At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of October, 1917.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act

may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

†Note (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidating List, No. 37A) consolidating all previous Lists revised to date and including the amendments in the Schedule annexed hereto is issued concurrently with this Order. This Consolidating List contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two

weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa.

Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names When the applicant of suitable substitutes. wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the spondence. work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

\*Note (6):—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappy" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance Handel Maatschappy van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

#### ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

LEATHER.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Army Council to take possession of all Leather that may be imported into the United Kingdom at any time after the date hereof.

If after this notice any person having any such Leather in his control without the consent of the Army Council sells, removes or secretes it, or deals with it in any way contrary to any licence that may have been granted by the Army Council in respect thereof, he shall be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations.

And it is hereby ordered that no person shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, make or take delivery of or payment for any such Leather as aforesaid in pursuance of any agreement entered into on or subsequently to the 3rd day of October, 1917.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

CITY OF LINCOLN.

Whereas by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903") it is enacted that the Local Government Board may by Regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, issued by the Local Government Board in pursuance of the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, the expression "heavy motor car" in that Order is defined as a motor car exceeding

two tons in weight unladen;

Notice is hereby given, that the Council of the City of Lincoln have made application to the Local Government Board for a Regulation to be made under Section 6 of the Act of 1896 and Section 8 of the Act of 1903, for prohibiting the driving of heavy motor cars (as defined by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904) on the road leading from St. Benedict's Square to Brayford Wharf East, in the City of Lincoln:

ENGLISH CHANNEL, NORTH SEA SOUTHERN PORTION, WITH RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY AND APPROACHES.

Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 929 of 1917; hereby

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

- I. ENGLISH CHANNEL AND NORTH SEA SOUTHERN PORTION—PILOT-AGE REGULATIONS.
- I.—All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.
- 2. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.
- 3. Clauses 1 and 2 above do not apply to British ships whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Gravesend, or between Gravesend and Great Yarmouth or between Great Yarmouth and the Downs Pilot Station, provided that they do not

make use of any port in the London Pilotage District within these limits.

4. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Porth north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

5. All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Great Yarmouth and vice versa, and between those places and the Sunk light-vessel, or any intermediate pilot station that may hereafter be established, and vice versa, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by

the London Trinity House.

6. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

7. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

- age are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

  (a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamers attached to the Downs, Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal Pier.
  - (b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise in the vicinity

of St. Nicholas light-vessel.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships trading with Netherlands Ports, but no others, can obtain Pilots for the River Thames and the Downs.

The Sunk Pilot Steamer will be on her station and available for shipping and landing Pilots between the following hours (G.M.T.):—

From the date hereof until the 14th October, 1917, between 6.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. only.

From the 15th October until the 31st October, 1917, between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.

From the 1st November until the 14th November, 1917, between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. only.

From the 15th November, 1917, until the 14th January, 1918, between 7.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. only.

From the 15th January until the 31st January, 1918, between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. only.

From the 1st February until the 14th February, 1918, between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. only.

From the 15th February until the 28th February, 1918, between 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. only.

From the 1st March until the 14th March, 1918, between 7 a.m. and 6.30

From the 15th March until the 31st March, 1918, between 6.30 a.m. and 7

p.m. only.

From the 1st April until the 30th April, 1918, between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. only.

From the 1st May, 1918, until further notice, between 5 a.m. and 7 p.m. only.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at London for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

## II.—RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY, &c.—TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-Buoys, and through the Oaze Deep until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels between a line drawn from London Stone to No. 3 Sea Reach Light-Buoy and thence to Canvey Point on the west, and the Sunk Head Buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles Buoys, on the east, from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights from one hour after

sunset until one hour before sunrise.

No merchant or other private vessel is to be at anchor in the Black Deep, and the Main Channel of the Thames, to the Southward of a line joining a position in lat. 51° 39′ N., long. 1° 23′ E., D3 Buoy, a position in lat. 51° 33′ 08″ N., long. 1° 13′ 03″ E., Knob Light-Buoy, a position in lat. 51° 31′ 45″ N., long. 1° 04′ 48″ E., South Shoebury Light-Buoy, a position in lat. 51° 29′ 15″ N., long. 0° 49′ 45″ E., and Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Sea Reach Buoys, except when

obliged to anchor on account of fog.

