**W**HEREAS by Articles Eleven and Twelve of an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the Twenty-second day of November, 1913, and known as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1913, provision was made for the administration of the Government of the said Protectorate in the absence of the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Articles and to make further and other provision in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of

His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1917.

II. The Eleventh and Twelfth Articles of the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1913, are hereby repealed and revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the said Order shall, from the date of the coming into operation of this Order, be construed and take effect as if, instead of the Eleventh and Twelfth Articles, the following Articles had been inserted therein:—

“XI. Whenever and so often as the Governor is absent from the seat of Government, or is absent in the Colony, or on a passage between any places in Nigeria, or is in any of the territories adjacent to or near to Nigeria in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, he may continue to exercise and shall be deemed to be capable of exercising all and every the powers vested in him by this Order in Council or by any Instructions from His Majesty; and may by an instrument under the

Public Seal appoint any person or persons to be his Deputy or Deputies within any part or parts of the Protectorate during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities by this Order in Council or otherwise vested in the Governor as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided nevertheless that by the appointment of a Deputy or Deputies as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time hereafter think proper to direct."

"XII. Whenever the Office of Governor is vacant, or if the Governor is absent from the Protectorate, or becomes incapable, or is from any cause prevented from acting in the duties of his Office, then such person as may be appointed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, or if there be no such person so appointed, or if such person be absent from Nigeria or unable to act, then the senior Member of the Executive Council present for the time being in Nigeria shall, during His Majesty's pleasure, administer the government of the Protectorate, first taking the Oaths hereinbefore directed to be taken by the Governor, and in the manner herein prescribed, which being done, the acting Governor is hereby authorised, empowered, and commanded to do and execute, during His Majesty's pleasure, all things that belong to the Office of Governor according to the tenour of this Order and according to His Majesty's Instructions and the Laws of the Protectorate; provided that the Governor, whenever and so often as he is in the Colony, or on a passage between any places in Nigeria, or is in any of the territories adjacent to or near to Nigeria in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by Us, shall not be considered to be absent from the Protectorate within the meaning of this Order in Council."

III. This Order shall come into operation on the First day of June, 1917, and shall be published in the Government Gazette, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such a manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Protectorate of Nigeria.

IV. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Walter Hume Long, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of June, 1917, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and

Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under existing Regulations the pensions payable to Warrant Officers, Class 2, and Non-commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines are restricted by maximum rates fixed with reference to the normal period of service of 21 years:

"And whereas in the present emergency a large number of such Warrant Officers and Non-commissioned Officers are being retained for further service beyond the completion of the term of 21 years under the provisions of the Royal Marine Acts of 1914 and 1916, Cap. 16, 5 George V., and Cap. 23, 6 and 7 George V.:

"And whereas the existence of the maximum rates will, in many cases, preclude such Warrant Officers and Non-commissioned Officers from obtaining any increase of pension in respect of such additional service:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the maximum rates should be increased to enable additional time served in consequence of the present War, amounting to at least one year, to carry with it the benefit of increase of pension:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following increases in the existing maxima as shown in Article 1198 of the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, such increases to be applicable to all cases in which the period of 21 years' service has been completed since the 4th August, 1914, and in which the total service is at least 22 years:—

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council of the 19th May, 1917:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 19th day of May, 1917, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

Omit Paragraphs 1 and 4:

In Paragraph 2, for the words “*Regulation*

2.R” there shall be substituted the words “*Regulation 2. O*”; for the figures “1906,” wherever the same occur, there shall be substituted the figures “1908”; and for the words “*section three*” there shall be substituted the words “*section seven*.”

In Paragraph 7, for the words “*Regulation 42C*,” there shall be substituted the words “*Regulation 42B*.”

WHEREAS by Section 7 of the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, No. 2, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make Regulations with respect to the establishment of Professional Committees to deal with claims for exemption made by duly qualified Medical Practitioners, and with respect to the reference to such Committees of applications by duly qualified Medical Practitioners for certificates of exemption:

And whereas by Order in Council of the 7th day of July, 1916, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Regulations contained in the Military Service (Professional Committees Regulations) Order, 1916, (made under Section 7 of the Military Service Act, 1916 (Session 2),) should be the Regulations made under the powers contained in Section 7 of the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, No. 2, subject to the modifications therein contained:

And whereas by Order of His Majesty in Council of the 19th day of May, 1917, the Military Service (Professional Committees Regulations) Order, 1916, has been in certain respects amended, and it is expedient to amend the same in its application to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that the Regulations contained in the Order in Council of the 19th May, 1917, amending the Military Service (Professional Committees Regulations) Order, 1916, shall be further Regulations made under the powers contained in Section 7 of the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, No. 2, subject to the following modification:—

