At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 6th day of *February*, 1917.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advan-

tageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with

any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect:—

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 4th day of September, 1916, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“I, Edgar Charles Sumner, by Divine Permission Bishop of Gloucester, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

“1. There is in the City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my Diocese of Gloucester, the Vicarage of Barnwood, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1,462; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from tithe-rent-charge, glebe rents, income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £300 or thereabouts:

“2. There is also in the same City and County, and within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Saint Catharine, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3,704; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from tithe-rent-charge, glebe rents, income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £292 or thereabouts:

“3. There is also in the said City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Perpetual Curacy of Saint Mark, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3,306; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £296 or thereabouts:

“4. There is also in the same City and County, and within my said Diocese, the Perpetual Curacy of All Saints, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 6,690; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £308 or thereabouts:

“5. There is also in the City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Saint Mary de Lode with Holy Trinity (hereinafter called “Saint Mary de Lode” only), the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3,964; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from glebe rents, and income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £218 or thereabouts:

“6. There is also in the County of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Hartpury, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 691; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from tithe-rent-charge, and fees and other sources, is £200 or thereabouts:

“7. Certain portions of the said Parish of

Barnwood are isolated from it and are situate in the Wotton District, and adjoin the said Parish of Saint Catharine, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish they are nearer than they are to the Parish Church of Barnwood:

“8. Another small portion of the said Parish of Barnwood is isolated from it and situate in the Sandhurst Road District, and surrounded by the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Barnwood:

“9. A portion of the said Parish of Barnwood is situated in the Old T-Station District, and adjoins the said Parish of All Saints, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Barnwood:

“10. A portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is isolated from it and is situate in the Old T-Station District, and adjoins the said Parish of Barnwood, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of St. Mary de Lode:

“11. Two portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode are situate in the Heathville Road District and are entirely isolated from the said Parish, and adjoin the said Parish of Saint Mark, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish they are nearer than they are to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

“12. A portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is isolated from it and situate in the Woolridge District, and adjoins the said Parish of Hartpury, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

“13. Certain districts, four in number, situate in the said City of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, are extra-parochial, and adjoin the said Parish of Saint Catharine:

“14. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the following alterations in the contents of the above-mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made:—

(a) The separation of the Wotton District portions of the said Parish of Barnwood, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 7, from the said Parish of Barnwood, and their annexation to the said Parish of Saint Catharine to which they are contiguous.

(b) The separation of the Sandhurst Road District portion of the said Parish of Barnwood, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 8, from the said Parish of Barnwood, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode to which it is contiguous.

(c) The separation of a portion of the said Parish of Barnwood, situate in the Old T-station District, and referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 9, from the said Parish of Barnwood, and its annexation to the said Parish of All Saints to which it is contiguous.

(d) The separation of a portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, situate in the Old T-Station District, and referred to

in the preceding paragraph numbered 10, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and its annexation to the said Parish of Barnwood to which it is contiguous.

(e) The separation of the Heathville Road District portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 11, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and their annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mark to which they are contiguous.

(f) The separation of the Woolridge District portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 12, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and its annexation to the said Parish of Hartpury to which it is contiguous.

(g) The annexation of the four Extra-Parochial Districts, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 13, to the said Parish of Saint Catharine to which they are contiguous.

"15. The Benefice of Barnwood is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint Catharine is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of St. Mark is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of All Saints is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Hartpury is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

"16. The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Barnwood.

The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Catharine.

The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mark.

The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boinville is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of All Saints.

The Reverend William Christian Macklin is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode.

The Reverend Nathan Jones is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hartpury.

"17. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to this Representation, describing the several Districts so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parishes of Saint Catharine, Saint Mary de Lode, All Saints, Barnwood, Saint Mark, and Hartpury, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues and Payments, and in respect of Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with full justice to all Parties interested,* and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents, to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme, you may certify the same and

such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

"THE SCHEME.

