The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 12th day of July, 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the Parish of Withington, in the County of Gloucester, now vested in us:

“Whereas under and by virtue of the two Indentures, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, the lands tenements and hereditaments situate in the

Parish of Withington aforesaid, and particularly described in the same Indentures and Schedule, became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us:

“And whereas none of the said lands tenements and hereditaments are subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

“And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands tenements and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands tenements and hereditaments, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and

empowered, by Instrument or Instruments in writing duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands tenements and hereditaments, so vested in us as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said Indentures or either of them, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as

occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rentcharges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other Public Securities in England.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Gloucester.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid

before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 14th day of June, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Matthew, Grangetown, situate within the Parish of Eston, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of York:

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Eston, and of the Parish of Wilton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lies contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parishes:

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Eston, and of the said Parish of Wilton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical

purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Matthew, Grangetown, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, as Bishop of the Diocese, and also as Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Eston, and with the consent of John George Lowther, of Wilton Castle, Redcar, in the said County of York, a Captain in Your Majesty's Army, as Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Wilton, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Eston, and of the said Parish of Wilton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Matthew, Grangetown, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Grangetown.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Grangetown, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Eston, and of the Parish of Wilton, both in the County of York, and in the Diocese of York, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north-east by the Parish of Kirkleatham, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-west by the County and Diocesan Boundary in the Rives Tees, upon part of the south-west by the New Parish of Saint John, South Bank, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south-west, upon the south-east, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, South Bank, from the said Parish of Eston at the point where the Parliamentary Boundary of the Borough of Middlesbrough crosses the middle of Eston Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Eston Road for a distance of 35½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the level-crossing where the roadway leading to Eston Grange Farm House crosses the line of the Eston Branch Railway, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby passing to the south of the said farm house, crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Eston from the said Parish of Wilton, and also crossing Lackenby Lane) for a distance of 66 chains or thereabouts to a point where the fence forming the southern boundary of the Close numbered 1 upon the *Map or Plan* annexed to this Representation meets the eastern side of the stream known as Kettle Beck, and extending thence north-eastward along the said fence and along

the fences forming the southern boundaries of the Closes numbered 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, upon the said *Map or Plan* for a distance in all of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the southern boundary of the said Close numbered 6 meets the western side of Pasture Road, and extending thence, first north-eastward to the middle of Pasture Road, and then first north-westward, then north-eastward, and then again north-westward, along the middle of Pasture Road for a distance in all of 1 mile and 40 chains or thereabouts to the point south of its junction with the roadway leading to the house known as West Coatham Grange where it meets the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wilton from the said Parish of Kirkleatham."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

#### ALLIED AND NEUTRAL CARGOES EX ENEMY VESSELS SEIZED BY PORTUGAL.

With reference to the notification which appeared in the London Gazette of May 30th, 1916, respecting the release of such cargoes.

His Majesty's Minister at Lisbon reports that a Decree was published by the Portuguese Government on the 13th instant to the following effect:—

(1) Goods for which delivery orders had been issued by the enemy shipowners previous to the entry of Portugal into the War will on presentation of such delivery orders be released without the necessity of guarantees being given.

(2) Other goods will be released on presentation of a certificate from the Legation of the country concerned undertaking to indemnify the Portuguese Government until the expiration of one year after the conclusion of peace against all claims by shipowners, captains or third parties up to value of the goods plus one-third, and on payment by the owners of the local charges incurred.

(3) The period for claiming goods is finally extended till August 31st, 1917.

(4) All questions relative to the cargoes of the S.S. "India," "Damao," and "Pangim" (formerly the "Vorwaerts," "Brisbane," and "Numantia" respectively), will be decided by the Tribunal of Commerce of Mormugao.

With regard to paragraph (2) it is understood that the intervention of the Legation of the country concerned is not necessary in the case of claims admitted as good by the Procurator of the Republic, and in respect of which the latter has given orders for the delivery of the goods under no fixed guarantee; nor in the case of claims submitted after July 13th, the date of the Decree. In these cases a direct guarantee of the nature mentioned may be given by the cargo-owners themselves.

A translation of the Decree will as soon as received be published in the London Gazette.

**ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF MUNITIONS TAKING POSSESSION OF ALL IRON ORE MINES IN THE COUNTIES OF CUMBERLAND AND LANCASTER.**

Whereas under Regulation 9GG of the Defence of the Realm Regulations (which was inserted in those Regulations by Order in Council dated the 13th day of March, 1917, and is set out at the foot of this Order), the Minister of Munitions has power to apply that regulation to any metalliferous mines, or to any mines of stratified iron stone, not being coal mines:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Munitions, being of opinion that for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm, it is expedient that the said regulation should be applied to all iron ore mines in the counties of Cumberland and Lancaster, in the exercise of his powers under the said regulation and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders that from and after the 24th day of July, 1917, and until further notice, Regulation 9GG of the Defence of the Realm Regulations shall be applied to all iron ore mines in the counties of Cumberland and Lancaster.

9GG (1) Where the Minister of Munitions is of opinion that for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm it is expedient that this regulation should be applied to any metalliferous mines, or to any mines of stratified iron stone, shale, or fire clay, not being coal mines, or to any quarries, he may by order apply this regulation, subject to any exceptions for which provisions may be made in the order, to all or any of such mines or quarries, either generally or in any special area, or to any special mine or quarry.

(2) Any mine or quarry to which this regulation is so applied shall by virtue of the order pass into the possession of the Minister of Munitions as from the date of the order, or from any later date mentioned in the order; and the owner, agent, and manager of every such mine or quarry and every officer thereof, and where the owner of the mine is a company, every director of the company shall comply with the directions of the Minister of Munitions as to the management and user of the mine or quarry, and if

he fails to do so he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

(3) It is hereby declared that the possession by the Minister of Munitions under this regulation of any mine or quarry shall not affect any liability of the actual owner, agent or manager of the mine or quarry under the Coal Mines Acts, 1887 to 1914, or the Metalliferous Mines Regulation Acts, 1872 and 1875, or the Quarries Act, 1894, or the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, or any Act amending the same.

(4) Any order of the Minister of Munitions under this regulation may be revoked or varied as occasion requires.

#### RAFFIA (PRICES) ORDER, 1917.

No person shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, sell any Raffia arrived or to arrive in the United Kingdom at prices other than those set out in the Schedule hereto annexed; provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to any stock of Raffia of less than 2 cwt. or to any Raffia in respect of which any licence

may be or may have been granted by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

*Transfer of Area from one Scheduled Area to another.*

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the parish described in the First Schedule hereto shall, for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and any modification of such Order which applies to the Scheduled Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, form part of that Area, and cease to form part of any other Scheduled Area.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of July, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL  
IN ENGLAND.

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:
