## A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN  
ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject

as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

Bacon.  
Butter.  
Hams.  
Lard (other than neutral Lard).

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 19) Proclamation, 1917.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Twenty-ninth day of *August*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign.

**W**HEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

At the end of Regulation 2j the following sub-section shall be inserted:—

"(5) Where the Food Controller considers it desirable to do so for the purpose of maintaining the supply of hops, he may, after consultation with the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, exercise, with respect to hops, any of the powers conferred on him by regulations 2f to 2h."

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of August, 1917, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas it is provided in Section 6 of the Indian Marine Service Act, 1884, that in case a state of War exists between Your Majesty and any foreign power, it shall be lawful for Your Majesty by Proclamation or Order in Council to direct that any Vessel belonging to Your Majesty's Indian Marine Service, and the Men and Officers from time to time serving thereon, shall be under the command of the Senior Naval Officer of the Station where for the time being such Ship may be:

"And whereas it is provided that while any such Vessel is under such command, such vessel shall be deemed to all intents a Vessel of War of the Royal Navy, and the Men and Officers from time to time serving in such Vessel shall be under such Naval Discipline Act or Acts as may be in force for the time being, and subject

to such Regulations as may be issued by us with the concurrence of the Secretary of State for India in Council:

"And whereas a state of War exists between Your Majesty and the German Emperor:

"And whereas the Government of Your Majesty in India has agreed to place unreservedly at the disposal of the Naval Commander-in-Chief on the East Indies Station Your Majesty's Indian Marine Service Vessels "General Elles," "Investigator," and "Elephanta," and certain other vessels employed or to be employed in minesweeping, patrol, and other auxiliary duties, the names whereof have been, or will be, communicated to the Naval Commander-in-Chief by the Government of India:

"Now, therefore, we beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that the aforesaid Vessels of Your Majesty's Indian Marine Service, and the Men and Officers from time to time serving thereon, shall be under the command of the Senior Naval Officer of the station where for the time being such ships may be.

"The Secretary of State for India in Council has signified his concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 26th day of August, 1917, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we deem it expedient to grant Temporary Commissions in the Royal Marine Force to a number of selected Warrant Officers and Non-commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines, and it is necessary to make provision as to their pay, and as to the award of gratuities or retired pay on retirement:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the proposals contained in the annexed Schedule, in substitution of those contained in the Schedule

to Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 13th day of June, 1917.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

#### " SCHEDULE.

"WARRANT AND NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL MARINES SERVING ON LONG SERVICE ENGAGEMENTS WHO ARE GRANTED TEMPORARY COMMISSIONS.

"(1) Whilst serving to be paid at the rates of pay for Officers promoted from the Ranks.

"(2) Outfit gratuity to be £34 0s. 0d. and Camp Kit allowance £7 10s. 0d.

"(3) Except in the cases of Officers selected for retention under Paragraph 4 Retirement to be compulsory at the close of hostilities, with Gratuities or Retired Pay on the following scale:—

"Position when Commissioned and Gratuity or Retired Pay.

"(a) Under nine years' service, gratuity of £300.

"(b) Nine to fifteen years' service, gratuity of £400, with an additional £100 for each year over nine.

"(c) With fifteen or more years' service, retired pay of £80 a year, or a gratuity of £1,000.

"Service to reckon from age of eighteen. Service in the ranks, or as Warrant Officer, to count as full time.

"(4) Any Officer whom the Admiralty may select in the interests of the Service to be retained after the termination of Hostilities to be transferred to the Permanent List, and to come under the provisions of Orders in Council of 5th December, 1916, and 8th October, 1914.

"(5) Disability Pensions, Widow's Pension, and Compassionate etc. Allowances for Children to be awarded on the same scale and under the same conditions as for other Temporary Officers, Royal Marines."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of August, 1917, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and

subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section 2 of the Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may enrol Officers of Reserve to the Royal Navy under, and subject to, such Rules, Orders and Regulations as the Admiralty may, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time establish:

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and that any Volunteer enrolled under this Act, when serving for training afloat, or called out for actual service, shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Officers holding Temporary Commissions or Appointments in the Naval Service should be granted increments of pay in the same manner as Permanent Officers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Officers holding Temporary Commissions or Appointments in the Royal Navy, Royal Marine Force, Royal Naval Reserve, or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, being granted increments of pay accordingly, after the periods of seniority or service specified in the case of Officers of corresponding Ranks on the Permanent Lists: Subject to the proviso that Officers holding the Temporary Rank of Lieutenant-Commander R.N.R. or R.N.V.R. shall be eligible for increments of pay on the scale applicable to Lieutenants only.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by "The Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1869," it was (amongst other things) enacted that any two Colonies might, with the sanction of an Order of His Majesty in Council, agree for the removal of any prisoners under sentence or order of transportation, imprisonment, or penal servitude, from one of such Colonies to the other for the purpose of their undergoing in such other Colony the whole or any part of their punishment, and for the return of such prisoners to

