At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 14th day of April, 1917,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations,") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said Regulations:—

1. In subsection (3) of Regulation 2L, the word "nineteen" shall be substituted for "eighteen."

2. In subsection (1) of Regulation 2R, the word "game" shall be omitted, and the words "or by vermin or pests" shall be inserted after the word "rabbits" where it first occurs.

3. In Regulation 15, after the words "which may be" there shall be inserted the words "owned by them or which may be," and for the words "on the date on which the order is issued" there shall be substituted the words "on such date as may be specified in the order."

4. In Regulation 32, after the words "His Majesty's forces" there shall be inserted the words "or any police constable or other person who is charged with the execution of any duties: under these regulations."

5. The following regulation shall be inserted after regulation 358:—

"35c.—(1) It shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, with the concurrence of a Secretary of State (or as respects Scotland, the Secretary for Scotland) by order—

(a) to declare that it is important in the interests of public safety as respects any area defined in the order, as being an area where bodies of His Majesty's Forces are located or

undergoing training, or where arms, ammunition, explosives or substances required for the production thereof (in this regulation referred to as munitions of war) are produced, treated, stored or handled, that rules should be made under this regulation; and

b) to make rules accordingly for securing and preserving order and good behaviour in the area, and maintaining in the area the efficiency of any of His Majesty's Forces or of any persons engaged in producing, treating, or handling munitions of war, whether by controlling or regulating the admission to or presence, movements, and behaviour in the area of any person or class of persons whose unrestricted admission to or presence in the area is likely to prejudice the training, discipline, administration, or efficiency of any of His Majesty's Forces or the efficiency of any person engaged in producing, treating, or handling munitions of war, or by any other means.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions the rules may require the presence of any persons or class of persons in the area to be notified to the police, and may empower a competent naval or military authority to prohibit any person from residing or remaining in or entering the area who has since the commencement of the war been convicted of any contravention of or non-compliance with the rules, or of any offence against public order or decency, or to impose on such person whilst in the area any condition as to reporting movements or otherwise.

"(3) If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any rule made under this regulation he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations, and if any person remains in or enters the area in contravention of a prohibition issued under the rules he may be removed therefrom by the direction of the competent naval or military authority."

6. After Regulation 37s the following regulation shall be inserted:

"37c. The Admiralty or the Shipping Controller may with the concurrence of the Board of Trade give directions that any British ship shall forthwith be and shall continue to be equipped with such apparatus as may be specified in the directions for securing the safety of the ship, and that the crew of the ship shall be properly instructed

in the use of such apparatus.
"If any ship with respect to which any such directions have been given puts to sea from any port in the United Kingdom without complying with the directions, the owner or master of the ship shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations, and if the ship is at any time subsequently found at any port of, or in the territorial waters adjacent to, the United Kingdom, the ship may be seized and detained.

7. After Regulation 39B, the following regulation shall be inserted:

"39BB.—If in the case of any harbour or dock undertaking carried on under statutory authority it appears to the Board of Trade that it is necessary for the successful prosecution of the war that the undertaking should be carried on in an efficient manner, but that, owing to circumstances arising out of the war, it cannot be so carried on without charging rates, dues, or charges in excess of those which the undertakers are authorised by statute to charge, the Board may by order authorise the undertakers to charge such rates, dues, or charges in excess of the statutory maxima as the Board think necessary in the circumstances, subject to such conditions as may be specified in the order."

8. After Regulation 39E, the following regu-

lation shall be inserted:

"39r. After the first day of June nineteen hundred and seventeen, it shall not be lawful for the owner of a British ship to employ in any neutral state as manager, broker or agent, any person who is of enemy nationality, or who, being a corporation or

company, is under enemy control.

"Any such owner who acts in contravention of this regulation shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations, and if the owner is a company, every director, manager and officer of the company shall also be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations, unless he proves that the contravention took place without his knowledge or consent.

For the purposes of this regulation a corporation or company shall be deemed to be

under enemy control if-

(a) the majority of the directors or persons occupying the position of directors by whatever name called are persons of enemy nationality; or

(b) the majority of the voting power is in the hands of persons who are of enemy nationality or who exercise their voting powers directly or indirectly on behalf of persons who are of enemy nationality; or

(c) the control is by any other means whatever in the hands of persons who

are of enemy nationality; or

(d) the executive is a company or corporation under enemy control, or the majority of the executive are appointed by a corporation or company under enemy control."

