The following is the account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

H.M.S. "Zulu" was mined on the 8th November, 1916. As a result of the explosion the bottom of the after part of the engine room was blown out, and the whole compartment reduced to a mass of debris and broken steam and water pipes.

Immediately after the explosion Joyce and Kimber proceeded to the engine room, the former having just come off watch. The latter had just left the boiler room, after he had seen that the oil-burners were shut off and everything was in order, and had sent his hands on deck.

Hearing the sound of moans coming from inside the engine room, they both attempted to enter it by the foremost hatch and ladder.

As the heat in the engine room was intense and volumes of steam were coming up forward, they then lifted one of the square ventilating hatches further aft on the top of the engine room casing (port side) and climbed into the rapidly flooding compartment over the steam pipes, which were extremely hot.

Scrambling over the debris, they discovered well over on the starboard side Stoker Petty Officer Smith, with his head just out of the water.

A rope was lowered from the upper deck, and with great difficulty Smith, who was en-

tangled in fractured pipes and other wreckage, was hauled up alive.

At the same time Stoker Petty Officer Powell was found floating in the water on the port side of the engine room. The rope was lowered again and passed around Powell, who, however, was found to be dead on reaching the deck.

The water was so high that further efforts to discover the remaining Artificer left in the engine room would have been useless, and the attempt had to be abandoned.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Amendment of Article 4 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908.*

1. Article 4 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908 and Form B therein mentioned are hereby revoked, and the following Article and the Form therein mentioned are substituted therefor but not so as to affect the operation of any existing Notice served under the revoked Article:—

*“ Provision for placing premises under Movement Restrictions.*

4.—(1.) For the purpose of preventing the spread of disease an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form B set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) on the occupier of any premises defined in the Notice on which the Inspector has reason to believe that there is, or recently has been, either a diseased or suspected pig, or a pig which has been exposed to infection, or the dung of a diseased or suspected pig, or some other possible source of infection, and thereupon movement of swine into or out of such premises shall by reason of such Notice become subject to the Rules contained in Article 5 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908 until the expiration of such period not exceeding twenty-eight days from the date of the service of the Notice as is therein specified.

(2.) A Notice so served by an Inspector of the Board may be modified so as to remain in force until the restrictions thereby imposed are withdrawn in manner hereinafter provided.

(3.) A Notice under this Article may be served on the occupier of any premises immediately after the withdrawal of a Notice (Form A) under such last-mentioned Order declaring part thereof to be an Infected Place.

(4.) The restrictions imposed by a Notice under this Article may at any time be withdrawn by a further Notice (Form C) signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, and served on the occupier of the premises.

(5.) The Inspector shall with all practicable speed send copies of any Notice served by him under this Article to the Local Authority and to the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District.”

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

(a) The movement must be authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board;

(b) The movement must be direct to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse and not elsewhere, and the bacon factory or

slaughterhouse must be specified in the licence;

(c) The swine shall before movement be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long;

(d) During the movement the swine shall except while being moved by railway or vessel, be moved in a float, van or cart, and shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in the prescribed manner;

(e) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered;

(f) The licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station of the District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement;

(g) Swine while being moved for slaughter with a licence under these Rules shall not be subject to any restrictions on movement imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, or any Regulations made under the Swine-Fever Order of 1908.

Swine shall not be moved into the premises unless such movement is authorised by a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which such premises are situate or of the Board, and any swine so moved shall be kept separate from other swine on the premises for a period of twenty-eight days after their arrival.

The occupier of the premises shall forthwith give notice of the death or illness of any pig on the premises to an Inspector of the Local Authority, unless the cause of death or the illness is clearly not swine-fever.
