PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be

more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such Consent as aforesaid, by his

Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect:—

And whereas the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 17th day of August, 1916, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“We, The Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

“That within the county of Hereford, and Our Diocese of Hereford, is situate the Vicarage and Parish Church of Bishops Froome, which Parish extends to and comprises a District called Froome’s Hill:

“That in the year 1866 a Church was built at Froome’s Hill aforesaid upon a site duly conveyed under the authority of The Church Building Acts, and such Church together with the surrounding Churchyard was duly consecrated on the 20th day of March, 1866, and dedicated to St. Matthew, but no District has been assigned thereto:

“That the said Church of St. Matthew is distant from the Parish Church of Bishops Froome about 2 miles:

“That in the said County, and Our Diocese of Hereford, there is also situate the Rectory and Parish Church of Evesbatch, which is distant about 1 mile from the said Church of St. Matthew, Froome’s Hill, and the population of the said Parish of Evesbatch is only 55:

“That the population of the Parish of Bishops Froome is 720, and the number thereof residing at or near Froome’s Hill is about 200:

“That the net yearly income of the Vicarage of Bishops Froome is £482 4s. 8d., and the net yearly income of the Rectory of Evesbatch is £154:

“That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Bishops Froome is now vested in Sybil Maude Hopton, wife of Colonel John Dutton Hopton, of Canon Frome Court, in the said County of Hereford, and the Patronage of the said Rectory of Evesbatch is now vested in us The Bishop of Hereford:

“That the Reverend William Cope Hopton is the Vicar of the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Bishops Froome, and The Reverend Pendarves George Kekewich is the Rector of the said Rectory and Parish Church of Evesbatch:

“That it appears to us that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the Session holden in the 1st and 2nd years of the Reign of Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, the District surrounding the said Church of St. Matthew, Froome’s Hill, may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage of Bishops Froome, and be united to the said Rectory and Parish of Evesbatch, to which it is contiguous, for ecclesiastical purposes, which District is delineated, and the boundaries thereof shown by the colour *pink*, on the *Map* or *Plan* annexed hereto:

“That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the hereinbefore-mentioned Act we have drawn up a Scheme in writing, appended to this Representation, describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration above proposed may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on

such alteration in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, and we do submit the same to Your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said Vicarage of Bishops Froome, and of the said Rectory of Evesbatch, to the intent that Your Grace may, if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with such Scheme, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid by your Report to His Majesty in Council.

“J., HEREFORD.”

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

#### “THE SCHEME.

“1. That the District coloured *pink* on the *Map* or *Plan* hereunto annexed, at present belonging to and forming part of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Bishops Froome, in the County and Diocese of Hereford, shall be separated from the said Vicarage and Parish, and be united to, and be deemed part of, the Rectory and Parish of Evesbatch, in the said County and Diocese, for ecclesiastical purposes.

“2. That the said District shall be subject to the same Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction as the said Rectory and Parish of Evesbatch, and the Rector of the said Rectory and Parish of Evesbatch shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the said District.

“3. That all Fees and other Ecclesiastical Dues and Payments for Marriages, Churchings, Burials, and other Ecclesiastical Offices, solemnized and performed in respect of Persons residing within the said District shall henceforth belong to the Rector of the said Rectory of Evesbatch.

“4. That the Parishioners of and residing within the said District shall not hereafter be entitled to accommodation in the said Parish Church of Bishops Froome, but shall be entitled in common with the Inhabitants of the said Parish of Evesbatch to accommodation in the Parish Church of Evesbatch, and the Church of St. Matthew, Froome’s Hill, and shall be exempted from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Bishops Froome, but shall be liable (subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868) to the repair of the said Parish Church of Evesbatch, and the Church of St. Matthew, Froome’s Hill.”

#### “CONSENTS.

“I, Sybil Maude Hopton, Wife of Colonel John Dutton Hopton, of Canon Frome Court, in the County of Hereford, the Patron or the person entitled to present to the Vicarage of Bishops Froome, in the County and Diocese of Hereford, in case the same were now vacant, and I, the Reverend William Cope Hopton, Clerk, Vicar of the said Vicarage, do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our Consent to the Scheme above proposed for separating a District adjacent to St. Matthew’s Church, Froome’s Hill, from the Parish of Bishops Froome, and annexing the same to the Parish of Evesbatch, in the same County and Diocese, for ecclesiastical purposes.

