At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th day of November, 1917.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord President. Lord Chamberlain. Sir Frederick Ponsonby. Mr. H. W. Forster.

HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 5th day of November, 1914, entitled the Cyprus (Annexation) Order in Council, 1914, it was directed that from and after the date of the said Order in Council the Island of Cyprus should be annexed to, and form part of, His Majesty's Dominions:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 3rd day of March, 1915, the High Commissioner and Commander-in-Chief of Cyprus, hereinafter called the High Commissioner, declared that under and by virtue of the said Order in Council the following provisions had effect, namely:—

1. That all Ottoman Subjects resident in Cyprus on the 5th November, 1914, had become British Subjects;

2. That any Ottoman Subject resident in Cyprus on the 5th November, 1914, desiring

to retain Ottoman nationality might, by notice under his hand, addressed to the High Commissioner, elect to do so within one month of the coming into operation of the said Proclamation; and any such person electing so to do must leave Cyprus within two months after the date of his election, and take up his residence elsewhere, failing which he would be treated as a British Subject;

- 3. Nothing in the said Proclamation contained was to be deemed to affect the position of Ottoman Subjects born in Cyprus, and resident elsewhere on the 5th November, 1914, with regard to whom a further Proclamation would be issued in due course;
- 4. That the said Proclamation should come into operation on the 4th March, 1915:

And whereas doubts have arisen as to the effect of the said Order in Council of the 5th of November, 1914, upon the nationality of Ottoman Subjects who were in Cyprus on the date thereof, and as to the proper interpretation of the provisions of the said Proclamation regarding the grant of British nationality to Ottoman Subjects resident in Cyprus at that date:

And whereas it is desirable to make further provision regarding the position of Ottoman

Subjects born in Cyprus, and resident elsewhere on the 5th of November, 1914:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The following persons shall be deemed to have become British Subjects under and by virtue of the Cyprus (Annexation) Order in Council, 1914, and the Proclamation of the High Commissioner of the 3rd of March, 1915:—
 - (i.) (a) Any Ottoman Subject who was ordinarily resident, and actually present, in Cyprus on the 5th of November, 1914;
 - (b) Any Ottoman Subject who was ordinarily resident in Cyprus on the 5th of November, 1914, but was absent from Cyprus on that date for the purpose only of his education, or for some other temporary purpose.

Provided that no Ottoman Subject coming within Paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Subarticle who, by notice under his hand, addressed to the High Commissioner before the 4th day of April, 1915, elected to retain Ottoman nationality, and, if present in Cyprus at the date of such election, left Cyprus within 2 months after that date and took up his residence elsewhere, shall be deemed to have become a British Subject under and by virtue of the Cyprus (Annexation) Order in Council, 1914, the High Commissioner's Proclamation of the 3rd of March, 1915, or this Order.

- (ii.) Any Ottoman Subject who, having been born in Cyprus, was not ordinarily resident there on the 5th of November, 1914, and who
- (a) shall apply to the High Commissioner before the expiration of 2 years from the termination of the present War for a certificate of British nationality under this Order; and
- (b) shall have resided in Cyprus for not less than 1 year immediately preceding such application; and
- (c) shall have resided in Cyprus or some other part of His Majesty's Dominions for a further period making a total period of residence in Cyprus, or in Cyprus and some other part of His Majesty's Dominions, as the case may be, of 5 years within the last 8 years before the date of the said application; and
- (d) shall have taken the oath of allegiance as hereinafter directed.
- 2. (i.) A certificate of British nationality shall be granted to any person who has acquired British nationality in accordance with Article 1 (i.) of this Order, and who applies to the High Commissioner for a certificate.
- (ii.) A certificate of British nationality shall be granted to any person coming within Article I (ii.) of this Order who shall have complied with the conditions laid down in Paragraphs (a) (b) (c) and (d) thereof.
- 3. The oath of allegiance may be administered by the President of a District Court, and shall be taken, subscribed, and attested in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
- 4. (i.) Certificates of British nationality under Article 2 (i.) of this Order shall be granted by the High Commissioner in the form

set out in the First Schedule hereto, and a certificate in such form shall be *prima facie* evidence of the British nationality of the person to whom it is granted.

- (ii.) Certificates of British nationality under Article 2 (ii.) of this Order shall be granted by the High Commissioner in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be endorsed with the oath of allegiance taken, subscribed, and attested as hereinbefore directed, and a certificate in such form, and so endorsed, shall be prima facie evidence of the British nationality of the person to whom it is granted.
- (iii.) A certificate of British nationality may be proved in any legal proceeding by the production of the original certificate, or of any copy thereof certified to be a true copy by the High Commissioner, or any person authorized by him in that behalf.
- (iv.) Nothing in this Order shall prevent the High Commissioner from cancelling at any time any certificate of nationality issued under this Order to a person as to whom it may be made to appear to the High Commissioner that he is not entitled to be deemed a British Subject under the provisions hereinbefore contained.
- 5. The High Commissioner may, by Order in Council, make, amend, and revoke regulations for carrying into effect generally the objects of this Order, and in particular with respect to the following matters:—
 - (a) The registration and issue of certified copies of certificates of British nationality:
 - (b) The imposition and application of any fees in respect of any registration authorized to be made under this Order, or the grant of any certificate, or the administration of any oath, or the issue of any certified copy under this Order.
- 6. If any person shall, for any of the purposes of this Order, make any false representation or any statement false in a material particular, he shall be liable in respect of each offence to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for any term not exceeding 6 months.
- 7. This Order may be cited as the Cyprus (Annexation) Amendment Order in Council, 1917, and shall be read as one with the Cyprus (Annexation) Order in Council, 1914, and the said Orders may be cited as the Cyprus (Annexation) Orders in Council, 1914 and 1917.

