ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby give notice as follows, that is to say :—

1. That they have taken possession of all Raw Hides taken from Horses or Mules that may be in stock in the United Kingdom at the date hereof, provided that nothing herein contained shall refer to any Hides of the description aforesaid that may be in process of manufacture at the date hereof.

2. That they intend to take possession of all Raw Hides that may after the date hereof be taken from Horses or Mules until further notice.

If after this notice any person having control of any Hides of the description aforesaid sells, removes or secretes such Hides without the consent of the Army Council, or deals with them in any way contrary to any conditions imposed in any licence, permit or order that may have been granted in respect thereof, he shall be guilty of an offence against the said Regulation.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Female Writing Assistant in certain Public Departments in London, will be held in London, Bristol, Leeds, Edinburgh, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Dublin, Belfast, Cork and Londonderry, commencing on the 20th September, 1917, under the Regulations dated the 27th April, 1917, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.
