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At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 16th day of February, 1917.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914,") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the follow-

ing amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. In subsection (1) of Regulation 2L paragraphs (a) and (b) shall be omitted.

In subsection (4) of the same regulation, the words "by any deterioration of the land caused" shall be omitted.

Subsections (6), (7) and (8), of the same regulation shall be omitted, and after subsection (5) the following subsections shall be inserted:—

"(6) A local authority authorised to exercise on behalf of the Board any of the powers of the Board under this regulation may exercise such powers in respect of land of which the local authority is owner or occupier and may retain the rents and profits arising from such exercise of those powers, but shall not be entitled to receive from the Board any rent or compensation for the use thereof or for the exercise by the local authority of any powers under this regulation in respect of that land.

"(7) This regulation shall apply to Scotland with the substitution of the Board of Agriculture for Scotland for the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, of arbiter for arbitrator, and of the Agricultural Holdings

(Scotland) Act, 1908, for the Agricultural Holdings Act, 1908.

“(8) This regulation shall apply to Ireland subject to the following modifications:—

“(i) The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland shall be substituted for the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“(ii) The following subsection shall be substituted for subsection (1):—

“Where the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland are of opinion that, with a view to maintaining the food supply of the country, it is expedient that they should exercise the powers given to them under this regulation as respects any land, the Department may enter on the land—

“(a) without any consent, if the land is for the time being unoccupied, or was unoccupied on the twenty-ninth day of November nineteen hundred and sixteen;

“(b) without any consent, if the land is comprised in a holding to which Regulation 2P applies, and it appears to the Department that the occupier has not before the twenty-fifth day of March nineteen hundred and seventeen, taken the necessary steps to comply with the requirements of that regulation, or is not after that date proceeding in compliance with those requirements; and

“(c) without any consent, if the land is situated in or near an urban district and the Department are of opinion that in order to provide necessary food for residents in the locality, land in or near that district is immediately required for the purpose of being cultivated in allotments, and that the use of the land for that purpose is unreasonably withheld; and

“(d) in any other case, with the consent of the occupier and the person in receipt of the rent of the land: and cultivate the land, or arrange for its cultivation, by any person either under a contract of tenancy or otherwise.

“For the purposes of this subsection the expressions ‘occupied’ and ‘unoccupied’ refer to such occupation as involves liability to payment of poor rates:

“Provided that where the poor rate is made in respect of a half rent under section sixty-three of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1838, instead of upon the occupier of the land, the land shall not on that account be deemed to be unoccupied.

“(iii) Subsections (4) and (6) shall not apply;

“(iv) The powers conferred by this regulation on the Department shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other powers of the Department.”

2. In paragraph (b) of Regulation 8B for the words “Board of Trade Labour Exchange” there shall be substituted the words “Labour Exchange established or assisted under the Labour Exchanges Act, 1909.”

3. After Regulation 9G the following regulation shall be inserted:—

“9H.—(1) Where the Board of Trade are of opinion that, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm, it is expedient that this regulation should be

applied to any canals, the Board may by order apply this regulation, subject to any exceptions for which provision may be made in the order, either generally to all canals or to canals in any special area or to any special canals.

“(2) Any canals to which this regulation is so applied shall, by virtue of the order, pass into the possession of the Board of Trade as from the date of the order, or from any later date mentioned in the order; and the owner of every such canal and every person concerned in the management or working thereof, and where the owner of the canal is a company, every director of the company, shall comply with the directions of the Board of Trade as to the management and user of the canal, and if he fails to do so he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

“(3) Any order of the Board of Trade under this regulation may be revoked or varied as occasion requires.

“(4) In this regulation the expression ‘canal’ includes all buildings, barges, machinery, and plant used in connection with the working of the canal.”

4. After Regulation 14F the following regulation shall be inserted:—

“14G. Without prejudice to any other provisions of these regulations or any Order in Council made under the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, no person, other than a member of His Majesty's Forces in uniform or a person specially authorised by the Admiralty or Army Council or a Secretary of State, or a British subject proceeding as a passenger from one part of the United Kingdom to another, shall embark at any port in the United Kingdom without the permission of an aliens officer:

“Provided that in granting or refusing permission an aliens officer shall act in accordance with the general or special instructions of the Secretary of State and any refusal of permission may be revoked by a Secretary of State.

“If any person acts in contravention of this regulation he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.”

5. In Regulation 24c for the words “any neutral country or countries in Europe” there shall be substituted the words “any country or countries specified in the order or notice.”

6. The following regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 39c:—

“39cc. A person shall not without permission in writing from the Shipping Controller, directly or indirectly, and whether on his own behalf or on behalf of or in conjunction with any other person, purchase or enter into or offer to enter into any agreement or any negotiations with a view to an agreement for the purchase of any ship or vessel.

“If any person acts in contravention of this regulation, or if where any permission of the Shipping Controller has been granted under this regulation subject to any conditions, the person to whom it was granted fails to comply with any such condition, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.”

