At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 19th day of *May*, 1917.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed 1,500 persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rec-

tory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the Principal Outer Door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Arch-

bishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 29th day of March, 1917, in the words following:—

“ We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

“ That the Right Reverend Charles, Lord Bishop of Oxford, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Vicarage of Bampton Proper, and the Vicarage of Bampton Lew, both in the County of Oxford, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

“ That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St. Peter in Exeter, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to both the said Benefices of Bampton Proper and Bampton Lew, have consented to the proposed Union:

“ That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the Principal Outer Door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, against such Union, and no such cause has been shown:

“ The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Oxford, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in writing of the said Patrons, and the Copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

“ And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

“ RANDALL, CANTUAR.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Vicarage of Bampton Proper, situate in the County and Diocese of Oxford, and the Vicarage of Bampton Lew, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the “ Statutory List ” should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by Paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List, consolidating all previous Lists, was published on the 27th April, 1917 (The Consolidating List No. 25a), which, together with List No. 26 of 11th May, 1917, and the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Super-

intendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country or in any country in the group with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 6th March and concluded on the 8th May, 1917, the following Verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

Wz, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold and silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint, from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of

gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took ten coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to eighty sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus one thousandth of an ounce (+ .001 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two hundred-thousandth (or + .00002), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then melted the said silver coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended, was minus fifty-five hundred-thousandths (or - .00055), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue four half-crowns, three florins, three shillings, one sixpence, and one threepence, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that

such half-crowns weighed respectively, the first 217.821 grains, the second 218.376 grains, the third 218.637 grains, and the fourth 218.002 grains; that such florins weighed respectively, the first 174.303 grains, the second 174.867 grains, and the third 174.407 grains; that such shillings weighed respectively, the first 87.375 grains, the second 87.051 grains, and the third 87.232 grains; that such sixpence weighed 43.602 grains, and that such threepence weighed 21.730 grains. We then assayed the said four half-crowns, the said three florins, the said three shillings, the said sixpence, and the said threepence separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crowns to be, the first 925.0, the second 924.7, the third 924.1, and the fourth 925.1; of such florins to be, the first 924.8, the second 923.6, and the third 923.9; of such shillings to be, the first 924.9, the second 924.7, and the third 924.3; of such sixpence to be 923.8, and of such threepence to be 924.4.

No claims not put forward within the time specified will be entertained by the Ministry of Marine.

The Conseil des Prises has been seized with jurisdiction in matters relating to the capture of the following German and Austro-Hungarian vessels. (Here follows the above list.)

GOODS EX ENEMY SHIPS IN ITALIAN PORTS.

His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome the following translation of a Royal Decree (No. 626), dated March 29th last, and published in the Italian Official Gazette of April 27:—

Article 1.

When it is necessary to discharge ships which are to be placed at the disposal of the State Administration, the captain of the port will, by registered letter, notify the captain and the owner and his representative that he must make provision therefor within a time-limit to be fixed in each case.

On the expiration of this time-limit, or immediately in case of urgency, the captain of the port, in agreement with the Royal Customs Authorities, will take the necessary steps, taking care that the goods are sorted and kept in depôts or warehouses.

The portion of the goods which is not requisitioned by the State Administrations must be handed over by the Royal Customs Authorities to those persons who shall prove that they have a right thereto, and that they have paid any charges due on the goods.

Article 2.

If persons demanding the consignment of the goods are for special reasons unable to present all the documents required, or if they consider the conditions made for the issue of

any of these documents excessive, they may apply for an arbitration commission to be established, when necessary, at the office of the captain of the port by the Minister of Maritime and Railway Transports.

The Commission is to consist of a presiding judge, an official from the Port Office, and a representative of the Chamber of Commerce, appointed by the Minister of Maritime and Railway Transports at the proposal respectively of the president of the Tribunal, the captain of the port and the president of the Chamber of Commerce.

After examining the documents and hearing the views of the Royal Customs Authorities, and where thought fit, after a summary interrogation of the interested parties, the Commission may order the goods to be handed over on payment of a fixed sum or production of a suitable guarantee.