And the Right Honourable Walter Hume Long, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.



WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and Places of the holding of any Court, and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court, and to order by what Name, and in what Towns and Places, a Court shall be held:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that:—

(1) From and after the 1st day of January next, the County Court of Staffordshire held at Cheadle shall cease to be held at Cheadle, and the Jurisdiction and District now appertaining to the County Court of Staffordshire held at Cheadle shall, as from that date, be transferred to the County Courts of Staffordshire held at Stoke-upon-Trent and Longton, Leek, and Uttoxeter, as hereinafter ordered.

(2) The Parishes of Cheadle, Caverswall, Dilhorne (including the Township or Liberty of Forsbrook) and Draycott-in-the-Moors shall be transferred from the District of the County Court of Staffordshire now held at Cheadle to the District of the County Court of Staffordshire held at Stoke-upon-Trent and Longton.

The Parishes of Cauldon, Cheddleton (including the Township of Consall), the Township of Cotton, and the Parishes of Ipstones, Kingsley, and Oakamoor, shall be transferred from the County Court of Staffordshire now held at Cheadle to the County Court of Staffordshire held at Leek.

The Parishes of Alton, Bradley-in-the-Moors, Checkley (including Tean), and Croxden, and the Township of Farley, shall be transferred from the County Court of Staffordshire now held at Cheadle to the County Court of Staffordshire held at Uttoxeter.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, Oxford, on the 3rd day of November, 1917, and sealed on the 30th day of November, 1917, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published an accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners, under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act; 1877, did, by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners, who are therein described as "The College of all Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford":

And whereas such Statutes were approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, on the 3rd day of May, 1882, and have since been altered and amended from time to time:

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of our said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 3rd day of November, 1917, it was unanimously resolved, by those present and voting at the Meeting, that the further alteration in the said Statutes hereinafter specified should be made, that is to say:—

In Statute III (April, 1913, Edition).

In Statute III, Clause 7, the words "any income not derived from an academical office.

- (a) in the University, or any College or Public Hall within the University; or
- (b) in any New Foundation for Academical Study and Education within the University; or
- (c) in connection with the body of Non-Collegiate Students; or

- (d) in any other University in the United Kingdom, or any College, Public Hall or Public Hostel within such University; or
- (e) in any University College in the United Kingdom'' shall be substituted for the words

"any income not derived from an academical office in the University, or in any College, University, or University College in the United Kingdom."

Now, we, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby submit the aforesaid alteration made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

RULE MADE BY THE LORD CHANCELLOR, WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF H.M. TREASURY FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE SUPREME COURT FUNDS RULES, 1915.

SUPREME COURT FUNDS RULES, 1917.

- I, ROBERT BANNATYNE LORD FINLAY, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do hereby in pursuance of the powers contained in the Court of Chancery Funds Act, 1872, the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1875, the Supreme Court Funds, &c., Act, 1863, the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1884, and of every other power enabling me in that behalf make the following rules:—
- 1. The following paragraph shall be added to Rule LXVIII:—
 - "(c) When the dividends or interest out of which the annuities are to be paid have not been subjected to a deduction for Income Tax at the source, the deduction for Income Tax from the annuities shall be made at the rate in force at the time of payment of the annuities, and the Paymaster, notwithstanding Rule 45 of these Rules, shall transfer the tax deducted from such annuities to the proper account of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue at the Bank, unless in any case the Court shall otherwise direct, or a certificate is produced from the Commissioners of Inland Revenue that no claim is made by them in respect of such tax."
- 2. These Rules may be cited as the Supreme Court Funds Rules, 1917.

BRITISH CARGOES EX ENEMY
VESSELS IN UNITED STATES
PORTS

His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington reports that he has received the following information from the United States Government as regards the procedure to be followed by claimants for the release of British cargo ex enemy vessels in United States ports:—

British consignees who desire to have the merchandise entered for consumption should furnish to such persons as they desire to represent them at the particular port at which goods may happen to be a duly endorsed Bill of Lading and the original invoice covering the consignments. If, on the other hand, it is desired to export the merchandise, it may be entered for warehouse and immediate exportation without the presentation of a Bill of Lading or invoice, but on the production to the Customs Officers of satisfactory evidence to act in the matter. In case of exportation of merchandise an export licence will probably be required.

HOME GROWN TIMBER PRICES ORDER, 1917.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2r. and 2jj. of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects timber, the Board of Trade hereby order as follows:—

- 1. As and from the fourth day of December, 1917, no person shall sell or offer for sale, or purchase or offer to purchase any timber grown in the United Kingdom at prices exceeding the following:—
 - (a). For timber standing or felled in the wood the prices set forth in Schedule A hereto annexed.
 - (b). For timber in the log delivered free

on rail at loading station the prices set forth in Schedule B hereto annexed.

(c). For converted Hardwood timber delivered free on rail at loading station the prices set forth in Schedule C hereto annexed.

(d). For converted softwood timber delivered free on rail at loading station the prices set forth in Schedule D hereto annexed.

2. The Home Grown Timber Prices (Great Britain) Order, 1917 (T.24051), is hereby cancelled without prejudice to any act or thing done or suffered or any penalty incurred or proceeding or prosecution taken or begun thereunder.