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of February, 1917, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 12th August, 1915, was pleased to sanction special Regulations for the award of Pensions to Seamen and Marines discharged from further Service on account of injury received or disease contracted directly on account of Service during the present War:

"And whereas we are of opinion that these Regulations require extension in certain respects in definition, or within the spirit, of the privileges granted under Your Majesty's said Order in Council:

"And whereas the grant of Pensions to men discharged during the present War is shortly to be transferred to Your Majesty's Ministry of Pensions:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction the following additional Regulations, to apply to grants which may have been made, or may be made until the issue of other Regulations by Your Majesty's Ministry of Pensions:—

"The Pensions provided under Order in Council of 12th August, 1915, shall be granted to any Seaman or Marine discharged from further Service on account of disability arising from disease where the disability is attributable to the Service, being due to extraordinary exertion or exposure on Service, though the disease from which it arose is not attributable to the Service provided that the 'Disability arising from disease' shall not include cases where the disability is due to the ordinary history of the disease, and not to special aggravation due to War Service.

"Allowances may be granted for children over the age of 16 on the recommendation of the Local Education Authority in the case of apprentices receiving not more than nominal wages, or of children being educated at Secondary Schools, Technical Schools, or Universities, provided that such conditions have obtained continuously from a period prior to the age of 16 whether any allowance has been previously granted or not.

"Additions shall be made to the Pensions awarded under Order in Council of 12th August, 1915, at the rates specified therein, in respect of each child born within six months of discharge.

"Allowances for children who are incapaci-

tated from earning their own living owing to physical or mental infirmity may be continued above the age of 16 up to the age of 21, and grants may be made in any such case where the child was already over 16 but under 21 at the time of the father's disability provided that the infirmity has existed since the age of 16. The grants are, however, to be discontinued in the event of the child being provided for in a Public or Charitable Institution free of cost.

"Men who have completed the necessary period of Service for Long Service Pension shall receive the addition granted in this respect in the award of Long Service Pensions for 'Very Good' character in excess of the Disability Pension on either the old or new scales.

"Men who have lost a limb shall be granted permanent Pensions of not less than the amounts shown in the following scale:—

"Men who have lost the use of a limb shall be granted Pensions of not less than 10s. 6d. a week, *i.e.*, the minimum rate allowable for loss of limb.

"Men who have been granted permanent Pensions in respect of the loss of a limb or eye, or the loss of the use of a limb, who re-enter for further Service in His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces shall receive payment of such Pension during the period of such further Service, but shall not receive payment of any additions thereto in respect of Good Conduct Badges, Medal, 'V.G.' character, or Service as Chief Petty Officer, Petty Officer, or Leading Rates of the Royal Navy, or Non-commissioned Officer of the Royal Marines, or any pension and allowances in respect of children.

"The provisions in this Order shall apply to all grants made until the powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to Disability Pensions and grants to Seamen and Marines are transferred to, and exercised by, His Majesty's Minister of Pensions.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 25th day of January, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint Peter, Belmont, in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas by virtue of an indenture, made the 6th day of September, 1916, between the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Bolton, in the County of Lancaster, (hereinafter called 'the said Corporation of Bolton'), of the one part, and the Reverend Thomas Alfred Chapman, Clerk, Bachelor of Divinity, Vicar of the Parish and Parish Church of Saint Peter, Bolton, of the other part, after reciting that the said Corporation of Bolton were seised, in fee simple, of the Advowson of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Belmont, it was witnessed that in consideration of the sum of £100 paid to them by the said Thomas Alfred Chapman, the receipt of which sum was thereby acknowledged, the said Corporation of Bolton, as beneficial owners, did thereby convey to the said Thomas Alfred Chapman the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Belmont, to hold the same unto and to the use of the said Thomas Alfred Chapman, Vicar of Bolton; and his Successors, Vicars of Bolton, in fee simple:

"And whereas the said conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation in the said Thomas Alfred Chapman, Vicar of Bolton, in right of his Vicarage, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out that intention may be done, and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that a Scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purpose, and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said Corporation of Bolton, and the said Thomas Alfred Chapman, are consenting to this Scheme, and in token of such Consents have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, is consenting to the transfer hereinafter recommended and proposed, and in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Edmund Arbuthnott; Bishop of Manchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Belmont, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Peter, Belmont:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Corporation of Bolton (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and of the said Thomas Alfred Chapman (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Belmont, shall be transferred to the said Thomas Alfred Chapman, Vicar of Bolton, and his Successors in the same Vicarage, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Thomas Alfred Chapman, Vicar of Bolton, and his Successors in the same Vicarage for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of his said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 25th day of January, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, situate within the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Luton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Cures:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and of the said New Parish of Luton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the Consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and with the consent of the Reverend Edmund Godfrey Burr, Doctor in Divinity, Clerk in Holy Orders, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the Parish of Chatham, in the said County and Diocese, and as such Rector or Incumbent the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Luton, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting Parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and of the said New Parish of Luton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* hereunto annexed, should be

united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Gillingham.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, upon the south-west partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Chatham, and partly by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Luton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Luton from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, at the junction of the road called Chatham Hill with Canterbury Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Canterbury Street for a distance of 29½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Byron Road, and extending thence, first south-westward, then westward, and then north-westward, along the middle of Byron Road for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Windmill Road, upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Luton which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of Gillingham, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-east by the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Windmill Road with Chatham Hill, where the boundaries of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, the said Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Chatham, and the said New Parish of Luton all meet, and extending thence southward in a straight line across Chatham Hill for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to the north-western corner of the premises attached to the house known as Number 122, Chatham Hill, and extending thence, first south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of such premises, and then generally south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the south-western or southern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Chatham Hill, for a distance in all of 30 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence meets the fence forming the south-western boundary of the Close numbered 255 upon the Ordnance Map of the Civil Parish of Chatham, published in the year 1909, upon the scale of