In such case the Commission will determine the conditions and terms of the deposit or guarantee.

The Commission can also order the sale of the goods and deposit of the price.

The Royal Customs Authorities, after having verified the execution of the Commission's orders, will give immediate effect to its decision.

No appeal or action against the decision of the Commission is admitted.

Rights of the respective parties to be made good before the competent authorities are reserved.

Article 3.

Goods not withdrawn within 60 days of the announcement in the Official Notices of the Province of the discharge of the ship may be sold by public auction, and if no sale ensues there, privately by the Royal Customs Authorities.

Consignments of goods under 2,000 lire in value will always be sold privately.

The Royal Customs Authorities will deposit in the Deposits and Loans Caisse for the account of the person to whom it belongs the sum obtained after deduction of freight, expenses and dues owing to the Administration, not including import duty.

In cases falling under the second paragraph of Article 2 sale can be effected after the expiration of the time-limit fixed by the Commission.

Article 4.

The expenses to be deducted from the price, which are to be paid at the time of handing over the goods on which they are due, are those for discharging, delays on board ship, transport to and arrangement in the depôts and warehouses, transport, warehousing, withdrawal and insurance on board ship or in the warehouses, and any other expense incurred in conservation, protection and sale of the goods discharged from the ship.

Article 5.

Before handing over or selling the goods the captain of the port will inform the Ministry of War in order to enable requisition to be made when desirable on account of that Ministry or for other civil or military administrations.

For all the purposes of requisition the captain of the port is considered the de facto possessor of the goods to which Article 1 refers.

Article 6.

On completion of the requisition, the captain of the port will compile a list of the goods requisitioned with the necessary indications to distinguish them, and the price fixed and the name of the Administration on whose account they have been requisitioned.

The list will be published in the Official Notices of the Province and exhibited at the Office of the port.

Article 7.

The indemnity for requisition will be paid, after deduction of the expenses, to the person to whom goods would have been handed over according to paragraph 2 of Article 1.

In case of doubt or controversy, or if the indemnity is not accepted, it will be paid, after deduction of the expenses, into the Deposits and Loans Caisse to the account of the person to whom it belongs.

Payment in this manner can similarly be made if within the period prescribed under Article 9 no one appears to claim the indemnity.

Article 8.

Whoever claims an indemnity for requisition, if the conditions of the first part of Article 2 apply, may apply to the Commission established there, which will arrange for the deposit or payment of the sum fixing the appropriate guarantees according to the conditions and for the effects provided in the same article.

Article 9.

The period of 60 days fixed in the first part of the Sole Article of the Decree of August 27, 1916, No. 1119, begins, for the purposes of the same Decree, from the time of the publication of the list in the Official Notices of the Province, provided for in Article 6.

It lies with the Administration on whose account the requisition is made to apply for the constitution of an arbitration college in the sense of Article 2 of the Decree of October 30, 1915, No. 1570.

Article 10.

The application of the present Decree does not prejudice regulations in force for the subjects of enemy States or States allied with the enemy, and for the exercise of the right of Prize.

Article 11.

The Minister of Maritime and Railway Transports, in concert with the Ministers of Foreign Affairs, Finance and War, will issue regulations for the execution of the present Decree.

Article 12.

The regulations referred to in the present Decree are issued by the officials of the Port Office and of the Royal Customs without any responsibility on their part or that of the public Administration, and without prejudice to the reciprocal rights of the parties.

Article 13.

The present Decree is also applicable to goods disembarked before this date from ships placed at the disposal of the Administration of the State.

In such cases the time limit fixed by Article 3 begins from the date of publication of the Decree.

As regards requisitions effected before the enforcement of the present Decree, the arrangements of the Sole Article of the above-mentioned Decree of August 27, 1916, hold good.

Article 14.

The present Decree will take effect from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.