No vessel is to anchor in the Black Deep between the parallel of lat. 51° 39′ N., and the Sunk Light-Vessel, without special orders, except such South-bound vessels as are unable to proceed further south owing to darkness or thick weather; vessels anchoring under such circumstances are only to anchor to the westward of a line joining positions in lat 51° 45′ 00″ N., long. 1° 30′ 15″ E., lat. 51° 42′ 00″ N., long. 1° 27′ 30″ E., and lat. 51° 39′ N., long. 1° 23′ E., and well clear of the fairway.

All other Channels are closed to navigation. The Nore Examination Anchorage is reserved for vessels under examination before entry into the Medway, and also for vessels on Government service which have left the Medway and are awaiting orders as to route, &c.

- 2. Coasting vessels are not to be under way nor exhibit any lights in the East Swin or Wallet between sunset and sunrise.
- 3. No merchant vessel is to be in the following area in the approaches to the River Thames, from one hour after sunset to half-an-hour before sunrise:—

The area is bounded on the north by the parallel of lat. 51° 33′ N.

The area is bounded on the east by the meridian of long. 1° 35′ E.

The area is bounded on the south by the parallel of lat. 51° 16′ N.

The area is bounded on the west by the

meridian of long. 1° 24' E.

Any merchant vessel contravening the foregoing regulation will run the gravest risk of being sunk.

- 4. The use of the Swin and Wallet Channels by sailing barges and small trading vessels engaged in coastwise traffic along the Essex coast is permitted, subject to compliance with the following restrictions:—
  - (i) Each vessel must obtain from the Customs a special clearance card, which is to be kept available for inspection by the Patrol Officers, on demand.
  - (ii) A red ensign is to be displayed while navigating the Middle Deep and Swin Channel.

(iii) No vessel may be under way after dark, except as provided for hereinafter.

(iv.) When at anchor in the Wallet, Ray Sand, and Whitaker Channels, or in the Rivers Colne, Blackwater, and Crouch, all lights are to be screened so that they will not show outboard.

(v) No vessel may anchor in the River Crouch in the area bounded by lines drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and a 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction, through Burnham Coastguard Station and Holliwell point; or in the River Blackwater in the areas bounded by a line drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and a 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction, through Ramsey Stone to the opposite shore, and a line drawn through the Tollesbury and Mersea Oyster Fishery Company's Beacon on Thurslet Spit and the same Company's Beacon on the south side of the river.

(vi) To enable vessels to save their tides they will be permitted to navigate the Rivers Colne, Blackwater, and Crouch at night

above the following places:-

River Roach above Quay Reach.

River Crouch above Burnham Coast-guard Station.

River Blackwater above Ramsey Island stone.

River Colne above Brightlingsea Creek.

They are to anchor immediately, should they be ordered to do so by the Naval or Military Authorities.

Military Authorities.

(vii) Vessels are to carry out all instructions received from the Naval Officers in command of vessels patrolling these Channels and Rivers.

(viii) No vessels are to enter or pass through the defended area in the Middle Deep and Swin Channels until they have been boarded and examined by the vessels stationed there for that purpose. Permission is given, subject to preliminary boarding and examination, for sailing vessels, if they so desire, to pass to the eastward of the Maplin Lighthouse, but under no circumstances may they pass to the eastward of any of the conical buoys in the defended area.

(Note.—The Examination Officers will board South-bound vessels in the vicinity of the Whitaker Spit. Those leaving the Thames and Medway will be boarded near the Mouse Light-Vessel.)

The Boarding Officers will give Masters of vessels instructions as to the course they are to steer when passing through the defended area.

(ix) Vessels reaching the entrance to the defended area within one hour of sunset will not be allowed to pass through till daylight.

5. All vessels, other than those of British Nationality or those of the Allied Nations, are prohibited from entering the Medway and

Swale rivers.

All Neutral Aliens are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers in British vessels, and this applies to Aliens carried in British ships or barges as passengers or part of crew; the limits of the prohibited area are defined as from the Outer Bar Buoy in the River Medway to Rochester bridge, and the whole of the River Swale from the light on Queenborough spit to Columbine spit Buoy. Attention is drawn to the necessity of shipowners and charterers satisfying themselves that no Neutral Aliens are on board vessels sent to the Rivers Medway and Swale. Variation.—14° W.

