

Meeting, the number of the Directors shall not be less than five nor more than twelve."

"When it is proposed to pass a Special Resolution the two Meetings for such purpose may be convened by one and the same notice, and it shall be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second Meeting contingently on the Resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first Meeting."
