At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 23rd day of February, 1917.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914,") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm :

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:—

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations :----

1. In Regulation 2B, after the first paragraph, the following paragraph shall be inserted :---

"Where any goods, possession of which has been so taken, are acquired by the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, the price to be paid in respect thereof shall in default of agreement be determined by the tribunal by which claims for compensation under these regulations are, in the absence of any express provision to the contrary, determined.

"In determining such price regard need not be had to the market price but shall be had—

(a) if the goods are acquired from the grower or producer thereof, to the cost of production and to the rate of profit usually earned by him in respect of similar goods before the war and to whether such rate of profit was unreasonable or excessive, and to any other circumstances of the case;

(b) if the goods are acquired from any person other than the grower or producer thereof, to the price paid by such person for the goods and to whether such price was unreasonable or excessive, and to the rate of

profit usually earned in respect of the sale of similar goods before the war, and to whether such rate or profit was unreasonable or excessive, and to any other circumstances of the case; so, however, that if the person from whom the goods are acquired himself acquired the goods otherwise than in the usual course of his business, no allowance, or an allowance at a reduced rate, on account of profit shall be made:

"Provided that where by virtue of these regulations or any order made thereunder the sale of the goods at a price above any price fixed thereunder is prohibited the price assessed under this regulation shall not exceed the price so fixed."

2. At the end of Regulation 2c the following subsection shall be inserted :-

(5) If in any case the Food Controller is of opinion that it is necessary or expedient to obtain information from any person in con-. nection with any article as to all or any of the matters specified in subsection (1) of this regulation, the Food Controller shall have power, without making an order applying this regulation to the article, to require that person to furnish him with that information; and any person who is so required to furnish information shall furnish it accordingly.

"In such a case, all the foregoing provisions of this regulation (other than that relating to the application thereof by order) shall apply to information so given and the giving of such information as they apply to returns made and the making of returns.

3. After Regulation 2q the following regulation shall be inserted-

"2R. (1) The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries may, with a view to preventing or reducing injury to crops by game birds,

(a) take, or authorise any body to whom the Board may delegate their powers as respects any locality to take, such action as in the opinion of the Board or of the body to which the powers are so delegated may be necessary for such purpose; "(b) provide for the manner in which

game birds killed in pursuance of the action so taken may be disposed of;

(c) by order, authorise the killing and taking, the sale and purchase, and the pos-session, of any game birds at any time when the killing and taking, the sale and purchase, or the possession thereof would otherwise be unlawful.

"(2) A person authorised or directed to kill or dispose of game birds under this regulation shall not be required to obtain for such purpose a licence to kill game, and shall have the same power of selling game killed by him or by the persons authorised by him as if he had a licence to kill game:

"Provided that nothing in this regulation shall exempt any person from the provisions of the Gun Licence Act, 1870.

"(3) This regulation shall apply to Scotland and Ireland with the substitution for the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries of the Board of Agriculture for Scotland and the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland respectively."

4. At the end of paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of Regulation 7B the following words shall be added:---" and for enabling wagons which are not promptly unloaded by

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the consignee to be unloaded, and their contents to be dealt with, at the risk and expense of the consignee in manner provided by the order."

5. In Regulation 18, after the first paragraph the following paragraph shall be inserted :

"For the purposes of the foregoing provisions of this regulation the expression 'ships of His Majesty or of any of His Majesty's allies' includes ships engaged in the service of His Majesty or of any of His Majesty's allies '

and the last paragraph of the same regulation shall be omitted.

6. After Regulation 43 the following regulation shall be inserted-

"43A. No person shall obstruct or otherwise interfere with or impede any member of the military police in the execution of his duties, and if any person does so he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

7. In Regulation 63, after the words "interpretation of these regulations," there shall be inserted the words " and of orders and rules made thereunder," and after the words "Act of Parliament" there shall be inserted the words "and as if these regulations were an Act of Parliament."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Act of the 35th and 36th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 14, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 25th day of January, in the year 1917, in the

and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Act of the 35th and 36th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 14, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Matthias, Stocksbridge, situate within the Parish of Bolster-stone, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Bolsterstone, and of the Parish of Penistone, in the said County of York, and in the Diocese of Wakefield, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written,

there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parishes :

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Bolsterstone, and of the said Parish of Penistone, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Matthias, Stocksbridge, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Penistone, and with the consent of Reginald Henry Rimington Rimington-Wilson, of Broomhead Hall, Bolsterstone, Esquire, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Bolsterstone, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would. in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Bolsterstone, and of the said Parish of Penistone, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Matthias, Stocksbridge, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ' The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias, Stocksbridge,' and that such Consolidated Chapelry should become and be and form part of the said Diocese of Sheffield, and should be included within and form part of the Rural Deanery of Ecclesfield, and of the Archdeaconry of Shef-

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field, within such last-named Diocese. "We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

## "THE SCHEDULE

to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias, Stocksbridge, comprising :----

