

Crudie Cottage; thence in a northerly direction along the road, via Nether Clochforbie, Bridge of Logie, and Croft of Cushnie, to its junction with the road leading to Afforsk; thence in a westerly and northerly direction along that road, via Cushnie and Gamrie, to its junction near Afforsk with the road leading to Gardenstown; thence in an easterly and northerly direction along that road, via Dubford and Gardenstown, to the sea beach; thence in an easterly direction along the sea beach to the point of commencement.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-one (The Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850), of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen ("The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868") do, out of the moneys which have been paid over to us by the Dean and Canons of the cathedral church in Manchester under the provisions of the hereinbefore first-mentioned Act, hereby grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the rectory of Saint Andrew, Droylsden, situate within the original limits of the parish of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, a payment at the rate of fifty pounds per annum for the period commencing the sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and terminating the first day of May in the same year.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of a sum of one hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us to be held by us for the permanent spiritual benefit of the parish of Plymstock, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant, subject as hereinafter mentioned, to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of Plymstock, one yearly sum or stipend of four pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the third day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and to be receivable in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day

of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Plymstock shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or after each of the said lastly-mentioned days in each and every year, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter that an Assistant Curate, duly licensed by such Bishop, has been employed within the parish of Plymstock aforesaid during the quarter of the year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said parish and vicarage of Plymstock.