Omit Article 1.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled “The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation,

1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by Paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List consolidating all previous Lists was published on the 22nd June, 1917 (The Consolidating List No. 29A), which together with the List herewith annexed contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

† NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

\*NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June and 10 November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

§ NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under Berg and Komeet respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

WHEREAS by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on Him by section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, as extended by section one of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, and section one of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1915, His Majesty was pleased to issue a Proclamation dated the 25th day of June, 1915, declaring that the exportation of the articles mentioned in the second column of the Schedule to that Proclamation is prohibited to the country named in the first column of the said Schedule unless those articles are consigned to the persons referred to in the third column of the said Schedule:

And whereas by section two of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, any Proclamation made under section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may be varied or added to whilst a state of war exists by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by an Order of Council dated the 7th day of October, 1915, the said Proclamation of the 25th day of June, 1915, was amended by the substitution of a new Schedule for the Schedule to that Proclamation:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation dated the 25th day of June, 1915, as amended, should be further amended by the substitution for the Schedule to that Proclamation, as amended, of the following Schedule:—

#### THE COAL TRANSPORT ORDER, 1917.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED THE 4TH  
JULY, 1917, AND MADE UNDER REGULATIONS  
2F TO 2JJ AND 9G OF THE DEFENCE OF THE  
REALM REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on them  
by Regulations 2F to 2JJ and 9G of the Defence  
of the Realm Regulations and all other powers  
enabling them in that behalf, the Board of  
Trade hereby order as follows:—

1. With a view to effecting economies in  
transport and of facilitating the supply of coal  
such restrictions may be placed on the transport  
of coal from particular areas or particular col-  
lieries in the United Kingdom to particular  
areas or particular destinations as the Board of  
Trade may from time to time consider neces-  
sary, and when such restrictions are so placed  
it shall be the duty of every person affected  
thereby to comply with the requirements of  
the Board of Trade for the purposes of giving  
effect thereto.

2. Contracts for the sale of coal shall be  
abrogated to such extent and as from such dates  
as may be deemed by the Board of Trade to be  
necessary in order to secure compliance with  
their requirements under this Order.

3. The requirements of the Board of Trade  
under this Order shall be notified in the form  
of directions issued from time to time by the

Controller of Coal Mines. Such directions  
may relate to any or all of the following  
matters:—

(a) The restriction or discontinuance of  
the transport of coal from particular areas or  
particular collieries to particular areas or  
particular destinations, either absolutely or  
by any specified method of transport or other-  
wise than by such method of transport as may  
be specified.

(b) The contracts which are to be re-  
garded as abrogated with a view to facilitat-  
ing compliance with such directions.

(c) Furnishing information by and to such  
parties and in such forms as may be specified  
in the directions.

(d) Any other matters for which provision  
may be necessary for the purpose of this  
Order.

4. Infringements of this Order are summary  
offences, subject to penalties under the Defence  
of the Realm Regulations.

5. This Order may be cited as the Coal  
Transport Order, 1917.

over the age of 16, during their second six  
months of employment, from 9s. to 10s. 6d.  
per week.
7. For Female Workers other than  
Learners, from 13s. 6d. to 15s. 9d. per week.

##### *Male Workers.*

1. For Male Learners of under 15 years of  
age, from 6s. 9d. to 7s. 6d. per week.
2. For Male Learners of 15 and under 16  
years of age, from 9s. to 10s. per week.
3. For Male Learners of 16 and under 17  
years of age, from 11s. 3d. to 12s. 6d. per week.
4. For Male Learners of 17 and under 18  
years of age, from 13s. 6d. to 15s. 6d. per week.
5. For Male Learners of 18 and under 19  
years of age, from 15s. 9d. to 18s. 6d. per week.
6. For Male Learners of 19 and under 20  
years of age, from 18s. to 21s. per week.
7. For Male Learners of 20 and under 21  
years of age, from 21s. to 25s. per week.

8. For Male Workers other than Learners, from 24s. 9d. to 29s. 3d. per week.

The minimum rates are based on a week of 54 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less or more than 54.

### DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE SOUTHERN MILITARY AND TRANSPORT AREA.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order shall apply to so much of the Southern Military and Transport Area as comprises the Borough and Petty Sessional Division of Andover, in the County of Southampton, so much of the Petty Sessional Division of Warminster, in the County of Wilts, as lies to the North East of the Great Western Railway line from Salisbury to Trowbridge, and the Parishes of Chute, Chute Forest, Ludgershall, North Tidworth, Collingbourne Ducis, Collingbourne Kingston, Everley, Fittleton, Figheldean, Milston, Netheravon, Upavon, Enford, Tilshead, Bulford, Cholderton, Newton Tony, Amesbury, Wilsford, Durrington, Shrewton, Orcheston St. Mary, Orcheston St. George, Rolleston, Winterbourne Stoke, Maddington, Berwick St. James, Steeple Langford and Stapleford in the County of Wilts.

2. After paragraph (d) of Article 3 of the Order of the Board now in force in the Area, and made on the seventeenth day of February, 1916, the following paragraph shall be added:

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 2 (1) of this Order, no person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any spirits to be consumed

on the premises or consume or permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any spirits except between the hours of 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. on weekdays and between the hours of 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. on Sundays.

And the said Article shall be read as if the foregoing paragraph were inserted therein.

3. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises in the above-mentioned part of the area shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order.

4. This Order shall come into force on the eleventh day of July 1917.

**ARMY COUNCIL ORDER**  
**SHEEP AND LAMB SKINS.**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council do hereby order that all persons engaged in the purchase, sale or manufacture of Sheep and Lamb Skins, taken from Sheep or Lambs killed in Great Britain, including Slink Lambs and Morts, or any article wholly or partly manufactured therefrom, shall comply with the following regulations:—

(1) Save as hereinafter specifically excepted, no fellmonger shall without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts hold any Skins of the descriptions aforesaid (other than those from Slink Lambs) for a period exceeding three weeks after the receipt by him of the Woolled Skins, but all fell-

mongers shall deliver such skins as aforesaid duly fellmongered to a Tanner or Dresser within the said period.

Provided that no person shall without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, fellmonger, sell or deliver any Shearling Skins of the descriptions aforesaid which would when fellmongered produce an Extra Pelt, but shall salt them immediately on receipt thereof, and keep them for inspection by a person authorised by the Director of Army Contracts. Such skins shall be re-salted within 7 days of the receipt thereof, and if they have not been inspected within 14 days of such receipt, application shall be made to the Director of Army Contracts for permission to fellmonger them.

(2) All Fellmongers and/or Tanners shall grade all Pelts of the descriptions aforesaid on the same principles and according to the same standards of assortment as those generally prevailing in the trade prior to April 9th, 1917.

The Classification shall be as follows:—

(a) *Sheep Pelts.*

1. English, Extras, Firsts, Seconds, Thirds.

2. Scotch, Primes, Light Primes, Seconds.

(b) *Lamb Pelts.*

1. English, Supers, Firsts, Seconds.

2. Scotch, Primes, Seconds.

In the event of any dispute as to the classification, the determination of the Director of Army Contracts shall be final.

(3) Any person having in his possession any skins, pelts or basils of the description aforesaid which he cannot put into work for manufacture into basils or finished leather within 30 days of the date hereof, or of the receipt by him of the Woolled Skins, which ever period shall be the longer, shall forthwith notify the Director of Army Contracts.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:—

##### (1) *Pentland and Moray Firths—Restriction of Traffic; Pilotage Regulations.*

The following regulations have been made with a view to safeguarding the interests of shipping in the Pentland and Moray firths:—

##### I.—RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.

1. No vessel, either British, Allied or Neutral, is to be in the area shaded on the accompanying portion of Admiralty Chart No. 2, from half an hour after sunset to half an hour before sunrise, unless at anchor. No vessel, however, is to anchor:—

(a) Anywhere along the coast between Tarbet ness and North Sutor, except within one mile radius of Balintore;

(b) Anywhere off the south shore of the Moray firth between the meridians of Port Gordon and Burghead, except within three-quarters of a mile of the low-water mark;

(c) Outside a distance of one mile of the coast in any other portion of the area shaded.

2. Vessels proceeding to ports in the Moray Firth should therefore endeavour to enter the firth in time to reach their destinations not later than half an hour after sunset. Should they not reach their destinations by that time they are to anchor, weather permitting, subject to the restrictions given in clause 1.

3. Any vessel contravening the foregoing regulations will run the gravest risk of being sunk.

*Caution.*—Neutral or Allied vessels are particularly warned that the passage through the Pentland Firth presents very grave risks to a Westbound vessel and are strongly advised not to take it.

##### II.—PILOTAGE REGULATIONS.

Pilotage is compulsory at the undermentioned ports for all vessels (including fishing vessels) which have a draught of over eight feet, and it is, highly dangerous for any vessel to enter or leave such ports without a pilot. Fishing and other small vessels having a draught of over eight feet are to assemble at the Pilotage stations, and will be conducted into and out of port in groups.

