The Weather is excessive cold here, and several persons have of lare been found dead, on the Roads; 'Tis thought these severe Frosts will do much harm to the Vines, and to the Corn in the Ground. Great Complaints are still made concerning the Listing of men by force, but without any redress; and several disorders have happened on this account.