25 inches to a mile, and also upon the *Map or Plan* which is annexed to this Representation, and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the western side of Ashtree Road, and extending thence, first south-eastward to the middle of Ashtree Road, and then generally southward along the middle of Ashtree Road, for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to a point near its junction with the road leading from Upper Luton to Hale, and opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Speeks Bottom, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of  $1\frac{1}{4}$  chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Luton from the said Parish of Gillingham."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

**W**HEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the

Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

- (c) Albumen;
- (A) Barometers;
- (B) Bladders;
- (c) Carbon, gas;
- (B) Casein and preparations thereof;
- (B) Casings;

#### DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (FURTHER AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE WESTERN BORDER AREA.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order shall apply to so much of the Western Border Area as comprises the Counties of Kirkcudbright and Dumfries, including all Burghs within the geographical limits thereof, the Parishes of Castleton and Teviothead in the County of Roxburgh, the City of Carlisle, the Petty Sessional Divisions of Longtown, Cumberland Ward and Brampton, so much of the Parishes of Hesketh in the Forest and



Hutton in the Forest as lie to the North of the road leading from Aikbank to Hutton End, and the Parishes of Ainstable, Middlesceugh and Braithwaite, Castle Sowerby, Sebergham, Westward, Thursby, Aikton, Kirkbampton, Woodside, Wigton, and Oulton, in the County of Cumberland.

2. After paragraph (d) of Article 3 of the Order of the Board now in force in the area and made on the eleventh day of November, 1915, the following paragraph shall be added:

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 2 (1) of this Order, on Saturdays no person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any spirits to be consumed on the premises or consume or permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any spirits.

And the said Article shall be read as if the foregoing paragraph were inserted therein.

3. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating or exciseable liquor to be consumed on the premises in the above-mentioned part of the area shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order.

4. This Order shall come into force on the twenty-third day of February, 1917.

(a) All aluminium held by them in stock or otherwise under their control on the last day of the preceding month.

(b) All aluminium purchased or sold by them for future delivery and not yet delivered on such last day, together with the names of the sellers to or purchasers from them.

(c) All aluminium delivered to them during the preceding month.

(d) All aluminium scrap or swarf produced by them and/or issued from their works during the preceding month.

(e) All contracts or orders existing on the last day of or entered into during the preceding month requiring for their execution the use of aluminium specifying the purposes thereof.

Notwithstanding the above no Return is required from any person whose total stock of aluminium in hand and on order for future delivery to him has not at any time during the preceding month exceeded 56 lbs.

For the purpose of this Order the expression Aluminium shall mean:—

Aluminium and Alloys of Aluminium, unwrought and partly wrought, including ingots, notched bars, slabs, billets, bars, rods, tubes, wire, strand, cable, plates, sheets, circles, strip;

Aluminium Scrap and Swarf, aluminium alloy scrap and swarf, remelted aluminium scrap and remelted aluminium alloy scrap and swarf;

Granulated Aluminium, Aluminium Powder, "bronze," "Flake," and "fitter";

or any of the above.

Note.—(1) Any person failing to comply with the above Order or making a false declaration will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations and be liable to penalties of fine and imprisonment.

(2) Attention is drawn to the fact that under the Order made by the Minister of Munitions on the 2nd December, 1916, whereby Regulation 30 (A) of the Defence of the Realm Regulations was applied to Aluminium as above defined all dealing or negotiations for dealing in aluminium without a permit as specified in that Regulation is illegal and an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

ALIEN PILOTS.

ADMIRALTY ORDER DATED 15TH FEBRUARY, 1917.

The Admiralty, under the powers given to them by the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby make the following Order:—

(1). This Order shall relate to the ports of

and the territorial waters adjacent to the United Kingdom from and including Great Yarmouth northward up to and including St. Abbs Head.

(2). As from the 1st March, 1917, no Alien, except the Master or Mate of the ship, shall pilot any ship which is entering or leaving any port or which is being navigated within any part of the said territorial waters within the limits above mentioned.

(3). For the purposes of this Order any Alien, other than the Master or Mate as aforesaid, who is on the bridge of a ship or in any other position (whether on board the ship or elsewhere) from which the ship is navigated, shall be deemed to be piloting the ship, unless the contrary is proved.

(4). If any Alien pilots a ship in breach of this Order he shall be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and shall be liable to be dealt with accordingly, and the Master of any ship who employs an Alien to act as pilot in breach of this Order shall be guilty of a like offence.