the former Colony at the expiration of their punishment, or at such other period as might be agreed upon, upon such terms and subject to such conditions as might seem good to the said Colonies, and that the sanction of the Order of His Majesty in Council might be obtained in the case of a Colony having a Legislative Body on an Address of such Body to His Majesty, and in the case of any Colony not having a Legislative Body on an Address of the Governor of such Colony, and that the Agreement of any one Colony with another should for the purposes of the said Act be testified by a writing under the hand of the Governor of such Colony:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty The King in Council, bearing date the 12th day of August, 1915, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that the Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1869, should, from the date of the said Order, apply to the Nyasaland Protectorate, as though that Protectorate were within the meaning of the said Act, a Colony not having a Legislative Body:

And whereas an Agreement, bearing date the 26th day of May, 1917, was made by and between Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir George Smith, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Protectorate of Nyasaland, and Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Henry Hesketh Joudou Bell, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Mauritius and its Dependencies, on behalf of the Protectorate and Colony of which they were respectively Governors as aforesaid, respecting the removal of prisoners from Nyasaland to Mauritius upon certain terms and subject to certain conditions therein set forth, of which Agreement a copy is contained in the Schedule to this Order annexed:

And whereas the said Agreement was duly testified by writing under the hand of the said Governors respectively:

And whereas Addresses have been received by His Majesty from the said Governor of Nyasaland, and from the Legislative Council of the said Colony of Mauritius respectively, praying that His Majesty will be graciously pleased to sanction the said Agreement by an Order of His Majesty in Council to be made under the said Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1869.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act of Parliament, doth, by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, declare His sanction to the said Agreement.

And the Right Honourable Walter Hume Long, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly

#### SCHEDULE.

Agreement made the 26th day of May, 1917, between His Excellency Sir George Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Nyasaland Protectorate, for and on be-

half of the Government of the said Protectorate, of the one part, and His Excellency Sir Henry Hesketh Joudou Bell, K.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Mauritius and its Dependencies, for and on behalf of the Government of the said Colony, of the other part.

Whereas by the fourth section of the Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1869, as applicable to Mauritius, and made applicable to the Nyasaland Protectorate by an Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1915, it is provided that:—

“Any two Colonies may, with the sanction of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, agree for the removal of any prisoners under sentence or order of transportation, imprisonment, or penal servitude, from one of such Colonies to the other for the purpose of their undergoing in such other Colony the whole or any part of their punishment, and for the return of such prisoners to the former Colony at the expiration of their punishment, or at such other period as may be agreed upon, upon such terms and subject to such conditions as may seem good to the said Colonies.

“The sanction of the Order of Her Majesty in Council may be obtained, in the case of a Colony having a Legislative Body, on an Address of such Body to Her Majesty, and in the case of any Colony not having a Legislative Body, on an Address of the Governor of such Colony; and such sanction shall be in force as soon as such Order in Council has been published in the Colony to which it relates.

“The Agreement of any one Colony with another shall for the purposes of this Act be testified by a writing under the hand of the Governor of such Colony.

And whereas it is proposed to remove certain prisoners under sentence or order of imprisonment or of penal servitude in the Nyasaland Protectorate to the Colony of Mauritius:

Now, therefore, it is this day agreed by and between:—

His Excellency Sir George Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of Nyasaland (on behalf of the Government of the Nyasaland Protectorate, hereinafter called the Nyasaland Government), of the one part, and

His Excellency Sir Henry Hesketh Joudou Bell, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of Mauritius (on behalf of the Government of the Colony of Mauritius, hereinafter called the Mauritius Government), of the other part, as follows:—

1. The Mauritius Government will receive for the term of their detention prisoners under sentence of imprisonment or of penal servitude sent to the Colony of Mauritius by the Nyasaland Government.

2. The Nyasaland Government agree to pay all the expenses connected with the transfer of the prisoners from the Nyasaland Protectorate to the Colony of Mauritius.

3. The Nyasaland Government agree to reimburse to the Mauritius Government all expenses incurred during the detention of the prisoners in the Colony of Mauritius.

