His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of a Bar to the Distinguished Service Order to:—

Capt. (temp. Lt.-Col.) Alfred John Hamilton-Bowen, D.S.O., Mon. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He, with great personal gallantry, supervised the difficult task of consolidation throughout the whole night, and continually went round his working parties. He was mainly responsible for the excellent work carried out.

(The Distinguished Service Order was awarded in London Gazette dated 3rd July, 1915.)

Brevet Major (temp. Lt.-Col.) Archibald Herbert Leggett, D.S.O., R. of O., late Royal Scots Fus., R. Scots Fus.

For conspicuous gallantry, coolness and resource when in command of an infantry battalion. He showed exceptional powers

of leadership when attacked by the enemy, upon whom he inflicted a severe defeat. (The Distinguished Service Order was awarded in Gazette dated 27th September, 1901.)

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the appointments of the undermentioned Officers to be Companions of the Distinguished Service Order in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:—

2nd Lt. Alfred Burgess, R. Berk. R.

For conspicuous courage and ability whilst commanding a raiding platoon which entered the enemy's trenches, and returned with two officers and fifty other ranks as prisoners. The success of the raid was largely due to the ability with which he conducted preparatory training, and also to his personal courage and example. He was severely wounded.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE ORDER.

Lt. (temp. Capt.) Selden Herbert Long,

M.C., Durh. L.I. and R.F.C.

For great skill and daring in piloting his machine. He shot down an enemy machine, which fell in our lines, and the same day he forced another hostile machine to land in Later, he shot down the enemy's lines. another enemy machine, which fell in our lines.

Capt. Thomas Samuel Masterson, Gen'I List.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in carrying out work of destruction. He passed through the rearguard of the retreating army and destroyed the remaining untouched works of value. He set a splendid example of courage and initiative throughout the operations.

Maj. (temp. Lt.-Col.) Frank George Grier Morris, Bord. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty when commanding his battalion in the attack. He personally supervised the consolidation of the position, which he extended beyond the line specified in order to obtain better observation, and inspired his companies with his own determination and bravery.

2nd Lt. (temp. Lt.) George Mutch, Gord.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. He rallied his men and led them forward under heavy fire. Later, with a few men he rushed an enemy post from the flank and captured the garrison. He was a magnificent example to his men, and to him was largely due the success of the raid.

Capt. John Dymoke Scale, Ind. Army.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to He rode out beyond the rearguard until nearly surrounded by the enemy in order to convince the retreating troops that further delay was dangerous. Then, later, although the rearguard had retired, he stuck to his post until his work was completed.

2nd Lt. Walter Henry Webster, Lond. R. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. At great personal risk he picked up an unexploded enemy projectile, and threw it over the parapet, where it at once exploded. He undoubtedly saved many lives.

Temp. Capt. William Dale Wilkinson, M.C., York. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to On entering the captured position he sent back clear and concise information, superintended the consolidation and blocking of the flanks, and remained complete master of the situation. It was mainly owing to his gallant leadership that the enemy's trench was captured and two officers and 78 other ranks taken prisoners.

Maj. Herbert Duckworth Wilson, R.F.A. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to He maintained observation throughout the day under very heavy fire. wounded on three different occasions during the day, but remained at his observation post until the light failed and his work was

He has on many previous accomplished. occasions done fine work.

CANADIAN CONTINGENT.

Capt. (Actg. Maj.) Harold William Alexander Foster, M.C., Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty when in command of one of the assaulting companies. Although wounded during the advance, he continued to direct his men throughout the whole operation, displaying great coolness and resource. When attacked by a party of the enemy, he personally accounted for two of them, and took a third prisoner.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award a Bar to the Military Cross to the undermentioned Officers:

Temp. Lt. (temp. Capt.) William George Sellar Curphey, M.C., Gen. List and R.F.C. For conspicuous gallantry in action. He,

with a patrol of four machines attacked a hostile formation of ten machines. After a prolonged fight he drove one enemy machine down. Later, although wounded, he again led another attack on a hostile machine and succeeded in bringing it down. He has on many previous occasions done fine work.

