DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL
BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE SOUTHERN
MILITARY AND TRANSPORT AREA.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor
Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred
upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating
to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the
following Order:—

1. This Order shall apply to so much of the
Southern Military and Transport Area as com-
prises the Petty Sessional Division of Wareham
and the Parishes of Lytchett Matravers and
Lytchett Minster in the County of Dorset.

2. After paragraph (d) of Article 3 of the
Order of the Board now in force in the Area
and made on the seventeenth day of February,
1916, the following paragraph shall be added:

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained
in Article 2 (1) of this Order, no person shall
either by himself or by any servant or agent
sell or supply to any person in any licensed
premises or club any spirits to be consumed
on the premises or consume or permit any
person to consume in any such premises or
club any spirits except between the hours of
12 noon and 2.30 p.m. on weekdays and
between the hours of 12.30 p.m. and 2.30
p.m. on Sundays.

And the said Article shall be read as if the
foregoing paragraph were inserted therein.

3. The secretary of every club to which this
Order applies and every holder of a licence for
the sale of intoxicating liquor to be consumed
on the premises in the above-mentioned part of
the area shall keep permanently affixed in some
conspicuous place in the club or in each public
room in the licensed premises a copy of this
Order.

4. This Order shall come into force on the
nineteenth day of March, 1917.
