### Weymouth & October 3.

Efferday was caft away upon the Beach of Fort. land a French fhip of Diep of about 70 Tuns with Ballaft from Doversbound for Rochelles the fhip was by the violence of the waves in little time Broken to pieces, but the men faved.

Lyme, Od. 3. The 29th paft arrived here the Hope of Weymouth from St. Malo's, informing us, that the day before their departure thenee there happened a great Barthquake; by which the people received much terror, but little or no damage.

Tarmonth, OH. 3. A ship of Weymouth of about 300 Tuns, laden from the Bastern parts with 1 arre, Iron, and Deals, unfortunately ran some dayes since upon the Sand called the Middle-grounds off Winserson, where she was cast away; part of her lading and all her men saved.

Rome, Septemb. 22. The 16th inftant dyed here Cardirial Panlo Emilio Rondanino, a Cresture of Pope Urban the 8th in the 51 year of his age and 25 of his Cardinalfhip, fo that a feventh place is now vacant in the Colledge at the difpolal of His Holínefs. His body was opened and ombowelled, and carried to the Church of St. Mary Upon Minerva where it lay in State on the Tuesday followingdrid was that Evening honourably interted in the prefence of the whole Co ledge.

This week the Pope has visited the Lateran Church with feveral others, in all which he has ordered 40 hours Prayers to be held with processions and other devotions to beg at bleffing upon the Christians in the defense of Candia.

Notice being given him that 2000 Germans were to be difmilled from the Spanish fervice in the Kingdom of Maples, the Nuncio has endeavoured to prevail with them to embark for *Candia*, having for their encouragement distributed among them a confiderable donative, for which the Pope himfelf advanced to thouland Crowns, Cardinal Rospigliofi 6000. and the Venculan Ambaliador 4000.

On Monday laft was held a Conliftory, wherein the Cardinal Projector proposed the leveral vacant Bishopricks under their care, according to the usual method.

The next morning departed hence Cardinal Sigifmundo Chigi for his Countrey of Siena.

Upon the applications of the Spanish Ambashadour, the Pope was pleased to grant to the Queen Regent of *Spain* a Licence of obliging the Ecclesiasticks to joyn with the Layety of *spain* for the raising of fome millions for the supply of the necessation of the raise of the terms of the term of the term of the spars.

On Monday last arrived from Rome a Courrier Extraordinary, bringing with him to the Numerio' the Ratification of all that has been concuded of for the comp fing of the Affairs of the Church, in refe ence to the Four Differing Biffrips, with a Bull approving of the manner of their figting the Formular. From Marsstelles we are a'vised, that Goo able soldiers which have been railed by the Venetian Ambashadour by vertue of the moneys advanced by His Majesty and the Duke of Lorsain, embarked the 27th past with their Officers for Candia, and 'ris believed the Volunteers which some dayes fince put to lea f om Thoulon for the same fervice, are by this much advanced on their way, the wind having ever fince terved them fairly.

The Marquis de Terne, Lieutenant General of His Majesties Gallies is here arrived in Post from Thouton, telling us that the three French Gallies lately emploied to Legora are returned with 350 Slaves who were formerly Janiaries, but now purchased at 200 Growns a piece, and are to be all put to the Chain in His Majesties Gallies.

On Monday next His Majefly intends to leave Chambourg and return to St. Germanns. His Maiefly having made choice of the Marquis de St. Andre Prefident of the Parliament of 1 auphine to be lent his Ambsfladour to the Republick of Venice, he is accordingly departed with a fplendid Train.