(The Military Cross was awarded in London Gazette dated 14th November, 1916.)

2nd Lt. (temp. Capt.) Frank Goldsmith,

Hamp. R., and Mach. Gun Corps.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led his company forward to the front line under heavy fire in readiness to deliver a counter-attack. Later, he organised a patrol which he personally led into "No Man's Land" in pursuit of the enemy raiders.

(The Military Cross was awarded in London Gazette dated 14th November, 1916.)

Temp. Capt. Allen Coulter Hancock, M.C., R.A.M.C.

For conspicuous good work in advanced Dressing Stations, notably when he successfully conducted evacuation of wounded under heavy shell fire and adverse circumstances. Again, when the O.C. was wounded, Capt. Hancock took command, and by his initiative, personal courage and devotion to duty was responsible for the able carrying out of wounded through a barrage of shell fire for He was then severely gassed, but persisted in attempting duty until physically incapable.

(The Military Cross was awarded in London Gazette dated 11th December, 1916.)

Capt. George Ambrose Pinney, M.C., R.F.A.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, notably when he took command and fought his battery with great skill and ability. He displayed great energy and resource in finding observation posts, and likewise owing to his exertions the batteries of his group were able to shoot by eye and not by map alone, thereby causing much damage to enemy counter-attacks.

(The Military Cross was awarded in London

Gazette dated 18th February, 1915.)

For conspicuous gallantry in action. led his company with great dash, captured all his objectives, and maintained his position against a hostile counter-attack. He captured two officers, 100 other ranks and a machine gun. (The Military Cross was awarded in London

Gazette dated 11th December, 1916.)

Temp. 2nd Lt. (temp. Capt.) Bruce Mitchell

Taylor, M.C., D. of C.L.I.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. He directed the operations with marked skill, and set a splendid example to all ranks.

(The Military Cross was awarded in London

Gazette dated 14th January, 1916.)

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Military Cross on the undermentioned Officers in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:

2nd Lt. Frank Arnold, R.F.A.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to He organised a party and succeeded in extinguishing a fire in an ammunition dump at a critical time. He has on many previous occasions done fine work.

2nd Lt. Alec. Pendock Aveline, R. Berks. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a raid against the enemy's trenches with marked ability and succeeded in capturing 52 prisoners. He has at all times set a fine example.

2nd Lt. Gervais de la Poer Beresford, R.E. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty when in charge of a working party. He successfully carried out his work under very Later, he made a dangerous heavy fire. reconnaissance and obtained most valuable information.

2nd Lt. Hugh MacCormac Boyle, R. Ir.

Fus., attd. R. Ir. Rif.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to He crawled with a patrol through a thick stretch of wire to the enemy parapet. On another occasion he gallantly led a successful raiding party against the enemy's trenches.

Capt. Gordon David Brewster, Bedf. R. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. He went out into "No Man's Land" and personally directed parties of men who had become disconnected into the enemy's trenches.

2nd Lt. (temp. Capt.) Henry Bunting, Bord. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led his company to their objective and consolidated the position. He kept up the spirits of his men by his own personal example in spite of heavy and constant shel-

Lt. Ernest Walter Cannings, W. Yorks. R. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a successful raid against the

enemy's trenches. He showed great courage and determination throughout, and was of very great assistance in the training of the raiders and in the preliminary reconnaissance

2nd Lt. William Butler Clarke, R.G.A.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. Although buried by a shell he extricated himself and continued to register his battery. He set a splendid example of courage and determination.

Temp. 2nd Lt. William Henry Joseph

Darling, E. Kent R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a most successful raid against the enemy trenches. He was amongst the last to return, and helped to carry a wounded officer back to our lines. He set a fine example throughout.

Temp. 2nd Lt. George Sidney John Downes, M.G.C.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty while in command of the Mobile Section of his machine gun company. Throughout the operations he has shown marked disregard of personal danger, and although wounded remained with his guns.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Stanley George Ellis, Gen. List, attd. T.M. By.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to

duty. He handled his trench mortar guns with great courage and skill, and thereby contributed largely to the success of an infantry raiding party.

