WE, considering that it is desirable that Saturday, the Seventh day of April next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout England and Wales, and Scotland, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Saturday, the Seventh day of April next as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout England and Wales, and Scotland, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

GIVEN at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Thirtieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by Proclamations dated the 30th November, 1915, and the 15th February and 10th March, 1916, and entitled the Machine Tools (Prohibition of Import) Proclamation, 1915, the Prohibition of Import (Paper, Tobacco, Furniture Woods and Stones) Proclamation, 1916, and the Prohibition of Import (Canned, Bottled, Dried and Preserved Fruits) Proclamation, 1916, respectively, and by Proclamations dated the 21st March, 30th March, 10th May, 1st June, 27th June, 28th July, 18th August, 3rd October, 16th November, and 5th December and 22nd December, 1916, and entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations, 1916, and numbered 3 to 13 respectively, and by a Proclamation dated the 23rd February, 1917, and entitled the Prohibition of Import (No. 14) Proclama-

tion, 1917, the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Proclamations should be revoked, and a Proclamation consolidating the same, with amendments and additions, substituted in their place:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring, and it is hereby declared, that the above-mentioned Proclamations be and the same are hereby revoked:

And We have further thought fit, by and with the advice aforesaid, and in virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, further to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (Consolidation and Amendment) Proclamation, 1917.

A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM, EXCEPT UNDER LICENCE, OF ALL FOREIGN COINS OTHER THAN GOLD AND SILVER COINS.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section two of the Customs Amendment Act, 1886, We are empowered from time to time to make and when made to revoke a Proclamation prohibiting the importation into Our United Kingdom of such coins coined in a foreign country as are in that behalf specified in such Proclamation:

And whereas by Our Proclamation made the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, We did prohibit the importation into Our United Kingdom of all coins coined in any foreign country other than gold or silver coins:

And whereas it is expedient that Our said Proclamation should be revoked, and that the importation into the United Kingdom of such coins coined in a foreign country as are hereinafter specified should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, all coins coined in any foreign country other than gold or silver coins are prohibited to be imported into Our United Kingdom:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that the foregoing prohibition shall not extend to any coins which are imported under and in compliance with the terms of any special or general licence issued by the Minister of Munitions.

2. Our said Proclamation of the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, is hereby revoked.

3. This Proclamation shall not affect the provisions of the Prohibition of Import (Consolidation and Amendment) Proclamation, 1917.

4. This Proclamation may be cited as "The Foreign Coins (Importation Prohibition) Proclamation, 1917," and shall come into operation on the Thirtieth day of March, 1917.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations,") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the Defence of the Realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915; the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. After Regulation 2A the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"2AA. Where with a view to increasing the supply of coal it appears to the Board of Trade that it is expedient that any railway, tramway, or other facilities for transport from a colliery should be provided, the Board of Trade may take possession of any land and construct and maintain thereon such works as may be necessary for the purpose."

2. In Regulation 2M, after paragraph (g), the following paragraphs shall be inserted:—

"and—

(h) Where, in the opinion of the Board, any land is injured or is likely to be injured by any such neglect on the part of the proprietor or occupier of any other land in relation to the maintenance of banks or the cleansing of channels as is mentioned in section fourteen of the Land Drainage Act, 1847, and subject to, and after the expiration of seven days from, the service of such notice as is required by that section, exercise such powers of executing all necessary works and recovering the expenses thereof as are by that section conferred on the proprietor or occupier of any land which is injured by any such neglect, and for any such purpose enter on any land without any warrant or authority; and

"(i) By notice served on the occupier or person in control of any dam, mill, lock, sluice, weir, or other obstruction of the flow of water in any river or stream, require such occupier or person to keep open any mechanical appliance by which the flow of water is regulated during such times and in such manner as the Board, having regard to the use by such occupier or person of the obstruction and of the water thereby impounded, consider to be necessary or desirable for the prevention of floods or for the draining of land adjoining or near the river or stream."

In subsection (9) of the same regulation, after the word "regulation," there shall be inserted the words "except paragraphs (h) and (i) of subsection (1)."

At the end of the same regulation there shall be inserted the following subsections:—

"(10) With a view to increasing food production by the conservation or improvement of grazing land, the occupier of any land in Scotland shall be entitled, after due notice in writing to the owner of such land and to the owner of any woodlands adjoining such land, or to their respective agents or factors, and with due care to prevent damage to any woodlands on or adjoining such land, to 'make muirburn' or set fire to any heath or muir within the boundaries of such land, at any time or times between 1st October and 30th April when the same would otherwise be unlawful or be in contravention of the lease or other contract affecting the land: Provided that nothing herein contained shall affect any duty to comply with any regulation, order or instruction in regard to the use, display or ignition of lights or fires, in force for the time being.

"(11) Any notice under this regulation may be served on the person to whom it is to be given, either personally or by leaving it for him at his last known place of abode, or by sending it through the post in a registered letter addressed to him there."

