W HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of December, 1917, in the words following, viz.:—

1917, in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the responsibilities devolving on certain Engine Room Ranks and Artificers in charge of the machinery of Vessels in Your Majesty's Fleet are recognised in some instances by the grant of allowances:

by the grant of allowances:

"And whereas the necessity has arisen for placing Engine Room Ratings, other than Artificers, in charge of the machinery in Small

Craft, and we are of opinion that the responsibilities and duties of such Engine Room Ratings are deserving of similar recognition:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to grant, at our discretion, an allowance of 6d. a day to Engine Room Ratings (including Motor Mechanic and Motor Boat Ratings) who are placed in charge of the machinery of Small Craft, whether steam or motor driven, the horse power of which exceeds 100, such Allowance not to be payable in respect of boats forming part of the equipment of H.M. Ships or of Vessels maintained in reserve.

"We would further submit that this proposal may take effect as from the 3rd day of October, 1917.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Dean and Chapter of Ely 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Ely College, in the Isle of Ely, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz:—

ELY COLLEGE.—Forthwith and entirely in the ground known as the ancient Burial Ground of the Monks in the precincts of Ely Cathedral, which adjoins the Lady Chapel, Choir, and South Transept of the Cathedral, and includes an area lying to the east of the public footpath leading from High Street to the south side of the Cathedral, bounded on the north for a distance of 260 feet or thereabouts by the Almonry Garden, on the east for a distance of 280 feet or thereabouts by private gardens, and on the south for a distance of 180 feet or thereabouts

by private gardens:

Provided that in the said Burial Ground, in grave spaces in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of the Very Reverend Alexander Francis Kirkpatrick, Dean of Ely Cathedral, the Wife of the said Dean, Canon Berkeley William Randolph, Canon George Hodges, Harriet Duke Lowe, and Cassandra Bury Dickson at their decease, subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 5th day of February next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 5th day of February.

Privy Council Office, 1st January, 1918. University of London Act, 1898.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the above named Act, that the following amendment of Statute 111 of the Statutes of the University of London has been made by the Senate, and that copies of the amended Statute can be obtained on application to the Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W. 7.

Statute 111 of the Statutes of the University to be amended by adding thereto a second Proviso, the said Statute as so amended running as follows:—

111. Except as hereinafter provided, no degree other than an honorary or ad eundem degree shall be conferred on any Student who has not satisfied the Examiners in the prescribed examination or examinations, and fulfilled all other prescribed conditions, and no Student shall be allowed to become a sandidate for any higher degree who shall not have previously taken the lower degree or degrees of the Provided that Students whose same class. qualifications are considered suitable may be admitted by the Senate as Candidates for the Degree of Doctor of Science without their having previously obtained the Degree of Master of Science. Provided also that during the War begun in 1914, and after its termination for such period as the Senate shall see fit, the Senate shall have power to waive the conditions of this Statute in such a way as will prevent as far as possible any Student of the University (whether an honorary (War) degree has been conferred on him by the University or not) from being placed at a disadvantage through going on active service or undertaking other approved duties in connexion with national defence, and in particular the Senate may accept such test as the Senate may consider adequate in lieu of the prescribed examinations.

HOWE, Lord Chamberlain to H.M. Queen Alexandra. Whitehall, December 28, 1917.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Decoration of the Albert Medal in Gold in recognition of the gallant action of Second Lieutenant Arthur Halstead, M.C., late of the 10th Battalion of the West Riding Regiment, in saving life in France, in July last, at the cost of his own life. The circumstances are as follows:—

On the 31st July, 1917, during instruction in the throwing of live bombs, a bomb was accidentally dropped. Lieutenant Halstead placed himself between the bomb and the soldier who had dropped it in order to screen him, and tried to kick the bomb away, but it exploded, fatally wounding him. The soldier was slightly wounded, and there can be little doubt that Lieutenant Halstead's gallant action saved the soldier's life.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Decoration of the Albert Medal in Gold to Private (acting Lance-Corporal) James Collins, of the 14th Field Ambulance, Royal Army Medical Corps, in recognition of his gallant action in saving life in France in the following circumstances:—

On the 11th November, 1917, near an advanced dressing station in France, a lunatic soldier escaped from his escort and ran away along a trench. Collins ran after him, and when he got near him the man threatened to throw a bomb at him. Collins closed with the man, who then withdrew the pin from the bomb and let it fall in the trench. In an endeavour to save the patient and two other soldiers who were near, Collins put his foot upon the bomb, which exploded, killing the lunatic and injuring Collins severely; fortunately the two soldiers were not hurt.