4. At the expiration of the term of imprisonment or of penal servitude of any par-

ticular prisoner; such prisoner shall be returned to the Nyasaland Protectorate and all expenses in connection with such return shall be borne by the Nyasaland Government.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into considera-

tion, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidating List, No. 33A) consolidating all previous Lists was published on the 17th August, 1917, and which, together with the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

†NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under

which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to the names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

\*NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

WHEREAS Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, being desirous of distinguishing by some mark of Her Royal Favour the many heroic acts performed by Mariners and others who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from shipwrecks and other perils of the sea; and the many heroic acts performed on land by those who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from accidents in mines, on railways and at fires, or other peril within Her Dominions, other than perils of the sea, did, by Warrants under the Royal Sign Manual bearing date respectively the 7th March, 1866, the 12th April, 1867, and the 30th April, 1877, for Herself, Her Heirs and Successors institute and create as a mark of Royal Approbation of such heroic acts, new Decorations styled respectively "The Albert Medal of the First Class" and "The Albert Medal of the Second Class," which Decorations Her Majesty was desirous should be highly prized and eagerly sought after:

And whereas the said Warrants were subsequently amended and all the Warrants relating to these Decorations were consolidated by a Warrant under the Sign Manual bearing date the 5th June, 1905:

And whereas it is Our Pleasure to amend the style of the said Decorations:

We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Rules and Ordinances for the government of the Decorations:—

I. It is ordained that the Decoration in each case shall be styled "The Albert Medal"; but when it is awarded for acts of such extreme and heroic daring as to merit a special degree of recognition, it shall be styled "The Albert Medal in Gold."

II. It is ordained that the Albert Medal shall consist of a bronze oval-shaped Badge or Decoration, having in the centre a Monogram composed of the letters V. and A. erect upon an enamelled background, surrounded by a Garter inscribed in raised letters "For Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea," or "For Gallantry in Saving Life on Land," as the case may be, and surmounted by a representation of the Crown of His Royal Highness the lamented Prince Consort; but where the Medal conferred is "The Albert Medal in Gold," it shall consist of a gold oval-shaped Badge or Decoration having in the centre a Monogram composed of the letters V. and A. erect in gold upon an enamelled background, surrounded by a Garter in bronze inscribed in raised letters of gold "For Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea," or "For Gallantry in Saving Life on Land," as the case may be, and surmounted by a representation in gold of the Crown of His Royal Highness the lamented Prince Consort. When the Medal is given for gallantry in saving life at sea, the letters V. and A. shall be interlaced



with an anchor erect in bronze or gold, as the case may be.

The Medal shall be suspended from a riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, having two white longitudinal stripes; in the case of the "Albert Medal in Gold" the riband shall have four white longitudinal stripes.

The colour of the enamel and riband shall be dark blue when the Medal is conferred for gallantry in saving life at sea, and crimson when it is conferred for gallantry in saving life on land.

III. It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects who, in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from perils of the sea, or from perils on land, have endangered their own lives, and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Provided always that where the Medal is conferred for gallantry in saving life at sea, the preliminary steps and inquiry shall, if the award be to anyone belonging to the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines, be with the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and in other cases with the President of the Board of Trade.

IV. It is ordained that the names of those persons upon whom We may be pleased to confer the Medal shall be published in the London Gazette. Where the Medal is conferred for gallantry in saving life on land a Register of such names shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department. Where the Medal is conferred for gallantry in saving life at sea a Register of the names of such of these persons as belong to the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines shall be kept in the Office of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and a Register of the names of such of these persons as do not belong to the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines shall be kept in the Office of the Board of Trade.

V. It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn suspended from the left breast.

VI. It is ordained that any act of gallantry which is worthy of recognition by the award of the Albert Medal, but is performed by one upon whom the Decoration has already been conferred, may, on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, be recorded by a bar attached to the riband by which the Medal is suspended; and for every such additional act an additional bar may be added.

VII. In order to make such additional provision as shall effectually preserve pure these most honourable Decorations, it is ordained that if any person on whom any of such Decorations is conferred be guilty of any crime or disgraceful conduct which in Our judgment disqualifies him for the same, his name shall, by an especial Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, be forthwith erased from the register of those upon whom the said Decoration shall have been conferred, and his Medal shall be forfeited. And every person to whom the said Medal is given shall before receiving the same enter into an engagement to return the same if his name shall be so erased as aforesaid under this regulation. It is hereby further declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors shall be the sole judges of the circumstances demanding such expulsion. Moreover, We shall at all times have power to order that any person who

may at any time have been expelled shall be restored to the enjoyment of the Decoration.

VIII. The warrant of the 5th June, 1905, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS His late Majesty King Edward VII, being desirous of distinguishing by some mark of His Royal Favour the many heroic acts performed by those of His faithful subjects who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from perils incurred in mines or quarries or otherwise in connection with Industrial Employment in His Dominions and in Territories under His protection and jurisdiction, did by Warrants under His Sign Manual bearing date respectively the 13th July, 1907, and the 1st December, 1909, for Himself, His Heirs and Successors institute and create a new Medal to be entitled the Edward Medal to be awarded for such acts of gallantry:

And whereas We are desirous of amending the rules governing the award of the said Decoration and of consolidating the Royal Warrants relating to the said Decoration, We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Rules for the governance of the said Decoration:

1. It is ordained that the Medal shall be styled "The Edward Medal," but when it is awarded for acts of such great and exceptional gallantry as to merit a special degree of recognition it shall be styled "The Edward Medal in Silver."