"That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Barnwood, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Catharine. The said portions (seven in number) are delineated and described in *Plan A* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *yellow* and lettered *A*, and consist of the District known as the Wotton District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Barnwood, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Lode. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan B* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *yellow* and lettered *B*, and consists of the District known as the Sandhurst Road District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Barnwood, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of All Saints. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan C* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *green* and lettered *C*, and is part of the District known as the Old T-Station District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Barnwood. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan C* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *violet* and lettered *D*, and is part of the District known as the Old T-Station District.

"That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mark. The said portions (two in number) are delineated and described in *Plan D* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *blue* and lettered *E*, and consist of the District known as the Heathville Road District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Hartpury. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan E* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *pink* and lettered *G*, and consists of the District known as the Woolridge District.

"That four Extra-Parochial Districts shall be annexed to the contiguous Parish of Saint Catharine. The said Districts are delineated and described in *Plan A* hereunto annexed, and therein cross-hatched with *blue* and lettered *H*.

"That the respective Incumbents of the Parishes to which such several Districts shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said Districts.

"That the Parishioners of such several Districts shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes to which the said Districts shall be annexed, and shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes from which the said Districts shall be separated, excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise

to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, shall be solemnized and performed as follows:—

(a) For the Inhabitants of the Wotton District in the said Parish Church of Saint Catharine.

(b) For the Inhabitants of the Sandhurst Road District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode.

(c) For the Inhabitants of the part of Old T-Station District (lettered C) in the said Parish Church of All Saints.

(d) For the Inhabitants of the part of the Old T-Station District (lettered D) in the said Parish Church of Barnwood.

(e) For the Inhabitants of the Heathville Road District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mark.

(f) For the Inhabitants of the Woolridge District in the said Parish Church of Hartpury.

(g) For the Inhabitants of the four Extra-Parochial Districts (lettered H) in the said Parish Church of Saint Catharine.

"That all Fees, Dues, Ecclesiastical Offerings, and Emoluments (excepting Tithe-Rent-Charge) arising from each of the Districts shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which such District shall be annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices, or either of them.

" CONSENTS.

"The said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Barnwood, in the County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Catharine, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Mark, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of All Saints, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boynville, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend William Christian Macklin, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the

Benefice of Hartpury, in the County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Nathan Jones, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth, and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof the said Dean and Chapter have caused their Common Seal to be affixed hereto, and the other parties above mentioned have hereunto set their respective hands this 4th day of September, 1916.

(f) The separation from the Woolridge District of an isolated portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and its annexation to the said Parish of Hartpury to which it is contiguous.

(g) The annexation of four Extra-Parochial Districts situate in the City of Gloucester to the said Parish of Saint Catharine to which they are contiguous.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act of Parliament the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to his Representation, describing the several areas or districts so as aforesaid proposed to be respectively annexed to the said several Parishes, and the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all Parties interested, which Scheme has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration together with the following Consents thereto in writing, *videlicet*:—The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the said Benefice of Barnwood in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Saint Catharine in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Saint Mark in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, the said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of All Saints in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boinville, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the said Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend William Christian Macklin, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Hartpury in case the same were now vacant, and The Reverend Nathan Jones, being the Incumbent of the same Parish.

"And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same, and such Consents as aforesaid, to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

HOLLOW-WARE TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).PROPOSAL TO VARY CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES
OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE
WORKERS IN THE HOLLOW-WARE TRADE IN
GREAT BRITAIN.

In accordance with the Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act, by the Board of Trade, and dated the 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Hollow-ware Trade as defined by the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 6th July, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by section 4 of the above Act, that they propose to vary the following minimum time rates of wages for female and for male workers fixed by them on the 1st January, 1916, set out in their Notice of that date and made obligatory by the Board of Trade on the 3rd July, 1916, as follows:—

A. *Female Workers.*

1. For Female Learners of under 15 years of age, from 6s. to 6s. 6d. per week.
2. For Female Learners of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 7s. 6d. to 8s. 6d. per week.
3. For Female Learners of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 9s. to 10s. 6d. per week.
4. For Female Learners of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 11s. to 13s. per week.
5. For Female Learners entering the trade over the age of 16, during their first six months of employment, from 8s. to 9s. 4d. per week.
6. For Female Learners entering the trade over the age of 16, during their second six months of employment, from 9s. to 10s. 6d. per week.
7. For Female Workers other than Learners, from 13s. 6d. to 15s. 9d. per week.

