions as to the course they are to steer when passing through the defended area.

(i) Vessels reaching the entrance to the defended area within one hour of sunset will not be allowed to pass through till daylight.

7. All vessels, other than those of British Nationality or those of the Allied Nations, are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers.

All Neutral Aliens are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers in British

vessels, and this applies to Aliens carried in British ships or barges as passengers or part of crew; the limits of the prohibited area are defined as from the Outer Bar buoy in the River Medway to Rochester bridge, and the whole of the River Swale from the light on Queenborough spit to Columbine spit buoy. Attention is drawn to the necessity of shipowners and charterers satisfying themselves that no Neutral Aliens are on board vessels sent to the Rivers Medway and Swale.

Variation.— 14° W.

III. HARWICH APPROACHES— TRAFFIC REGULATION.

With a view to safeguarding the interests of shipping in the vicinity of Harwich, no vessel, either British, Allied, or Neutral, is to be within the area west of a line joining the following positions:—

(a) Lat. $52^{\circ} 08'$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 41'$ E.

(b) Lat. $52^{\circ} 02'$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 42'$ E.

(c) Sunk Light-Vessel.

(d) Sunk Head Buoy.

Except in the case of a vessel trading with Netherlands ports which may enter the area to the Westward of the Sunk Light-Vessel, in order to communicate with the Sunk Pilot-Vessel, to embark or disembark her pilot, should the Pilot Vessel be on her Pilot Station within the area at the time.

Any vessel contravening the foregoing regulation will run the gravest risk of being sunk.
