**His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of a Bar to the Distinguished Service Order to:—**

Capt. (temp. Lt.-Col.) Alfred John Hamilton-Bowen, D.S.O., Mon. R.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He, with great personal gallantry, supervised the difficult task of consolidation throughout the whole night, and continually went round his working parties. He was mainly responsible for the excellent work carried out.

Brevet Major (temp. Lt.-Col.) Archibald Herbert Leggett, D.S.O., R. of O., late Royal Scots Fus., R. Scots Fus.

For conspicuous gallantry, coolness and resource when in command of an infantry battalion. He showed exceptional powers

of leadership when attacked by the enemy, upon whom he inflicted a severe defeat.

(The Distinguished Service Order was awarded in Gazette dated 27th September, 1901.)

**His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the appointments of the undermentioned Officers to be Companions of the Distinguished Service Order in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:—**

2nd Lt. Alfred Burgess, R. Berk. R.

For conspicuous courage and ability whilst commanding a raiding platoon which entered the enemy's trenches, and returned with two officers and fifty other ranks as prisoners. The success of the raid was largely due to the ability with which he conducted preparatory training, and also to his personal courage and example. He was severely wounded.