Lt. (temp. Capt.) John Walter Ewbank, Bord. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to He kept his men working under very heavy fire and thereby allowed the ground won to be consolidated at a critical time. He set a fine example of courage and determination.

Temp. Capt. Leonard Gale, E. York. R.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He personally held an important tactical post, and by his courage and coolness in directing his fire was able, time after time, to assist in beating off stubborn enemy counter-attacks. He has previously done fine work.

Capt. Ivan Harold Garvey, Conn. Rang., Spec. Res.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. displayed great courage and determination in driving off a strong enemy attack with severe casualties. He has on several previous occasions done fine work.

Lt. (temp. Capt.) John Trevor George, Mon. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He rapidly got his men to work under fire and thereby prevented a number of casualties. He has at all times set a fine example of courage and determination.

2nd Lt. Cecil Gordon-Davis, N. Staff. R. and R.F.C.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He brought down a hostile machine. Later, during the same flight, he attacked

four enemy machines, split up their formation, and brought one of them down. He set a splendid example of courage and determination in the face of superior forces.

Temp. 2nd Lt. John Stanley Hancock, D. of C.L.I.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. Although badly shaken by the explosion of a torpedo he led his men forward to their objective, and personally captured a prisoner. Later, he effected a skilful withdrawal under heavy fire.

Temp. Lt. George Cleverdon Hartley, M.B., R.A.M.C., attd. E. Surr. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He displayed great courage and determination in assisting to rescue a wounded man from the open under very heavy fire.

Lt. John Thomson Hayward, Gen'l List.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Although well knowing that the enemy were already in his rear, he single-handed destroyed several important works. Later, he marched some 60 kilometres through hilly native paths to regain safety, and suffered much privation.

Temp. Lt. William Carlile Hill, R. Ir. Rif.,

attd. T.M. By.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He succeeded in moving his guns to defensive positions under very heavy fire. Later, in spite of heavy fire, he continued to fire a gun himself. He set a splendid example of courage and determination throughout.

Temp. Lt. (temp. Capt.) Peter Townend

Hough, R.E.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He, with a few volunteers, entered the workings of a mine which were ablaze, and for several hours combatted the flames, fully conscious of the imminent danger from further explosions and falling ground.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Alvert Edward Hughes, R. Fus.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a successful raid in daylight against the enemy's trenches and penetrated their support line. He was severely wounded.

Temp. Lt. Sedgebert Herschel Joelson, R. Fus.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Although wounded, he led a raiding party with great gallantry, and successfully entered the enemy's trenches. He carried out most valuable reconnaissance work previous to the raid.

Capt. Robert Millington Knowles, Norf. R., Spec. Res., and R.F.C.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty when acting as observer. He showed throughout the greatest courage in the face of very superior forces, and a high standard of marksmanship. Temp. Lt. Patrick Robert Koekkoek, R.E. For conspicuous gallantry in action. He handled his trench mortars with marked courage and ability throughout, and thereby materially assisted the infantry. He has on many previous occasions done fine work.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Frank Light, S. Wales Bord.
For conspicuous gallantry when in charge
of a small party which attempted to cross
a river in a pontoon. He displayed great
coolness and judgment under heavy fire during the embarkation and in directing the
retirement and bringing in the wounded
when ordered to withdraw.

Temp. Lt. Gordon Parmiter Lindsay, Bord. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He displayed great courage and initiative during a raid, and was the last to leave the enemy's front line trench. Later, he made a gallant attempt to rescue a wounded man.

Temp. 2nd Lt. William Henry Lindsay, E. Surr. R.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He assumed command of a company and led them in the assault with great gallantry. After his objective had been gained, he took a party forward and captured many prisoners.

2nd Lt. Donald Clements Logan, L.N. Lan.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. He led his party to their objective with skill and intelligence, inflicted severe losses on the enemy, and captured six prisoners.