9. After Regulation 41AA, the following regulation shall be inserted:-

"41 AAA. Any person who in Great Britain employs in agriculture any male person of sixteen years of age or over (such employment not being of a casual nature) shall on such person ceasing to be so employed by him give or send to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries (or in Scotland to the Board of Agriculture for Scotland), or to such person or body of persons as the Board may direct in that behalf, notice in writing within twenty-four hours of the termination of the man's employment, stating his name, the nature of his employment, his place of residence whilst so employed, and particulars (where known to him) of the man's new employer and place of employment (if any).

'If any person fails to give or send ${f a}$ notice in accordance with the requirements of this regulation, or in any such notice gives any false information, he shall be guilty of

a summary offence against these regulations. regulation this the expression 'agriculture ' includes market gardening and forestry.''

10. After Regulation 45c. the following regulation shall be inserted:--

"45D. If any person, with a view to preventing or postponing—

- (a) the calling up of himself or any other person for any form of naval or military service or for any medical examination as to his fitness therefor;
- (b) the operation of any notice duly given for the purpose;

makes or connives at the making of any statement, whether oral or in writing, which is false or misleading in any material particular, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

11. After Regulation 51B the following regulation shall be inserted—

"51c. If a justice of the peace is satisfied, by information in writing upon oath laid before him by any competent naval or military authority, or any person duly authorised by him, or by an officer of police of a rank not below that of inspector, that any house, land, building, or other premises are being used for any purpose or in any way prejudicial to the public safety or the defence of the realm, by persons of hostile origin or association, or by persons suspected of attempting to cause mutiny, sedition, or disaffection among His Majesty's forces or among the civil population, the justice may by order require the premises either to be closed altogether or not to be used for any purpose prohibited by the order, or not to be used except in accordance with conditions and restrictions imposed by the order, and if the owner or occupier of the premises or any other person contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of the order or any conditions or restrictions imposed thereby, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and the competent naval or military authority may cause such steps to be taken as may be necessary to enforce compliance

with the order.

"In the application of this regulation to Scotland references to a justice of the peace shall be construed as references to the sheriff."

12. In paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of Regulation 55A, after the words "specified in the order" there shall be inserted the words "and empower such authority to exercise any of the powers that may be exercised by the police authority or chief officer of any county police force, including the power of appointing constables for the special police area."

ing constables for the special police area."

In paragraph (d) of the same sub-section after the word "provisions" there shall be inserted the words "(including provisions for obtaining assistance from other police forces)."

In sub-section (2) of the same regulation, after the words "assigned to" there shall be inserted the words "or appointed for."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of April, 1917, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council of the 28th March, 1903, and subsequent Orders, it is provided that certain Commissioned Warrant Officers and Warrant Officers shall be eligible for promotion to the Rank of Lieutenant, or the corresponding relative Rank, as a reward

for long and zealous Service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that advancement to similar relative Rank should be open to Commissioned Warrant Officers and Warrant Officers of the Writer and Ship's

Steward Classes:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Commissioned Writers and Commissioned Stewards, and Warrant Writers and Warrant Stewards, being eligible for promotion to the Rank of Assistant Paymaster as a reward for long and zealous Service, under the conditions set forth in the subjoined Schedule, the Officers so promoted to be included in the present authorized numbers of Commissioned Writers and Commissioned Stewards, and Warrant Writers and Warrant Stewards.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE

1. Commissioned Writers, Commissioned Stewards, Warrant Writers, and Warrant Stewards.

To have the title of Assistant Paymaster on promotion, and to rank with Assistant Paymasters of 4 years' seniority. To receive automatic promotion to the rank of Paymaster after 8 years from date of promotion to Assistant Paymaster.

2. Numbers.

The number of promotions from the Writer Class to be limited to 10, from the Ship's Steward Class to 6, these totals to be reached gradually.

3. FULL PAY.

On promotion - - 14 0 a day
After 2 years' service - 14 6 a day
After 4 years' service - 15 0 a day
After 6 years' service - 15 6 a day
After 8 years' service - 16 0 a day

4. HALF-PAY.

Officers when unemployed, except for the reasons stated below, to be borne for full pay on the books of their Depôt.

The Admiralty to have power, in cases of misconduct or prolonged sickness, to place Officers on temporary half-pay, such pay not to exceed the half of the full pay to which they are entitled.

Time on half-pay to count for all purposes as the half-pay-time of Officers generally.