B. *Male Workers.*

1. For Male Learners of under 15 years of age, from 6s. 9d. to 7s. 6d. per week.
2. For Male Learners of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 9s. to 10s. per week.
3. For Male Learners of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 11s. 3d. to 12s. 6d. per week.
4. For Male Learners of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 13s. 6d. to 15s. 6d. per week.
5. For Male Learners of 18 and under 19 years of age, from 15s. 9d. to 18s. 6d. per week.
6. For Male Learners of 19 and under 20 years of age, from 18s. to 21s. per week.
7. For Male Learners of 20 and under 21 years of age, from 21s. to 25s. per week.

Provided that no variation is proposed in the present provision that a male learner entering the trade between 17 and 21 years of age may serve a period of one year at minimum rates which during the first six months are 3s. and during the second six months 1s. 6d. less than the rate otherwise payable.

8. For Male Workers other than Learners, from 24s. 9d. to 29s. 3d. per week.

The above proposals are on the basis of a week of 54 hours, the rates being subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less or more than 54.

No variation is proposed in respect of the other provisions of the above-mentioned Notice

issued by the Trade Board, dated the 1st January, 1916.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within three months from 5th March, 1917. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Hollow-ware Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade, dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Tin Box and Canister Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 12th June, 1914, have given notice that they have varied certain minimum rates of wages for male and female workers as follows:—

A.—*Female Workers.*

1. For Female Workers under 15 years of age, no variation.
2. For Female Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 8s. to 9s. per week.
3. For Female Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 10s. to 11s. 6d. per week.
4. For Female Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 12s. to 13s. 6d. per week.
5. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months and cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, from 12s. to 13s. 6d. per week.
6. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and upwards (and others to whose employment the minimum rate of 14s. 1d. per week is applicable under the terms of paragraphs (a) and (b) of Section I of the above-mentioned Notice dated 29th November, 1915), from 14s. 1d. to 16s. 3d. per week.

B.—*Male Workers.*

1. For Male Workers under 15 years of age, no variation.
2. For Male Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 8s. to 9s. per week.
3. For Male Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 10s. to 11s. 6d. per week.
4. For Male Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 12s. to 13s. 6d. per week.
5. For Male Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, from 15s. to 16s. 3d. per week.
6. For Male Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, from 18s. 6d. to 19s. 6d. per week.
7. For Male Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, from 22s. 6d. to 23s. 6d. per week.
8. For Male Workers of 21 years of age and upwards who have been employed in the trade

for an aggregate period of less than 12 months and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, from 22s. 6d. to 23s. 6d. per week.

9. For Male Workers of 21 and under 22 years of age, from 26s. to 27s. 6d. per week.

10. For Male Workers of 22 years of age and upwards (and others to whose employment the minimum rate of 26s. per week is applicable under the terms of paragraph (a) of Section I of the above-mentioned Notice dated the 29th November, 1915), from 26s. to 30s. 4d. per week.

The notices setting out the variations which have been made are dated 1st March, 1917, from which date such variations take effect as provided by the Trade Boards Act.

ORDER AS TO PRIORITY.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers enabling him, hereby orders and requires that all persons engaged in any of the trades, businesses, or industries specified in the third schedule hereto shall in all respects comply with the following directions and regulations as to the priority to be given to work carried out in their factories and workshops and elsewhere in or in connection with such trades, businesses, or industries or any of them:—

(1) Priority shall be given to work in such trades, businesses and industries in accordance with the classification set out in the first schedule hereto.

(2) All work and orders for work of materials undertaken by them shall be divided into the three classes, Class A, Class B, and Class C, mentioned in the first schedule.

(3) Work and orders in Class A shall take precedence of work and orders in Class B or Class C, and work and orders in Class B shall take precedence of work and orders in Class C irrespective of the date when the orders were received and of any contractual obligations to the contrary.

(4) Subject to Paragraph 7 hereof orders for work shall be treated as belonging to Class A or Class B as the case may be if accompanied by a certificate from the person ordering the same in the form set out in the second schedule hereto, stating that the work belongs to Class A or Class B respectively.