1. Vessels bound for Cromarty and Inverness will be led through the defences from a position off Tarbet ness by a pilot boat. They should follow directly astern of her.

Local arrangements for leading vessels through the defences will be made for vessels leaving Cromarty or Inverness.

2. It is dangerous for any vessel to be under way to the south-westward of a line joining Tarbet ness and Findhorn without a pilot.

3. No vessels of any description other than H.M. Ships and Auxiliaries are to be under way between sunset and sunrise in the waters contained between a line drawn from Tarbet ness to Findhorn, and a line drawn from Fort George to Chanonry point.

(2) Orkney Isles—Traffic Regulations.

I.—SCAPA FLOW AND APPROACHES.

1. All entrances are dangerous, and entry is absolutely prohibited by any of them except as provided in succeeding paragraphs.

2. Examination services have been established in the entrances to Hoxa and Hoy sounds; vessels directed to enter must communicate with the Examination vessel and follow the instructions received from her very carefully.

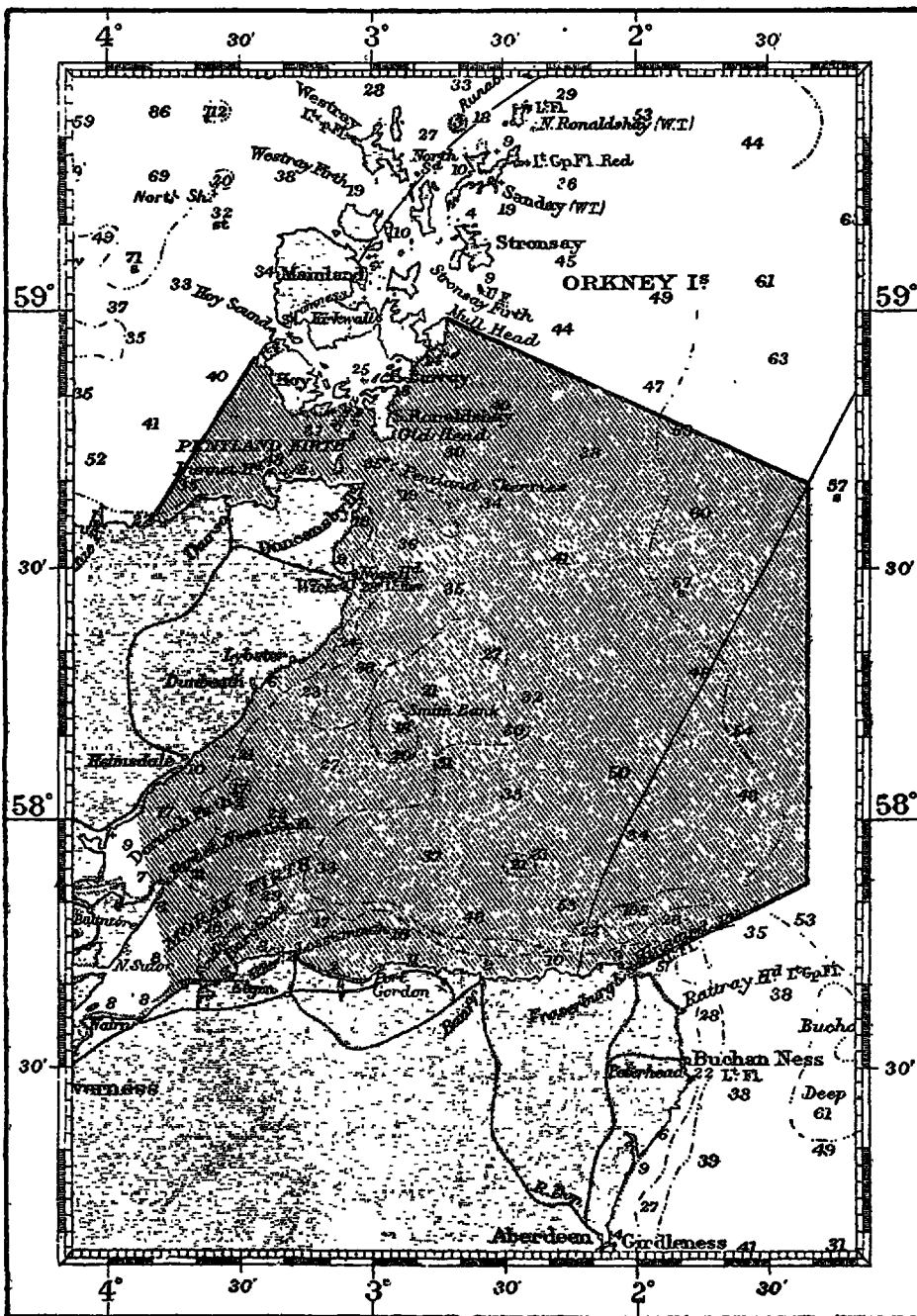
3. No vessel is permitted to approach the

enclosed waters of the Wide Firth and Kirkwall bay to westward of Thieves holm.