#### III. HARWICH APPROACHES-TRAF-FIC REGULATION.

With a view to safeguarding the interests of shipping in the vicinity of Harwich, no vessel, either British, Allied, or Neutral, is to be within the area west of a line joining the following positions:

(a) Lat. 52° 08′ N., long. 1° 41′ E. (b) Lat. 52° 02′ N., long. 1° 42′ E.

(c) Sunk Light-Vessel. (d) Sunk Head Buoy.

Except in the case of a vessel trading with Netherlands ports which may enter the area to the Westward of the Sunk Light-Vessel, in order to communicate with the Sunk Pilot-Vessel, to embark or disembark her pilot, should the Pilot-Vessel be on her Pilot Station with the area at the time.

Any vessel contravening the foregoing regulation will run the gravest risk of being sunk.

ENGLAND, EAST COAST.

Thames Estuary and River Medway--Regulations with regard to Yachts and Pleasure Craft.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

1. (i) The cruising of yachts and pleasure craft in the Thames Estuary and River Medway will be permitted under the following restric-

tions:

(a) No mechanically propelled vessel may be used for pleasure cruising.

(b) No commercial vessel may take out pleasure parties or any persons other than the regular crew.

(c) No professional fisherman or boatman

may be employed on a pleasure craft.

(d) Pleasure cruising is only allowed on the understanding that all persons using pleasure craft will do their utmost to increase the food supply by catching fish; pleasure craft which ignore this condition are liable to be laid up by order of the local Police.

(ii) Except as stated in paragraph (xiii) no pleasure craft are allowed:-

(a) In the Estuary of the Thames East of a line drawn between the Grain Spit and

West Shoebury Buoys.

(b) In the area enclosed between a line drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction through the Ovens Buoy and a line joining Holehaven Point and the Blyth Middle Buoy.

(c) In the Medway East of Rochester

Bridge.

- (iii) For the purposes of this order the Estuary of the Thames includes the North Coast of Kent from North Foreland to Sheerness, and the Coast of Essex from Shoeburyness to the Naze.
- (iv) All pleasure craft of any description are prohibited from being under weigh between sunset and sunrise, except as provided for in par. (xiii).

(v) Pleasure craft using the waters to the West of the line mentioned in par. (ii) (a), in which cruising is permitted, and also pulling boats which are permitted under par. (xi), must obtain a licence from the local Police.

(vi) No licences are, however, required for pleasure cruising to the West of Rochester Bridge, nor is par. (i) (d) applicable to such pleasure cruising. Otherwise pleasure cruispleasure cruising. ing to the West of Rochester Bridge, so far as the tide flows, is to be governed by these regulations.

(vii) The licence to be in the following

form:—

Mr. (name, Christian and Surname) of (address) is hereby authorised to use a (here state whether sailing vessel, rowing boat, etc.) in (area to be specified in detail) from sunrise to sunset.

This licence is available for six months from date of issue, when it is to be returned and a new licence will be issued, if required.

If more than one craft is used, a separate

licence is required for each.

- (viii) The name must be marked legibly on every yacht. All open, half-decked and other craft must have the number and distinguishing letter of the licence clearly painted on each side of the bow.
  - (ix) The licence must be carried in the craft,

and is to be available for inspection.

(x) Boats licensed for hire may be taken out by British subjects other than those in whose names the licences are made out, provided that they be returned to the licences by sunset on the day of hire. The licence for the boat must be carried by the person hiring it.

(xi) Pulling boats are allowed within the area prohibited by par. (ii) (a) provided:—

- (a) A separate licence is obtained for each boat.
- (b) Pars. (i) (v) (vii) (viii) (ix) and (x) are complied with.
- (c) No such boats proceed more than one mile from the shore, nor, in the area between Margate Coast Guard Station and the North Foreland, more than half a mile from the shore.

Pulling boats are forbidden to go alongside or communicate with any vessel lying off the shore.