(5) In the case of a person whose production either as regards the whole or a particular part thereof is regulated by specific directions or regulations from any department of the Government, such person shall not, in so far as relates to the production so regulated, act on a certificate presented to him by another person, but must apply for instructions to the department which regulates such production,

forwarding to that department the certificate presented. Any order for work which entails the use of materials which are for the time being subject to control by a Government Department, and in respect of which Regulations shall have been issued, must not be carried out until after compliance with the said Regulations.

(6) Any order for work not accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the second schedule hereto to the effect that the work falls within Class A or Class B shall be treated as an order for work in Class C.

(7) Any particular or special directions or regulations issued in writing by the Minister of Munitions, or by any Government Department regulating production as mentioned in paragraph 5 hereof, as to the classification of any work or orders belonging to the same class, shall override these general directions and regulations.

As from the date hereof this Order shall be substituted for Circular L.33 as to the control of output issued by the Minister of Munitions on the 31st March, 1916, and references to this Order and the corresponding classes herein mentioned shall be substituted in all orders, directions, notices and permits already made or issued by or on behalf of the Minister of Munitions for any references therein to the said Circular L.33 and the classes therein mentioned, but such substitutions shall not affect the previous operation of the said Circular L.33 or any of such orders, directions, regulations, notices or permits or the validity of any action taken under them or any of them or any penalty or punishment incurred in respect of any contravention or failure to comply with the same or any of them or any proceeding or remedy in respect of such penalty or punishment.

And any certificate already issued under the said Circular L.33 shall, so far as the same was properly issued thereunder, continue to have the same effect as if this Order had never been made.

CLASSIFICATION OF WORK.

Definition of Class A.

Class A comprises:—

Work or material wholly required as a component part of any work or goods to be carried out or supplied under—

(a) A Government War Contract, which signifies:—

1. Any Contract placed by the Admiralty, the War Office, or the Minister of Munitions.

2.* Any Contract for Naval or Military Equipment placed by an Allied Government by or with the consent, in writing, of the Admiralty, the War Office, or the Minister of Munitions.

(b) Certified War work, which signifies:—

1. Work on a Contract or Order which the Admiralty, the War Office, or the Minister of Munitions has certified, in writing, to be War or Munitions work.

2. Work which the Minister of Munitions has directed to be treated on an equality with War work.

(c) Merchant shipping work certified in writing by the Board of Trade to be Munitions work.

Definition of Class B.

Class B comprises:—

Work or material wholly required for:—

(a) Repairs to existing industrial machinery (but not the replacement of old machinery by new) wherever essential to maintain continuity of operation in the United Kingdom.

(b) The maintenance of reasonable stocks of materials or articles necessary as component parts of work or goods to be carried out or supplied under any orders or contracts to be executed under Class A or Class B.

(c) Export orders, certified in writing by the Board of Trade, the Admiralty, the War Office, or the Minister of Munitions to be of sufficient national importance to be specially approved for export to approved destinations, and as to which the Minister of Munitions or other Government Department controlling the necessary materials has certified that such materials can be spared.

(d) Contracts or orders certified in writing by the Admiralty, the War Office, or the Minister of Munitions as necessary for the efficient conduct of the War.

(e) Contracts or Orders certified in writing by the Director General of National Service to be of sufficient importance in the national interest to be placed in Class B, and as to which the Minister of Munitions or other Government Department controlling the necessary materials has certified that such materials can be spared.

Definition of Class C.

† Class C comprises all work not comprised in Classes A or B.

* The consent of these Departments will usually be given through the Commission Internationale de Ravitaillement (The International Commission), India House, Kingsway, London, to whom application should be made for such consent.

† No certificate may be issued for orders in Class C.

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE EAST MIDLANDS AREA (NORTH HUNTINGDON).

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations

is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

Limits of Area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is so much of the East Midlands Area as comprises the Petty Sessional Division of Norman Cross in the County of Huntingdon.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold.

A.—For Consumption ON the Premises.

2. (1) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption on the premises shall be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises; or

(b) Consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

B.—For Consumption OFF the Premises.

