Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.

Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915: Extending Time limited by Section 17 of the London County Council Tramways and Improvements Act, 1914, for Compulsory Purchase of Lands for widening Piccadilly.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, '1914 (herein-after referred to as "the Act of 1914"), it is provided that the powers of the London County Council (herein-after referred to as "the County Council") for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of the Act of 1914 (including lands for the widening of Piccadilly) shall cease after the expiration of three years from the 7th d-y of August, 1914:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, and of any other powers in that behalf, by this Our Order extend for a period of one year the time limited by Section 17 of the Act of 1914 for the exercise of the powers of the County Council for

the compulsory purchase of the lands required for the widening of Piccadilly.

Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915: Extending Time for operation of certain provisions of the Mall Approach (Improvement). Act, 1914.
