For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. When the enemy were attacking he mounted his machine-gun and brought it into action in the open. When a withdrawal was ordered, having loaded his own mule, he returned under fire to make sure that everything had been got away, and discovered another machine-gun, which he brought back. He set a splendid example of courage and initiative.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He did continuous excellent work under most adverse and difficult conditions, and set a splendid example to his men.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He has consistently performed good work throughout, and has at all times set a splendid example.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He has shown great zeal and ability during the past fifteen months, and has always set a fine example of coolness and disregard of danger under heavy fire.

2609 Pte. B. E. Galli, Imp. Camel Co.
