TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.
SHIRT-MAKING TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the above Act for the Shirt-Making Trade, as

defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 26th December, 1913, have given notice that they have varied certain minimum rates of wages fixed by them on 5th July, 1915, the variations being as follows:—

- (a) For female workers other than Homeworkers from 3½d. an hr. to 4d. an hr.
- (b) For female Homeworkers from 3½d. an hr. to 4d. an hr.

(c) For Female Learners.
