A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms,

ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

- Abrasive wheels.
- Binder or reaper twine.
- Brass rod and brass wire.
- Cycles, other than motor cycles.
- Electric meters.
- Electrical motors over one-half horse-power.
- Electric hand lamps and torches.

Magnetos.

Measuring tapes and rules of all descriptions, including verniers.

Micrometers.

Pens, penholders, pencils and all other stationery of which the importation is not already prohibited.

Vegetables in brine.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 20) Proclamation, 1917.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we consider that the emoluments of Quartermaster Sergeant Instructors in the Royal Marines are inadequate.

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the following allowances being granted to these Warrant Officers, with effect as from the 10th October, 1917.

“Quartermaster Sergeant Instructors of Gunnery to receive, in addition to their pay, Gunnery Instructional Allowance of 6*d.* a day, and such gunlayer pay as they are qualified for.

“Quartermaster Sergeant Instructors of Musketry and Infantry to receive Instructional Allowance of 6*d.* a day.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 28th day of June, 1917, to institute the Commissioned Warrant Rank of Commissioned Master at Arms, and to provide that one Officer of this rank should be borne pending the operation of the rule under which deserving Warrant Officers belonging to Classes in which Commissioned Warrant Rank is attainable are promoted to Commissioned Warrant Rank after 15 years' service as Warrant Officer:

“And whereas we consider that, pending the operation of this rule, the number of Commissioned Masters at Arms allowed should be increased to three:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of such increase in the number of Commissioned Masters at Arms; the Officers of this rank to be included in the established number of Chief Masters at Arms.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, and having regard to the provisions of the Berlin Copyright Convention,

was pleased to make an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of June, 1912 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection is guaranteed by the said Convention:

And whereas His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco has acceded to the said Convention in so far as concerns that part of the Empire of Morocco which is under French Protection:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Principal Order shall extend to that part of the Empire of Morocco which is under French Protection as if it were amongst the Foreign Countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) The provisions of Article 2, proviso (iii) (a) shall apply as if the aforesaid Territory were included amongst the Foreign Countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is that part of the Empire of Morocco which is under French Protection the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act and for the Commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act in Section 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs; and the 16th June, 1917, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-section (1) (a), and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-section (1) (b).

And the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury are to give the necessary orders accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of October, in the year 1917, in

the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries of Ely and Wisbech, in the Diocese of Ely, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries:

“ Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Ely and Wisbech, and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries, are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, *firstly*, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed out of the Rural Deanery of Fordham, within the said Archdeaconry of Ely, and shall be named ‘ the Rural Deanery of Cheveley,’ and *secondly*, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed out of the Rural Deanery of Fincham, within the said Archdeaconry of Wisbech, and shall be named ‘ the Rural Deanery of Feltwell,’ and *thirdly*, the said Rural Deaneries of Fordham and Cheveley, and the Rural Deanery of Quay in the said Archdeaconry of Ely, and the said Rural Deaneries of Fincham and Feltwell, and the Rural Deaneries of March and Wisbech, in the said Archdeaconry of Wisbech, shall respectively comprise and consist of the Parishes, Cures and Churches, the names of which are set down in numbered order under the names of such Rural Deaneries respectively in the first column of the Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and each of the said Parishes or Cures or Churches shall belong to and be and form part of the Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry under the names of which it is set down as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery, and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry, under which it is so set down as aforesaid, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the first day of November, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, Sections 6 and 8, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Prebend of Cudworth in the Cathedral Church of Wells, and now vested in us:

"Whereas on the vacancy of the said Prebend which occurred on or about the 17th day of October, in the year 1843, by the decease of the Reverend Thomas Heberden, the then Prebendary, all the lands, tithes, and hereditaments then belonging to the said Prebend (except rights of patronage) became by virtue of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, absolutely vested in us for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us:

"And whereas the lands, tithes, and hereditaments aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding lease or grant, but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof are on account of their character or situation unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands, tithes, and hereditaments, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our Common Fund, it is expedient that the said lands, tithes, and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands, tithes, and hereditaments, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered, by Instrument or Instruments in writing duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty's reign; all or any of the said lands, tithes, and hereditaments formerly belonging to the said Prebend, and so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and

inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other Public Securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Bath and Wells.

They therefore denounce the Commercial Treaty between the United Kingdom and Russia of January 12th, 1859. The Treaty will accordingly be terminated on October 24th, 1918.