3. For Regulation 2R down to the end of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) the following provision shall be substituted:—

"2R.—(1) The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries may, with a view to preventing or reducing injury to crops or trees or wastage of pasturage by game birds hares or rabbits, or to securing for the food supply of the country any migratory kind of wild bird,

"(a) take or authorise such action as, in the opinion of the Board, may be necessary for such purpose, or delegate to any body the powers conferred by this paragraph as respects any locality."

In the same regulation, after the word "hares," wherever it occurs, there shall be inserted the words "or rabbits."

4. The following amendments shall be made in Regulation 41:—

In paragraph (a), after the words "calculated to deceive," there shall be inserted the words "or any miniature or other representation of any such decoration or medal, or any brooch or personal ornament designed to imitate any such decoration or medal."

In paragraph (c), after the word "supplies," there shall be inserted the words "or offers to supply," and after the words "as aforesaid" there shall be inserted the words

"or any such representation, brooch, or ornament as aforesaid."

At the end of the same regulation, after the words "against these regulations," there shall be inserted the following proviso:—

"Provided that nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit the wearing or supply of ordinary regimental badges, or any brooch or ornament representing the same."

WHEREAS by the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1916 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, has been pleased to impose restrictions on aliens, and to make various regulations for carrying these restrictions into effect:

And whereas the principal Order has been extended and amended by subsequent Orders in Council, and it is expedient further to amend the provisions of the principal Order in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The following Article shall be substituted for Article 25 of the principal Order:—

25.—(1) A Chief Officer of Police, if so authorised by general or special order of a Secretary of State, may direct that any premises within his jurisdiction which, in his opinion, are used for the sale of refreshments to be consumed on the premises, or as a place of public resort or entertainment, or as a club, and—

- (a) are frequented by alien enemies; or
- (b) are frequented by undesirable aliens;

or

- (c) are in the occupation or control of an alien, and are conducted in a disorderly or improper manner, or in a manner prejudicial to the public safety;

shall be kept closed, either altogether or during such hours or for such purposes as may be required by him; and if any premises are kept open in contravention of any such direction, the occupier or person having control of the premises shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of this Order.

(2) Where any premises have been closed under this Article, the occupier or person having control of the premises shall not occupy or control any other premises which are used for the sale of refreshments or as a place of public resort or entertainment or as a club, without the consent of the Chief Officer of Police for the district in which the premises are situate.

(3) Any constable, if authorised by the Chief Officer of Police, may, for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Article, enter, if necessary by force, and search or occupy any premises to which an order under this Article relates.

1. The powers of the Board of Trade under section six of the Output of Beer (Restriction) Act, 1916, as amended by section four of the Output of Beer (Restriction) Amendment Act, 1916, are hereby transferred to the Food Controller.

2. This Order may be cited as the Food Controller (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1917.

And whereas the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the enactments mentioned in the Schedule to the last-recited Act which were, under the provisions of Section 14 (2) of that Act transferred to the Minister of Labour were, by Order in Council dated the 10th day of January, 1917, transferred as from the date thereof:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the enactments referred to in the Schedule to this Order should be transferred to the Minister of Labour:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the enactments referred to in the Schedule to this Order shall be transferred to the Minister of Labour, and such transfer shall take effect as from the Thirtieth day of March, 1917.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the Summer Time Act, 1916, as so amended as aforesaid, shall be in force during the year 1917, and the prescribed period in that year shall be from two o'clock in the morning Greenwich Mean Time on Sunday the 8th day of April, until two o'clock in the morning Greenwich Mean Time on Monday the 17th day of September.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under existing Regulations Senior Allowance at the rate of 1s. 6d. per day is payable to the Lieutenant performing executive duties at Bermuda, so long as a Depôt Ship is stationed at that port, the Officer being regarded as Senior Lieutenant of the Ship:

"And whereas a Depôt Ship is not now stationed at Bermuda, but these duties continue to be performed by the Senior Lieutenant at the Royal Naval Barracks, Bermuda:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of Senior Allowance at the rate of 1s. 6d. per day to the Senior Lieutenant at the Royal

Naval Barracks, Bermuda, as from the 1st June, 1915, on condition that the Allowance will not be payable concurrently with an Allowance to the Senior Lieutenant of a Depot Ship, should one again be stationed at Bermuda.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas by Order in Council of the 7th day of July, 1916, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Regulations contained in the Military Service Regulations (Amendment) Order, 1916, should be the Regulations made under the powers contained in Paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, subject to the modifications therein contained:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that the Regulations contained in the Military Service Regulations (Amendment) Order, 1917, shall be further Regulations made under the powers contained in Paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, subject to the following modifications:—

1. In the Definition "*The principal Regulations*" after the words "*Military Service*" there shall be read the words "*(Isle of Man)*," and for the words "*1st day of June, 1916*," there shall be substituted "*7th day of July, 1916*."