5. Retirement.

Officers to be retired at the age of 55, or at any age if physically unfit for service. Voluntary retirement to be allowed after the age of 40.

7. MISCELLANEOUS.

Pensions for hurts and wounds, widow's pensions, and compassionate allowances to children, to be at the same rate and under the same conditions as those granted in the case of Lieutenants or Lieutenant-Commanders R.N.

An allowance of £50 towards the cost of outfit to be payable to every Officer on promotion.

To receive an allowance of 1s. 6d. per day when required to join a Ward Room Mess."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council of the

23rd February, 1917:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 23rd day of February, 1917, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 29th day of March, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, Eastbourne, situate in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Eastbourne, in the County of Sussex, and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, East-

bourne, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, which is described. in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Eastbourne, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Eastbourne.'

"And with the like consent of the said

Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, Churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Andrew, Eastbourne, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism,

or for the registration thereof.
"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall

seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Eastbourne, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Eastbourne, in the County of Sussex, and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say: —upon the south-east by the sea, upon the north-east and upon the north by the Parish of Westham, upon the north-west by the Parish of Willingdon, upon part of the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, at the southern end of Horsey Sewer where the boundary of the Municipal Borough of Eastbourne turns north-eastward along the middle of such Sewer, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the present north-western end of Woodgate Road, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of Woodgate Road for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Road called Seaside almost opposite to the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 311 313, Seaside, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of $1\frac{3}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of the Roadway running along the backs of the Houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Seaside, and extending thence south-eastward, first to the junction of such Roadway with the Roadway running along the backs of the Houses and premises situate on the northern side of Beach Road, and then along the middle of the last-mentioned Roadway (thereby crossing Fairlight Road, Latimer Road, and Bexhill Road) for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with

Sidley Road, and continuing thence southeastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing Royal Parade East) for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the sea."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like

of the said Diocese of Chichester.

To all whom it may concern.

Whereas it is desirable to protect the interests of British subjects in Patents, Trade Marks and Designs, and for this purpose it has proved to be necessary to make certain arrangements dealing with the interests of both British and Enemy subjects in Patents, Trade Marks and Designs, and whereas it has been represented to me by the Board of Trade that British subjects are permitted to apply in enemy territories for the grant and renewal of the grant of letters patent and for the registration and renewal of the registration of Trade Marks and Designs: Now I, Ernest Murray Pollock, one of His Majesty's Counsel and a Member of the Commons House of Parliament, Controller of the Foreign Trade Department of the Foreign Office, in pursuance of the authority given me in this behalf by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, hereby, on behalf of His Majesty, give and grant, unto every person, or body of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom, full licence and authority to apply on behalf of any person, or

body of persons, whose name now is, or shall hereafter be, placed on the Statutory List of persons with whom trading is forbidden by any Proclamation issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, for the grant, or for the renewal of the grant, of any letters patent, or for the registration, or for the renewal of the registration, of any trade mark or design in the United Kingdom, or in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom, where such applications are allowed by the Government of that part of His Majesty's Dominions to be made on behalf of persons, or bodies of persons, whose names are on the Statutory List, and for that purpose to transact all necessary business with regard to the application, and to all matters arising thereout with the person, or body of persons, on whose behalf the application is made, and generally to do all things necessary for carrying the application into effect, and in particular to pay any fees payable in the United Kingdom, or in any such part of His Majesty's Dominion outside the United Kingdom as aforesaid (provided that no fees be paid to any person, or persons resident or carrying on business outside the United Kingdom, unless such person or persons is or are permitted by the Government of that part of His Majesty's Dominions in which he or they is or are resident or carrying on business, to pay fees on behalf of persons or bodies of persons whose names are on the Statutory List), and to pay and retain any charges or expenses incurred in relation to the matter aforesaid.

Admiralty Order as to Pilotage between Great Yarmouth and Berwick.

In pursuance of the powers given to them by the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following Order:—

(1) This Order shall relate to the territorial waters adjacent to the United King-

dom from and including Great Yarmouth, Northward up to and including Berwick-upon-Tweed.

