The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal in Gold in recognition of the conspicuous gallantry and self-sacrifice of Second Lieutenant Grey de Leche Leach, late of the 1st Battalion of the Scots Guards. The circumstances are as follows:—

In France, on the 3rd September, 1916, Lieutenant Leach was examining bombs in a building in which two non-commissioned officers were also at work, when the fuse of one of the bombs ignited. Shouting a warning, he made for the door, carrying the bomb pressed close to his body, but on reaching the door he found other men outside, so that he could not throw the bomb away without exposing others to grave danger. He continued, therefore, to press the bomb to his body until it exploded, mortally wounding him.

Lieutenant Leach might easily have saved his life by throwing the bomb away or dropping it on the ground and seeking shelter, but either course would have endangered the lives of those in or around the building. He sacrificed his own life to save the lives of others.

EXPORT OF TIMBER (IRELAND) ORDER, 1917.

3. This Order may be cited as the Export of Timber (Ireland) Order, 1917.

CORN PRODUCTION ACT, 1917,

AND

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

Provisional regulations made by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries under Section 12 (1) (b) and (c) of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

In pursuance of the provisions of Section 12 (1) (b) and (c) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, and of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby certify that on account of urgency the following regulations should come into immediate operation, and accordingly make the following regulations to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations:—

1. The Agricultural Wages Board shall, except in any case where the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries on the application of the Agricultural Wages Board by general or special order otherwise direct, by Order—

(a) define the benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the pur-

poses of any minimum rate of wages fixed under the Corn Production Act, 1917, and the value at which they are to be so reckoned for such purposes; and

(b) define for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed under the said Act the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment.

2. The Agricultural Wages Board shall have power by Order to limit or prohibit the reckoning of benefits or advantages as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purposes of any minimum rate of wages fixed under the Corn Production Act, 1917.

3. Any Order under the preceding regulations may be made so as to apply universally to workmen employed in agriculture, or to any special class of workmen so employed, or to any special area, or to any special class in a special area, subject in each case to any exceptions prescribed by the Order.

4.—(1) Before making any Order the Agricultural Wages Board shall give notice of the Order which they propose to make and consider any objections to the proposed Order which may be lodged with them within one month; provided that the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries on the application of the Agricultural Wages Board made on the ground of the limited application of a proposed Order may exempt the proposed Order from these provisions and authorise the Wages Board to make the Order at the expiration of seven days after service of Notice of the proposed Order on the persons affected by the Order.

(2) Notice of a proposed Order and of an Order when made shall be given by the Board in such manner as they think fit with a view to bringing the Order, so far as practicable, to the knowledge of the persons affected by the Order.

5. The Agricultural Wages Board may, if they think it expedient, cancel or vary any Order made by them, and shall reconsider any such Order if the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries direct them to do so, and the provisions of these regulations as to notice shall apply in the case of the cancellation or variation of an Order in the same manner as they apply in the case of the making of an Order.

6. The Agricultural Wages Board shall have power on the application of any employer or workman to determine any question which may arise—

(a) as to the value of any benefits or advantages reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purposes of any minimum rate of wages fixed under the Corn Production Act, 1917; or

(b) as to any contract of employment so far as the application of the provisions of the said Act thereto is concerned.

7. The expressions "agriculture," "workmen," and "employment" in these regulations have the same meanings as in Section 17 of the Corn Production Act, 1917, and any Notice required by these Regulations to be given to any person may be given by leaving it for him at his last known place of abode or by sending it through the post in a registered letter addressed to him there. Where the notice is required to be given to a body corporate or incorporate, the notice may be given to the Secretary or some other officer of the body.

8. Any question upon the construction or interpretation of these regulations shall in the event of a dispute be referred to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for decision.

9. These regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Wages Regulations, 1917.

Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915:
Extending Time for operation of certain provisions of the Leeds Corporation Act, 1907, and the Leeds Corporation Act, 1908.

To the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and
Citizens of the City of Leeds;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by virtue of Section 39 of the Leeds Corporation Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), and of an Order dated the 16th day of November, 1916, issued by Us, the Local Government Board, under Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1915"), the time within which the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Leeds (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") are required to sell the lands (and the minerals thereunder either together or separately) known as the Gateforth Estate, in the Townships of Gateforth, Burn, and Hambleton, and Parish of Brayton, in the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, will expire on the 26th day of July, 1918;

And whereas by virtue of Section 17 of the Leeds Corporation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1908"), the time limited for the completion by the Corporation of the works authorised by Part II. of the Act of 1908 will expire on the 1st day of August, 1918:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 1 of the Act of 1915, and of any other powers in that behalf, We, by this Our Order—

(a) extend until the 26th day of July, 1919, the time limited as aforesaid within which the Corporation are required to sell the lands and minerals aforesaid known as the Gateforth Estate; and

(b) extend until the 1st day of August, 1919, the time limited as aforesaid for the completion by the Corporation of the works authorised by Part II. of the Act of 1908.

SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the Board of Trade hereby Order that the time limited by their Order dated the 15th day of March, 1917 (a), for the exercise of powers for the compulsory purchase of lands (1) for the deviation railways (Nos. 1 and 2) at Wood Green, widening (No. 1) of the Enfield Branch, widening (No. 2) at Grantham, widening (No. 3) from Trent Box to Muxham Siding, widening (No. 4) from Gamston to Retford, and widening (No. 5) from Bawtry to Rossington, authorized by Section 5 of the Great Northern Railway Act, 1914, (2) at Holloway, Finsbury Park, Hitchin, and Caythorpe, authorised by Section 45 of the Great Northern Railway Act, 1914, shall be extended for one year from the 7th day of August, 1918, (3) for the widening from Saxondale Junction to Radcliffe, the widening (2) from Adwick Junction to Hemsworth South Junction, authorized by Section 6 and Section 46 respectively of the Great Northern Railway Act, 1911, as extended by Section 56 and Section 57 respectively of the Great Northern Railway Act, 1914, and for Railway No. 8 (Railway at South Elmsall), authorized by Section 63 of the Great Central Railway Act, 1907, as extended by Section 57 of the Great Northern Railway Act, 1914, shall be extended for one year from the 18th day of August, 1918, and (b) for the construction of Railways Nos. 2, 2a, and 4, authorized by the Tickhill Light Railway Order, 1901, as limited by Section 13 of the Tickhill Light Railway (Amendment and Transfer) Order, 1908, and extended by Section 38 of the Great Northern Railway Act, 1912, shall be extended for one year from the 4th day of November, 1918, and (c) for the exercise of the powers for the construction of Railways Nos. 4, 4a, 4b, and 4c (Railways at Harworth), and Railway No. 5 (Railway at Shaftholme), authorized by the Great Northern Railway Act, 1911, shall be extended for one year from the 18th day of August, 1918.