2. Merchant vessels shall obey all orders given them by the Admiralty Port Officer as regards anchoring or shifting position.

3. No vessel other than H.M. Ships shall enter or leave the Port of Kirkwall during hours of darkness, *i.e.*, between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise, except in special circumstances with special permission from the Admiralty Port Officer.

4. During foggy or thick weather, traffic in



entrance to Hoxa sound within a radius of 5 miles under any circumstances whatever, except when actually ordered to Scapa Flow.

4. The only vessels permitted to enter Hoy sound from the westward are those ordered to Stromness.

5. Vessels are not permitted to enter Hoxa or Hoy sounds by night or in thick weather.

6. Passage through Cantick sound is entirely prohibited.

II.—PORT OF KIRKWALL AND APPROACHES.

1. The Port of Kirkwall shall comprise all

and out of the port is stopped, and no vessel shall approach the boom from either direction.

5. No vessel (other than H.M. Ships) or boat shall move in the harbour during hours of darkness as aforesaid. And no boat other than those belonging to H.M. Ships shall approach the shore or go alongside any pier in the Port of Kirkwall.

6. All vessels other than H.M. Ships entering or leaving the Port of Kirkwall shall be piloted in and out by a Pilot drifter, and are prohibited from entering or leaving harbour unless so piloted, save and except only (1) in

the case of such British vessels as have a written exemption therefrom, issued by the Admiralty Port Officer, (2) when a liner is entering the harbour, the Pilot may at his discretion, when circumstances of tide and sea render it advisable, direct such liner to enter the harbour without being piloted, provided always that the gate is open for incoming traffic.

7. Vessels, when cleared, shall wait for the Pilot vessel to conduct them out of port.

8. Drifters engaged on pilot duty will fly the pilot flag (white and red, horizontal).

9. Incoming and outgoing traffic will be regulated by signals hoisted at the yardarm of the Boom trawler, and repeated at Hellier holm lighthouse.

10. Traffic signals are to be strictly obeyed, and no vessel shall approach the entrance against the signal.

11. The following Traffic signals will be displayed at the Boom and at Hellier holm:—

Gate "Open for Incoming Traffic":

By day—two balls, vertical.

By night—a red light.

Gate "Open for Outgoing Traffic":

By day—a cone, point upwards.

By night—a green light.

Gate Closed: By day—Three balls at Hellier holm.

By night—Three red lights at Hellier holm.

12. Vessels entering will, as a rule, be given priority over those leaving.

13. All outgoing vessels shall pass round the Turning buoy (red and white striped, spherical) moored approximately 285° (N. 56° W. Mag.), one mile from the entrance.

14. Incoming vessels will not pass round the Turning buoy, but will shape course as requisite for the anchorage on entering.

15. No outgoing vessel shall pass the Turning buoy, unless the signal for outgoing traffic is up. If the signal is against it, such vessel shall stop and wait in the neighbourhood of the Turning buoy.

16. No incoming vessel shall pass Hellier holm, unless the signal for incoming traffic is up at Hellier holm. If the signal is against it, such vessel shall wait in Shapinsay sound.

17. Incoming and outgoing vessels shall not pass through the gate simultaneously. If, through any misunderstanding, an outgoing and an incoming ship are approaching the gate simultaneously, then the outgoing ship shall give way, and shall turn round, and return to the Turning buoy, and there wait till such time as the entrance is clear.

18. As a rule only one ship will be conducted out at a time, but under exceptional circumstances, in the event of two ships being conducted out, then the pilot will give instructions as to which ship is to go first and the rear ship shall then keep a full half mile directly astern, and is on no account to close or overhaul or attempt to pass the ship ahead.

19. *Caution.*—Caution is necessary when approaching the boom, as the tidal stream does not set fairly through the opening and attains considerable velocity especially on the ebb or west-going stream, which sets in a north-westerly direction.

*Variation.*—19° W.

(3) *Shetland Isles*—Traffic of Neutral Vessels Prohibited.