2. It is ordained that the Edward Medal shall consist of a circular Medal with Our Effigy on the obverse, and on the reverse a suitable design with the words "For Courage"; and that the Medal shall be of Bronze or, when the Edward Medal in Silver is awarded, of Silver.

3. It is ordained that the Edward Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from perils incurred in connection with Industrial Employment in these Our Dominions, and in Territories under Our protection or jurisdiction, and such awards shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

4. It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer either of these Decorations shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.



5. It is ordained that each Medal shall be suspended from the left breast, and the riband, of an inch and three-eighths in width, shall be dark blue with a narrow yellow stripe on either side: Provided that when the Medal is awarded to a woman it shall be worn on the left shoulder, suspended from a riband of the same width and colour fashioned into a bow.

6. It is ordained that any act of gallantry which is worthy of recognition by the award of the Edward Medal, but is performed by one upon whom the Decoration has already been conferred may, on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, be recorded by a Bar attached to the riband by which the Medal is suspended; and for every such additional act an additional Bar may be added.

7. In order to make such provision as shall effectually preserve pure these most honourable Decorations, it is ordained that if any person on whom either of such Decorations is conferred be guilty of any crime or disgraceful conduct which, in Our judgment, disqualifies him for the same, his name shall, by an especial Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, be forthwith erased from the Register of those upon whom the said Decoration shall have been conferred and his Medal shall be forfeited. And every person to whom the said Medal is given shall, before receiving the same, enter into an agreement to return the same, if his name shall be so erased as aforesaid under this regulation. It is hereby further declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be the sole judges of the circumstances demanding such forfeiture. Moreover, We shall at all times have power to regrant a Medal to any person whose Medal may at any time have been forfeited.

8. The Warrants of the 13th July, 1907, and 1st December, 1909, are hereby revoked.

On the 3rd November, 1916, while a brick plug was being removed from an outfall sewer

pipe at the Bombay Municipal Sewage Works, a coolie was overcome by gas. Two other coolies at once went down the man-hole, shaking off their fellow-workmen who attempted to restrain them, and refusing to wait until they could be roped. They fastened their fellow-workman to a rope and sent him up, but were then overcome themselves. Newarti then went down. He found one of the coolies with difficulty and sent him up, and was then ordered to the surface. He at once went down again, but failed to find the other, whose body was not recovered until hours later: Both the rescued men died shortly after their rescue.

Although the atmosphere was less foul when Newarti first descended, and was probably almost clear at his second descent, he and the others present were not aware that this was so, and he undoubtedly risked his life in endeavouring to save the lives of others.

**DEFENCE OF THE REALM.**

THE THROUGH RATES (Great Britain and Ireland) ORDER, 1917, dated August 28, 1917, made by the Board of Trade under Regulation 7BB of the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

Whereas by Regulation 7BB of the Defence of the Realm Regulations it is amongst other things provided that for the purpose of maintaining an efficient service and promoting the efficient transport of goods with a view to the successful prosecution of the war the Board of Trade may by order, subject to such conditions as may be specified in the Order, authorise an increase in the charges for carrying merchandise by sea between Great Britain and Ireland not exceeding such amount as the Board think necessary in the circumstances:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of their powers under that Regulation and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the Board of Trade hereby order as follows:—

1. The charges at present in force for carrying merchandise between Great Britain and Ireland may be increased by amounts not exceeding those specified in the Schedule to this Order.

2. The increased charges authorised by this Order shall be allocated to the sea portion of the journey.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 3rd day of September, 1917.

4. This Order may be cited as the Through Rates (Great Britain and Ireland) Order, 1917.

**SCHEDULE.**

Increased charges for carrying merchandise between Great Britain and Ireland.

No person shall, as from the 1st October, 1917, until further notice, supply to any person or take or accept or attempt to obtain delivery of any Crude Benzol, Crude Naphtha or Light Oils containing recoverable quantities of Benzol or Toluol except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a licence issued by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions, or under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a contract in writing for the delivery of such articles existing at the date of this Order.

2. All persons engaged in producing, treating, distributing, storing, selling or dealing in Crude Benzol, Crude Naphtha or Light Oils, or in any manufacture, trade or business in which the same or any of them are used shall make all such returns with regard to their businesses as may from time to time be required by or under the Authority of the Minister of Munitions.

“Light Oils” shall mean Light Oils obtained by the distillation of Coal Tar.

*Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.*

*Former Notice.*—No. 729 of 1917; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

I. ENGLISH CHANNEL AND NORTH  
SEA SOUTHERN PORTION—PILOT-  
AGE REGULATIONS.

1. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

3. Clauses 1 and 2 above do not apply to British ships whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Gravesend, or between Gravesend and Great Yarmouth or between Great Yarmouth and the Downs Pilot Station, provided that they do not make use of any port in the London Pilotage District within these limits.

4. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

5. All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Great Yarmouth and *vice versa*, and between those places and the Sunk light vessel, or any intermediate pilot station that may hereafter be established, and *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

6. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

7. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of

pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamers attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal Pier.

(b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise between the position of the wreck of the Corton Light-Vessel (Lat.  $52^{\circ} 31\frac{1}{2}'$  N., long.  $1^{\circ} 50'$  E.) and the South Scroby Buoy.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships trading with Netherlands Ports, *but no others*, can obtain Pilots for the River Thames and the Downs.

The Sunk Pilot Steamer will, until further Notice, be on her station and available for shipping and landing Pilots between the hours of 5.0 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., G.M.T., only.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

## II.—RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY, &c.—TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-Buoys, and through the Oaze Deep until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels between a line drawn from London Stone to No. 3 Sea Reach Light-Buoy and thence to Canvey Point on the west, and the Sunk Head Buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles Buoys, on the east, from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise.

No merchant or other private vessel is to be at anchor in the Black Deep, and the Main Channel of the Thames, to the Southward of a line joining a position in lat.  $51^{\circ} 39'$  N., long.  $1^{\circ} 23'$  E., D3 Buoy, a position in lat.  $51^{\circ} 33'$  08" N., long.  $1^{\circ} 13'$  03" E., Knob Light-Buoy, a position in lat.  $51^{\circ} 31'$  45" N., long.  $1^{\circ} 04'$  48" E., South Shoebury Light-Buoy, a position in lat.  $51^{\circ} 29'$  15" N., long.  $0^{\circ} 49'$  45" E., and Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Sea Reach Buoys, except when obliged to anchor on account of fog.

No vessel is to anchor in the Black Deep between the parallel of lat.  $51^{\circ} 39'$  N., and the Sunk Light-Vessel, without special orders, except such South-bound vessels as are unable to proceed further south owing to darkness or thick weather; vessels anchoring under such circumstances are only to anchor to the westward of a line joining positions in lat.  $51^{\circ} 45'$  00" N., long.  $1^{\circ} 30'$  15" E., lat.  $51^{\circ} 42'$  00" N., long.  $1^{\circ} 27'$  30" E., and lat.  $51^{\circ} 39'$  N., long.  $1^{\circ} 23'$  E., and well clear of the fairway.

All other Channels are closed to navigation.

The Nore Examination Anchorage is reserved for vessels under examination before entry into the Medway, and also for vessels on Government service which have left the Medway and are awaiting orders as to route, &c.

2. Coasting vessels are not to be under way nor exhibit any lights in the East Swin or Wallet between sunset and sunrise.

3. (i.) No merchant vessel is to be in the following area in the approaches to the River Thames, from one hour after sunset to half-an-hour before sunrise:—

The area is bounded on the north by the parallel of lat.  $51^{\circ} 33'$  N.

The area is bounded on the east by the meridian of long.  $1^{\circ} 35'$  E.

The area is bounded on the south by the parallel of lat.  $51^{\circ} 16'$  N.

The area is bounded on the west by the meridian of long.  $1^{\circ} 24'$  E.

(ii.) Any merchant vessel contravening the foregoing regulation will run the gravest risk of being sunk.

4. (i) The cruising of yachts and pleasure craft in the Thames Estuary and River Medway will be permitted under the following restrictions:—

(a) No mechanically propelled vessel may be used for pleasure cruising.

(b) No commercial vessel may take out pleasure parties or any persons other than the regular crew.

(c) No professional fisherman or boatman may be employed on a pleasure craft.

(d) Pleasure cruising is only allowed on the understanding that all persons using pleasure craft will do their utmost to increase the food supply by catching fish; pleasure craft which ignore this condition are liable to be laid up by order of the local Police.

(ii) Except as stated in paragraph (xiii) no pleasure craft are allowed:—

(a) In the Estuary of the Thames East of a line drawn between the Grain Spit and West Shoebury Buoys.

(b) In the area enclosed between a line drawn in a  $0^{\circ}$  (N.  $14^{\circ}$  E. Mag.) and  $180^{\circ}$  (S.  $14^{\circ}$  W. Mag.) direction through the Ovens Buoy and a line joining Holehaven Point and the Blyth Middle Buoy.

(c) In the Medway East of Rochester Bridge.

(iii) For the purposes of this order the Estuary of the Thames includes the North Coast of Kent from North Foreland to Sheerness, and the Coast of Essex from Shoeburyness to the Naze.

