PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time, to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts, and the Place of holding any Court, and to order by what name and in what Towns and Places a Court shall be held in any District:

His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the 1st day of July, 1917, so much of the Parish of Eltham as lies east of the River Quaggy shall be transferred from the Greenwich District of the County Court of Kent holden at Greenwich and Woolwich, to the Woolwich District of the said County Court.

REGULATION OF AMERICAN EXCHANGE.

Deposit of Securities with the Treasury.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury announce that until further notice no further securities will be accepted for deposit except securities which are subject to the Special Income Tax of 2s. in the \pounds , but which have not yet appeared in any requisition order under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

Any securities approved for deposit before the date of this announcement will be accepted if lodged not later than 31st May, 1917.

The Treasury is still desirous, notwithstanding the closure of the deposit scheme, of purchasing outright American and Canadian Dollar Securities suitable for sale in the United States of America, and holders of such securities (whether they have appeared in previous lists or not) are invited to communicate with the American Dollar Securities Committee, 19, Old Jewry, E.C., from whom quotations may be obtained.
