By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom, from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the list contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such list being therein referred to as "the Statutory List":

And whereas by section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any list of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation has been

varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident,
carrying on business or being in the United
Kingdom are prohibited from having with any
person or firm mentioned in this List, or in
any List issued under the Trading with the
Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916,
No. 3, any dealings other than such as are
expressly authorised by Paragraph 5 of the
Proclamation. A List, consolidating all pre-
vious Lists, was published on the 27th April,
1917 (The Consolidating List No. 25a), which,
together with Lists No. 26 & 27 of 11th & 25th
May, 1917, respectively, and the List here-
with annexed, contains all the names which up
to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists
will be published at intervals approximately of
two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London
Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade
Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may
be obtained at a small cost from the Superin-
tendent of Publications, His Majesty's
Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway,
W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm men-
tioned in the List has more than one address in
the country or group of countries under which
the name of the person or firm appears, all
dealings in that country or in any country in
the group with such person or firm are pro-
hibited, even in cases where one only of the
addresses or one only of the countries is speci-
fically mentioned.

* NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the
Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25
June, and 10 November, 1915, with any per-
son or firm of enemy nationality resident or
carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia,
Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa.
Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are
therefore prohibited from trading with any
person or firm of enemy nationality in any of
those countries, even though such person or firm
is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as
possible any inconvenience which may be caused

to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

SUGAR CONFECTIONERY

and

FOOD PRESERVING TRADE

(Great Britain).

PROPOSAL TO VARY CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS IN THE SUGAR CONFECTIONERY AND FOOD PRESERVING TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act, by the Board

of Trade, and dated the 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for certain branches of the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 23rd December, 1913, hereby give notice as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that they propose to vary the following minimum time rates of wages for female workers at present fixed and set out in their Notices dated 7th June, 1915, 14th August, 1916, and 29th May, 1917, as follows:—

Female Workers.

1. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and upwards (and others to whose employment the minimum rate of 16s. 3d. per week is applicable under the terms of Section I. of Schedule 1 of the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated the 29th May, 1917), from 16s. 3d. to 19s. 6d. per week.

2. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months and cannot suitably be engaged on piece work and to whom the Trade Board shall have issued a certificate on the ground that the employment is not merely temporary or seasonal, from 14s. to 17s. 6d. per week.

3. For Female Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 13s. to 16s. per week.

4. For Female Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 11s. to 13s. per week.

5. For Female Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 8s. to 10s. per week.

6. For Female Workers under 15 years of age, from 6s. 6d. to 7s. per week.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the following minimum time rates of wages for male workers at present fixed, and set out in their Notices of 7th June, 1915, and 29th May, 1917, as follows:—

Male Workers.

1. For Male Workers of 24 years of age and upwards (and those to whose employment the minimum rate of 30s. 4d. per week is applicable under the terms of Section I of the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated the 29th May, 1917), from 30s. 4d. to 34s. 8d. per week.

2. For Male Workers of 22 and under 24 years of age, from 28s. 2d. to 31s. per week.

3. For Male Workers of 22 years of age and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months and who cannot suitably be engaged on piece work and to whom the Trade Board shall have issued a certificate on the ground that the employment is not merely temporary or seasonal, from 25s. to 28s. per week.

4. For Male Workers of 21 and under 22 years of age, from 25s. to 28s. per week.

5. For Male Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, from 22s. to 25s. per week.

6. For Male Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, from 19s. to 22s. per week.

7. For Male Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, from 16s. to 19s. per week.

8. For Male Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 13s. to 16s. per week.

9. For Male Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 10s. to 13s. per week.

10. For Male Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, from 8s. to 10s. per week.

11. For Male Workers under 15 years of age, from 6s. 6d. to 7s. per week.

The above proposals are on the basis of a week of 52 hours, the rates being subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less or more than 52.

No variation is proposed in respect of the other provisions of the above-mentioned Notices issued by the Trade Board, dated the 7th June, 1915, 14th August, 1916 and 29th May, 1917.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to vary which may be lodged with them within three months from 4th June, 1917. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon-factory or slaughter-house in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

A licence under this Order shall for the pur-

poses of the above-mentioned Order of 1908 be treated as a licence under that Order.