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Bolsterstone, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Sheffield, and of the Parish of. Penistone, in the said County of York, and in the Diocese of Wakefield, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Penistone from the said Parish of Bolsterstone, at the centre of Unsliven Bridge which carries Underbank Lane across The Porter or Little Don River, and extending thence southward along the middle of Underbank Lane for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Smithy Moor Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Smithy Moor Lane for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cross Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Cross Lane for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to its junc-

tion with Green Lane, and extending thence, first south-westward, and then southward, along the middle of Green Lane for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Hall Lane, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of New Hall Lane for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to Greave House, and extending thence, first north-eastward, and then eastward, along the middle of the roadway and footpath leading past Greave House to the house called Clough View for a distance of 311 chains or thereabouts to the junction of the said footpath with the road leading from Hole House past Clough View into Whitwell Lane, and extending thence, first southward, and then eastward, along the middle of the last described road for a distance of 44 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whitwell Lane, and extending thence, first north-eastward, and then in various directions, along the middle of Whitwell Lane for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Pot House Lane, and extending thence, first south-eastward, then southward, and then eastward, along the middle of Pot House Lane for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spink Hall Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Spink Hall Lane for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Coal Pit Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Coal Pit Lane for a distance of  $12\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Broomfield Lane, and extending thence, first north-eastward, and then south-eastward, along the middle of Broomfield Lane for a distance of  $21\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point at its eastern end and opposite to the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the Close numbered 1 upon the Map or Plan annexed to this Representation, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said fence and along the fences forming the southeastern boundaries of the Closes numbered 2 and 3 upon the said Map or Plan (thereby following in part the northern side of the footpath leading into Clough Lane) for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned fence meets the southern side of the roadway leading from Stubbin House into Clough Lane, and extending thence, first northward to, and then eastward along, the middle of such roadway for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clough Lane, and extending thence, first northward, and then north-westward, along the middle of Clough Lane and of the road called Quarry Hill for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Quarry Hill with Haywood Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Haywood Lane for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Ash Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Ash Lane for a distance of chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manchester Road, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of Manchester Road for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Hen Holmes and Wharncliffe Villa, and extending thence, first north-westward, then north-eastward, and then again north-westward, along the middle of the last-mentioned road (thereby crossing at the centre of the bridge over the Porter or Little Don River the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bolsterstone from the said

Parish of Penistone) for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction north of Hen Holmes with the footpath leading into Park Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 231 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Park Lane and almost opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the Close numbered 4 upon the Map or Plan annexed to this Representation, and extending thence, first northward to the said fence, and then first north-eastward, and then north-westward, along such fence and along the fence forming the and north-eastern eastern boundary of the Close numbered 5 upon the said Map or Plan for a distance of  $10\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the south-western corner of the Close in which the house called Windy Bank Hall stands, and extending thence northeastward to and along the roadway leading from Windy Bank Hall into Hill Top Lane for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the junction of such roadway with Hill Top Lane, and extending thence, first westward, and then north-westward, along the middle of Hill Top Lane for a distance of  $27\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Don Hill Height, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Don Hill Height for a distance of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction near Don Hill House with the footpath leading into Hunshelf Hall Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hunshelf Hall Lane, and extending thence, first north-west-ward, then westward, and then again northwestward, along the middle of Hunshelf Hall Lane for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Tofts Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Tofts Lane for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Underbank Lane, and extending thence, first south-westward. and then in various directions, along the middle of Underbank Lane for a distance of 72 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Unsliven Bridge which carries such lane across the Porter or Little Don River, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Penistone from the said Parish of Bolsterstone, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore. His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Diocese of Sheffield and of the said Diocese of Wakefield respectively.

## ORDER.

#### DRAWN STEEL RODS AND BARS, STEEL WIRE AND STEEL WIRE ROPE.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Act, 1914, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) No. 2 Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Munitions of War Acts, 1915 and 1916, and all other powers thereunto enabling him, hereby orders that all persons engaged in the manufacture, sale or purchase of, or other dealings in drawn steel rods or bars, steel wire or steel wire rope, shall comply with the following regulations:—

1. No order for drawn steel rods or bars, steel wire or steel wire rope shall be accepted for manufacture, and no such material shall be manufactured unless the purpose for which it is required has been approved. Such approval must be evidenced by one or other of the following, which must be quoted in writing by the ordering firm to the manufacturer, together with a written statement of the specific purpose for which the material is to be used :--

(a) Admiralty contract reference and number or Admiralty Priority Section permit reference and number.

(b) War Office contract reference and number.

(c) Marine Department, Board of Trade permit reference and number for Merchant Shipping. (d) Ministry of Munitions contract reference and number.

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(e) Post Office contract reference and number.

(f) Commission Internationale de Ravitaillement or Commission Française sanction reference and number, with Ministry of Munitions Priority Classification.

Munitions Priority Classification. (g) Ministry of Munitions permit reference and number and Priority Classification.