Collins, who could easily have got out of the way, ran the gravest risk of losing his life in order to save others.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Decoration of the Albert Medal in recognition of the gallantry of Petty Officer Alfred Place, late of the Royal Navy. The circumstances are as follows:—

At Blandford, on the 16th June, 1916, during grenade practice, a live bomb thrown by one of the men under instruction fell back into the trench. Petty Officer Place rushed forward, pulled back two men who were in front of him and attempted to reach the grenade with the intention of throwing it over the parapet. Unfortunately the bomb exploded before he could reach it and inflicted fatal injuries. By his coolness and self-sacrifice Petty Officer Place probably saved the lives of three other men.

Major Lewis Collingwood Bearne, D.S.O., and Private Albert Edward Usher, both of the Army Service Corps.

On the 22nd October, 1916, a French motor lorry, loaded with 3,000 lbs. of aeroplane bombs, caught fire in the middle of a camp of the Serbian Army. Efforts to beat out the flames with earth proved ineffectual, and, after the fire had

been burning for seven or eight minutes, and the bomb cases were already involved, Major Bearne and Private Usher ran up with extinguishers. Both immediately crawled underneath the lorry, and eventually succeeded in extinguishing the flames, thus averting a serious disaster at the risk of their own lives. Major Bearne was severely burnt about the hands and arms.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Decoration of the Albert Medal to the undermentioned Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers and a Private of His Majesty's Forces serving in France or elsewhere in recognition of their gallantry in saving life:—

Captain the Hon. Thomas Charles Fitz-herbert, Lancashiro Hussars.

On the 10th July, 1916, an instructional party was throwing live bombs from separate A volley was ordered. All the bombs were thrown successfully except one, which hit the parapet and stuck in the mud. For three or four seconds the accident was unnoticed, as everyone was watching the bombs in the air, and the man who threw the bomb was too Suddenly frightened to call out or to move. Captain Fitzherbert noticed smoke issuing from the parapet and saw the bomb. He might have placed himself in safety by throwing himself on the bottom of his pit; but seeing that the man would be exposed to the full force of the explosion, he picked the bomb out of the mud and threw it clear just as it exploded. By his courage and presence of mind he undoubtedly saved the man's life, while risking his own.

Captain Charles Reginald Hoskyn, Royal Army Medical Corps.

In France on the 24th November, 1916, as a result of a serious railway accident, a man was pinned down by the legs under some heavy girders. The wreckage was on fire, and the flames had already reached the man's ankles. Captain Hoskyn crawled into a cavity in the flaming wreckage, and after releasing one of the man's legs, amputated the other, whereupon the man was drawn out alive, Captain Hoskyn retaining hold of the main artery until a tourniquet could be put on.

Lieutenant Andrew Berghans McCreath, Northumberland Fusiliers, attached The King's Own Scottish Borderers (Egyptian Military Force).

On 26th July, 1917, during an inspection of grenades, one of the grenades fell on the ground and detonated, and Lieutenant McCreath, hearing warning shouts, ran up and picked up the bomb. In order to get rid of it without endangering others, he had to run until he found an empty dug-out into which to throw it. As he was about to throw it away the detonator exploded; fortunately, the ammonal was wet (although Lieutenant McCreath did not know this), and no further

explosion took place, or he would almost certainly have been killed or severely injured.

Lieutenant Eric Arnold Shacklady, Manchester Regiment.

During bombing practice at Cleethorpes on the 5th December, 1916, a live grenade which was thrown by one of the men under instruction failed to clear the parapet. The bomb was picked up and thrown a second time, but again failed to clear the parapet. By this time the fuse had burnt nearly to the end, but Lieutenant Shacklady ran forward, picked up the grenade, and was about to throw it away when it exploded and blew off his hand. By this gallant action, in which he risked his life, Lieutenant Shacklady undoubtedly saved the life of the man who had thrown the grenade.

Lieutenant Frederick Stuart Smith and Serjeant William Ernest Rhoades, both of the Royal Flying Corps.

