At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of August, 1917.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order

made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory list contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Note (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List consolidating all previous Lists was published on the 22nd June, 1917 (The Consolidating List, No. 29A), which together with Lists No. 30 and 31 of the 6th and 20th July, 1917, respectively, and the List herewith annexed contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

†Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, 'all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Šiam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would

specify the particular trade or trades for which | substitutes are required.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambaseador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

*Note (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappy" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel English company. Maatschappy van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

CARGOES EX ENEMY VESSELS IN PORTUGUESE HARBOURS.

Foreign Office, July 31, 1917.

With reference to the notifications which were published in the London Gazette of May 30, 1916, and July 24, 1917, respecting the release of allied and neutral merchandize found on enemy vessels in Portuguese harbours, a translation is now appended of a Decree which has been issued by the Portuguese Government on the subject:-

Decree (No. 5246), July 13, 1917.

[TRANSLATION.]

Taking into consideration the representations made to me by the Ministers of all the Departments, with the view of simplifying in certain cases the procedure for the delivery of goods found on board requisitioned vessels; availing myself of the authorisation granted by the Laws No. 373 of September 2, 1915, and No. 491 of March 12, 1916: I hereby, on the advice of the Council of Ministers, decree as follows: -

ARTICLE I.

The production of a guarantee is dispensed with in the case of the delivery of the goods referred to in Article 32 of the Decree of the 20th of April, 1916*, whenever in regard thereto claimants produce delivery orders issued by the owners of the vessels.

ARTICLE II.

The goods referred to in the above mentioned Article 32 of the Decree of April 20, 1916which may have already been claimed, and respecting which a certificate, from the Legation of the Allied or Neutral country to which the claimant belongs, has been presented by the 31st of August, 1917, declaring that the Government concerned will, up to the expiration of the period of one year counting from the date of the signature of the treaty of peace, indemnify the Portuguese Government against all claims by the shipowners, captains or third parties up to the amount of one and one-third times the value of the said goods-may be handed over on an order from the Minister of Finance provided the parties interested pay the expenses of unloading, storage and conserva-tion of the goods, as well as the Customs clearance charges on re-exportation, at the time the clearance is effected.

ARTICLE III.

An extension is hereby granted to the 31st of August, 1917, of the period for the presentation of all claims or documents relative to goods of the same origin.

At the termination of this extended period no claim or document will be admitted, and all proceedings pending will follow their legal course.

ARTICLE IV.

The decisions referred to in Articles 34 and 35 and their sub-Articles of the Decree of the 20th of April, 1916, shall appertain to the Tribunal of Commerce at Mormuagão as regards the questions still pending in connection with the cargoes of the ships "Pangim," "Damao" and "India," requisitioned at that port.

ARTICLE V. .

Legislation to the contrary is hereby revoked.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-one ("The Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850") of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen ("The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868 ") do, out of the moneys which have been paid over to us by the Dean and Canons of the Cathedral Church in Manchester, under the provisions of the hereinbefore first mentioned Act, hereby grant to the respective Incumbents for the time being of the several benefices situate within the original limits of the Parish of Manchester, in the County of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which are named in the first column of the first and second Schedules hereunto annexed, the several sums, the amounts of which are set opposite to the names of such benefices in the second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth columns of the First Schedule, and the second column of the Second Schedule, the said sums to be payable for and in respect of the year ending the first day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, the sums specified in the second, third and fifth columns of the First Schedule, and in the second column of the Second Schedule, to be receivable by the respective Incumbents in equal quarterly portions on the first day of August, the first day of November, the first day of February, and the first day of May now next ensuing, and the sums specified in the fourth column of the First Schedule to be receivable by the respective Incumbents on the first day of May now next ensuing, but nevertheless to be deemed to accrue from day to day, and to be apportionable accordingly.

Provided always, that the sum specified in the second column of the said First Schedule shall be taken and received by the several Incumbents to whom the same are hereby made respectively payable in substitution for and not as additional to any grants which Instruments, heretofore sealed by us, have purported to charge permanently on the capitular revenues of Manchester other than by way of relief to our common fund under the thirteenth section of the Act firstly hereinbefore recited. Provided also that every sum specified in the fourth column of the said First Schedule shall be payable only on the production to us, on or after the said first day of May now next ensuing of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of Manchester that the Incumbent has complied with the Bishop's requirements as to residence. Provided also that every sum specified in the fifth column of the said First Schedule shall be payable only upon the production to us, on or after each of the four above-mentioned days, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of Manchester that with his licence or permission an Assistant Curate has been employed within the parish during the quarter of the year then ended, and that such Assistant Curate is in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum. Provided lastly, that of the sums specified in the second column of the said Second Schedule proportionate parts only shall be payable in the event of the pensions now charged on the said benefices respectively in favour of retired Incumbents ceasing or being reduced before the first day of May next ensuing.