Provided that no permit reference need be quoted in respect of orders for ships' ropes weighing less than 5 cwt. each, and for lift and crane ropes weighing less than 2 cwt. each containing wire of over 25 gauge.

2. Full and accurate returns shall be made in such form and at such times as may be required by the Director of Navy Contracts, the Director of Army Contracts or the Director of Steel Production, Ministry of Munitions, as to any particulars of or relating to the said manufacture, sale, purchase or other dealings.

3. Save and except where special instructions are issued by the Priority Branch of the Ministry of Munitions orders must be executed in the following order of priority:—

Priority 1. Priority 2. Priority 3. Priority 4 (or Class A). Priority 5. Class B. Priority 6.

All orders in Clause 1 (c) to (e) inclusive shall rank automatically as Class A or Priority 4 (War Work). If a higher grade of priority is required, written application must be made to the Priority Branch of the Ministry of Munitions, and the grounds of special urgency must be clearly and fully set forth therein.

4. Maintenance.—Manufacturers or other persons to whom there has been allocated a Ministry of Munitions permit reference number and priority classification for steel for general repairs and maintenance of existing plant and machinery will be entitled to quote such permit reference number and priority classification under Clause 1 (g) above.

5. Stock.—Manufacturers may apply in writing to the Director of Navy Contracts, the Director of Army Contracts or the Priority Branch of the Ministry of Munitions for the approval necessary to enable them to obtain such monthly supplies of drawn steel rods or bars, steel wire or steel wire rope as shall be required for the production of the minimum quantities of materials or articles necessary to enable such manufacturers to maintain such stocks as are essential for the purpose of executing orders for approved purposes. Such application must contain an undertaking that all materials obtained under any special permit that may be granted and all materials and articles manufactured from such materials shall be used and delivered only for approved purposes, evidenced as set forth in Clause 1 hereof.

6. Applications for Approval.—All applications for approval of orders under Clause 1 (g) herein must be made to the Ministry of Munitions Priority Branch, 1, Caxton-street, S.W., and full particulars must be given under the following headings:—

(a) A precise description of the goods or work for which the materials the subject of the order to be approved are required and proof that no other materials can be substituted.

(b) The exact quantities and gauges of the materials required. If required for different orders or purposes the quantities required for each order or purpose respectively.

(c) An estimate of the amount of the materials required to complete each order.

(d) The name of the firm or firms with whom the order or orders will be placed.

(e) The respective war, national or other purpose, and proof of urgency and importance.

7. Interpretation.—For the purpose of this Order the term "manufacture" shall include the drawing of rods, bars or wire and the spinning or working of wire ropes, whether from material made in this country or imported.

#### ORDER.

#### BRASS SWARF AND SCRAP.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Act, 1914, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) No. 2 Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Munitions of War Acts, 1915 and 1916, and all other powers thereunto enabling him, gives notice and orders as follows:—

1. He hereby takes possession as from the 28th day of February, 1917, until further notice of :---

(a) All yellow brass and cartridge metal swarf, turnings and borings (hereinafter referred to as "brass swarf").

(b) All yellow brass scrap resulting from the manufacture in any stages of any class of war material (hereinafter referred to as "brass scrap").

2. If any person having control of any metal to which this notice applies, without the consent of the Minister of Munitions sells, removes or secretes it, or deals with it in any way contrary to any conditions imposed in any licence or permit that may have been granted in respect thereof, he will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

3. All existing licences or permits issued by or on behalf of the Minister of Munitions for dealing in any brass swarf or brass scrap are hereby cancelled.

4. All persons shall in the first fourteen days of March, 1917, and thereafter in the first seven days of each succeeding month, send in to the Director of Materials (A.M.2.S.), Hotel Victoria, Northumberland Avenue, London, S.W., Monthly Returns of :---

(a) All brass swarf or brass scrap held by them in stock or otherwise under their control on the last day of the preceding month.

(b) All brass swarf or brass scrap purchased or sold by them for future delivery and not yet delivered on such last day, together with the names of the sellers to or purchasers from them.

Notwithstanding the above, no return is required from any person whose total stock of brass swarf and brass scrap in hand and on order for future delivery to him has not at any time during the preceding month exceeded 560 lbs. (5 cwt.).

5. The Minister of Munitions will subsequently communicate to the owners of brass swarf and brass scrap taken over by him the prices which he will be prepared to pay for the same.

Note.—(1) Notwithstanding the above Order, licences may be granted by the Minister of Munitions in approved cases for the use of brass swarf or brass scrap by producers thereof in their own works, and for the sale of any brass swarf or brass scrap which may be considered by the Minister unsuitable for his purposes.

(2) Any person acting in contravention of or failing to comply with the above Order, or making a false return, will be guilty of an offence under the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and be liable to penalties of fine and imprisonment.

(3) The above Order does not apply to old collected miscellaneous or domestic brass scrap not arising from the manufacture of munitions.

#### Application of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914.

1. Part 1 (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, and shall in its application to such Area be read and have effect as if paragraph (3) of Article 2 of that Order were omitted.