At an aerodrome in France, on the 14th October, 1916, a bomb accidentally exploded in the mouth of a dug-out forming a bomb store, which contained a large number of bombs packed in wooden cases and a quantity of rockets. Two men were killed by the explosion, and another man, who was severely injured, was thrown down into the store. Dense volumes of smoke issued from the dug-out, and there was great risk of a further explosion. Lieutenant (then 2nd Lieutenant) Smith, on hearing a call for help, immediately entered the dug-out, followed by Serjeant Rhoades, and succeeded in rescuing the wounded man, who would otherwise have been suffocated.

Second Lieutenant Frederick Leonard Houghton, The Royal Warwickshire Regiment.

On the 27th July, 1917, during bombing instruction, a bomb hit the parapet and fell back into the trench which was occupied by Lieutenant Houghton, a non-commissioned officer and the man who had thrown the bomb. The noncommissioned officer shouted to the man to seek cover, which he could easily have done, but the man remained crouching near the bomb. Lieutenant Houghton had already placed himself in safety; but on hearing the shouts of the non-commissioned officer, he ran back into the trench, seized the bomb, and threw it over the parapet, where it at once exploded. Had not Lieutenant Houghton returned from safety into danger, the man would almost certainly have been killed.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling him, hereby orders as fol-

- 1. For the purposes of this Order, the expression "Coal Tar" shall mean tar produced or derived from the destructive distillation of bituminous material by any means other than blast furnaces, the expression "Water Gas Tar" shall mean tar produced by carburetting water gas, and the expression "Tar" shall mean and include both Coal Tar and Water Gas Tar as above defined.
- 2. No person shall as and from the day following the date of this Order until further notice purchase or offer to purchase any Tar (whether crude or dehydrated) except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a License issued by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions. Provided that no License shall be required-
  - (a) By a Tar Distiller for the purchase of Tar in any quantities, provided that the whole quantity purchased is intended to be and is in fact distilled to pitch by such
  - b) By any person for the purchase of Tar (whether crude or dehydrated) in quantities not exceeding ten gallons, provided that the total quantity purchased by any one person during any one calendar month does not exceed 50 gallons.
- 3. No person shall as from the day following the date of this Order until further notice, except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a License issued by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions:-
  - (i) Accept delivery of or make payment for any Coal Tar tendered for delivery under any contract existing at the date of this Order unless (a) such contract was entered into prior to the 5th September, 1917, and is in writing, and (b) full written particulars of such contract were furnished to the Minister of Munitions before the 1st October, 1917, by the person entitled at that date to deliveries thereunder; or
  - (ii) Accept delivery of or make payment for any water gas tar tendered for delivery under any contract existing at the date of this Order unless (a) such contract is in writing, and (b) full written particulars of such contract shall be furnished to the Minister of Munitions before the 25th January, 1918, by the person for the time being entitled to deliveries thereunder.
- 4. As on and from the 15th January, 1918, until further notice no person manufacturing or producing Tar shall burn or consume any such Tar for firing, steam raising, or heating purposes, nor use any such Tar for any other purposes except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a License issued by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions. Provided that no such License shall be required by a manufacturer or producer of Tar who is also a Tar Distiller to entitle him to distil to pitch all or any of the Tar manufactured or produced by him.
- 5. The Order of the Minister of Munitions dated the 4th September, 1917, relating to Coal Tar is hereby cancelled, but such cancellation shall not affect the previous operation of that Order nor the validity of any action taken thereunder, nor the liability to any penalty or punishment in respect of any contravention or failure to comply with such Order prior to this

6. This Order may be cited as the "Tar (Coal and Water Gas) Order, 1917."

2. All persons engaged in producing, treating, distributing, storing, selling, or dealing in Crude Solvent Naphtha, Solvent Naphtha or Heavy Naphtha, or in any manufacture, trade or business in which the same or any of them are used shall make all such returns with regard to their businesses and verify the same in such manner (including production of their books) as may from time to time be required by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions

3. For all purposes of this Order the expressions "Crude Solvent Naphtha," "Solvent Naphtha" and "Heavy Naphtha" shall mean Crude Solvent Naphtha, Solvent Naphtha and Heavy Naphtha obtained during distillation of coal tar or extracted from coal gas.

- (1) No Hides of the description aforesaid shall be bought by or on behalf of any Tanner, or delivered to any Tanner or to any person on his behalf, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, or at prices other than those set out in the schedule hereto annexed, or at such other prices as in any particular case may be allowed by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials.
- (2) All persons concerned in any transaction herein referred to shall furnish such particulars as to their business as may be required. by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials.
- (3) All persons to whom any permit may be issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials shall comply strictly with any conditions that may be imposed by such permit.