- (2) Subject to the provision hereinafter contained it shall be unlawful as from May 15th, 1917, for any person other than the Master or Mate of any ship to pilot such ship within the limits to which this Order relates unless he is the holder of a special pilotage certificate granted by the Admiralty.
- (3) Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prohibit a person who holds a licence granted by the Pilotage Authority of any district named in the Schedule hereto from Piloting any ship within the limits of such district.
- (4) For the purposes of this Order any person other than the Master or Mate as aforesaid who is on the bridge of a ship or in any other position whether on board the ship or elsewhere from which the ship is navigated shall be deemed to be piloting the ship unless the contrary is proved.
- (5) If any person pilots a ship in breach of this Order he shall be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations and shall be liable to be dealt with accordingly and the Master of any ship who employs any person not so certificated to act as pilot in breach of this Order shall be guilty of a like offence.

River Humber and Approaches—Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.-No. 23 of 1917; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:

1. That portion of the Humber which lies between two straight lines, drawn from shore to shore, as follows:—(1) a line drawn 225° (S. 61° W. Mag.) through Spurn lighthouse, (2) drawn 344° (North Mag.) from the east side of Barrow haven, will be referred to as

- 2. Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels should be directed to conform to the following regulations:-
- (I.) Except under exceptional circumstances merchant vessels will be free to enter or leave the port during the hours of official day.
- (II.) Before entering the port merchant vessels must receive permission and the necessary instructions from the Examination steamer, and before leaving they must obtain permission through the Collector of Customs at Hull, Grimsby, or Goole, as the case may be.
- (III.) Shipowners and local agents are advised to time the arrival of their vessels at the port for daylight.
- (IV.) Vessels desiring to enter the port from seaward are, unless previously met by the Examination steamer, to proceed to the Southern Examination anchorage (except during strong northerly or north-easterly winds, when they should proceed to the Northern Examination anchorage) and there
- (V.) The Examination steamer will be met in the Examination area between Bull lightvessel and Chequer Shoal buoy.

The Examination steamer will be distinguished by the following means:-

By Day.—A white ensign, and at the foremast head the special flag mentioned in Part II. of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1 of 1917. When the port is closed 3 red balls will be hoisted in addition to the special flag.

By Night.—Three lights vertically, 3 feet apart, conspicuously displayed at the end of a yard so as to shew an unbroken light round the horizon. When the port is closed these lights will be red, when it is open they will be white.

NOTE.—These lights are in addition to the ordinary navigation lights.

(VI.) There are two Examination anchorages. The northern is to be used in strong northerly and easterly winds. The southern is to be used under all other conditions.

The Northern Examination anchorage comprises those portions of Hawke road and Middle shoal included between the intersection of the following lines of bearing:-

(1) Skeffling Church bearing 18° (N. 34° E. Mag.).

(2) Skeffling Church bearing 4° (N. 20°

E. Mag.). (3) Spurn lighthouse bearing 120° (S. 44°

E. Mag.). (4) Extreme of Spurn point bearing 115° (S. 49° E. Mag.).

The Southern Examination Anchorage comprising the area bounded as follows:

1) On the north by the Bull sand.

(2) On the south by the three fathom contour line northward of Tetney haven.

- (3) On the east by the line joining the Bull light-vessel and entrance to Tetney
- (4) On the west by a line parallel to and 7 cables from the eastern limit (3).

Note.—When the Southern Examination anchorage is full of shipping further arrivals should anchor eastward of and as near to it as possible.

The Examination area is that portion of the river enclosed by an irregular line drawn from the Bull light-vessel to the extreme of Spurn point, thence to the Chequer Shoal buoy, thence to a point 210° (S. $4\bar{6}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) of and distant 7 cables from Bull light-vessel and thence to Bull light-vessel.

certificates granted to 3. All pilotage masters and mates for the whole or any part of the Humber Pilotage district are suspended and further all vessels (irrespective of draught, size, or nationality, but with the exception of those provided for in paragraph 4) bound to or from any place on the Humber must be conducted by licensed pilots over the whole or any part of the waters between Hull and the Outer Pilotage station of the Humber Pilotage district, which, until further notice, will be situated in the neighbourhood of the "Bull" lightvessel.

4. In the case of lighter inter-dock traffic and of small British vessels engaged in local traffic above Immingham, pilotage by licensed pilots is not compulsory.

5. During the hours of official night, and during fog with visibility of less than half a mile, no traffic is permitted to move on the Humber below Paull point; also when these conditions prevail no vessel should enter or remain within a radius of five miles from "Humber" (late "Spurn") light-vessel.

6. A vessel should not approach the Humber unless there is sufficient time available to enable such vessel to obtain a pilot and to arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor before the commencement of official night.