(2) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises shall (subject to the additional restrictions as regard spirits) be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club or (except as hereinafter expressly provided) dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed off the premises; or

(b) Take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

Additional Restrictions as to Spirits.

3. In addition to the above general restrictions as to hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied, the sale and supply of spirits in licensed premises and clubs shall be subject to the following special restrictions, that is to say:

(a) No orders for spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be given by or accepted from any person actually present in any

licensed premises or club except on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and during the hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

(b) Spirits to be consumed off the premises must not (except as hereinafter expressly provided) be dispatched from any licensed premises or club, nor must they be taken therefrom by the person to whom they are sold or supplied or by any person acting on his behalf, except on the days and during the hours aforesaid.

(c) Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied or taken from any licensed premises or club in any bottle or other vessel not bearing a label showing the name and situation of the premises or club, or in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.

(d) No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in or taken from any refreshment room in any railway station.

Conditions as to Distribution.

4. No person shall either by himself or any servant or agent—

(a) Sell, supply, distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor from any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle unless before the liquor is dispatched it has been ordered and the quantity, description and price thereof together with the name and address of the person to whom it is to be supplied has been entered in a delivery book or invoice, which shall be carried by the person delivering the liquor, and in a day book which shall be kept on the premises from which the liquor is dispatched.

(b) Carry or convey in any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle while in use for the distribution or delivery of intoxicating liquor, any such liquor not entered in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(c) Distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor at any address not specified in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(d) Refuse to allow any constable to examine such van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle or such delivery book or invoice.

(e) Solicit or canvass for orders for, or collect or receive payment for, intoxicating liquor except at the licensed premises.

(f) Send or cause to be sent or leave or cause to be left to or at any premises, or to or with any person, any order form for intoxicating liquor.

(g) Cause or permit any payment for intoxicating liquor to be made on his behalf by any person in the service or employment of the vendor of the liquor, or, being a person in such service or employment, make any such payment as the agent or on behalf of the purchaser of the liquor.

Hours of Opening for the Supply of Food and Non-intoxicants.

5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Order or of the Law relating to licensing or the sale of intoxicating liquor:—

(a) Licensed premises may be opened for the supply of food and non-intoxicating liquor at the hour of 5.30 in the morning on all days and be kept open for this purpose from that hour until the evening closing

hour prescribed by the general provisions of the Licensing Acts; and

(b) Refreshment houses may be kept open for this purpose at any time during which they may be kept open under the general provisions of the said Acts.

Saving Provisions.

6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be deemed to prohibit, in cases where the same is otherwise lawful;

(a) The consumption of intoxicating liquor by any person in any licensed premises or club where he is residing; or

(b) The consumption of intoxicating liquor at a meal by any person in any licensed premises or club at any time within half an hour after the conclusion of the afternoon and evening hours during which the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is permitted by this Order; Provided that the liquor was sold or supplied and served during such hours at the same time as the meal and for consumption at the meal; or

(c) The sale or supply of spirits to any person producing a certificate in writing dated and signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner that the spirits are immediately required for medicinal purposes and specifying the quantity of spirits required; Provided that the quantity sold or supplied shall not exceed the quantity specified in such certificate; or

(d) The dispatch from licensed premises for delivery at a place more than five miles distant of any spirits or other intoxicating liquor in the forenoon of any day on which the sale of the same for consumption off the premises is permitted by Article 2 (2) and Article 3 of this Order as the case may be.

Treating Prohibited.

7. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply any intoxicating liquor to any person in any licensed premises or in any club for consumption on the premises unless the same is ordered and paid for by the person so supplied; nor shall any person order or pay for or lend or advance money to pay for any intoxicating liquor wherewith any other person has been or is to be supplied for consumption on the premises; nor shall any person consume in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor which any other person has ordered or paid for or agreed to pay for or lent or advanced money to pay for;

Provided always that if such intoxicating liquor is supplied or served for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal the provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to be contravened if the person who pays for such meal also pays for such intoxicating liquor.

