Pendennis, October 15.

Several ships which lately put in here on their return from Foreign Parts, are put out again to Sea, bound to their particular Ports. The 3d instant came in the *Olive Branch of London*, intending for the *Ganaries*, with two or three other Vessels outwards bound. The *Albemarle, Africa*, and near 30 sail of other Merchants ships, are now in Port, expecting a fair wind; amongst whom are three or four Dutch Merchants Ships intended for *Bordeaux*.

Lisbonne, Sept. 8. On Sunday last was issued out Orders for Solemn and Publick Prayers in all the Churches, and that the Sacrament should be publicly exposed for nine dayes; since that these following Persons have been nominated to the Succession in the Vacant Arch-Bishopricks and Bishopricks of this Kingdom.

What alteration may be made in this Nomination we yet know not.

Alcicante, Septemb. 10. Letters of the 5th instant from *Algiers* inform us, that ten of the men of War lately employed in the Grand Seigniors service are returned from *Candia*, having by the way met with five small Venetian ships, two of which they sunk, and burnt one, the other two escaping; they brought in with them two French Sayias and one Polack of considerable value, selling the people they found aboard them publicly in the Market for slaves.

Eight other of their men of War are gone out to sea with private Orders from the Duan, sealed up, which they are not to open till they are out at sea.

From *Malaga* we are informed of the arrival there, of the *Leopard* an English Fregat, having on board her his Excellency Sir *Daniel Harvy* His Majesty of Great Britains Ambassador, intended for *Constantinople*.

Madrid, Septemb. 19. The Marquis *de Villars Orinda* being lately arrived in this Court, in Quality of Envoye Extraordinary from the Court of France, has made his Compliments to their Majesties upon the birth of the young Duke of *Anjou*, for the return of which Compliment, the Court has nominated the Camp master *Don Geronimo Quinoas*.

From *Cadix*, Letters of the 9th instant advise us of the late arrival there of a Squadron of English men of War under the Command of Sir *Thomas Allen*, who intended in few dayes to pass thence for the Streights.

From *Lisbonne* they tell us that they have information

that the Moors in *Africk* had an intention with a numerous Army to attempt upon their Garrison of *Mazagora* for prevention whereof, the Portuguez were dispatching away three Caravels laden with men and other necessaries for the defence of that place.

Cadix, Septemb. 23. Sir *Thomas Allen* with a Squadron under his Command departed some days since from this place, and is safely arrived at *Tangier*, only the *Tyger* Fregat endeavouring to put in there, spent her Fore-mast and Main-top, and is since come in again hither to repair.

Sir *Thomas Allen* lying off this Bay, was complemented and saluted by the Holland Squadron of six Men of War, their Admiral giving 15 Guns to His Majesties Flag, which Sir *Tho.* returned with a like number, the rest giving and receiving the usual civilities practis'd on such occasions.

Rome, Septemb. 29. The Duke of *Parma* finding the difficulties daily encreasing about the restitution of *Castro*, hath this week ordered the summe of Moneys formerly taken up for its redemption to be restored to the Merchants from whence it was drawn.

From *Naples* we are advised, that about 900 of the Banditi are got together in the Province of *Puglia*, where they are fortifying themselves in the fastnesses, and have carried in out of the adjacent Countreys large quantities of Ammunition, Corn, Wine and other necessaries, which may be sufficient to maintain them for many moneths, of which the Vice-Roy having information, hath ordered four Companies of Spanish Foot to march into that Countrey to secure the peace.

Vienna, Septemb. 30. The Reformation of the Army is still continued, many of the disbanded soldiers as they are paid off searching for employment in *Muscovy*, or passing into the service of the Venetians.

The Deputies from the States of *Hungary* have in an Audience at *Ebersdorf* received assurances from His Imperial Majesty, that he will in little time give them liberty to assemble themselves in a General Diet at *Presburga* wherein they shall proceed according to their desires to the election of a Palatine.

The Turks continue their design of building a Fort upon the *Danube* for the security of those Convoys, which they are frequently obliged to send for the maintenance of their Garrison at *Neuhaußel*.

The 28th instant, the Arch-Bishop Primate of *Hungary* and the Chancellour had another Audience from the Emperour, wherein they pressed hard that His Imperial Majesty would nominate some Commissioners to consider and examine several Grievances, which it were convenient to remedy before the Convocation of the General Diet.

Madrid, Off. 3. The young Prince of *Tuscany* is in little time expected in this Court, and the Pallace de *Buon Retiro* preparing for his Reception; the Queen Regent has already sent to Duke d' *Osanna* to receive him with much honour, to entertain him upon his Majesties account, and to attend him to the Confinnes of his Government; where the Vice-Roy of *Aragon* is to receive and entertain him in the same manner; and conduct him to the Borders of *Castille*; whither some Person of Honour will be sent in the Name of their Majesties to complement him, and attend him to this place.

The Baron de *Batavis* journey to *Lisbonne* is yet uncertain.

Staats, Offob. 4. The Queen *Christina* arriv'g lately at this place made her entry with extraordinary Ceremony, the whole City being drawn into Arms, and placed in Order

Order to receive her, and above 80 Great Guns discharged from the Ramparts, with several volleys from the Musketeers. That day she was entertained with much liberality by General *W'rangle*, and the next diverted with several entertainments, and in the evening with Fireworks of excellent Artifice, wherein was exhibited the Queens name, and a Neptune upon the water with two sea-horses and his Trident, to the great satisfaction of the Queen and all the spectators: The day following about 11 in the morning, all the Swedish Army which has for some time been quartered in the Dutchy of *Bremen*, were drawn into the field between this and *Hagen* in the Plain appointed for their Rendezvous, the whole body consisting of 18 Squadrons of Horse, and nine Brigades of Foot, in all about 11000 men, and 18 Field pieces, which being ordered into several Battailles, they gave several volleys of shot, and made several skirmishes in excellent order, representing a battle; which ending they drew off again to their Quarters where they attend further Orders; several ships are arrived in the River for the Transportation of a great part of them.