2nd Lt. Arthur Denis Worsley Lowe, S. Wales Bord.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. When the attack was temporarily held up by machine gun fire, he led his party to this place and successfully bombed the enemy gun team, thus enabling the attack to push on. Later, he himself captured six prisoners.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Patrick Joseph Lyne, R. Mun. Fus.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He reorganised all the men of his company and supported the troops advancing to the second: objective, leading them with great gallantry and capturing many prisoners.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Sidney Albert Macey, Devon.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a patrol 400 yards in front of the line, and obtained most valuable information. He has on many previous occasions done fine work.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Donald MacLeod, attd. Bord. R.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He led his men through their first objective, and himself with his platoon captured some gun pits which were very strongly held. Later, he assisted in digging a strong point undervery heavy fire.

Temp. Capt. John Martin, Gord. Highrs.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He displayed marked courage and ability in organising the arrangements previous to a raid. Later, during the raid, he personally supervised the guiding of the assaulting troops.

2nd Lt. James Thomas Byford McCudden, Gen. List, and R.F.C.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He followed a hostile machine down to a height of 300 feet, and drove it to the ground. He has shown marked skill on many previous occasions, and has destroyed two hostile machines and driven another one down out of control.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Robert Scott Miller, R.G.A. (S.A.H.A.).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Although wounded, he, during a heavy hostile bombardment, extricated several men who had been buried.

Temp. Lt. Deric William Parkes, Midd'x R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a successful raid against the enemy's trenches, and inflicted many casualties. He set a splendid example to his men.

2nd Lt. James Ronald Patten, R.F.A.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He greatly assisted in the consolidation of the position, and brought up reinforcements under very heavy fire. He set a splendid example throughout, and inspired his men to resist vigorous enemy counter-attacks.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Samuel John Haughton Pile, Midd'x R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. He completely overcame the resistance of the enemy by shooting their leaders. He led his party beyond their objective, and later effected a skilful withdrawal.

Capt. (Actg. Maj.) Darcy John Rigby Richards, R.G.A.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He assisted to re-establish telephonic communication, and established visual signalling, which was used for important messages under a heavy fire. He set a splendid example throughout.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Percy Crawford Richards, R.F.A.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. At great personal risk he extricated a man who had been buried in close proximity to a burning ammunition dump.

2nd Lt. Cecil Martin Sankey, Bord. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led his company in a most successful raid against the enemy's trenches. He himself killed one of the enemy and wounded another, whom he brought back to our lines.

Capt. David Scollard, R. Ir. Rif.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He carried out several dangerous reconnaissances, and obtained most valuable information. Later, he led a successful raiding party, and inflicted many casualties on the enemy.

Lt. Philip Huntington Simpson, Gen'l List. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Although slightly wounded by an explosion and his clothes badly burnt, he succeeded in carrying out the work of destruction entrusted to him. Later, to escape capture, he had to make his way across country.

2nd Lt. Francis William Smith, W. York.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. With a few men he dispersed a fighting patrol of the enemy. Later, he assisted to bring in a wounded man under heavy fire. He has at all times set a fine example of courage and determination.

· Temp. 2nd Lt. Allan Robert Steele, Sco. Rif.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He displayed great courage and determination in endeavouring to breach the enemy's wire under most difficult conditions. Later, he carried out several dangerous patrols, and took part in a successful raid.

2nd Lt. Herbert Wilfred Taylor, R.F.A., Spec. Res.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He carried out the observation for wire-cutting under very heavy fire with conspicuous success.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Lechmere Cay Thomas, E. Surr. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a successful raid with great gallantry, and personally accounted for four of the enemy. Later, he skilfully withdrew his party under heavy fire.

2nd Lt. Terence Conrad Thorn, I.A.R.O.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, when he went out under very heavy rifle and machine gun fire and carried into safety a man who had been severely wounded.

Capt. (temp. Lt.-Col.) John Brereton Owst Trimble, E. York. R., attd. W. York. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a most successful raid against the enemy's trenches, inflicted many casualties, and captured several prisoners. The success of the raid was largely due to his magnificent personal example.

Temp. 2nd Lt. Cyril Raymond Wise, Bord.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He assumed command of his company and personally superintended the capture of a strong point, which was holding up the line. He set a splendid example throughout.

