

In the Matter of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1916, and in the Matter of FELD BROS. AND CO. Limited.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Board of Trade, dated the 26th day of September, 1916, and made under section 1, sub-sections (1) and (2) of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1916, it was ordered and required that the business carried on in the United Kingdom by the above named Feld Bros. and Co. Limited, of 432/433, Mansion House-chambers, Queen Victoria-street, London, E.C., should be wound up, and Mr. J. E. Percival, of 6, Old Jewry, London, E.C., was appointed Controller to control and supervise the carrying out of the order and to conduct the winding-up of the said business, and the said Mr. J. E. Percival has made application to the Board of Trade under section 1, sub-section (5) of the said Act to grant him a release:

THE Court of Directors of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England give notice that a General Court will be held at the Bank on Thursday, the 20th September, at 12 o'clock precisely, to consider of a dividend. This will also be one of the half-yearly General Courts.