7. No vessel should anchor whilst awaiting a pilot.

8. Vessels when leaving the Humber must proceed direct to sea. Should it be necessary to wait for the weather to moderate or clear, they must remain inside the river at an authorised anchorage.

The pilot lobbies will be notified when the existence of fog outside the river is known.

9. A pilot should not board a vessel unless there is sufficient time available to enable such vessel to arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor, before the commencement of official night. The latest time at which the pilot cutter stationed at the "Bull" light-vessel should board inwardbound vessels is one hour before the commencement of official night.

Vessels bound outward should not pass Hawkins point later than 45 minutes before the

commencement of official night.

10. All vessels proceeding into or out of the Humber must be navigated by way of Hawke and Sunk roads passing to the northward of the Bull light-vessel, except those outwardbound from Grimsby, which may cross the Middle shoal passing at once into the channel north of the Middle.

Note.—The five-fathom channel through the Sunk and Hawke roads is very narrow at the western entrance and also at a point north of "Middle" light-vessel; deep draught steaming against the tide when approaching the buoys marking these portions of the channel should endeavour to avoid passing other vessels between them by easing engines to allow ships with the tide under them to get through first. Smaller vessels outwardbound should pass close to the southward of the buoys marking the south side, and those inward-bound close to the northward of the buoys marking the north side, of the narrow portions of the channel, provided always that their draught of water and the state of the tide will admit.

11. Sailing vessels of 50 tons register and upwards when entering or leaving the Humber must be towed through the Boom Defence gate-Should tugs not be available, inwardbound vessels may anchor north-westward of the No. 2 Lower Middle light-float at a distance of not more than 12 miles from it, but they must not bring the before-mentioned light-float to bear to the southward of 128°

(Š. 36° E. Mag.).

12. All vessels entering or leaving Grimsby docks must pass to the southward of the No. 4 Lower Burcom buoy except those making use of the channel southward of the Burcom shoal (hereinafter called the Burcom channel), which are exempted from this condition, but no vessel may cross the Burcom shoal between the No. 5 Middle Burcom and No. 4 Lower Vessels using the Burcom Burcom buoys. channel must pass into and out of its western end to the eastward of No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, and through a gateway at its eastern end 170 feet wide each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole.

Vessels making use of this gateway, are cautioned to keep well in the middle of the opening and are subject to the following

regulations:-

(1.) Vessels navigating against the tide must in all cases give way to those navi-

gating with the tide.
(2.) No vessel must approach the defences in this part of the river nearer than a quarter of a mile except to pass through the before-mentioned gateway or to Grimsby docks.

(3.) No vessel may tow more than two craft at one time through the gateway, as

stated in paragraph 17.

- (4.) Distant signals will be shown from the flagstaff on the West Pier at the Grimsby Dock entrance as follows:
 - (a) Two black balls will denote that the gateway is open.

(b) Three black balls will denote that

the gateway is closed.

(c) No signal being hoisted denotes that traffic is suspended.

When signal (b) three black balls is hoisted, no vessel may approach the gateway, and when traffic is suspended no vessels, other than H.M. Ships on special duty, may use the gateway.

13. Prohibited Anchorage areas:-

(I.) Anchorage is prohibited for all vessels

between two imaginary lines: —

(a) Joining Stone Creek Coast Guard (a) Joining Stone Creek Coast Guard flagstaff and the eastern extremity of the

eastern jetty at Immingham.

- (b) Joining the Riverward beacon of the two centre measured mile beacons on Sunk island and the northernmost of two clumps shown southward of Stallingborough on Admiralty Chart No. 109. The latter line passes through the position of No. 6 Upper Burcom buoy.
- (II.) No merchant vessel shall anchor (except when granted special permission) between the before-mentioned prohibited anchorage area (I.) and the line of transit of the eastern

measured mile beacons on Sunk island produced to the Lincolnshire shore or (except as provided for in paragraph 11) to the northward of the line of the Killingholme leading lights or within 12 cables of any of the Admiralty mooring buoys.

(III.) Anchorage is prohibited to merchant vessels over the whole of Grimsby roads to the eastward of the line joining New Clee railway station and Patrington Church, except so far as the Examination anchorages are concerned.