- (xii) No pleasure pulling boats are allowed in the Medway to the Eastward of Rochester Bridge, nor are any allowed in the area mentioned in par. (ii) (b).
- (xiii) Amateurs desiring to fish for fish as food, outside the areas in which pleasure cruising is permitted, may obtain permits as laid down in (f) below, authorising them to fish in those areas in which, and subject to the conditions under which, fishing is permitted to commercial fishing boats, subject to the following provisions:—
  - (a) The crew of the boat, and if desired an alternative for each, shall be named on the permit, which shall be signed by each of those persons, and no persons other than those named on the permit may be at sea in the boat.
  - (b) Boats sailing under amateur fishing permits shall not carry as members of their crews bona fide fishermen or boatmen holding or qualified to hold commercial fishing permits.
  - (c) Amateurs and visitors who propose to hire boats for periods of not less than one week, and whose credentials are satisfactory, may obtain amateur fishing permits as laid down in (f) below. The period of such a permit shall be stated on it together with the holder's home address and the permit must be given up to the Local Correspondent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries at the end of the period for which it is valid.

(d) The crews of boats fishing under these regulations may be called upon to make returns of their catches and if these returns are considered to be unsatisfactory their permits will be liable to be withdrawn.

(e) Amateur fishing permits will be issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries and countersigned by the Senior Naval

Officer

(f) Applications for permits should be made to the Local Correspondent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries in the port to which the boat belongs or at the nearest part at which there is such a correspondent.

(g) Copies of the regulations governing fishing in the Nore area can be obtained from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 43, Parliament Street, London, S.W. 1, or from

the Board's Local Correspondents.

(xiv) Amateur fishing permits may be endorsed, suspended or withdrawn by the Senior Naval Officer or the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by whom, acting in conjunction, the provisions as to fishing may be modified locally.

(xv) Boats fishing under these Regulations are liable at any time to be ordered to port or detained in port by the Naval Patrol Boats or

other Naval Authority.

(xvi) Where it is proved that there is a shortage of bona fide fishermen to form the crews of fishing boats provided with commercial fishing permits, licences may be granted by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or their representatives to a limited number of approved amateur fishermen or yachtsmen enabling them to ship as whole time crews of such boats.

(xvii) It should be noted that, although mechanically propelled craft are prohibited from pleasure cruising, such craft are not prohibited from fishing under the amateur permit

system defined above.

(xviii) Commercial fishing vessels are governed by the terms of the Notices issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

2. (i) In the Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach Rivers the cruising of yachts and pleasure craft will be permitted under the following restrictions:—

(a) No mechanically propelled vessel may

be used for pleasure cruising.

(b) No commercial vessel may take out pleasure parties or any persons other than the regular crew.

(c) No professional fisherman or boatman

may be employed on a pleasure craft.

- (d) Pleasure cruising is only allowed on the understanding that all persons using pleasure craft will do their utmost to increase the food supply by catching fish; pleasure craft which ignore this condition are liable to be laid up by order of the local Police.
- (ii) All pleasure craft of any description are prohibited from being under weigh between sunset and sunrise, and every such vessel shall return to the anchorage from which she started by sunset, excepting as follows:—

Pleasure craft may proceed from place to place in the area for which the permit is issued provided that the local Police are clearly notified previously of the anchorage proposed for the night, and that the local Police are again informed on arrival at the new anchorage.

Upon this condition, the persons named in the permit (and no one else) may remain

- on board for the night. They must otherwise disembark before dark and in any case by 9 p.m. G.M.T. (except as laid down in clause xi).
- (iii) Pleasure craft using the areas mentioned in parts (ix) and (x), in which cruising is permitted, must obtain a licence from the local Police.
- (iv) The licence to be in the following form:—
  - Mr. (name, Christian and Surname) of (address) is hereby authorised to use a (here state whether sailing vessel, pulling boat, etc.) in (area to be specified in detail) from sunrise to sunset.

This licence is available for six months, when it is to be returned and a new licence will be issued, if desirable.

If more than one craft is used, a separate licence is required for each.

- (v) The name must be marked legibly on every yacht. All open, half-decked and other craft must have the number and distinguishing letter of the licence clearly painted on each side of the bow.
- (vi) The licence must be carried in the craft, and is to be available for inspection.
- (vii) Boats licensed for hire may be taken out by British subjects other than those in whose names the licences are made out, provided that they be returned to the licences by sunset on the day of hire. The licence for the boat must be carried by the person hiring it, and the licencee will be responsible for the bona fides of the person hiring it.

