

lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Calton, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 11th day of June, in the year 1902, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church of Saint Mary, Calton, situate in the Parish of Mayfield, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary, Calton':

"And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary, Calton, has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Calton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose, that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Calton, shall be altered so that all that portion of the Parish of Ilam, in the said County and Diocese, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the *Map* or *Plan* hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured *pink*, shall be dissevered from such Parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Calton.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing, any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly represent, recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council. "THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Mary, Calton, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Ilam, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south partly by the detached portion of the Parish of Croxden which is known as Musden Grange, in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the said New Parish of Saint

Mary, Calton, upon the west partly by the Parish of Waterfall and partly by the Parish of Grindon, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-west by the last-named Parish, upon the north-east and upon part of the east by the Parish of Wetton, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wetton from the said Parish of Ilam, at the centre of the weir which crosses the River Manifold at a distance of 44 chains or thereabouts measured in a straight line north-west from the centre of Rushley Bridge, and extending from the centre of the said weir in a straight line due south (thereby crossing Rushley Wood) for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to the fence which divides Rushley Wood from Musden Wood, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ilam from the said detached portion of the Parish of Croxden which is known as Musden Grange."

And whereas Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively either signified their assent or offered no objection thereto:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.
