Privy Council Office, 5th June, 1917. UNIVERSITY OF LONDON ACT, 1898.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the above-named Act, that the following amendment of Statute 62 of the Statutes of the University of London has been made by the Senate, and that copies of the amended Statute can be obtained on application to the Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W. 7.

Statute 62 of the Statutes of the University to be amended by adding thereto a Proviso, the said Statute as so amended running as follows:---

"62. The members of the several Faculties shall continue to be such members so long as they respectively continue to be Teachers of the University. Provided always that a member of a Faculty shall be permitted to resign such membership."