Francfort, Oftob. 6. Of the late engagement between the Forces of His Highnels the Prince Elector Palatine, and the Lorrainers, we have this farther account. That the faid Frince Elector having incelligence that the Count de Li lebonne, General of the Lorrain forces expected in few days a confiderable reinforcement, was willing to lay hold of the first opportunity of ingaging him before their arrival, to which purpose the 26th path, he ordered the body of his Horie to pais down from the Hill whereon his Army lay encamped between Spanheim and Dromersteim, and entring the Plain, drew them up in two divitions, his left wing was obferved to charge the Lorrainers with much courage, patting them into some diforder, and killing the Sieur de Chauviret, Major of the Prince de Vaudemonts Regiment, with leweral other Officers and many Soldiers : on the other fide the left wing of the Lorrainers prevailing, the Palatines were forced to give back, but rallied again at the foot of the hill, which place they made good till the reft of the Army was retired to their Camp : whilft the Horfe was thus emploied, Collonel Dofne and Lieutenant Collonel Spar, at the head of the Palatines Infantry, and feconded by feveral other able Officers ftormed a Redoubr which the Count de Lil ebonne had ordered to be caft up the night before upon a little hill encompassed with Vines, which was done with that vigor, that after a sharp dispute they beat out the Lorrainers, obliging them to fly to another Fort, leaving behind them two pieces of Canon, which the Palatizes drew off with them about an hundred p.c.s from the Work. But then the Lorrainers rallying, returned again and renued the Fight, which with frequent difcharges was continued for three hours; till the night approaching, both parties refumed their Posts, whe ein they continued that night. In this action the loss feemed most confiderable to the valatines for the number of men, as to the others for the quality, of which we have not yet a particular account. The Prince Eleftor finding a defect of water in his Camp, drew off the next day, and marched towards Frankendale. The Lorrainers have fince feiled on Ingleheim, forcing the Inhabitants by the promife of 6000 Rixdollers to compound for their fecurity against fire and plunder ; for which fumme the Chapter of Mayence have engaged : and 'is faid the Count de Lillebanne is fince muched to straiten Oppenheim, and expects a recruit of 2000 horse and foot, who are already marched as far as Himbourg. Both Parties put in their Claims for he advantages of this dayes fight , and have accordingly made their Bonnefires at Heidelberg and Nancy. They are both likewife recruiting their forces, with an intention to try the iffue of a fecond Battel, but in the mean hime there are endeavours used to prevent the farther spreading of the war; and alrea y fome Ministers are faid, to be arrived at Bingen, to compole the differences, and mediate a reconciliation.

Bruger, Oflob. 14. On Thursday towards the evening pifed through Damme the Marquis de Gastel Rodrigo from Antwerp, and by the Bridge at the Skipfial went forward for Offend, accompanied by the Prince de Chimay with a great Train of others of the Nobility and Gentry, intending with the first fair wind to embark hindelf for Spain, many ships lying there ready to attend him.

His kay at Bruffels was but thort, not above two days, and many hours of that time tpent in conferences with the Spanifl Ambaflador Bon Effevan de Gamarra, concerning the furthere Government of these Countreys 3 the tubstance whereof, with the reason of his change of resolution of taking Holland in his way, the faid Ambaflador communicated on the Munday following to the New Governour the Constable of Cafille.

The Privy Council has been lately at Malines to congratulate the New Governour on his Entry into his Charges where has been also the Baron de Groyck and the Sieur, Bouton, to give him an accoupt of the Regulation made by the Marquis de Caftel Restrigo amongst the Army ; wherein 'tis believed the Constable may fuddenly make fome alteration, and particularly as to the German frees, which are in their proportion of greatest expence to the C untrey, he has already his intentions to alter the method of the Cavalry by reducing their Regiments to free Companies.

Some, tew days fince's Spanish Regiment under the command of Don Antonio Furtado, being drawn up not far from Ghent near another Regiment of Germans, fome reproaches palling between them, they fell at the last to their weapons, in which above 30 Germans were in little time killed upon the place, and fix or feven Spaniards, and many, wounded on both tides'; much more execution had probably been done amongst them, bad not the appearance of their, Golonels & other Officers reftrained them from farther violence.

From Eurgundy we are adviced that the Prioce d'Arem-, berg having intelligence of iome tumult rilen in the City of Gray betwixt the people and the foldiery, was haftning, thither with extraordinary fpeed; but was near the City unfortunately thrown from his Horle, and much bruiled, fo tha he was forced that Night to take the benefit of the next Houle; but his hurt not iuppried to be dangerows: Upon the newsof his approach the tumult immediately vanified; all perfons retiring themfelves to their own houles.

At Lefançon they have now fallen upon the work of digging for a foundation for the crefting of a Cittadel, the 29th paft being the day appointed for the Ceremony of laying the first Scone. The Prince of Aremberg 1 as made himfelf 'a Guard of an hundred Swilles, which he found amongst the Lorrainers which were entred into the fervice of that County; they are at prefent to be placed in Garriy fon at Befançon. A Committion is also granted to the Baron de Soye Governour of that place, for the railing of a Regiment of Burgundians, which he is to command as Collonel, and keep in Garrifon in that City.

Ipfwich Oftob. 6. On Saturday last His Majefly pased through this place to Landguard-Fort, going thence for Harwich. Y fterday being Monday, he returned again hither, where he was received as in other places, with all possible expressions of joy, and was the same day entertained at dinner at the Lord Viscount Hereford's house near this place, and from thence returned again for Newmarket.

Whitehall, Oftob. 6. This morning Her Majesty attended by several Ladies of the Court, went hence for Audly-End, where his Majesty was suddenly likewise expected, having divertised himself for some time at Newmarkes, and since in visiting several Ports and Towns upon the sea coasts.
