PROCEDURE.

THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT (Costs No. 2), 1917. DATED THE FIRST DAY OF AUGUST, 1917.

We, the Rule Committee of the Supreme Court, hereby make the following Rule.

1. Rule 2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court (Costs), 1917, dated the 26th day of January, 1917, is hereby annulled and in lieu thereof the following Rule shall stand:—

(2) During the continuance of the present war and for a period of six months thereafter the charges specified in Clause 106 shall be further increased from 1s. 4½d. to 1s. 7d.

2. These Rules may be cited as Rules of the Supreme Court (Costs No. 2), 1917.

And we, the said Rule Committee, hereby certify that on account of urgency the said Rules should come into immediate operation, and we hereby make the said Rules to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Rules.

The KING has been pleased, in pursuance of the provisions of the Second Schedule to the Military Service Act, 1916 (5 & 6 Geo. V, cap. 104), to appoint Captain Arthur Edward Montagu Wadham, of the Mount, Cockermouth, to be a member of the Appeal Tribunal for the County of Cumberland, including the County Borough of Carlisle, and the County of Westmorland.

POLICE, FACTORIES, &c. (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT, 1916.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories or workshops, he proposes to make an Order in regard to the supply of drinking water, to take effect from the 1st October next, and to apply to all factories and workshops in which 25 or more persons are employed.

The proposed Order will require the provision (a) of an adequate supply of wholesome drinking water from a public main or from some other approved source of supply, which shall be either laid on or contained in a suitable vessel, and (b) (except where the water is delivered in an upward jet from which the workers can conveniently drink) of sufficient cups or other suitable drinking vessels.

Any objection to the proposed Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, within 21 days after the date of this notice. The objection must be in writing, and must state—

- (a) the requirements in the draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the modifications asked for.

Where an objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if the objection is made by an association of occupiers on behalf of its members,