It shall be the duty of all Tanners to communicate to any person buying on their behalf the conditions of any permit granted to such Tanner and for the time being in force, and it shall be the duty of all parties to any of the transactions herein referred to to require or disclose, as the case may be, all such informa-tion as may be required by such parties as aforesaid, or by the Director of Raw Materials for the purpose of satisfying them or him that the provisions of this Order have not been contravened.

#### SHEEP AND LAMB PELTS (IRELAND) ORDER, 1917.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby require all persons engaged in the purchase or sale of Skins or Pelts taken from Sheep or Lambs killed in Ireland to comply with the following Regulations until further notice:—

(1) No person shall purchase, sell or make or take delivery of or payment for Pelts of the description aforesaid without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials or at prices exceeding those set out in the schedule hereto annexed.

(2) All persons to whom a permit may be issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials shall comply strictly with any conditions which may be imposed by such permit.

(3) All Fellmongers shall grade all Pelts of the description aforesaid in accordance with the principles and standards of assortment provided in clause 2 of the Order made by the 'Army Council, relating to Skins taken from Sheep and Lambs killed in Great Britain and dated the 30th day of June, 1917.

The classification shall be as follows:—

(a) Sheep Pelts.—Extras, 1st, 2nds, 3rds.
(b) Lamb Pelts.—Supers, 1sts, 2nds.

(4) No person shall without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials hold any Skins of the description aforesaid (other than those from slink lambs) for a period exceeding three weeks after the receipt by him of the woolled skins, but all persons shall deliver such Skins as aforesaid duly fellmongered to the Tanner or Dresser within the said period.

(5) Any person failing to comply with any provision hereof or with any requirement or direction made or given hereunder or with any condition of any permit herein referred to shall be guilty of an offence against the said

Belfast Lough—Light-Buoys established; Traffic Regulations.

Two light-buoys have been established to

mark a gateway on the northern side of the entrance to Belfast lough, as follows:—

(a) South-eastern light-buoy:

Position.—At a distance of  $8\frac{1}{4}$  cables, 133° (S. 28° E. Mag.), from the extremity of Cloghan point.

Lat. 54° 43¾' N., long. 5° 42¼' W.

Description.—A can light-buoy, painted black, exhibiting a flashing red light every four seconds.

(b) North-western light-buoy:

Position.—At a distance of approximately 600 feet north-westward from the south-eastern light-buoy.

Description.—A conical light-buoy, painted red, exhibiting a flashing green light every four seconds.

When making for this gateway, vessels must maintain a course of  $201^{\circ}$  (S.  $40^{\circ}$  W. Mag.) or  $21^{\circ}$  (N.  $40^{\circ}$  E. Mag.) for a distance of a quarter of a mile on either side of the gateway.

The Gobbins head light-and-whistle-buoy, exhibiting a *flashing red* light, situated in lat. 54° 48′ 10″ N., long. 5° 38′ 20″ W., approximately, serves as an additional aid to vessels.

Vessels approaching Belfast must be careful to look out for and close the Patrol Vessels off the port, and strictly observe any instructions communicated to them by the Patrol.

A drifter will be stationed at a distance of about half a mile north-eastward of the gateway.

This drifter regulates inward-bound and outward-bound traffic. When no signals are exhibited by day or night by this drifter, inwardbound traffic may proceed to pass through the gateway.

Inward-bound vessels will be given priority over outward-bound vessels in respect of passage through the gateway.

To indicate that the gateway is clear for outward-bound vessels the drifter will display by day a black shape and by night two horizontal white lights.

During fog three long blasts on the steam whistle, repeated at intervals of five minutes, will indicate that the gateway is clear for outward-bound traffic.

Vessels approaching Belfast lough in foggy weather should be careful to sound the regulation fog-signals, and to proceed with great caution when within a depth of 30 fathoms at all states of the tide.

When the gateway is clear for inward-bound traffic, no outward-bound vessel may approach within half a mile of the gateway; and when the signals indicate that outward-bound traffic may pass through the gateway, no inward-bound vessel may approach within half a mile of the gateway.

During the hours of darkness, all vessels entering or leaving must exhibit their side lights.

Before attempting to leave Belfast lough, outward-bound vessels must obtain instructions as to the route to be followed.