  (viii) Local craft used for business purposes
- (viii) Local craft used for business purposes are subject to the foregoing regulations, but may in certain instances be allowed in prohibited areas if permission in writing has been previously obtained from the Naval or Military Authorities.
- (ix) Cruising is permitted in the area to the West of a line drawn from Colne Point to N.W. Knoll Buoy and thence to Sales Point; and up these rivers. In the River Blackwater no vessel may anchor, nor many any landings be effected, in the area bounded by a line drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction, through Ramsey Stone to the opposite shore, and a line drawn through the Tollesbury and Mersea Oyster Fishery Company's Beacon on Thurslet Spit and the same Company's Beacon on the South side of the river, and extended to the North and South shores of the river.
- (x) Cruising is permitted in the Crouch West of a line drawn in a 0° (N. 14° E. Mag.) and 180° (S. 14° W. Mag.) direction through Nass Point. Cruising is also permitted in the Roach as far as Paglesham Hard, but owners of yachts are to intimate their intention to proceed up the Roach to the Coastguard, Burnham, before leaving, and report their return.
  - (a) No vessels may anchor in the Crouch between the Coastguard Station and Nass Point.
  - (b) Landing in the Roach may be permitted only at Paglesham Hard and permits are to be exhibited to the Military Patrol stationed there.
- (xi) Owners of boats anchored within sight of Burnham Coastguard Station, in Mersea

- Quarters, or Brightlingsea Creek may go on board their boats up to 9 p.m. G.M.T. provided that a permit to do this has been obtained from the Senior Naval Officer, Brightlingsea, and provided also that the boat remains at anchor.
- (xii) Amateurs desiring to fish for fish as food, outside the areas in which pleasure cruising is permitted, may obtain permits as laid down in (f) below, authorising them to fish in those areas in which, and subject to the conditions under which, fishing is permitted to commercial fishing boats, subject to the following provisions:—
  - (a) The crew of the boat, and if desired an alternative for each, shall be named on the permit, which shall be signed by each of those persons, and no persons other than those named on the permit may be at sea in the boat.
  - (b) Boats sailing under amateur fishing permits shall not carry as members of their crews bona fide fishermen or boatmen holding or qualified to hold commercial fishing permits.
  - (c) Amateurs and visitors who propose to hire boats for periods of not less than one week, and whose credentials are satisfactory, may obtain amateur fishing permits as laid down in (f) below. The period of such a permit shall be stated on it together with the holder's home address and the permit must be given up to the Local Correspondent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries at the end of the period for which it is valid.

(d) The crews of boats fishing under these regulations may be called upon to make returns of their catches and if these returns are considered to be unsatisfactory their permits will be liable to be withdrawn.

Position.—At a distance of 3 miles and  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables, 77° (S. 85° E. Mag.), from Rosslare point Pilot Signal staff.

Lat. 52° 20½' N., long 6° 17¼' W.

Description.—A black pillar-shaped light-buoy exhibiting a flashing red light every three seconds.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (CONSOLI-DATION) ACT, 1914, AND THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGU-LATIONS.

BYELAW (ORDER).

Deep Sea Certificate shall embark as pilot on any vessel, not being a British vessel, in the waters between Berwick and Flamborough Head unless he has been engaged through the Pilot Office at South Shields, or other authorised Agency, and any such pilot who embarks under an engagement obtained otherwise than as aforesaid shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Byelaw.

A list of pilots shall be kept at such Pilot Office, and a Registration Fee of Five shillings (5/-) shall be paid by every pilot on applying to have his name placed on such list.

The foregoing Byelaw is made under the authority of the Corporation of Trinity House, London, acting under the instructions of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and comes into force the 15th day of October, 1917.

Note.—Attention is drawn to the fact that any pilot who corruptly offers, and any Agent who corruptly accepts, any money or valuable consideration with respect to the employment of a pilot will be guilty of a misdemeanour under the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1906, and liable if convicted on indictment to not more than two years' imprisonment with or without hard labour or a fine not exceeding Five hundred pounds (£500) or both; if convicted summarily, to not more than four months' imprisonment or a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) or both.