The Queen is returned with much satisfaction to *Hambourg*, from whence she has thoughts of departure to make another voyage into *Italy*.

Hambourg, Oct. 12. The Queen of *Swedeland* is again returned hither, much satisfied with her entertainment at *Staad*. The Swedish forces are marching for *Pomerania*, about 300 of them only being left in Garrison in the Dutchy of *Bremen*.

From *Stockholme* we are told, that the Assembly of the States of that Kingdom is now dissolved, but their resolutions not yet published; and that the King is at present somewhat indisposed in his health.

Bruges, Oct. 16. There are lately arrived at *Ostend* four ships, with about 12 hundred Italian foot for the Service of those Countries, and 'tis said four Regiments more are in little time expected to follow them.

The Marquis *de Castel Rodrigo* having left at *Ostend* all his Retinue, with his Baggage, to be there embarked for *Spain*, is privately gone thence to *Callice* by land, with intention to make his journey thence to *France*.

Yesterday came Letters from the New Governour the Constable of *Castille*, to the Lords of *Flanders* and of this City, countermanding the Orders formerly given out by the Marquis *de Castel Rodrigo* for the payment of the Militia by the several Provinces; requiring that after the expiration of this Month all payments shall be made as formerly to the Governour, that the moneys may by his Order be distributed amongst the soldiery.

Hague, Oct. 16. The 12th instant arrived here the Heer *Van Beuning*, from his Employment under the Character of Ambassador Extraordinary in the French Court, and the next day attended the States in their Assembly, to whom he gave an account of his Negotiation; of which they seemed fully satisfied, and returned him their thanks for the great Services he had thereby rendered to the Publick.

On Monday Morning last Monsieur *d' Estrades* the French Ambassador had his Audience of Congé from the States, intending to spend this week in visiting, and the next to leave the Town.

The 2400 *Lunenbourgers* designed for the assistance of the Venetians, seem not pleased with the resolution taken of sending them away by sea. Several Commissioners are nominated to be sent to *Deventer*, to consider of some expedient for their satisfaction, and to take order for their motion. The Seat *Muller* the *Lunenbourg* Agent, finding their number of late decreased, is endeavouring privately to make them up, according to the first intention.

On Friday last his Highness the Prince of *Orange* visited the Pensionary *de Wit*, with whom he had a long Conference, and went afterwards to *Houstaerdiick*, from whence he is again returned.

All Publick Acts of Justice in this Province are to pass for the future in the Name of the States of *Holland* and *West Vriesland*.

The 13th instant came into the *Texel* the Fleet from *St.*

Hube, and with them one ship from *Lisb*, infor ming that at her departure thence, which was the 17th past, the *Brasil* Fleet was not arrived, though daily expected.

The 12th instant came into the *Texel* the Captains *Van den Woods* and *Kuilembourg* from *Cadix*, with 9 Merchant ships under their Convoy, informing, that the 23th past they were met by 5 *Barbary* Men of War, who took a View of them, but misdoubting their own strength, made all the Sail they were able from them; leaving this Convoy to pursue their Voyage.

Disso, From *Lingen* we are told by Letters bearing date the 13th instant, that on the Thursday before the Countess *de Bentheim* was seized on by a party sent out by the Bishop of *Munster*, and conducted to a Cloister at *Coevels*, where the said Bishop and the Count *de Bentheim* attended her arrival.

From *Deventer* we are told, that some of the *Lunenbourg* forces which were in garrison at *Otmarsen*, being drawn together to receive their Pay, endeavoured to have plundered the Town; but the Inhabitants putting themselves into arms, opposed them, and beat them off from their intention, wounding many of them.

Paris, Octob. 17. Letters from *Perpignan* inform us, that several Counsellors of the Chamber Sovereign went lately from *Aries* to *Rousillon* to settle there the Gabells; but the people taking the Allarum, and disliking their proceedings, tumultuously got together and besieged them, in which tumult, several persons were killed on both sides, the Counsellors themselves running a great hazard of their lives, and had not escaped their fury, but upon a promise made of presently leaving the Town, and for the future to forbear the execution of the like Commissions amongst them.

His Majesty is now upon his return from *Chambourg*, intending to lye on Sunday at *Bloys*, there to continue for two days, and to pass thence on Wednesday for *Chartres*, and might be expected the Saturday following at *St. Ger. mains*.

From *Amiens* we are told, that the people of that place having suffered many wants by reason of the Plague which hindered all Commerce with them, were of late grown very disorderly, tumultuously opposing the Magistrates, plundering and robbing many houses of the most principal Citizens; of which complaint being made, His Majesty has ordered 2000 men to be drawn out of the Neighbouring Garrisons, and sent thither to reduce them to obedience.

By the way of *Marseilles* we have advice from *Legorn* of the arrival there of the Sieur *Tavernier* on his return from *Persia* with great quantities of Jewels.

Lyme, Oct. 7. The *Windfor* a Merchant Ship of this place arriving here from *Morlaix*, informs us, that the Plague continues still at *Rouen*, where there weekly die about 30 or 40 persons, but by the care of the Magistrates, so strict Guards are kept in all places, that the infection hath not of late spread it self into the Country.