In the last Paragraph of the Definition Clause for the words "*7th day of March, 1917*," there shall be substituted "*11th day of April, 1917*."

2. For the words "*Local Government Board*" wherever the same occur, there shall be substituted the words "*Lieutenant-Governor*."

3. After the words "*Munitions of War Act, 1915*," in Paragraph 2 of Part III, there shall be read the words "*(being an Act of the Imperial Parliament)*."

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed 1,500 persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Repre-

sentation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, shall present or nominate to such United Benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 29th day of September, 1916, in the words following:—

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend George Wyndham, Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Rectory of North Stoke, and the Rectory of Langridge, both in the County of Somerset, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:—

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Right Honourable Stanley Owen, Baron Buckmaster, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of the Crown, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of North Stoke, and Robert Wynter Blathwayt, Esquire, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of Langridge, have consented to the proposed Union:

"That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the Principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, against such Union, and no such cause has been shown:

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in writing of the said Patrons, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and

Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"And we further recommend that the course and succession in which the Patrons for the time being shall present to the said Benefices, in case the same shall be united into one Benefice, shall be as follows, that is to say:—That the said Robert Wynter Blathwayt, or his successors in title, shall present on the first vacancy, the said Lord High Chancellor on the second and third vacancies, the said Robert Wynter Blathwayt, or his successors in title, on the fourth vacancy, and the said Lord High Chancellor on the fifth vacancy, and so on, that is to say, the said Robert Wynter Blathwayt, and his successors in title, shall present on the first and fourth vacancies, and the said Lord High Chancellor on the second, third and fifth vacancies, in each successive five vacancies of the said United Benefice.

"RANDALL, CANTUAR."

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of North Stoke, situate in the County of Somerset, and Diocese of Bath and Wells, and the Rectory of Langridge, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant, shall be as follows, that is to say:—The said Robert Wynter Blathwayt, or his successors in title, shall present on the first vacancy, the said Lord High Chancellor on the second and third vacancies, the said Robert Wynter Blathwayt, or his successors in title, on the fourth vacancy, and the said Lord High Chancellor on the fifth vacancy, and so on, that is to say, the said Robert Wynter Blathwayt, and his successors in title, shall present on the first and fourth vacancies, and the said Lord High Chancellor on the second, third, and fifth vacancies in each successive five vacancies of the said United Benefice.

And whereas the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3. A List consolidating all previous Lists was published on the 16th February, 1917 (The Consolidating List No. 19a), which together with Lists No. 20, 21 and 22 of the 2nd, 16th and 23rd March, 1917, respectively, and the List herewith annexed contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June and 10 November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable

amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from the Belgian Government the text of a declaration, which was published on the 19th March, 1917, of which the following is a translation:—

An order of the German Governor, dated August 29th, 1916, prescribes, in violation of

the principles of international law, the forced liquidation of certain concerns in the parts of Belgium occupied by the enemy.

Further, according to reliable information, the German Government have ordered certain establishments to hand over to the Reichsbank the balances of current accounts standing in the names of French and British nationals.

Belgian legislation, in which are incorporated the Hague Conventions, recognises neither the validity of the powers given by the occupying authorities to the sequestrators named by them for the purposes of liquidating nor the validity of the actual liquidations themselves. Consequently, after the liberation of the country, persons adversely affected by any abuse which the sequestrators or other authorities concerned with the liquidation may make of their powers, will have a legal remedy against such authorities or sequestrators and against their estates.

All agreements or juridical acts involving anything beyond mere custody and maintenance will be liable to be annulled. The same applies to any alienation of real or personal property, transfers of credit, and in general to all acts disposing of property.

Representatives, domiciled outside of the occupied parts of Belgium, of Belgian or foreign firms or companies placed under sequestration by the German authorities would run the risk of incurring, besides civil claims against them, the infliction of the penalties provided for by the law of December 10th, 1916, if they should carry out instructions given them by sequestrators or other authorities concurred in a liquidation.

In denouncing to neutral and allied Powers these latest abuses of the German occupation, the Belgian Government beg them to warn their nationals against the possible legal consequences of entering into any transactions with agents whose powers are not valid.

(2.) While this Order remains in operation sheep in the Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall be exempt from the provisions of Article 3 of the Sheep Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1915 so far as they relate to dipping within the first prescribed dipping period.

Modification of Part I of the Principal Order.

2. Part I of the Principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, be read and have effect as if paragraph (3) of Article 2 of that Order were omitted.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the First Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the principal Order, are hereby fixed to be the nineteenth day of July and the twenty-first day of August in each year.

Modification of Part II of the Principal Order.

4. Part II of the Principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, be read and have effect as if paragraphs (2) and (3) of Article 5 and Article 6 were omitted, and as if the following paragraph were inserted in Article 5:—

"(2.) The dippings shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, and served by post or other-

wise on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice."

5. The Order described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby revoked.