2nd Lt. Stephen Montague Wilson, Durh.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. Although wounded, he continued to lead his men and set a splendid example throughout the operation.

2nd Lt. Wilfred Darby Wynne, R. Ir. Regt., Spec. Res., attd. T.M. By.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He opened a brisk bombardment on the enemy's front line and wire, thereby dispersing an enemy raiding party. He set a splendid example throughout.

2nd Lt. Bryant Wynne Yorke-Lodge, Lan. Fus

For conspicuous gallantry when on special night patrol. He most skilfully led his party to the point from which an assault was made, although not having previously traversed the ground. Also he gallantly led a party of six men against two listening posts in the face of fire directed at him from the enemy occupying the posts. Having forced them to vacate the posts, he pursued them to the enemy wire entanglements, where he grappled with one and took him prisoner.

CANADIAN CONTINGENT.

Capt. (actg. Maj.) George Scott Stanton Bowerbank, Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He displayed great courage in leading his men against superior numbers of the enemy. He set a fine example to his men and succeeded in capturing a number of prisoners.

Lt. Reginald Percy Cattell, Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He organised and led a most successful raid against the enemy's trenches, demolished a mine shaft, and inflicted many casualties. He has previously done fine work.

Lt. Arthur Mortimer, P.P.C.L.I.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. Although severely wounded, he rushed an post and with great gallantry attacked one of the sentries, killing him with his revolver. He has previously done fine work.

Lt. William Edward Nutter, Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid against the enemy's trenches. He first reconnoitred the gap in the enemy's wire, to which he laid a direction tape. He and another officer then led over the raiding party, entered the trench, and captured a prisoner.

Capt. Harold Parke, Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to He led his party to the enemy's support line, where he successfully held them back whilst the demolition of dug-outs was in progress. Although twice wounded, he refused to leave his command until the operation was complete.

Capt. (actg. Maj.) Frederick Douglas Raymond, Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He single-handed killed or wounded the crew of a machine gun which was opposing the advance of his men. He also destroyed a trench mortar.

Lt. Gilbert Smithson Reid, Can. Infy.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a successful daylight raid and personally shot one of the enemy. He set a splendid example of courage and determination throughout the operation.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award a Bar to the Distinguished Conduct Medal to the undermentioned Warrant Officers for subsequent acts of conspicuous gallantry:-824 C./S./M. C. Gardner, Newfoundland R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led a party of stretcher-bearers into "No Man's Land." Later, he succeeded in securing the surrender of seventytwo of the enemy, whom he handed over to a party of another regiment.

(The Distinguished Conduct Medal awarded in the London Gazette dated 11th

Dec. 1916.)

7816 Sjt. R. Munday, R. Berks. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during a raid on the enemy's trenches. Although wounded, he continued to assist his officer, and the complete success of the raid

was largely due to his personal example.

(The Distinguished Conduct Medal was awarded in the London Gazette dated 6th Nov.

1914.)

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Distinguished Conduct Medal to the undermentioned Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men for acts of gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:-

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to He has rendered the most valuable services throughout, and has at all times set a splendid example of courage and endurance.

8334 Sjt. F. le B. Allbeury, Bord. R.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. He proceeded along the enemy trench and effected the capture of 12 prisoners. He set a splendid example of courage and devotion to duty.

9514 Sjt. P. Battle, E. Lan. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and coolness under very heavy fire. While in charge of a patrol came under very heavy enemy fire, one of his men being badly wounded. He rallied the patrol and rescued the man. He was wounded himself while doing this.

26747 Sjt. B. Berry, R.F.A.

For conspicuous gallantry in action. Hedisplayed great courage and determination in extinguishing a fire in a gun-pit during a heavy hostile bombardment. He set a splendid example to all ranks.

S/7992 Pte. (actg. L./Cpl.) H. C. Burrell,, R. Fus., attd. L.T.M. By., Spec. Res.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He seized a shell which had started to fuse and threw it up the shaft of a gun emplacement, where it immediately exploded. He undoubtedly saved many lives.

855 T/Sit. F. N. B. Fitzhardinge, Imp. Camel Corps.