" I, John, Bishop of Hereford, the Patron or the person entitled to collate to the Rectory of Evesbatch, in the County and Diocese of Hereford, in case the same were now vacant, and I, the Reverend Pendarves George Keke-wich, Clerk, Rector of the said Rectory, do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our Consent to the Scheme above proposed for separating a District adjacent to St. Matthew's Church, Froome's Hill, from the Parish of Bishops Froome, and annexing the same to the Parish of Evesbatch aforesaid, for ecclesiastical purposes.

And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report dated the 28th day of August, 1916, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—

" We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby represent to Your Majesty in Council:—

" That The Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, has represented unto us (amongst other things):—

" That there is in the County and his Diocese of Hereford, the Vicarage and Parish Church of Bishop's Froome, which Parish comprises a District called Froome's Hill:

" That in the year 1866 a Church was built at Froome's Hill aforesaid, which was duly consecrated and dedicated to St. Matthew, but to which no District has been assigned:

" That in the same County and Diocese there is also the Rectory and Parish Church of Evesbatch, which is distant about 1 mile from the said Church of St. Matthew:

" That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, the said District of Froome's Hill (more particularly delineated on the *Map* or *Plan* annexed to the Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, and thereon coloured *pink*) may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage of Bishop's Froome and be united to the said Rectory and Parish of Evesbatch to which it is contiguous:

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme, together with the Consents thereto in writing of Sybil Maude Hopton, Wife of Colonel John Dutton Hopton, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Vicarage of Bishop's Froome, The Reverend William Cope Hopton, Vicar of the said Vicarage, the said Lord Bishop of Hereford, the Patron or person by virtue of his Bishopric entitled to collate to the Rectory of Evesbatch, and the Reverend Pendarves George Keke-wich, the Rector of the said Rectory, has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration:

" The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, and the Consents above referred to, are hereunto annexed:

" And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Scheme be carried into effect.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby require that all persons engaged in the manufacture of Leather from any Hides, ox, cow or bull, whether produced in or imported into the United Kingdom,

shall comply with the following Regulation, that is to say:—

No person shall split, or cause to be split any hides of the description aforesaid, in such a manner that the substance of the grain in the crust state may be less than 2 m/m.

#### GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

##### THE PUBLIC HEALTH (SMALL-POX PREVENTION) REGULATIONS, 1917.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the CITY OF LONDON, in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs, Municipal

Boroughs, and other Urban Districts in ENGLAND and WALES;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts in ENGLAND and WALES;—

To the Council of the ISLES OF SCILLY;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas We, the Local Government Board, are empowered by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, from time to time, to make, alter, and revoke Regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with any epidemic, endemic or infectious disease and for preventing the spread of the disease; and to provide for the enforcement and execution of the Regulations;

And whereas Small-pox is an epidemic and infectious disease:

Now therefore, We, by this Our Order and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations that is to say:—

#### Definitions.

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—

(a) The expression "Local Authority" means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, the Council of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, the Council of a Rural District, or the Council of the Isles of Scilly.

(b) The expression "Medical Officer of Health" includes any Assistant Medical Officer of Health.

ARTICLE II.—The Medical Officer of Health of any Local Authority may, on the occurrence of any case of small-pox and where the circumstances, in his opinion, so require and permit, perform vaccination or re-vaccination on any person who has come in contact with the infection and is willing to be vaccinated, and without charge to the said person.

ARTICLE III.—The Medical Officer of Health shall keep a record of every vaccination or re-vaccination performed by him, with the results as ascertained by inspection, which shall contain the following particulars:—

The date of the vaccination or re-vaccination, the names, age, and address of each person vaccinated, the result of the vaccination or re-vaccination, and the source of the lymph used together with the Official Reference Number if it is obtained from the National Vaccine Establishment.

ARTICLE IV.—Any expenses incurred by a Local Authority in the execution of these Regulations shall be deemed to be incurred in the execution of the Public Health Act, 1875, or the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, as the case may be, and may be defrayed accordingly.

ARTICLE V.—A person shall not wilfully obstruct a Medical Officer of Health in the exercise of any power or the discharge of any duty under these Regulations, and a refusal to comply with a reasonable requisition of a Medical Officer of Health shall, for the pur-



poses of these Regulations, be deemed to be a wilful obstruction of the Medical Officer of Health.

ARTICLE VI.—This Order may be cited as “The Public Health (Small-pox Prevention) Regulations, 1917.”
