ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

HIDES, SKINS AND LEATHER.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby require all persons engaged at any time before or after the date hereof in the purchase, sale, distribution, storage, or shipment of hides or skins of any description or in the manufacture of leather from such hides or skins as aforesaid or of any articles wholly or partly manufactured therefrom, or in the purchase, sale, distribution, storage or shipment of such leather or articles aforesaid, or of any articles or materials required for the purpose of such manufacture as aforesaid, to furnish to the Director of Army Contracts such particulars as to their business as may be required on his behalf.

INCOME TAX.

Whereas it has become necessary to renew the list of persons to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners appointed to act in the division of Lexden and Winstree, in the county of Essex, as Commissioners for the general purposes of the Acts of Parliament for granting to His Majesty duties on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices: Now we, two of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, in pursuance of the powers vested in us in that behalf, do hereby convene a meeting of the Land Tax Commissioners for the county aforesaid, being respectively qualified to act as such Commissioners, to be holden at 60, High Street, Colchester, on Saturday, the 19th day of May, 1917, at 2.15 o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of choosing fit and proper persons to be Commissioners to supply vacan-

THE URBAN DISTRICT OF WALSOKEN,
IN THE COUNTY OF NORFOLK.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order given under the Seal of Office of the Local Government Board on the 30th day of March, 1917, it was declared that on and after the 7th day of May, 1917, Part IV of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the District of the Urban District Council of Walsoken, the effect of which Order is to prevent any person suffering from any infectious disease from carrying on any trade or business unless he can do so without risk of spreading the disease. And also to grant to the Local Authority power to require dairymen to furnish a list of sources of supply of milk, and also that all dairymen are to notify any infectious disease existing among their servants. And also that no clothes are to be sent to a laundry unless they have been disinfected by or to the satisfaction of the Local Authority or their Medical Officer. And also that filthy and dangerous articles are to be purified or where necessary to be destroyed. And also that a child who is or has been suffering from an infectious disease is not to attend school without a medical certificate. And the effect of the Order is also to make provision as to the use of library books and for the payment of expenses of any person in a hospital and for the removal of any person from infected premises and for prohibiting the conveyance of infected persons in public vehicles and for the cleansing and disinfecting of premises in the district and for providing nurses for attendance on patients. But with regard to section 59, dealing with the use of public libraries, it is declared that until further order be made nothing in that section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district.

SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME)
ACT, 1915.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the Board of Trade hereby order that the period limited

(1) by section 10 of the Swansea Corporation Light Railways (Extensions) Order, 1914, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of Railway No. 2 authorised by the Order shall be extended for one year from the 28th day of August, 1917;

(2) by section 12 of the Swansea Corporation Light Railways (Extensions) Order, 1914, for the completion of Railways Nos. 1 and 3 authorised by the Order shall be extended for one year from the 28th day of August, 1917.