For the purposes of this regulation consumption on the premises includes consumption of intoxicating liquor in or on any highway open ground or railway station adjoining or near to the licensed premises or club in which the liquor was sold or supplied; and any person consuming intoxicating liquor in or on any such highway open ground or railway station shall be deemed to consume the liquor in such licensed premises or club as the case may be.

Credit Prohibited.

8. No person shall—

(1) (a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any licensed premises or club or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed either on or off the premises; or

(b) Consume any intoxicating liquor in or take it from such premises or club;

unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is supplied or dispatched or taken away.

Provided always that if the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal, this provision shall not be deemed to be contravened if the price of the liquor is paid together with the price of such meal and before the person partaking thereof quits the premises.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any intoxicating liquor unless it is paid for before it is so introduced.

Long Pull Prohibited.

9. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent in any licensed premises or club sell or supply to any person as the measure of intoxicating liquor for which he asks an amount exceeding that measure.

Dilution of Spirits.

A.—Compulsory.

10. (a) No person shall on or after the twenty-sixth day of March, 1917, either by himself or by any servant or agent—

(1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

Provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply in bottles of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the nineteenth day of March, 1917.

B.—Permissive.

(b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 30 and 50 is hereby permitted.

(c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by an admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

Sale of Light Beer.

11. The Order of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) made on the third day of July, 1916, with reference to the sale of light beer shall apply to the area and come into force on the nineteenth day of March, 1917.

12. *Explanatory Provisions.*

(a) Nothing in this Order authorizes any licensed premises to be kept open for the sale of intoxicating liquor except during the hours permitted under the general provisions of the Licensing Acts.

(b) The prohibition under this Order of the sale supply and consumption of intoxicat-

ing liquor except during certain hours is not subject to the exceptions provided for in the Licensing Acts with respect to *bonâ fide* travellers and the supply of intoxicating liquor at railway stations or any other provisions in those Acts enabling intoxicating liquor to be supplied during closing hours in special cases.

(c) The expression "licensed premises" includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under a licence.

(d) This Order does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade or to a registered club for the purposes of the club.

(e) This Order does not affect the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor to or in any canteen where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty.

Exhibition of Order.

13. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order and any other notice required by the Board to be so affixed.

Commencement of Order.

14. This Order shall come into force on the nineteenth day of March, 1917.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE EAST MIDLANDS AREA (NORTH HUNTINGDON) WITH REFERENCE TO MEDICATED WINES AND NEW EXCISE LICENCES.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order supplemental to the Order made on the eighth day of March, 1917, for the East Midlands Area (North Huntingdon).

Conditions as to the Sale of Medicated Wines.

1. On and after the twenty-sixth day of March, 1917, no person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises for consumption off the premises or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor in the form of or prepared as (a) medicated wine or (b) any mixture or preparation which contains any drug or medicament or is sold or advertised for sale as containing or purporting to contain medicinal properties except in a bottle or other vessel bearing a label correctly stating in clear and legible words or figures the amount of proof spirit contained in such medicated wine or mixture or

preparation. Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the sale of—

(a) Any medicine mixture or preparation appearing in the British Pharmacopœia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex; or

(b) Any medicine mixture or preparation which is made up for a customer on the signed prescription of a medical practitioner; or

(c) Medicated or methylated spirits or spirits made up in medicine and sold by medical practitioners or chemists or druggists.

2. (a) The expression "licensed premises" in the foregoing Article includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises is carried on under a licence.

(b) The foregoing Article does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade.

Restrictions on the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor under new Excise Licences.

3. No person shall, except with the written authority of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which such authority may be granted, either by himself or by any servant or agent, sell or supply in any premises any intoxicating liquor under an excise licence granted in respect of such premises on or after the nineteenth day of March, 1917, unless an excise licence authorising such sale was in force in respect of such premises on the eighteenth day of March, 1917.

Provided always that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to affect the sale of intoxicating liquor under—

(a) An excise licence granted on the authority of a Justices' licence; or

(b) An excise licence granted to any person holding a canteen under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty; or

(c) A manufacturer's licence.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE LUTON AREA.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

Limits of Area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is the Luton Area, being the area comprising the Boroughs of Luton and Dunstable and the Petty Sessional Division of Luton, in the County of Bedford.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold.