(iv) All pleasure craft of any description are prohibited from being under weigh between sunset and sunrise, except as provided for in par. (xiii).

(v) Pleasure craft using the waters to the West of the line mentioned in par. (ii) (a), in which cruising is permitted, and also pulling boats which are permitted under par. (xi), must obtain a licence from the local Police.

(vi) No licences are, however, required for pleasure cruising to the West of Rochester Bridge, nor is par. (i) (d) applicable to such pleasure cruising. Otherwise pleasure cruising to the West of Rochester Bridge, so far as the tide flows, is to be governed by these regulations.

(vii) The licence to be in the following form:—

Mr. (name, Christian and Surname) of (address) is hereby authorised to use a (here state whether sailing vessel, rowing boat, etc.) in (area to be specified in detail) from sunrise to sunset.

This licence is available for six months from date of issue, when it is to be returned and a new licence will be issued, if required.

If more than one craft is used, a separate licence is required for each.

(viii) The name must be marked legibly on every yacht. All open, half-decked and other craft must have the number and distinguishing letter of the licence clearly painted on each side of the bow.

(ix) The licence must be carried in the craft, and is to be available for inspection.

(x) Boats licensed for hire may be taken out by British subjects other than those in whose names the licences are made out, provided that they be returned to the licencees by sunset on the day of hire. The licence for the boat must be carried by the person hiring it.

(xi) Pulling boats are allowed within the area prohibited by par. (ii) (a) provided:—

(a) A separate licence is obtained for each boat.

(b) Pars. (i) (v) (vii) (viii) (ix) and (x) are complied with.

(c) No such boats proceed more than one mile from the shore, nor, in the area between Margate Coast Guard Station and the North Foreland, more than half a mile from the shore.

Pulling boats are forbidden to go alongside or communicate with any vessel lying off the shore.

(xii) No pleasure pulling boats are allowed in the Medway to the Eastward of Rochester Bridge, nor are any allowed in the area mentioned in par. (ii) (b).

(xiii) Amateurs desiring to fish for fish as food, outside the areas in which pleasure cruising is permitted, may obtain permits as laid down in (f) below, authorising them to fish in those areas in which, and subject to the conditions under which, fishing is permitted to commercial fishing boats, subject to the following provisions:—

(a) The crew of the boat, and if desired an alternative for each, shall be named on the permit, which shall be signed by each of those persons, and no persons other than those named on the permit may be at sea in the boat.

(b) Boats sailing under amateur fishing permits shall not carry as members of their crews bona fide fishermen or boatmen holding or qualified to hold commercial fishing permits.

(c) Amateurs and visitors who propose to hire boats for periods of not less than one week, and whose credentials are satisfactory, may obtain amateur fishing permits as laid down in (f) below. The period of such a permit shall be stated on it together with the holder's home address and the permit must be given up to the Local Correspondent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries at the end of the period for which it is valid.

(d) The crews of boats fishing under these regulations may be called upon to make

returns of their catches, and if these returns are considered to be unsatisfactory their permits will be liable to be withdrawn.

(e) Amateur fishing permits will be issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries and countersigned by the Senior Naval Officer.

(f) Applications for permits should be made to the Local Correspondent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries in the port to which the boat belongs or at the nearest port at which there is such a correspondent.

(g) Copies of the regulations governing fishing in the Nore area can be obtained from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 43, Parliament Street, London, S.W. 1, or from the Board's Local Correspondents.

(xiv) Amateur fishing permits may be endorsed, suspended or withdrawn by the Senior Naval Officer or the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by whom, acting in conjunction, the provisions as to fishing may be modified locally.

(xv) Boats fishing under these Regulations are liable at any time to be ordered to port or detained in port by the Naval Patrol Boats or other Naval Authority.

(xvi) Where it is proved that there is a shortage of bona fide fishermen to form the crews of fishing boats provided with commercial fishing permits, licences may be granted by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or their representative to a limited number of approved amateur fishermen or yachtsmen enabling them to ship as whole time crew of such boats.

(xvii) It should be noted that, although mechanically propelled craft are prohibited from pleasure cruising, such craft are not prohibited from fishing under the amateur permit system defined above.

(xviii) Commercial fishing vessels are governed by the terms of the Notices issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

4. (i) In the Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach Rivers the cruising of yachts and pleasure craft will be permitted under the following restrictions:—

(a) No mechanically propelled vessel may be used for pleasure cruising.

(b) No commercial vessel may take out pleasure parties or any persons other than the regular crew.

(c) No professional fisherman or boatman may be employed on a pleasure craft.

(d) Pleasure cruising is only allowed on the understanding that all persons using pleasure craft will do their utmost to increase the food supply by catching fish; pleasure craft which ignore this condition are liable to be laid up by order of the local Police.