The Orders contained in Admiralty War Instructions for British Merchant Ships or in any instructions or advice, confidential or otherwise, issued or given to Masters of vessels by British or Allied Naval Officers, or by other duly authorised Officers or Officials, as to routes to be taken and other precautions to be observed to avoid capture or destruction by the enemy, are to be observed even when they are in conflict with the provisions of the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea, and every vessel observing such regulations, instructions or advice shall be deemed to be taking measures to meet "special circumstances"

within the meaning of Article 27 of the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling them, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following Order:—

1. *Anchor Lights.*—No electrically-lit lanterns are to be employed as anchor lights. The normal brilliancy of all anchor lanterns is to be reduced by 50 per cent.

All anchor lanterns are to be fitted with overhead screens, so arranged as to cut off the light at an angle of between 20 and 25 degrees above the horizontal.

Note.—Specimen screens can be viewed at the Board of Trade Surveyors' Offices at Leith, North Shields, Hull, London, Plymouth, Cardiff, Liverpool, Glasgow and Dublin.

2. *Bow and Masthead Steaming Lights.*—Vessels in estuaries, harbours, anchorages and channels, where navigation in the dark hours is permitted, are not to employ electrically-lit lanterns as bow or steaming lights, with the exception of those vessels especially mentioned in paragraph 5.

3. *Other Lights.*—No light, either aloft, on deck or below, except those authorised by the Admiralty Confidential Instructions, and such as may be necessary for authorised signalling purposes, are to be permitted to be visible from outboard. This applies to vessels whether under way or at anchor.

4. The above order applies to vessels of every description other than H.M. ships, and the vessels mentioned in the succeeding paragraph, in the waters of the United Kingdom.

5. Vessels carrying volatile oil or spirits in bulk are, notwithstanding the above orders, to exhibit (in lieu of oil lamps) electrically-lit lanterns not exceeding in brilliancy 50 per cent. of the brilliancy of the normal oil lamps.

The Admiralty Order as to Ships' Lights dated 14th October, 1916, is hereby cancelled.

RULES FOR NAVAL AIRSHIP STATIONS.

Under the "Defence of the Realm Regulations."

RULES FOR SECURING THE SAFETY OF AIRSHIP STATIONS CONTROLLED BY AND UNDER THE CHARGE OF THE ADMIRALTY.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Regulation 35A of the "Defence of the Realm Regulations," the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following rules:—

1. *Application.*—These rules shall apply to every person employed or being in any such Station, and shall have effect over the whole area of the Station, except only such areas or buildings (if any) as are expressly excepted by the order of the Officer in charge of the Station.

The posting of these Rules conspicuously in or at the entrance to the Station shall be deemed to be notice of their contents to all persons concerned.

2. *Smoking.*—No person shall smoke within any such Station except as authorised by the Officer in charge of the Station or by the Station Rules.

3. *Tobacco, etc.*—No person shall bring into, or have in his possession while within any "danger building" or "danger area," any cigar, cigarette, tobacco, pipe or contrivance for smoking except as authorised by the Officer in charge of the Station or by the Station Rules.

4. *Matches, Lights, etc.*—No person shall bring into any "danger building" or "danger area," or have in his possession whilst within the same, any match or apparatus for producing a light, or any lamp, light or fire of any description, except as authorised by the Officer in charge of the Station or by the Station Rules.

NOTE.—*Danger Buildings and Areas.*—All danger buildings and areas under Rules (3) and (4) will be marked by notice boards displaying the sign "Danger Building (or Area).—No Matches, Tobacco, etc."

5. *Searching.*—Any Police Constable and anyone authorised by the Officer in charge of the Station may search at any time any person entering or being within the Station, and may examine such person's clothing and any bag, basket, parcel or other article carried by him, and any person entering or being within the Station shall, if so required by any such Police Constable or any authorised person, submit to being searched and comply with any reasonable directions or regulation given or made with the object of enabling the search to be carried out. Provided that in no case shall any female be searched by or in the presence of anyone but a female person.

6. *Intoxication.*—No person in a state of intoxication shall be or shall be allowed to enter or to remain within the Station.

Any person failing to comply with the above rules will be guilty of an offence against the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations," and liable on summary conviction to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding £100, or both.