A.—For Consumption ON the Premises.

2. (1) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption on the premises shall be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises; or

(b) Consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

B.—For Consumption OFF the Premises.

(2) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises shall (subject to the additional restrictions as regard spirits) be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club or (except as hereinafter expressly provided) dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed off the premises; or

(b) Take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

Additional Restrictions as to Spirits.

3. In addition to the above general restrictions as to hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied, the sale and supply of spirits in licensed premises and clubs shall be subject to the following special restrictions, that is to say:

(d) No orders for spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be given by or accepted from any person actually present in any licensed premises or club except on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and during the hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

(b) Spirits to be consumed off the premises must not (except as hereinafter expressly provided) be dispatched from any licensed premises or club, nor must they be taken therefrom by the person to whom they are sold or supplied or by any person acting on his behalf, except on the days and during the hours aforesaid.

(c) Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied or taken from any licensed premises or club in any bottle or other vessel not bearing a label showing the name and situation of the premises or club, or in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.

(d) No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in or taken from any refreshment room in any railway station.

Conditions as to Distribution.

4. No person shall either by himself or any servant or agent—

(a) Sell, supply, distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor from any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle unless before the liquor is dispatched it has been ordered and the quantity, description and price thereof together with the name and address of the person to whom it is to be supplied has been entered in a delivery book or invoice, which shall be carried by the person delivering the liquor, and in a day book which shall be kept on the premises from which the liquor is dispatched.

(b) Carry or convey in any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle while in use for the distribution or delivery of intoxicating liquor, any such liquor not entered in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(c) Distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor at any address not specified in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(d) Refuse to allow any constable to examine such van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle or such delivery book or invoice.

(e) Solicit or canvass for orders for, or collect or receive payment for, intoxicating liquor except at the licensed premises.

(f) Send or cause to be sent, or leave or cause to be left to or at any premises, or to or with any person, any order form for intoxicating liquor.

(g) Cause or permit any payment for intoxicating liquor to be made on his behalf by any person in the service or employment of the vendor of the liquor, or, being a person in such service or employment, make any such payment as the agent or on behalf of the purchaser of the liquor.

Hours of Opening for the Supply of Food and Non-intoxicants.

5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Order or of the Law relating to licensing or the sale of intoxicating liquor:—

(a) Licensed premises may be opened for the supply of food and non-intoxicating liquor at the hour of 5.30 in the morning on all days and be kept open for this purpose from that hour until the evening closing hour prescribed by the general provisions of the Licensing Acts; and

(b) Refreshment houses may be kept open for this purpose at any time during which they may be kept open under the general provisions of the said Acts.

Saving Provisions.

6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be deemed to prohibit, in cases where the same is otherwise lawful;

(a) The consumption of intoxicating

liquor by any person in any licensed premises or club where he is residing; or

(b) The consumption of intoxicating liquor at a meal by any person in any licensed premises or club at any time within half an hour after the conclusion of the afternoon and evening hours during which the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is permitted by this Order; Provided that the liquor was sold or supplied and served during such hours at the same time as the meal and for consumption at the meal; or

(c) The sale or supply of spirits to any person producing a certificate in writing dated and signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner that the spirits are immediately required for medicinal purposes and specifying the quantity of spirits required; Provided that the quantity sold or supplied shall not exceed the quantity specified in such certificate; or

(d) The dispatch from licensed premises for delivery at a place more than five miles distant of any spirits or other intoxicating liquor in the forenoon of any day on which the sale of the same for consumption off the premises is permitted by Article 2 (2) and Article 3 of this Order as the case may be.

Treating Prohibited.

7. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply any intoxicating liquor to any person in any licensed premises or in any club for consumption on the premises unless the same is ordered and paid for by the person so supplied; nor shall any person order or pay for or lend or advance money to pay for any intoxicating liquor wherewith any other person has been or is to be supplied for consumption on the premises; nor shall any person consume in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor which any other person has ordered or paid for or agreed to pay for or lent or advanced money to pay for;

Provided always that if such intoxicating liquor is supplied or served for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal the provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to be contravened if the person who pays for such meal also pays for such intoxicating liquor.