(ii) All pleasure craft of any description are prohibited from being under weigh between sunset and sunrise, and every such vessel shall return to the anchorage from which she started by sunset, excepting as follows:—

Pleasure craft may proceed from place to place in the area for which the permit is issued provided that the local Police are clearly notified previously of the anchorage proposed for the night, and that the local Police are again informed on arrival at the new anchorage.

Upon this condition, the persons named in the permit (and no one else) may remain

on board for the night. They must otherwise disembark before dark and in any case by 9 p.m. G.M.T. (except as laid down in clause xi).

(iii) Pleasure craft using the areas mentioned in parts (ix) and (x), in which cruising is permitted, must obtain a licence from the local Police.

(iv) The licence to be in the following form:—

Mr. (name, Christian and Surname) of (address) is hereby authorised to use a (here state whether sailing vessel, pulling boat, etc.) in (area to be specified in detail) from sunrise to sunset.

This licence is available for six months, when it is to be returned and a new licence will be issued, if desirable.

If more than one craft is used, a separate licence is required for each.

(v) The name must be marked legibly on every yacht. All open, half-decked and other craft must have the number and distinguishing letter of the licence clearly painted on each side of the bow.

(vi) The licence must be carried in the craft, and is to be available for inspection.

(vii) Boats licensed for hire may be taken out by British subjects other than those in whose names the licences are made out, provided that they be returned to the licencees by sunset on the day of hire. The licence for the boat must be carried by the person hiring it, and the licensee will be responsible for the bona fides of the person hiring it.

(viii) Local craft used for business purposes are subject to the foregoing regulations, but may in certain instances be allowed in prohibited areas if permission in writing has been previously obtained from the Naval or Military Authorities.

(ix) Cruising is permitted in the area to the West of a line drawn from Colne Point to N.W. Knoll Buoy and thence to Sales Point; and up these rivers. In the River Blackwater no vessel may anchor, nor may any landing be effected, in the area bounded by a line drawn in a  $0^{\circ}$  (*N.  $14^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*) and  $180^{\circ}$  (*S.  $14^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) direction, through Ramsey Stone to the opposite shore, and a line drawn through the Tollesbury and Mersea Oyster Fishery Company's Beacon on Thurslet Spit and the same Company's Beacon on the South side of the river, and extended to the North and South shores of the river.

(x) Cruising is permitted in the Crouch West of a line drawn in a  $0^{\circ}$  (*N.  $14^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*) and  $180^{\circ}$  (*S.  $14^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) direction through Nass Point. Cruising is also permitted in the Roach as far as Paglesham Hard, but owners of yachts are to intimate their intention to proceed up the Roach to the Coastguard, Burnham, before leaving, and report their return.

(a) No vessels may anchor in the Crouch between the Coastguard Station and Nass Point.

(b) Landing in the Roach may be permitted only at Paglesham Hard and permits are to be exhibited to the Military Patrol stationed there.

(xi) Owners of boats anchored within sight of Burnham Coastguard Station, in Mersea Quarters, or Brightlingsea Creek may go on board their boats up to 9 p.m. G.M.T. provided that a permit to do this has been obtained from the Senior Naval Officer, Brightlingsea,

and provided also that the boat remains at anchor.

(xii) Amateurs desiring to fish for fish as food, outside the areas in which pleasure cruising is permitted, may obtain permits as laid down in (f) below, authorising them to fish in those areas in which, and subject to the conditions under which, fishing is permitted to commercial fishing boats, subject to the following provisions:—

(a) The crew of the boat, and if desired an alternative for each, shall be named on the permit, which shall be signed by each of those persons, and no persons other than those named on the permit may be at sea in the boat.

(b) Boats sailing under amateur fishing permits shall not carry as members of their crews bona fide fishermen or boatmen holding or qualified to hold commercial fishing permits.

(c) Amateurs and visitors who propose to hire boats for periods of not less than one week, and whose credentials are satisfactory, may obtain amateur fishing permits as laid down in (f) below. The period of such a permit shall be stated on it together with the holder's home address and the permit must be given up to the Local Correspondent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries at the end of the period for which it is valid.

(d) The crews of boats fishing under these regulations may be called upon to make returns of their catches and if these returns are considered to be unsatisfactory their permits will be liable to be withdrawn.

(e) Amateur fishing permits will be issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries and countersigned by the Senior Naval Officer.

(f) Applications for permits should be made to the Local Correspondent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries in the port to which the boat belongs or at the nearest port at which there is such a correspondent.

(g) Copies of the regulations governing fishing in the Nore area can be obtained from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 43, Parliament Street, London, S.W. 1, or from the Board's Local Correspondents.

