The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 30th day of October, 1917, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTE APPROVED BY THE CONVOCATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD, ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 30, 1917.

Whereas it is expedient to amend Sectio II. A. § 4 of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, so as to vary the constitution of the Board of Electors to the Oriel Professorship of the Interpretation of Holy Scripture:

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. II. A. § 4. cl. 2 (p. 78, ed. 1914), after the words "consisting of" all the words to the end of the clause shall be struck out, and the following words shall be substituted:—

"(1) The Archbishop of Canterbury, or a person appointed by him on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion;

(2) The Bishop of Rochester;

(3) The Vice-Chancellor, or, if an election is to be held at a time when the Provost of Oriel College is Vice-Chancellor, a person appointed by the Hebdomadal Council to act as an Elector on that occasion in the place of the Vice-Chancellor;

(4) The Provost of Oriel College, or, if he is unable or unwilling to act, a person appointed by the Provost and Fellows of Oriel College on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion;

(5) A person elected by the Hebdomadal Council;

(6) The Regius Professor of Divinity;

(7) A person elected by the Board of the Faculty of Theology."