- (IV.) No vessel of any description may anchor on the south side of the Bull sand between the western limit of the Southern Examination anchorage described in paragraph 2 of this notice and a line drawn through the Cleethorpes Sewer Outfall beacon (on which a red light is exhibited in peace time) in a direction 60° (N. 76° E. Mag.), passing through a point 299° (North-west Mag.) distant 7 cables from Spurn lighthouse; nor on the north side of the Bull sand between the before-mentioned line of bearing passing through the Cleethorpes Sewer outfall and a line joining Spurn lighthouse and the Bull light-vessel produced to the Bull sand.
- 14. No merchant vessels or boats, etc., will be allowed to approach within a quarter of a mile of any defence work (except to pass through the Boom gateways) or to go alongside any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or any other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission. All vessels proceeding up and down the Humber are to pass at a distance at least three cables from H.M. Ships, if the depth of water and circumstances of navigation permit.

All vessels employed in laying moorings, raising wrecks, etc., must be passed at slow speed, propelling engines being eased at least 300 yards before reaching such vessels and so continued for 150 yards after passing them. While the said mooring or wreck raising craft are at work they will each fly a red flag.

16. Anchor lights are to be reduced in power and screened as prescribed in Admiralty Notice

to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916.

Vessels anchored in the Humber westward of the meridian of Greenwich are to exhibit anchor lights as mentioned above, except that Immingham and the meridian of between Greenwich they are to be reduced in brilliancy so as to be invisible at any greater distance than Eastward of the meridian of half-a-mile. Greenwich no lights whatever are to be exhibited.

Anchor lights authorised by these orders are never on any account to be extinguished; the order "Out lights" will not apply to them.

Bow and masthead steaming lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916. Other lights are to be as prescribed in

Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916, and this order also applies to vessels in dock or alongside quays and jetties. Notwith-standing anything in these orders, dredgers may be permitted to work at Hull and Immingham at night provided all their lights are extinguished within half-an-hour of issue of the general order "Out lights."

The above orders will not absolve the Masters of craft at anchor from keeping a sharp lookout and giving warning on the approach of any

craft under way.

The above orders apply to vessels of every description, other than H.M. ships.

latter should, however, comply so far as the visibility of anchor lights eastward of Immingham is concerned.

than two craft at one time through the gate-way at the eastern end of the Burcom channel referred to in paragraph 12, each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole; no tug is permitted to tow more than three craft at one time through the remaining gateways of the Boom defence. Owners of tugs may apply to the Humber Conservancy Board for pilot licences for the masters of their vessels which will enable them to pilot their own vessels and river craft comprising their tow (in certain parts of the river). The number of craft towed will be restricted according to the power of the tug.

18. Humber Rule No. 18 is to be strictly enforced. No sound signals other than navigation signals authorised by the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea and by Humber Rules Nos. 14 to 16 (inclusive) at all times of the day or night, and No. 17 during the day only, are on any account to be used by vessels in any part of the Humber, the Old Harbour at Hull, or within any of the docks at Hull,

Immingham or Grimsby.

19. Owners of small vessels plying in the vicinity of the Humber are instructed not to paint their craft light grey, and are hereby directed to have any vessels so coloured repainted. They are warned that small vessels painted grey run a great risk of being fired upon in mistake for submarines. Vessels painted black run the least risk.

20. Fishing in the Humber.—No vessel is allowed to fish in the Humber below Hull without a permit from the Admiralty port officer; all fishing, shrimping, trawling, or whelking in this portion of the river in areas other than those for which permits are granted is pro-

hibited

21. Regulations affecting small craft in the vicinity of Cleethorpes.—Pleasure boats may ply for hire at Cleethorpes only between the Eastern and Western Sewer Outfall beacons, and must keep within a distance of one mile from the shore.

Notwithstanding anything in these orders, rowing boats may pass along the shore at Cleethorpes, but they must keep within 400 yards of the high-water mark of spring tides.

- 22. Excursions by Water.—Excursions by water are limited to the River Humber above Hull, and Rivers Ouse and Trent. Excursion steamers will not be allowed to ply without a permit from the Admiralty port officer, Dock Offices, Immingham, and in no case are they to pass to the eastward of an imaginary line joining Victoria Dock entrance, Hull, and the east beacon on Skitter Ness.
- 23. Patrol of Internal Waterways.—The internal waterways of the port will be policed by Naval patrol vessels and by the Humber Conservancy Board under the direction of the Naval authorities.

Captains and Masters of Merchant Vessels and persons in charge of barges or boats of any kind are hereby warned to observe any orders which may be given to them by Naval Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board.

24-25. Warning.—Warning is hereby given

that vessels disobeying the above regulations will be liable to be fired on.

Variation.—16° W.

Note.—This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprison-

ment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.