(xiii) Amateur fishing permits may be endorsed, suspended or withdrawn by the Senior Naval Officer or the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by whom, acting in conjunction, the provisions as to fishing may be modified locally.

(xiv) Boats fishing under these regulations are liable at any time to be ordered to port or detained in port by the Naval Patrol Boats or other Naval Authority.

(xv) Where it is proved that there is a shortage of bona fide fishermen to form the crews of fishing boats provided with commercial fishing permits, licences may be granted by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or their representative to a limited number of approved amateur fishermen or yachtsmen enabling them to ship as whole time crew of such boats.

(xvi) It should be noted that, although mechanically propelled craft are prohibited from pleasure cruising, such craft are not prohibited from fishing under the amateur permit system defined above.

(xvii) Commercial fishing vessels are governed by the terms of the notices issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.



5. The use of the Swin and Wallet Channels by sailing barges and small trading vessels engaged in coastwise traffic along the Essex coast is permitted, subject to compliance with the following restrictions:—

(i) Each vessel must obtain from the Customs a special clearance card, which is to be kept available for inspection by the Patrol Officers, on demand.

(ii) A red ensign is to be displayed while navigating the Middle Deep and Swin Channel.

(iii) No vessel may be under way after dark, except as provided for hereinafter.

(iv) When at anchor in the Wallet, Ray Sand, and Whitaker Channels, or in the Rivers Colne, Blackwater, and Crouch, all lights are to be screened so that they will not show outboard.

(v) No vessel may anchor in the River Crouch in the area bounded by lines drawn in a  $0^{\circ}$  (*N.  $14^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*) and a  $180^{\circ}$  (*S.  $14^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) direction, through Burnham Coastguard Station and Holliwell point; or in the River Blackwater in the areas bounded by a line drawn in a  $0^{\circ}$  (*N.  $14^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*) and  $180^{\circ}$  (*S.  $14^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) direction, through Ramsey Stone to the opposite shore, and a line drawn through the Tollesbury and Mersea Oyster Fishery Company's Beacon on Thurslet Spit and the same Company's Beacon on the south side of the river.

(vi) To enable vessels to save their tides they will be permitted to navigate the Rivers Colne, Blackwater, and Crouch at night above the following places:—

River Roach above Quay Reach.

River Crouch above Burnham Coastguard Station.

River Blackwater above Ramsey Island Stone.

River Colne above Brightlingsea Creek.

They are to anchor immediately, should they be ordered to do so by the Naval or Military Authorities.

(vii) Vessels are to carry out all instructions received from the Naval Officers in command of vessels patrolling these Channels and Rivers.

(viii) No vessels are to enter or pass through the defended area in the Middle Deep and Swin Channels until they have been boarded and examined by the vessels stationed there for that purpose. Permission is given, subject to preliminary boarding and examination, for sailing vessels, if they so desire to pass to the eastward of the Maplin lighthouse, but under no circumstances may they pass to the eastward of any of the conical buoys in the defended area.

(Note.—*The Examination Officers will board South-bound vessels in the vicinity of the Whitaker Spit. Those leaving the Thames and Medway will be boarded near the Mouse Light-Vessel.*)

The Boarding Officers will give Masters of vessels instructions as to the course they are to steer when passing through the defended area.

(ix) Vessels reaching the entrance to the defended area within one hour of sunset will not be allowed to pass through till daylight.

6. All vessels, other than those of British Nationality or those of the Allied Nations, are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers.

All Neutral Aliens are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers in British vessels, and this applies to Aliens carried in British ships or barges as passengers or part of crew; the limits of the prohibited area are defined as from the Outer Bar buoy in the River Medway to Rochester bridge, and the whole of the River Swale from the light on Queenborough spit to Columbine spit buoy. Attention is drawn to the necessity of ship-owners and charterers satisfying themselves that no Neutral Aliens are on board vessels sent to the Rivers Medway and Swale.

### III. HARWICH APPROACHES— TRAFFIC REGULATION.

With a view to safeguarding the interests of shipping in the vicinity of Harwich, no vessel, either British, Allied, or Neutral, is to be within the area west of a line joining the following positions:

(a) Lat.  $52^{\circ} 08' N.$ , long.  $1^{\circ} 41' E.$

(b) Lat.  $52^{\circ} 02' N.$ , long.  $1^{\circ} 42' E.$

(c) Sunk Light-Vessel.

(d) Sunk Head Buoy.

Except in the case of a vessel trading with Netherlands ports which may enter the area to the Westward of the Sunk Light-Vessel, in order to communicate with the Sunk Pilot-Vessel, to embark or disembark her pilot, should the Pilot Vessel be on her Pilot Station within the area at the time.

Any vessel contravening the foregoing regulation will run the gravest risk of being sunk.