For the purposes of this regulation consumption on the premises includes consumption of intoxicating liquor in or on any highway open ground or railway station adjoining or near to the licensed premises or club in which the liquor was sold or supplied; and any person consuming intoxicating liquor in or on any such highway open ground or railway station shall be deemed to consume the liquor in such licensed premises or club as the case may be.

Credit Prohibited.

8. No person shall—

(1) (a) Either, by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any licensed premises or club or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed either on or off the premises; or

(b) Consume any intoxicating liquor in or take it from such premises or club; unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is supplied or dispatched or taken away.

Provided always that if the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at

such meal, this provision shall not be deemed to be contravened if the price of the liquor is paid together with the price of such meal and before the person partaking thereof quits the premises.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any intoxicating liquor unless it is paid for before it is so introduced.

Long Pull Prohibited.

9. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent in any licensed premises or club sell or supply to any person as the measure of intoxicating liquor for which he asks an amount exceeding that measure.

Dilution of Spirits.

A.—Compulsory.

10. (a) No person shall on or after the twenty-sixth day of March, 1917, either by himself or by any servant or agent—

(1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

Provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply in bottles of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the nineteenth day of March, 1917.

B.—Permissive.

(b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 30 and 50 is hereby permitted.

(c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by an admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

Sale of Light Beer.

11. The Order of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) made on the third day of July, 1916, with reference to the sale of light beer shall apply to the area and come into force on the nineteenth day of March, 1917.

Explanatory Provisions.

(a) Nothing in this Order authorizes any licensed premises to be kept open for the sale of intoxicating liquor except during the hours permitted under the general provisions of the Licensing Acts.

(b) The prohibition under this Order of the sale supply and consumption of intoxicating liquor except during certain hours is not subject to the exceptions provided for in the Licensing Acts with respect to *bonâ fide* travellers and the supply of intoxicating liquor at railway stations or any other provisions in those Acts enabling intoxicating liquor to be supplied during closing hours in special cases.

(c) The expression "licensed premises" includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under a licence.

(d) This Order does not affect the sale or

dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade or to a registered club for the purposes of the club.

(e) This Order does not affect the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor to or in any canteen where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty.

Exhibition of Order.

13. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order and any other notice required by the Board to be so affixed.

Commencement of Order.

14. This Order shall come into force on the nineteenth day of March, 1917.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE LUTON AREA WITH REFERENCE TO MEDICATED WINES AND NEW EXCISE LICENCES.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order supplemental to the Order made on the eighth day of March, 1917, for the Luton Area.

Conditions as to the Sale of Medicated Wines.

1. On and after the twenty-sixth day of March, 1917, no person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises for consumption off the premises or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor in the form of or prepared as (a) medicated wine or (b) any mixture or preparation which contains any drug or medicament or is sold or advertised for sale as containing or purporting to contain medicinal properties except in a bottle or other vessel bearing a label correctly stating in clear and legible words or figures the amount of proof spirit contained in such medicated wine or mixture or preparation. Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the sale of—

(a) Any medicine mixture or preparation appearing in the British Pharmacopoeia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex; or

(b) Any medicine mixture or preparation which is made up for a customer on the signed prescription of a medical practitioner; or

(c) Medicated or methylated spirits or spirits made up in medicine and sold by medical practitioners or chemists or druggists.

2. (a) The expression "licensed premises"

in the foregoing Article includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises is carried on under a licence.

(b) The foregoing Article does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade.

Restrictions on the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor under new Excise Licences.

3. No person shall, except with the written authority of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which such authority may be granted, either by himself or by any servant or agent, sell or supply in any premises any intoxicating liquor under an excise licence granted in respect of such premises on or after the nineteenth day of March, 1917, unless an excise licence authorising such sale was in force in respect of such premises on the eighteenth day of March, 1917.

Provided always that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to affect the sale of intoxicating liquor under—

(a) An excise licence granted on the authority of a Justices' licence; or

(b) An excise licence granted to any person holding a canteen under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty; or

(c) A manufacturer's licence.
