Now upon the application of the bankrupt, and the Court being satisfied that there is no probability of the bankrupt being in a position to comply with the terms of the above-mentioned Order, it is ordered that the bankrupt be discharged subject to the following condition to be fulfilled before his discharge takes effect, namely:—He shall, before the signing of this Order, consent to Judgment being entered against him in the County Court of Devonshire, holden at Exeter, by the Official Receiver, for the sum of £40, being part of the balance of the debts provable in the bankruptcy which is not satisfied at the date of this Order; and it is further ordered that, upon the required consent being given, Judgment may be entered against the bankrupt in the County Court of Devonshire, holden at Exeter, for the said sum of £40.
